## Summer Student Employment Opportunity

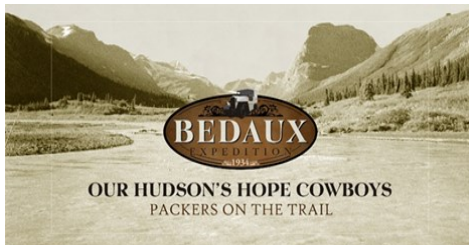
The Hudson's Hope Museum will be hiring two (2) Summer Students for the 2024 summer season. Duties will include, not limited to:

### "Looking Back 90 Years ago this month"



Key members of the 1934 expedition were: **Jack Bocock**, an Alberta geologist and partner with Bedaux in mining ventures in the Hudson's Hope area. He was appointed 2nd in command of the Expedition and coordinated most of the arrangements from St Albert base. Fort St John's **Bill Pickell** was recruited to buy the horses and rigging and helped put the advance survey party on the trail. North Pine's **Tom Wilde** took on the initial trail cutting contract, and Hudson's Hope's **Bob Beattie**, was hired on as head packer.

As the snow melted in April the trail cutting and survey crews set out from Fort St John. The first advance outfit was Tommy Wilde's trail cutting crew that left Fort St John on April 13, 1934, with instructions to cut a 6-foot-wide tractor trail with wide sweeping turns north to the Prophet River. We will be looking back over the months ahead. Stop by the Museum and check out the Expedition of Charles Bedaux.

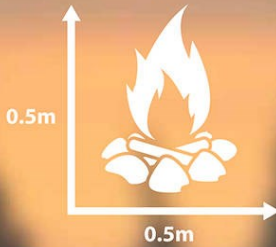

# OPEN FIRE REGULATIONS

## CAMPFIRES, CATEGORY 2 FIRES AND CATEGORY 3 FIRES: WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?



### CAMPFIRE:

- Any fire smaller than 0.5 metres high by 0.5 metres wide

#### REGULATIONS:



You must have ready access to 8 litres of water or a shovel for the entire time your campfire is lit.



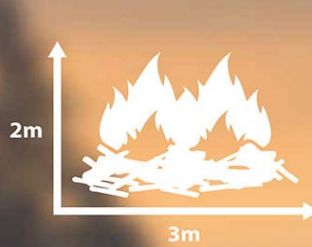
Your campfire must be completely extinguished and the ashes must be cool to the touch before leaving the area for any length of time. (Hot coals can reignite the fire.)



During campfire prohibitions, only a CSA- or ULC-approved portable campfire apparatus may be used, and the flame height must not exceed 15 centimetres.



You must build a fire guard around your campfire.



### CATEGORY 2 FIRE:

- 1 to 2 concurrently burning piles no larger than 2 metres high by 3 metres wide
- Stubble or grass burning over an area less than 0.2 hectares

#### REGULATIONS:



A fuel break must be established around any Category 2 burn area.



Fireworks are banned when a Category 2 fire prohibition is in effect.



Burning barrels are banned when a Category 2 fire prohibition is in effect.



At least one person equipped with a fire-fighting hand tool must monitor the fire at all times.



### CATEGORY 3 FIRE:

- Any fire larger than 2 metres high by 3 metres wide
- 3 or more concurrently burning piles no larger than 2 metres high by 3 metres wide
- 1 or more burning windrows
- Stubble or grass burning over an area greater than 0.2 hectares

#### REGULATIONS:



A fuel break must be established around any Category 3 burn area.



Monitor your open burn to ensure that the fire doesn't spread beyond its intended size.



You must have a burn registration number to light a Category 3 open fire. Call the burn registration line **1 888 797-1717** to obtain one.

## GENERAL REGULATIONS:



Never burn in strong wind conditions.



Your fire must be extinguished before leaving the area.



Always keep your fire a safe distance away from nearby branches, wood and other combustible materials.



Do not conduct Category 2 or Category 3 burns when venting conditions are "Poor" or "Fair". Always check here first: [www.bc.airquality.ca/readings/ventilation-index.html](http://www.bc.airquality.ca/readings/ventilation-index.html)

*\*Further bans and restrictions can be implemented at the BC Wildfire Service's discretion.*



Anyone found in contravention of an open fire prohibition may be fined up to \$1,150. If your fire escapes and results in a wildfire, you may be fined anywhere from \$100,000 to \$1 million and be sentenced to one year in prison. Please check with local government authorities for any other restrictions before lighting any open fire.

# Monthly Police Report



## Hudson's Hope RCMP Monthly Police Report

The Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 11 calls for service between February 21<sup>st</sup> and March 23<sup>rd</sup>. 28 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates for various motor vehicle related offences. Highway and road safety continues to be a focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP.

On February 24<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a report of a single motor vehicle accident involving a commercial tanker truck along the Kobes Creek FSR. Upon arriving on-scene, police observed a tanker truck that had slide off the main road and come to an abrupt stop among a crop of trees and a hillside. The driver was transported to hospital with non-life threatening injuries. The cause of the accident was deemed accidental based on the road conditions.

On March 22<sup>nd</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of an iPhone SOS crash alert somewhere along the Kobes Creek FSR. Police located the vehicle which was found in a ditch and no signs of injury were observed. Upon speaking with the registered owner of the vehicle, it was confirmed that no persons were injured in the accident and that the cause was due to road conditions and human error.

The Hudson's Hope RCMP would like to remind residents that effective at 12:00 (noon) on Thursday, March 28<sup>th</sup>, 2024, Category 2 and Category 3 open fires will be prohibited across the Prince George Fire Centre. This prohibition is being implemented to help prevent human-caused wildfires and protect public safety due to the high grass fire hazard and persistent drought conditions in the region. Members of the public and industry are highly urged to be extra vigilant when monitoring existing Category 2 and Category 3 open burns and must extinguish all such fires by noon on March 28<sup>th</sup>, 2024.

For reference on the categories of fires:

- **Category 1 campfire** (defined): Any fire no larger than 0.5 metres high by 0.5 metres wide (a fire larger than this is considered a Category 2 fire).
- **Category 2 open fire** (defined): An open fire that burns material in one pile not exceeding 2 metres in height and 3 metres in width. Material concurrently in 2 piles each not exceeding 2 metres in height and 3 metres in width. Stubble or grass over an area that does not exceed 0.2 hectares.
- **Category 3 open fire** (defined): An open fire that burns material concurrently in 3 or more piles each not exceeding 2 metres in height and 3 metres in width. Material in one or more piles each exceeding 2 metres in height or 3 metres in width. One or more windrows, none of which exceed 200 metres in length or 15 metres in width. Stubble or grass over an area exceeding 0.2 hectares.

Before lighting a fire, even if the burn category is not currently prohibited, ensure you are properly prepared, aware of the conditions, and are following open burning regulations:

- Establish a fuel break around your Category 2 or 3 burn or a fire guard around your campfire.
- Ensure someone is always monitoring the fire so it does not spread beyond its intended size. At least one person equipped with a fire-fighting hand tool must monitor the fire at all times.
- Do not burn when venting conditions are “poor or fair”.

Anyone found in contravention of an open burning prohibition may be issued a violation ticket for \$1,150.00, required to pay an administrative penalty of up to \$10,000.00 or, if convicted in court, fined up to \$100,000.00 and or, sentenced to one year in jail. If the contravention causes or contributes to a wildfire, the person responsible may be ordered to pay all fire-fighting and associated costs. Violators could also be held responsible for damages to Crown resources, which could be significant.

FireSmart  
Homeowners Manual

**It's the little tasks around your home that can make a world of difference if a wildfire comes a bit too close for comfort. To drastically increase the fire resiliency of your home and your community, you'll need to:**

- Remove debris from your gutters.
- Mow your lawn and keep it under 10cm tall.
- Relocate combustible materials (firewood, propane tanks, etc.) at least 10 meters away from your home.
- Clean out under your deck to remove combustible debris such as leaves and branches.
- Prune tree branches on your property that are within 2 m of the ground.
- Reduce highly flammable plants on your property and choose fire-resistant plants to replace them.

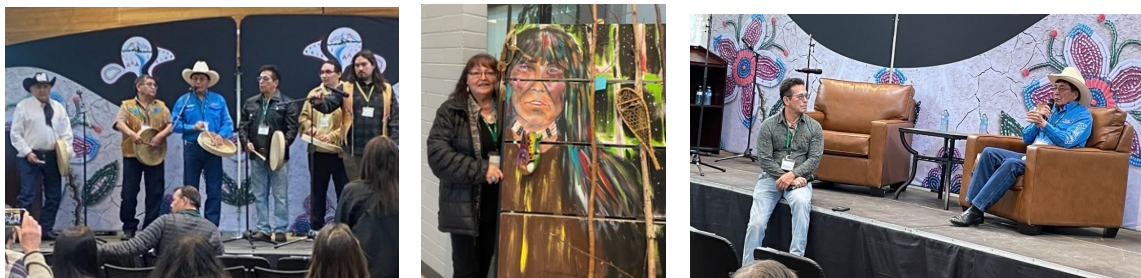


## River of the Peace Métis Society Community Report April

# Homeowner Information to Building Permits

The District of Hudson’s Hope wants to assist homeowners and contractors to avoid unnecessary delays and expense in planning and construction of residential projects. Below explains when permits are required, requirements for the permit, possible other documents that may be required and other information to assist you in obtaining your building permit. Additional information is available at the District Office or online at [www.hudsonshope.ca](http://www.hudsonshope.ca)

## A BUILDING PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO:

- ↳ construct a new home;
- ↳ locate mobile / modular home;
- ↳ construct a commercial, industrial or public use building;
- ↳ construct a new accessory building e.g., carport, farm building, garage or storage shed;
- ↳ renovate existing buildings;
- ↳ undertake any structural work such as interior partitions;
- ↳ enclose a porch or roof over a sundeck;
- ↳ move or demolish a building;
- ↳ re-roof a building;
- ↳ reconstruct after damage;
- ↳ plumbing system changes;

## INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED WITH A BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION

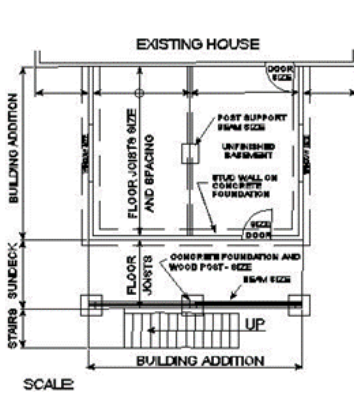
The following items must be supplied along with a completed Building Permit Application before a Building Permit can be issued. A Building Permit fee is based on the value of the building or structure and will be calculated by the Building Official.

### 1. BUILDING PLANS

Two sets of detailed building plans. If you cannot draw the necessary building or site plans, then you should obtain the services of a qualified person.

#### Example Floor Plans

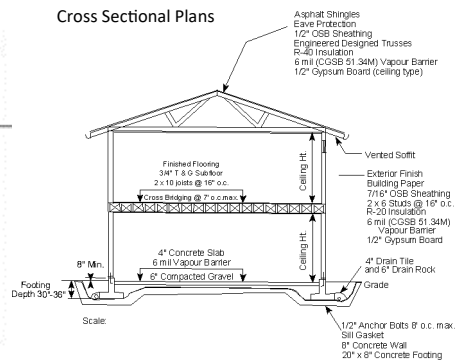
- scale not less than 1:50 metric (1/4 inch to 1 foot);
- size and location of windows and doors;
- location of all plumbing fixtures;
- location of all mechanical equipment.
- all rooms, size and use of each;
- all dimensions;
- finished and unfinished areas; —

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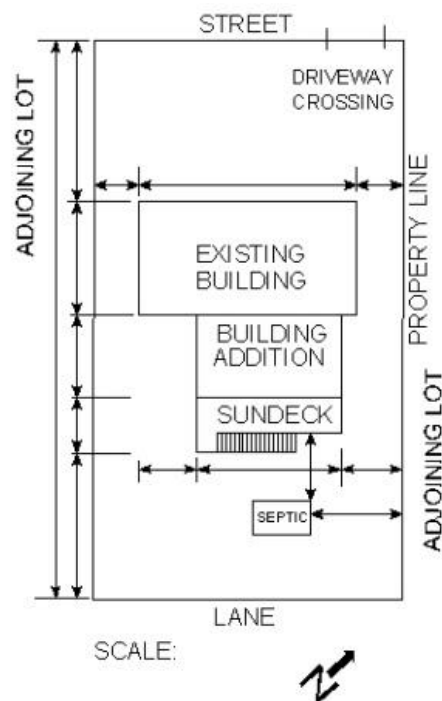

## 2. SITE PLAN

- full legal description of lot: lot number, plan number; district lot number (from your tax notice or Title);
- lot dimensions;
- adjoining street names;
- locations and uses of existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- distances from all property lines for existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- location of legal road access to the property;
- size, location and number of parking spaces;
- existing and proposed wells or other water sources;
- location of existing or proposed sewage disposal fields on property;
- location of any watercourses on property showing distances from existing or proposed buildings or additions;

**This information is intended to assist the general public in applying for a Building Permit within the District of Hudson’s Hope.**



### BUILDING INSPECTIONS (Typical)

The Building Bylaw requires inspections at the following stages of construction;

- Footings - prior to pouring concrete.
- Backfilling - after completion of damp-proofing, drain tile, and drain rock (if required), but prior to backfilling.
- Plumbing - before any part of the plumbing system is covered.
- Framing - after the entire rough-in plumbing, electrical and mechanical equipment is installed and the framing is completed to lockup stage, but prior to insulating.
- Insulation and Vapour Barrier - after all insulation and vapour barriers are installed, but prior to covering.
- Final - when the building or portion thereof is completed and ready for occupancy, but prior to occupancy thereof.

An Occupancy Certificate is required prior to occupancy of a building. In order for an Occupancy Certificate to be issued, all inspections above must be approved.

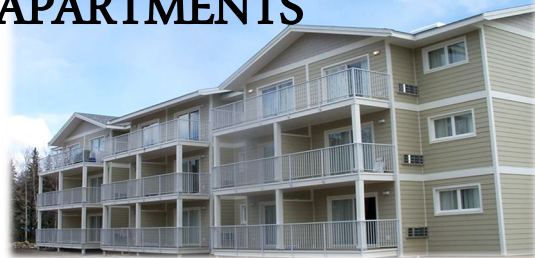

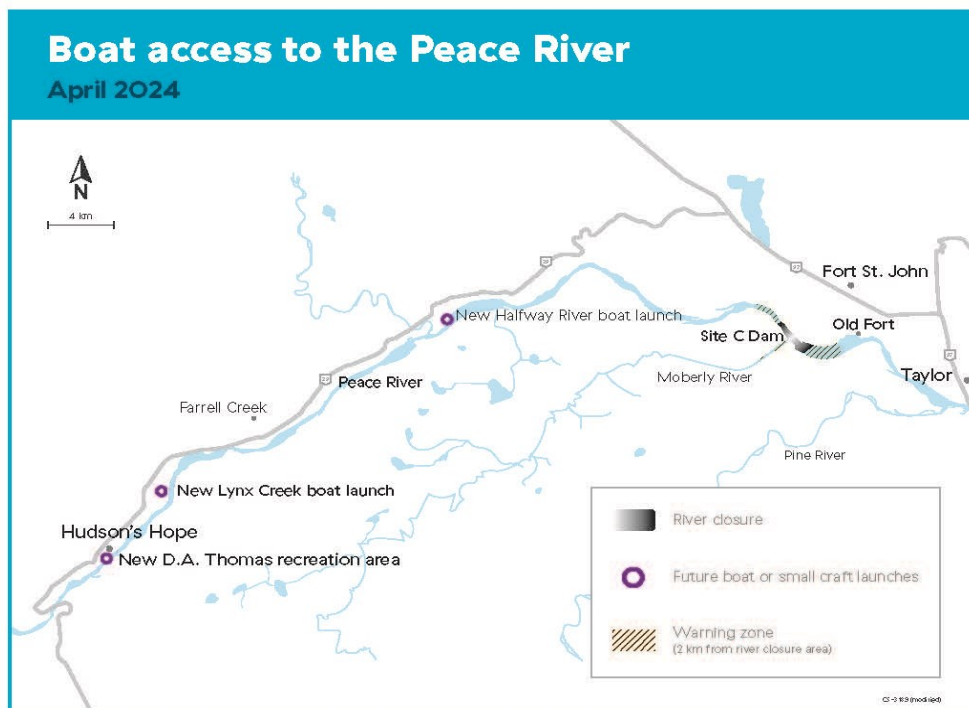
## Boat access changes in preparation for Site C reservoir filling

To prepare for filling of the Site C reservoir, which will begin late summer 2024, there will be changes in access to the Peace River.

The Lynx Creek and D.A. Thomas boat launches are now closed. The existing Halfway River boat launch opens in early April for a shortened season. It will permanently close in mid-August before reservoir filling begins.

New boat launches are under construction, but they will be inaccessible for at least one year after filling as BC Hydro monitors for slope stability. Please continue to use caution when on the water and stay away from the Site C dam construction area.
