FWCP is Now Accepting Grant Applications for Fish & Wildlife Projects

Apply Now for a Grant

(PEACE REGION) The Fish & Wildlife Compensation Program (FWCP) has now opened its annual intake of fish and wildlife grant applications. Stewardship groups, First Nations, consultants, agencies or individuals are invited to apply for a grant to help conserve and enhance fish and wildlife impacted by existing BC Hydro dams in the Williston and Dinosaur watersheds.

“We fund hands-on and research-based projects that align with our Action Plans,” says FWCP Peace Region Manager, Dan Bouillon, adding, “Our Action Plans reflect local conservation priorities and guide our strategic funding decisions.”

Anyone interested in applying for funding from the FWCP should review the Action Plans and must submit a mandatory Notice of Intent, by September 21, that helps ensure your project idea aligns with these Plans, and enables early engagement of First Nations. Completed online grant applications are due by October 28, 2016. See fwcp.ca for our Action Plans, and more information about our grants, including a Notice of Intent form.

Currently the FWCP is funding 20 fish and wildlife projects for more than \$970,000 in its Peace Region. Species that are benefiting from this work include Woodland Caribou, Bull Trout, Arctic grayling, Fisher, amphibians as well as many migratory birds and bats.

Fish and wildlife projects funded by FWCP in 2016-17 include:

- maternity penning for Klinse-Za (Moberly) caribou that will help improve survival rates for calves;
- reducing wildlife barriers to improve habitat connectivity;
- banding birds at Mackenzie Nature Observatory to continue long-term data collection;
- estimating Bull Trout spawner abundance in Williston Reservoir, in order to identify critical spawning habitat and estimate populations;
- prioritizing angling enhancement opportunities in Nak’azdli First Nation territory to improve habitat and sustenance angling; and
- Restoring lichen for caribou in the Finlay Arm.

The projects approved for FWCP funding reflect conservation priorities in the region, and were selected after a review by the FWCP’s First Nations’ Working Group (FNWG), technical committees and the 16-member Peace Region Board. Across the province, FWCP is funding more than 116 fish and wildlife projects for a total of approximately \$8.7 million. Learn more at fwcp.ca.

BC Hydro: Site C Drinking Water Well Monitoring Program

BC Hydro is implementing a Drinking Water Well Monitoring Program within 1 km of the Site C reservoir area to ensure that any potential changes to drinking water quality due to the reservoir can be identified. This monitoring program is being implemented as a precaution. Changes in groundwater levels are not expected to affect water quality in wells.

BC Hydro is inviting residents with wells that are within 1 km of the future reservoir to participate in the Drinking Water Well Monitoring Program. Participation in the Program is voluntary. The program will include completion of an initial questionnaire, one baseline water quality test, and outreach to residents twice a year over the 10-year monitoring program to identify changes in water quality and production from drinking water wells. Follow-up water quality testing may be done when required.

Doctor Recruitment Update: A young doctor and his wife did a whirlwind tour of Hudson's Hope last week and have shown interest in Hudson's Hope. We hope to hear their decision shortly. Meanwhile, the medical staff situation is tentatively as follows:

Dr. Kamath leaves at the end of July.

August – There will be no physician at the clinic. Susan will be on holidays, but a nurse will be covering for her. Northern Health is hoping to find additional support during this time as well.

September & October – A temporary locum physician has been engaged.

November – Hopefully we will have a permanent resident physician by this time.

This could change, and we will advise as we find out. Meanwhile, announcements will be made via PSA's, or notices posted in the Clinic.

Many thanks to Northern Health for their recruiting efforts – they have worked hard on our behalf.

Public Bathrooms: Hudson's Hope has long needed public bathrooms. Early last week, Public Works installed two new campground-style outhouses in the parking lot behind the Info

Centre. Check them out: fold-down change-table, support bars, easily accessible by vehicle or pedestrian traffic, they will provide a much-needed service.

Dinosaur Trackway: Are You Interested in an Organized Site Visit?

The dinosaur trackway near Johnson Creek Road was officially unveiled on July 8 with representation from the provincial government (Minister of Education Bernier & MLA Pimm); regional elected officials from surrounding communities; and contingents from the Peace Region Paleontology Research Centre and the Tumbler Ridge Museum Foundation, led by Dr. Helm from Tumbler Ridge. Working on-site were paleontologists from BC, Yukon, the US and China.



About 600 square meters of trackway have been uncovered so far. By the end of the summer, they hope to have exposed about 3,000 square meters.

Dr. Rich McCrea, who leads the project, welcomes visitors. He suggests having an organized group tour sometime in late August, (probably 2nd or 3rd week) which would avoid having a lot of private vehicles on the Canfor radio-controlled forestry road.

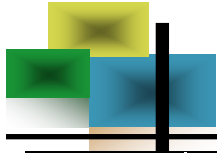

Police Report: July 2016



Hudson's Hope RCMP Detachment responded to approximately 40 calls for service over the last four weeks.

On June 24th, 2016, Hudson's Hope RCMP assisted Fort St. John RCMP Traffic Service with a vehicle stop on Highway 29. A male driver was found to be driving an uninsured vehicle while impaired and was issued an Immediate Roadside Driving Prohibition. A passenger was arrested for breaching his bail conditions of not to consume alcohol.

On June 28th, 2016, Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a local residence for a report of shots being fired. The investigation led to a male being arrested and a seizure of a rifle. That male is currently in custody and facing several Criminal Code charges.

On July 2nd, 2016, Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a motorcycle previously reported to police as speeding near Moberly Lake. The driver was found to be operating the vehicle with no driver's license and no insurance. The vehicle was towed and the driver was issued two violation tickets.

On July 8th, 2016, Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a motorist due to his driving behavior. The driver was found to be under the influence of liquor and was issued an immediate roadside driving prohibition.

Hudson's Hope RCMP, in conjunction with Fort St. John RCMP, have been conducting boat patrols along the Peace River checking boaters for proper licensing and safety equipment. Several warnings have been issued and boat operators are reminded that violation tickets may be issued for not complying with the Small Vessel Regulations and Canada Shipping Act. Please refer to Transport Canada website for complete requirements for your vessel.

Getting Help and Reporting a Scam:

The best agency to contact depends on where you live and what type of scam is involved.

If you think you have spotted a scam or have been targeted by a scam, there are a number of government and law enforcement agencies in Canada that you can contact for advice or to make a report. This may help you and prevent others from being ripped off by scam operators.

Reporting Banking and Credit Card Scams

Contact your bank or financial institution. As well as reporting these scams to the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre, you should alert your bank or financial institution about any suspicious correspondence that you receive about your account. They can advise you on what to do next. **Make sure that the telephone number you use is from the phone book, your account statement or the back of your Credit or ATM card.**

Contact the police? Many scams that may breach consumer protection laws (those enforced by the Competition Bureau, other government and law enforcement agencies) may also breach the fraud provisions of the *Criminal Code*.

If you are the victim of fraud—you have suffered a loss because of someone's dishonesty or deception—you should consider contacting your local police (particularly if the amount involved is significant).

You should definitely contact the police if you have had your property stolen or have been threatened or assaulted by a scammer.

Tips to Stay Safe While Boating



With the four tips below, individuals who are boating can stay safe and ensure that each experience out on the water is rewarding and free of potential emergencies.

1. The importance of lifejackets: The most essential thing that individuals need when they're out on the water is a lifejacket or personal flotation device (PFD), as this can substantially reduce the potential for drowning or other dangerous aquatic incidents.

2. Avoid alcohol: According to the Canadian Red Cross, 37 per cent of boaters in Canada consume alcohol each time they are on the water, while alcohol has been linked as a factor in more than 40 percent of deaths in recreational boating incidents.

Beer, liquor and wine can negatively impact a boater's judgment and make him or her less likely to maintain control of core motor functions compared to individuals who do not drink on the water, which underscores the importance of being sober while boating.

3. Pay attention to weather conditions: While weather conditions may not seem as essential as wearing a lifejacket or PFD, understanding what the climate and forecast will be like during an upcoming boating experience can be crucial for staying safe while aboard a vessel.

4. Bringing safety gear on board: From marine first aid kits to sunscreen, drinking water, flashlights, sound signaling devices and manual propelling devices, there are a variety of safety devices that should be brought on a boat in order to reduce the likelihood of emergencies.

WAC Bennett Dam Rip-Rap Project

Traffic impacts

We have approval from the B.C. Utilities Commission to begin work on the WAC Bennett Dam Rip-Rap Upgrade Project. The early stages of the project will see the contractor mobilize equipment and workers to the area. During the month of August 2016 our contractor will start with road maintenance on the Utah and Table Forest Service Roads (FSRs) and construction on the spur road access to the Sand Flat quarry site, west of the dam. Improvements including road widening, ditching and possible culvert repairs will then be made. Quarry operations and trucking are expected to start shortly after.

Please be aware that traffic on the Utah and Table FSRs will see intermittent stoppages with flag person control. Please respect all speed limits in construction zones and obey traffic control personnel.

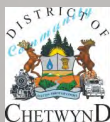

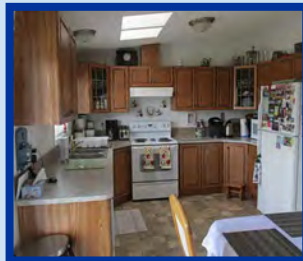
