UTILITY BILLING CHANGES

Did you know that Council recently adopted Bylaw No. 958, 2025, which updates the way the District processes utility bills, starting with this upcoming cycle.

Summary of residential changes based on Bylaw No. 958, 2025:

- Slight price increases:
 - Residential Water from \$250 to \$280 annually
 - Residential Sewer from \$207 to \$230 annually
- Quick pay discounts have been removed.
- Utilities are now due 60 days from invoice date
- Late payment penalty of 10% will be added after due date (Water & Sewer only)

As we have shot by the midpoint of 2025 and are well into the second half of the year, I can't help but feel like this year is passing by at a record speed. Very shortly we will be gearing up to head down to Victoria to participate in the annual Union of BC Municipalities Conference and AGM (UBCM), where we will meet with numerous Ministers and Ministry Staff, many of whom are still very new to their appointments. Once there we will continue to advocate for our community as we always do. We are continuing to argue our case for greater capacity and a more equitable arrangement for Hudson's Hope with regard to the Payment in Lieu of Taxes we receive from BC Hydro, and we are meeting to discuss healthcare, childcare, transportation and several other issues central to the wellbeing of our community and its residents.

I am almost ashamed to admit that this will be my first time at the Victoria Legislature on Council business. While there we will also be looking forward to defending our resolutions, both those that we have put forward as a region as well as the resolution presented by Hudson's Hope individually that have been accepted to go forward for consideration at UBCM. Hudson's Hope provided a resolution on Library funding which was endorsed without opposition at the recent North Central Local Government Association AGM (NCLGA) and we are hopeful that it will garner attention at UBCM. Our Library is a well-used and much-loved center of activity in our community, as libraries are in many communities throughout the province.

Thanks to the dedicated efforts of the District of Hudson's Hope staff, we were able to open our swimming pool shortly after the Canada Day celebrations. Each year, our team assesses the condition of the pool liner and performs necessary repairs. However, with the pool now over 20 years old, it requires more than just routine patching—it needs significant repairs to both the liner and the underlying piping and mechanical systems. Despite these challenges, staff managed to make essential fixes, effectively limiting water loss and maintaining safe chlorine levels. While these measures are not a permanent fix, they allow us to keep the pool operating for the season as we await specialized contractors to conduct more extensive repairs and install a new liner.

It was wonderful to see so many of our community join us at the Canada Day celebration this year, and so many from the region as well! While I didn't have the opportunity to be as socially available as usual, it was a pleasure to see so many familiar faces and make many new acquaintances at the same time! I sincerely hope that we can keep growing our community events and welcome even more guests in the years to come!







Monthly Police Report



Hudson's Hope RCMP Monthly Police Report

The Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 37 calls for service between June 18th and July 25th. 31 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates for various motor vehicle related offences. Highway and road safety continues to be a focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP.

On June 18th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of an online fraud in which an individual responded to an online add for a job with AWR Digital and invested money as the ad stated that they would receive a commission and bonus. This monetary account grew in value and upon trying to withdraw some of the money, they were advised that they would have to pay a fee. Upon paying said fee, they were then asked for a secondary fee which at this point, the individual reported this company as a fraud. As the monies were transferred via crypto and the company used an encrypted communication platform, the company was unable to be identified, and the monies are now lost.

If anyone comes across and/or communicates with an online platform like the one noted above, please use extreme caution in confirming legitimacy prior to forwarding any money and report all fraudulent communications, numbers, websites, etc. to the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre: www.antifraudcentre.ca and 1-888-495-8501

On July 3rd, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of an individual who had been bitten by a dog along Kruger St. It was reported that the non-confined dog approached in a friendly manner but then bit the individual twice. This matter was forwarded to the local Animal Control and Bylaws Officer for further investigations.

On July 7th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a report of an individual uttering threats with a firearm and assault along Beryl Prairie Rd. Police investigated both offences and based on evidence gathered, police arrested and charged two individuals, one for uttering threats and the other for assault with a weapon. This matter is before the courts.

On July 8th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a report of a mischief to a vehicle along Beryl Prairie Rd. It was reported that a commercial logging truck had exterior electrical cords cut, windshield damaged, and a screw was put into one of the tires. No suspects were observed.

On July 10th, Hudson's Hope RCMP conducted a roadside stop with a vehicle along Hwy 29 for minor traffic infractions. Upon conducting an investigation, police observed a quantity of illicit tobacco within the vehicle, in which the driver was arrested for. Upon a search incidental to arrest, police further located a vial of testosterone enanthate on the driver. A further search of

the vehicle yielded a vial of psilocybin and a greater volume of illicit tobacco. All items were seized by police for destruction.

On July 14th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a break & enter to a residence along Dudley Dr. It was reported that someone gained access to the residence via unlocked doors and had unplugged freezers and a motion-sensor light. No items were noted to have been stolen. The homeowner was advised to lock doors and to look into setting up security cameras. Time of the break & enter is believed to be somewhere between July 12th to 13th.

On July 18th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a break & enter to a residence along Beattie Dr which occurred on July 13th. It was reported that the homeowner was away at the time but later observed via video surveillance cameras, an unknown male climbing onto the roof of their workshop and gained access to the residence via a window. It was reported that numerous drawers were opened within but as-to-date, no items have been noted as stolen. Photos of the suspect were posted on the BC RCMP website and local social media pages.

On July 21st, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a break & enter to a residence along Beattie Dr. which is believed to have occurred on July 13th. It was reported that someone gained access to a mechanical room of the residence via an unlocked door. No items are noted to have been stolen but cords to the boiler and internet cords had been unplugged. A Stihl chainsaw was found on the property and did not belong to the homeowner nor occupants of the residence.

Based on the above noted break & enter incidents, and the fact that access to the residences was gained via unlocked doors and windows, police are advising residents that when you are away for any period of time, to verify that your doors and windows are locked at all times. Though we live in a small quaint community, criminals do come through town quite often and look for any easy opportunities. The use of security cameras and/or trail cams greatly assists police in attempting to identify the suspects which can lead to charges if identification is made. Also, police recommend that any hot ticket items such as ATV's, dirt bikes, tools, items that are easy to grab and of value, be stored out of sight and/or locked up.

ED SYKES November 23, 1941 - June 22, 2025




