MAYOR'S CORNER

I want to provide an update on an issue of significant local importance. Highway 29. As everyone who has taken a drive from Hudson's Hope to Fort St John at any time in the last several decades will know, the highway has always been subject to some amount of movement, especially at the Halfway Hill, requiring constant maintenance and often creating hazards and delays.

Your Council reached out to the Minister of Transportation and Transit (MOTT) for a meeting during UBCM this past September, however the meeting was declined by the Minister and the Minister's staff. Since UBCM we have made efforts to reach out to the Minister and remind them of the importance of this highway, for public transportation, safety and the contribution by industry to the local and provincial economies. The loss of this critical arterial highway would have far reaching impacts for everyone in the region.

We have since met with local representatives from MOTT for an update on the highway, and to reiterate our concerns. I have committed to meeting regularly with local representatives, as well as continuing to lobby the Minister through both local and regional voices. While there is not a plan at present to permanently address the condition of the highway, we are looking forward to building a relationship with local ministry staff and ensuring your concerns are heard.

While we work to find a long-term solution to the condition of Highway 29 we would like to remind everyone that if you experience issues with the road condition, do not hesitate to reach out directly to the road contractor, Dawson Road Maintenance. They have a 24-hour hotline, and your concerns will be recorded and formally reported. These road reports are helpful in building a business case for action and funding. And as always, for immediate life safety concerns or incidents please contact 911.

I hope everyone has a happy and fulfilling Holiday Season. Wherever you are travelling to, be safe. If you are staying in the community over the holidays, then I look forward to seeing you at one of the many holiday events in our community!

Finally, thank you to everyone who participated in this year's Parade, and congratulations to our winners!

- Full main replacement planned in near future

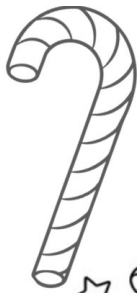
Kendrick Lift Station

Protective Services

New Rescue Truck Added to Our Fleet

The District of Hudson's Hope Fire Department has acquired a 2010 Spartan/SVI rescue truck from the Municipality of Saanich. This unit lets us carry all our rescue equipment in one vehicle instead of three, improving efficiency and response time.

It includes a breathing air compressor with onboard storage bottles, powered by a 40,000-watt generator that can also run our rescue tools. The truck came with a full matching set of extrication tools, giving us reliable spares when needed.

For scene operations, it features extensive lighting, including a 7-foot light tower with six heads, plus four rope-rescue anchor points and two winch anchor points.

With added storage, rooftop compartments, and seating for five with a workstation in the rear of the cab, this truck replaces our older rescue unit and greatly enhances our emergency response capabilities.

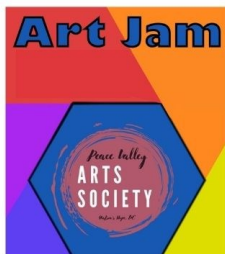

Public notice

Westcoast Energy Limited Partnership (Westcoast) plans to conduct controlled burning in various locations within its powerline right-of-way from Compressor Station N5 (CS-N5) in Mackie Creek to southwest of Hudson's Hope, BC (please refer to map).

This activity is needed to complete the removal of woody debris following vegetation clearing for powerline construction as part of the Aspen Point Program, an expansion of the Westcoast natural gas pipeline system. Burning will be completed in compliance with all applicable regulations.

This activity will occur from November 5 to December 18, 2025. During this period, the public may notice increased smoke.

We appreciate your patience as we complete this essential work.



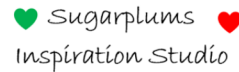

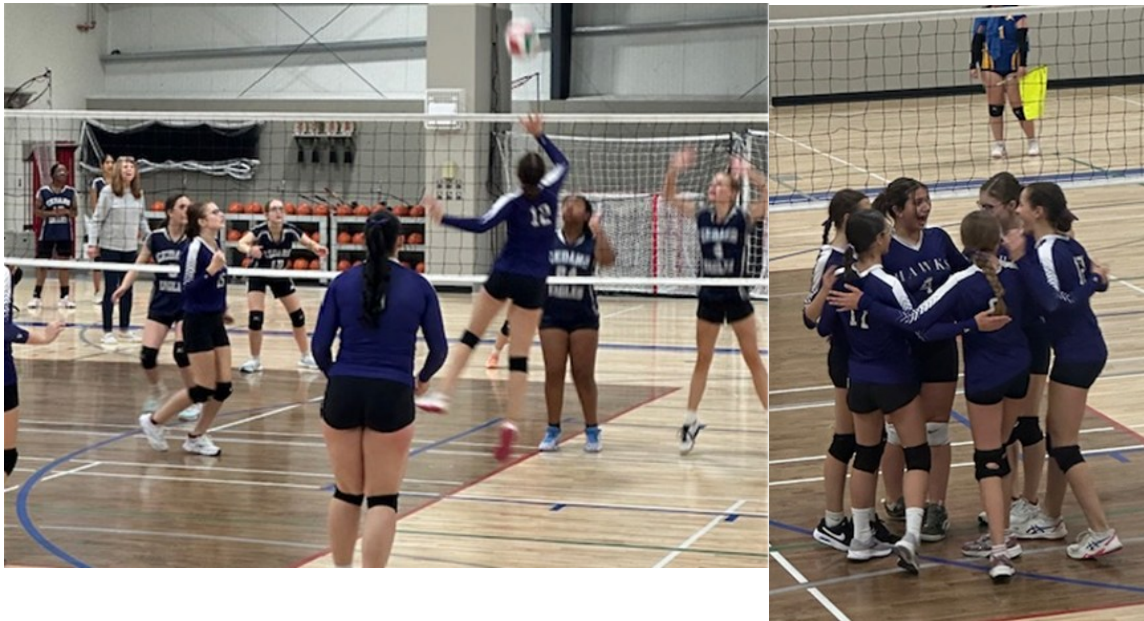

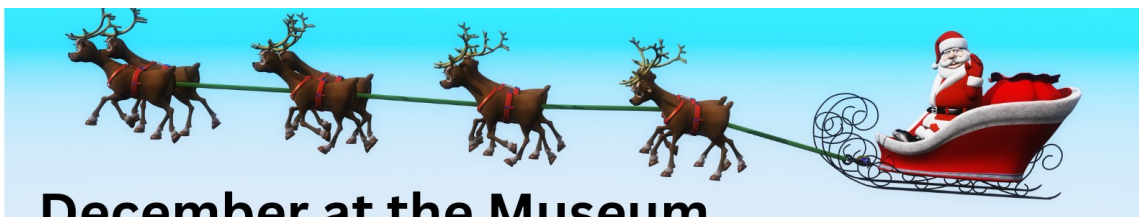

Monthly Police Report



Hudson's Hope RCMP Monthly Police Report

The Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 35 calls for service between October 21 to November 21. Halloween passed with no major shenanigans disrupting the community.

On October 22 police attended a local business for what initially sounded like a serious call, a glass break alarm indicating a break and enter in progress. Police attended and found the alarm to be false. On November 11 police responded to another false alarm at the Health Center. This is always the best case scenario when responding to alarms.

On November 3rd a report of numerous missing firearms and a vehicle was filed. They had been at a property that has had a high turnover of residents and visitors over the past few years, but no permanent resident. The firearms have been added to police databases. If you have possession or any knowledge of these missing firearms, please contact the Hudson's Hope RCMP.

On November 6, a passer-by reported seeing a deer in the ditch that had been struck by a vehicle the previous night, and had not moved. Police attended and found the deer to still be alive, but gravely injured. Police did the humane thing and ended the deer's suffering.

On November 7, police received a report of minors in possession of vape products. Subsequent investigation found that numerous youths have been found in possession of vape products. Local businesses that sell these products were spoken to by police and reminded to enforce obtaining proper identification before selling such products. It is unknown where these products were obtained, no statements were made naming where they were obtained and may even be acquired outside of Hudson's Hope.

On November 10, emergency services attended a single vehicle collision on Hwy 29 south of Hudson's Hope. The driver stated they had been travelling to Chetwynd when he lost control of the vehicle on the icy road. The vehicle had crossed the highway, gone into the ditch and bounced back out, partially onto the road. None of the four occupants sustained any injuries.

On November 11, police were called to assist the ambulance crew with a patient who was becoming unruly in the back of the ambulance while being transported to Chetwynd hospital. Hudson's Hope Fire Department arrived on scene and assisted BCAS during the remainder of the transport.

On November 13, a female reported being assaulted at a residence of a friend. A verbal dispute escalated to a physical confrontation. Investigation is ongoing.

On November 14 a male was involved in a single vehicle collision on Hwy 29 near Farrell Creek Rd. He was extracted from the vehicle by Fire Rescue crews and transported to hospital in Fort St John. It is unknown how long the vehicle was in the ditch prior to emergency services being notified.

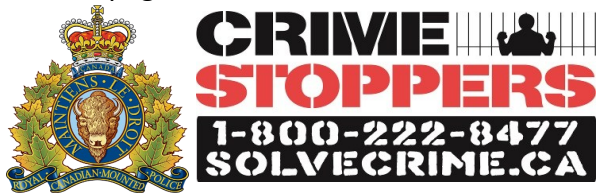
On November 15 a wallet was turned into the Hudson's Hope RCMP detachment. The wallet had been left at the front door of the detachment, unattended. The wallet was returned to the grateful owner. If you find a wallet or other valuable items that you wish to turn in to the RCMP, please do not leave it unattended as other nefarious characters may find it before police do. Wallets can also be turned into the post office or dropped into a mailbox.

Police are dealing with an ongoing landlord/tenant issue. Although this is technically a private civil issue, police are attending to ensure things do not escalate to violence or property damage and to ensure things remain fair and civil.

Throughout the month, several suspicious vehicles were reported to the RCMP. One vehicle was seen driving slowly through a residential area, braking often. Investigation showed they were looking for a lost car. Another was seen prowling around the laydown yard on Beryl Prairie Rd; it departed prior to police arrival. A third was reported parked at the school for over an hour prior to school hours; investigation revealed it was a tired traveler getting a little nap during his long journey.

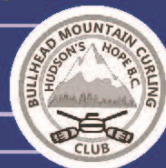




2026 Budget Update – We are completing 3-year grant cycle that was the primary funder for all newer programming, increased staff hours & more. We are expecting reductions across our 2026 budget, affecting all library service areas. The Library Board will review the proposed budget at our next Library Board meeting on December 3rd at 7:00 pm, discussion to revise any of the budget cuts and to accept the terms of our updated Library Service Agreement will be In Camera. We are seeking additional funding sources to maintain or restore services, we expect some changes to begin in January 2026, and others to commence in the summer and fall.

Purdy's Chocolate – Thank you for supporting our fundraiser through online orders and for purchasing items on sale at the library right now! Once all items are sold, we will have earned nearly \$2000! We passed the \$5000 goal which gave us a bit more revenue from our campaign sales!

Pro-D Camp Funding Request – Recently, we sent out a sponsor letter campaign to support library camps for kids in Kindergarten to Grade 4. This is our most costly program, as it runs all day on non-instructional days and needs staffing of at least three and up to 5! We will be seeking a minimum sponsorship of \$500 to run the camp for 12 children and \$1000 to run a camp for up to 16. The \$1000 sponsorship will allow us to have full staffing to accommodate field trips! The cost of the field trips would be yet another level of sponsorship to cover expenses, such as booking a bus to go swimming out of town or to a gymnastics camp. Sponsorships can be shared between companies and private donors. Camps will run once 100% of the donations for each camp are received. 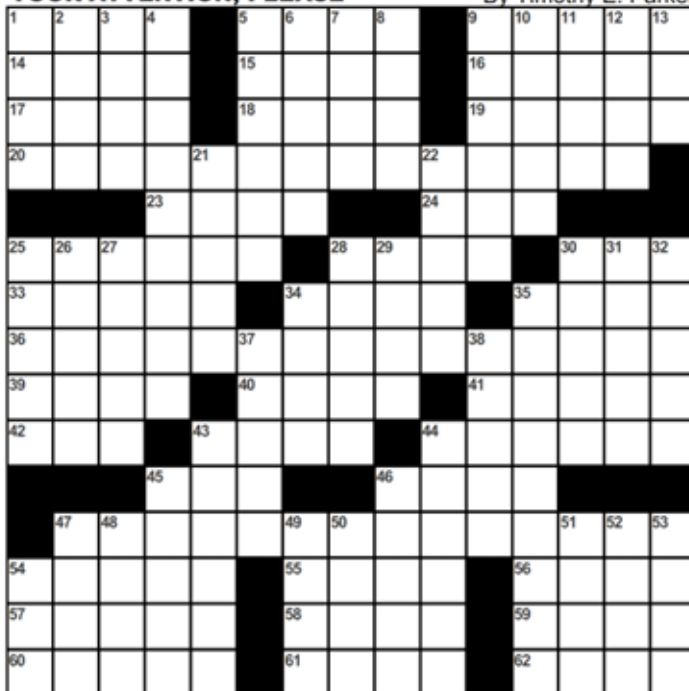

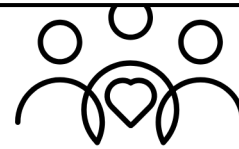
