The Financial Assistance Grant Policy is available on the District of Hudson's Hope Website.

Everyone should have received their 2026 property assessment notices in the mail in January. If you have questions or concerns about your annual property assessments reach out to BC Assessment as soon as possible, as the deadline for appeal is February 2nd. If you did not receive your assessment notice in time due to circumstances outside your control you may be able to apply for a late appeal. Your assessment is the primary source of information used by the District of Hudson's Hope for taxation purposes.

As winter gradually moves into spring we will be working diligently on completing the 2026 budget for the District of Hudson's Hope, as well as continuing the public engagement process for the Multi Use Gathering Center, and planning for the ongoing work on our Water Treatment Plant. There is much on the go, and as always we will do our best to keep the community informed and engaged as we move forward.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE GRANTS



Council is now accepting applications from non-profit clubs and organizations requesting funding assistance in 2026. The deadline for submission is February 16, 2026.

1. The primary purpose of Financial Assistance Grant is to assist the organization for a specific capital project or local event that benefits the residents of the District of Hudson's Hope;
2. The financial assistance includes donation of time, facilities and District inventory (tables, chairs, etc.);
3. Grants will not be provided for travel expenses;
4. The applicant organization must be registered as a Society in either the Province of British Columbia and/or Canada, and includes organizations that belong to a parent Society in Canada; and
5. Upon completion of the project, the applicant must submit a final report to the District outlining how funds were expended.

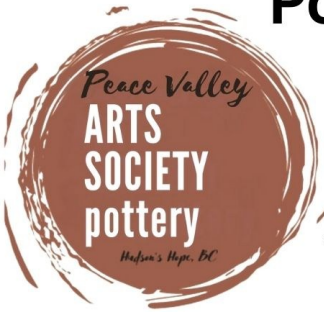

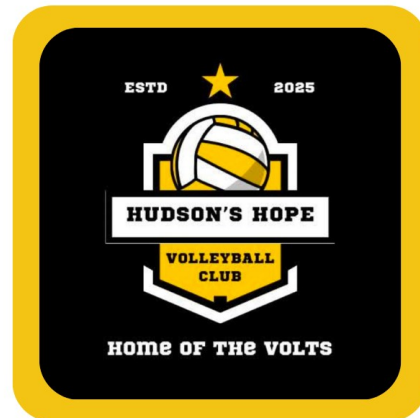

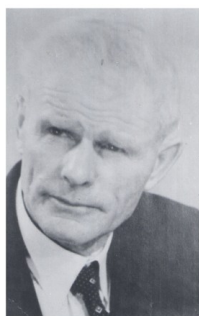


February at the Museum

The Hudson's Hope Historical Society welcomes all new residents and those here for employment to Hudson's Hope. Our community and surrounding areas are rich in history. We are happy to share that history with you.

“Adams Creek”

Adams Creek; name was officially adopted in October of 1945. Previously also known as “Burnt Creek”, Adams Creek gets its name from Jack and Lucille Adams. The year was 1913 when Jack and new bride Lucille, came to Finlay Forks from California. Here Jack prospected and trapped. In 1924, with now 2 children, Jack pre-empted Lot No. 329 at the mouth of what is now called Adams Creek. It is here that they built a large split level log cabin known for its massive stone fireplace. This was also the site of the very first “Gold Bar” post office to which Jack was the postmaster. They were here until 1927 at which time they moved away from the area. Mrs. Lucille Adams was in her 80's when BC Hydro took up the land for the WAC Bennett Dam. Their homestead is now under the waters of Williston Lake.

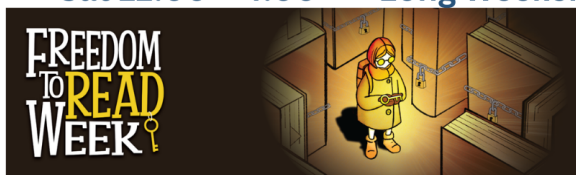

Library cards are also free for local patrons, and only a \$25 deposit for temporary cards!

Purdy's Chocolate – Please support our library programs by purchasing some of our remaining Purdy's chocolates ! There are still 14 items left!

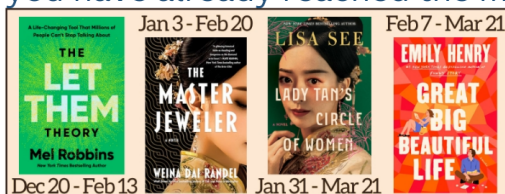

Check it out, read it, & discuss it with other club members, participating staff, or anyone you'd like! 5 copies of each, get in early to get your copy!




Monthly Police Report



Hudson's Hope RCMP Monthly Police Report

The Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 33 calls for service between December 22 to January 21.

On December 24, a tank truck loaded with produced water failed to stop at the stop sign at the bottom of Ferrell Creek Rd at Hwy 29. The hill and intersection had not yet been sanded at the time. The tractor trailer crossed the highway and came to a stop in the opposite ditch. The trailer rolled onto its side, the truck remained rubber down. No spillage was noted from the tanker.

Beginning on Jan 3, police were involved in a lengthy game of hide-and-seek with a three legged ungulate of interest (UOI) in the Jamieson neighbourhood. Police were searching for the UOI to conduct a wellbeing check after reports it was injured. The public was extremely helpful, calling in tips and sightings of the UOI over a period of several days. Nobody was reported to be harbouring her from police. Some reports included allegations the UOI had been stealing feed from birdfeeders. Eventually it was determined that the UOI did not require medical intervention based on its increasingly nimble getaways.

Scammers did not take a break during the holiday season. Police received a report of a "Telus Scam" which cost the victim over \$1800. The scammer used the guise of correcting a Telus bill. A reminder to all, if you are contacted by any company or person asking for money, tell them you will phone them back once you have confirmed if you owe money. DO NOT believe threats of jail or further penalty if you do not pay ASAP. DO call the number on the back of your bank/credit card or on your bill and not a number provided by the caller or on your caller ID.

Police received a report of a vehicle passing a school bus on Beryl Prairie Road while the flashing red lights were activated. The fine for this offence is \$368 and 3 points on your driving record. Drivers: please use caution around school busses! If you can't remember that red lights mean STOP, please consider re-doing your driving test. Parents: remind your children not to assume that traffic will stop for the red lights on the school bus. *Stop, look, listen, before you cross the street. Use your eyes. Use your ears. Then you use your feet.*

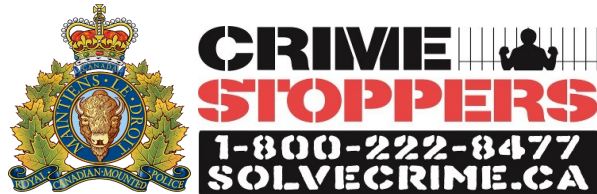
Police were requested to complete a couple of wellbeing checks and are happy to

report that both people were found to be safe and healthy.

Police also responded to numerous issues between landlords and people living on their properties. In order for police to have the authority to assist in these situations, landlords must follow the framework set out in the Residential Tenancy Act (RTA) available online. This includes tenancy agreements, the rights of both the tenant and the landlord, and a process for dispute resolution. If the required paperwork is not in place prior to allowing a tenant onto the property, it can be very difficult for police to assist in removing them.

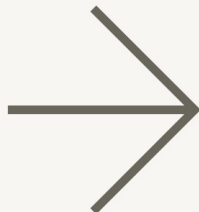

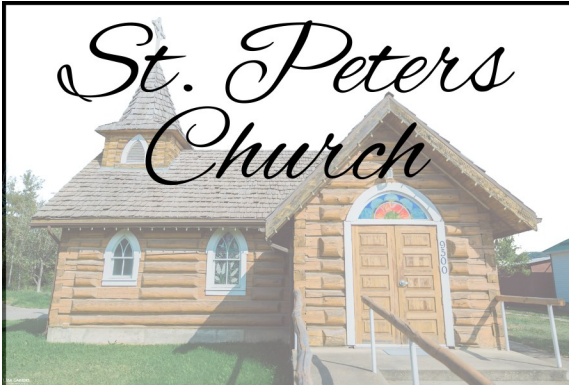
