



The company's servant could not read, and it would never do for Davis to admit that he could not either. With a great show of learning, Davis studied the note. The only character in it which he could identify was the figure '2'

In that land on the lonely frontier letter-writing was a rare occurrence. Consequently, thought Davis, if his friend had written him, it must be on a matter of grave importance. Davis concluded that he was ill. If he were ill, there was one unfailing remedy for illness and snake-bite. So Davis went to his stock and wrapped up two bottles of his best whisky and sent them along to the Hudson's Bay post with his condolences, glad to be able to help even a rival when he was in need.

When his companions returned Davis told them of their rival's illness and showed them the note. When he learned that the note was only a trivial New Year's greeting with and invitation to supper he was indignant. To his partner's chaffing he replied lamely: It was that darned 2 set me wrong."

## **Protective Services**

### Canada Sun Guide

When you get a sunburn, the long-term effects of skin injured by the sun can be very serious. The more time young people spend unprotected in the sun, the higher their risk for developing skin cancer later in life. Dermatologists describe a burn as being the skin cells' response to injury. Getting a tan also injures skin cells. When skin cells are damaged skin cancer can result from these irreparable cell mutations.

Outdoor physical activity can be healthy, fun and safe if you remain protected. Follow the *Canada Sun Guide*, created by Canada Safety Council and other partners, to help Canadians combine sun safety with outdoor activities.

### **Minimize Sun Exposure**

- Schedule outdoor physical activities when UV rays are at their weakest—before 11am and after 4pm, especially between the months of April and October.
- Always keep children under the age of one out of the sun.
- Remember that skin doesn't have to be hot to burn, so don't be fooled by cloudy or overcast weather.
- Remember too that water, snow, sand and concrete can reflect and increase the sun's burning rays.

### **Seek and Create Shade**

- Seek natural shade from trees and buildings.
- Plant trees in schoolyards and other play areas.
- Use shade umbrellas, or create other forms of shade if natural shade is not possible.
- Keep playpens, strollers and carriages in shaded areas.

#### Cover Up

- Cover children's heads, necks and ears with a broad brimmed hat when outdoors.
- Protect arms and legs with tightly woven, loose fitting, cotton clothing.
- Children should wear a T-shirt over their bathing suit, and long shorts instead of short shorts.
- Wear UVA/UVB protective sunglasses—children can wear them too.

### **Use Sunscreen**

- Have children use a broad spectrum sunscreen (protects against both UVA and UVB rays) with an SPF of 15 or more.
- Apply sunscreen generously before all outdoor physical activities such as swimming, skateboarding, biking or even walking. Remember to apply at least 20 minutes before sun exposure. Reapply often, as perspiration will reduce the effectiveness.

### BioBlitz 2015:

During the last week of June, thirty-odd scientists from across western Canada descended on Hudson's Hope and spent their time collecting and cataloguing animal and plant life in the Peace Valley. It was organized by the Biological Survey of Canada, (BSC), a not-forprofit organization that helps coordinate scientific research across the country. For over 30 years, the BSC has been discovering, synthesizing, and sharing knowledge about Canada's biological diversity. It has produced 15 major books, numerous briefs, papers, newsletters, and workshops.

Dr David Langor, president of the Biological Survey of Canada, said he expected some rare and perhaps

previously un-described species of insects and plants would be found. What they found won't be known for sometime, though, as specimens not readily recognized have to be taken back to the labs for examination under a microscope and identified through technical references.

There was a good turnout for the Wednesday Open House. Participants were able to talk to the scientists about their work and check out some of the species collected at stations set up around the Pearkes Center gym. A presentation by Tom Long, a photographer who has spent years recording the unique features of Pink Mountain, rounded out the evening. Did you know that tourists and scientists travel all the way from Japan to see the rare sub-species of butterfly that lives only at the top of Pink Mountain?

### **Natural Gas Development:**

Some of the natural gas companies have adopted a policy of requiring all workers, to live in camp rather than in nearby communities. That applies to all workers, whether company employees or contractors. It also applies to pipeline workers. One company has purchased the Pink Mountain Airport, which will make it easier to fly their employees in and out for their shift rotation. These policies by-pass the local communities near the resource activity.

This is disappointing because it means that local people who have invested time and capital in anticipation of providing services for LNG developments have fewer opportunities. I've written a letter regarding the issue and I encourage those affected to contact their MLA and MP.

### **Lynx / Brenot Creek Water Update:**

Nobody wants to "own" the issue of heavy metal contamination that showed up last year in Lynx/Brenot Creeks.

### Background:

Sept 10, 2014 - Hudson's Hope put out a PSA advising people not to use the water in Lynx Creek until further notice, due to a private test which showed levels of heavy metals above Canadian guidelines.

Sept 18, 2014 - Northern Health put out a "Media Advisory" in which they advised people not to use the water from Brenot or Lynx Creek downstream of a slide which was the origin of the heavy metals.

Winter 14/15 - I called the Ministries of Forest, Lands and Natural Resources (FLNRO) and Environment (MoE) to see what next steps were. The answer, basically, is "none." They wrote and filed a report. I got a report from the Oil & Gas Commission hydrologist who said the investigation was being led by

Northern Health. He suggested further testing should be done once the spring runoff was finished. Northern Health say they have no budget to do further investigation.

It appears that Hudson's Hope is on its own. There apparently has been more movement at the Brenot Creek slide since last fall and the soil from high on the bank is still being carried into the creek. I've contacted the hydrologist who did sampling and testing for us from last year, to find out what the tests would be priorities. Council then has a basis on which to consider where to go from here.

## Police Report: June 2015



Over the last month, Hudson's Hope RCMP Detachment responded to approximately 45 calls for service.

Some incidents of note during the month are as follows:

On May 29<sup>th</sup>, report of mischief at the local Hudson's Hope landfill of two smashed panes of glass from the attendant shed. That was the second time someone had caused mischief that week as earlier the side window had been broken, a metal rod was pushed through the recycling trailer, and a pushed over porta potty. It was destructive and senseless damage.

On May 30<sup>th</sup>, a third report of mischief at the Hudson's Hope landfill site that week. This time someone had pried the padlock latch off the door to the attendant shed and gone through the building.

On May 31<sup>st</sup>, report of a single vehicle rollover on Highway #29 near Hudson's Hope and the s-curves near Lynx creek. BC Ambulance and Hudson's Hope Road Rescue were also dispatched. The vehicle was headed northbound on Hwy #29 and failed to negotiate the sharp left turn, landing on the roof in the ditch. No serious injuries.

On June 3<sup>rd</sup>, BC Ambulance requested assistance from the RCMP with an unconscious male found on the side of the road on Hwy #29 near Powell Road. The male was conscious on police arrival, but then lost consciousness again. Queries on the police system found he was a suspect for a serious crime within the previous 24 hours in Chetwynd. Chetwynd RCMP were advised of the findings and attended the Hospital to arrest on arrival, once he received medical treatment.

On June 11<sup>th</sup>, Hudson's Hope RCMP were dispatched to a report of a female being crushed by a fallen tree in her tent at the approximate 17km marker on the Johnson Creek Forest Service Road. The subject had minor injuries and was treated by BC Ambulance and Hudson's Hope Fire rescue.

On June 18<sup>th</sup>, a complainant dropped off a seismic explosive located when the company was digging a pipeline pathway in the Core Road area. Two members of the RCMP Explosives Disposal Unit, in the Lower Mainland, flew to Hudson's Hope and successfully destroyed the seismic explosive with a controlled detonation. Hudson's Hope RCMP advice the public to leave any suspected explosives in place and the RCMP will attend the area, versus having risk themselves or other public by trying to bring it to the detachment which does not have the appropriate storage facilities for explosives.

Back in April, a local complainant reported a large sword had been taken from an insecure deck storage area on MacDougal Street. The sword went missing sometime over the month of March. The sword was approximately 3 1/2 feet long, Masonic in style (knight), in a brown leather holder with a flap closure. The

handle was beige with scrolling and had a chain. The complainant requested this item be added to the Bulletin in hopes of its recovery.

Traffic volumes continue to increase as the busy summer season approaches. Police will be conducting additional enforcement for speed, seatbelts, and distracted driving (cell phone use). Speeding fines start at \$138 and go as high as \$483, and anyone more than 45 km over the posted speed limit will have their vehicle impounded for 7 days, incurring tow and storage fees. Seatbelts and distracted driving fines are \$167.

Cst. Grant Bernier and his family are departing Hudson's Hope after living and working in the community for the last 4 years. They will be greatly missed by the RCMP community as well as the Hudson's Hope Community. The Bernier's were heavily involved in the community, from the Rod and Gun Club, schools, DARE teacher, minor hockey, softball, band member, fundraisers, social butterfly, etc, etc, etc. They are leaving with good memories, and are wished the best in their new journey. Thank you for your years of service.

In December 2014, the Site C project received approval from the provincial government to proceed to construction.


