Claim your Home Owners Grant Online

The District of Hudson's Hope has implemented eHOG this tax season. Home owners can claim their Home Owners Grant online.

Easy steps to claiming your HOG online:

1. On the Hudson's Hope web page go to <http://hudsonshope.ca/residents/tax-information/home-owner-grant/>
2. Click on the picture—claim the home owner grant online
3. Enter your Roll number and password from your tax form
4. Click on Apply Now
5. Pick which applies to you regular HOG or Additional HOG over 65
6. Fill in all the information and check the boxes. Click on Apply.
7. Confirmation that your application has been sent will appear and you can print a copy for your files.

Museum News: We are hoping to repaint the outside of the museum with help from board members and summer staff. The summer students will continue to accession and research artifacts' and work on displays. We are also going ahead with the expansion project this summer! Back in 2008, Olive Powell donated her family's extensive trophy Collection to the Hudson's Hope Museum. With the assistance of Northern Guides, the majority of the trophies are in storage until the museum can create suitable display space. In the fall of 2013, the museum received a donation from the Rutledge family of a well preserved log building located on the Rutledge farm. It has the potential to solve many of the Hudson's Hope Historical Society's storage and display needs. Currently the plan is to move the building, build a basement, and then renovate the structure at our museum site. The Rutledge Heritage Building will be an ideal venue to tell the story of Hudson's Hope and history of Outfitters in the north. We are looking forward to telling it. If you would like more information on the Expansion or would like to volunteer with the Museum, please contact us.

The project requires short sections of the downstream (south) lane to be closed off with traffic barriers and posted signage for the grouting work. Traffic will be single lane, intermittently, through the work area for the duration of the project.

Geocaching in Hudson's Hope

The District has been working with many dedicated geocaching community partners to help make our region an amazing place to come geocaching. We have approximately 16 new geocaches that are being launched for **July 1st!**

Come enjoy the Canada Day Celebrations with us at the Pool Park and then head out for the afternoon to see how many NEW geocaches you can find in Hudson's Hope. Go onto www.geocaching.com the day before and get the coordinators for the geocaches you are planning to find.

What is geocaching?

Geocaching is a real-world, outdoor treasure hunting game using GPS-enabled devices. Participants navigate to a specific set of GPS coordinates and then attempt to find the geocache (container) hidden at that location.

How is the game played?

At its simplest level, geocaching requires these 8 steps:

1. Register for a free [Basic Membership](#).
2. Visit the "[Hide & Seek a Cache](#)" page.
3. Enter your postal code and click "search."
4. Choose any geocache from the list and click on its name
5. Enter the coordinates of the geocache into your GPS Device.
6. Use your GPS device to assist you in finding the hidden geocache.
7. Sign the logbook and return the geocache to its original location.
8. Share your geocaching stories and photos online.

Water Smart® Advice for Parents

Drownings are preventable

Drownings involving toddlers can be prevented if parents or caregivers are within arms' reach of their children when they are near water.

Designate a backyard pool lifeguard. An adult should always supervise whenever children are using a pool -- in-ground, above ground or wading pool. If you must be absent for a moment, designate another adult to replace you or close the pool until someone can assume supervisory duties.

Stay tub-side until all the water is drained and you have removed your children from the tub. Most bathtub drownings occur because youngsters were left alone for "just a moment".

Drain bathtubs when they are not in use. Empty unattended wading pools and buckets of water and turn them over. Put a life-jacket on children who can't swim when they're in a boat or at the beach or pool.

Be vigilant. Many children who drown do so because parents or caregivers lose sight of them for a very short period of time.

Drowning is a silent killer

Drowning victims rarely call or wave or signal for help because they can't keep their head or arms above water. Even when they manage to get their head above water, getting a breath (not calling for help) is their priority.

Drowning can happen in seconds

Drowning can take as little as 10 seconds and occurs in just inches of water...in bathtubs, wading pools, and wells, even buckets. Never leave a child alone near the water. Don't be distracted by a ringing phone, a doorbell or another child.

Drowning is a big problem in Canada

Almost 500 Canadians drown each year, and children under 5 are at high-risk. In fact, drowning is the second leading cause of preventable death for children under 10 years of age.

Most toddlers drown in backyard pools.

Their natural curiosity combined with an almost magnetic attraction to water means toddlers have a high risk of drowning anytime they are near water – natural or man-made.

Fair Share:

As I mentioned last month, "Fair Share" is a tax replacement program through which communities receive funds from the province to replace money they could have collected in industrial taxes if the industry were located inside the municipality. The existing agreement was to have run until 2020 but the Province determined that it should be opened this year and allowed only 6 weeks to conclude a new agreement. It's called a negotiated agreement but in reality the Province has the power.

The new agreement runs from now until 2035. For each of the next four years, \$50 million will come into the region via Fair Share. For each year after that, the amount will increase by 2%. Distribution is done according to a formula that only a mathematician could love. Fort St John receives by far the largest share at just under 50%; Hudson's Hope gets by far the smallest, at 1.35%.

We tried to get the Hudson's Hope share increased, using the argument that in the 1990's, when the program began, Hudson's Hope had very few residents who made their living in the gas fields. This has changed and now, the number is more like 150, all dependent on industry located outside our boundaries. That's the situation Fair Share was set up to address. In addition, much of the subsurface rights

north of us is owned by Petronus, the company said to be most likely to proceed with LNG development, which would result in more gas field workers. However, despite what seemed to us to be a very reasoned argument, we were unsuccessful. So Hudson's Hope will continue to receive just 1.35 % of Fair Share.

Site C:

Hudson's Hope's position on Site C is that it should be referred to the BC Utilities Commission (BCUC) for oversight and scrutiny. We are not alone: the Environmental Assessment Joint Review Panel recommended it, the past and present executive directors of the Association of Major Power Customers (eg: pulp mills, mines, etc.) agree, as does the Peace River Regional Districts and several other organizations.

On Tuesday, May 26th, noteworthy energy economist Robert McCullough laid out why referral to the BCUC makes sense. His report shows that the cheapest new generation is natural gas; second cheapest is a combination of wind and solar backed up by natural gas generation for emergency backup and peak supply. That's what most jurisdictions in North America are doing. McCullough's report further vindicates Hudson's Hope's position.

Pipelines:

If you are confused about what pipelines are going where, you aren't alone. From what I've been able to track down, here's the summary:

Trans-Canada Prince Rupert Gas Transmission:

Proposed. Would carry gas from just north of our border, to Prince Rupert. Follows the present corridor through the municipality, crossing the river between Peace Canyon and the bridge, underground. Customer is Petronas/Progress to get gas to their LNG plant on the coast. 48" pipe.

Spectra:

Proposed. Would carry gas from the northern gas fields to the coast. Has similar line through the municipality, as the one above, but east of the Beryl Prairie Road. Not as far along as Prince Rupert one. Customer is Shell and its associates. 48" pipe.

Trans Canada North Montney Mainline Extension:

That's the three red pipes on those

yellow trucks that have been going through town up to the laydown yard on Drew Road in Beryl Prairie. It's not within the municipality. It starts in the Farrell Creek gas field to the east of us, crossing the river near the mouth of Farrell Creek. 42" pipe.

Progress Cypress Completion:

Under construction now. A gathering line with three pipes in the same trench: one gas line and two water lines. Not in our municipality. As far as I could tell from the description coming out of Calgary, it starts near the Half-way River and comes south to connect to the plant just north of our boundary.

Police Report: May 2015



Over the last month, Hudson's Hope RCMP Detachment responded to approximately 50 calls for service. Calls have increased due to the warmer weather. The following are a few incidents of note:

May 4, Complaint received of construction supplies that had been stolen from a Construction site on Dudley Drive. Items stolen as follows: Six Sewage pipes - 3" by 20 feet - Green. Two Sewage pipes - 6" by 30 feet - Blue. Six Wooden LVL Microllam beams - 1 1/2" x 16 foot.

On May 6, Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report that a vehicle had just been stolen with a 3 year old child still inside.

Officers immediately attended the scene and obtained details as quick as possible in order to activate an Amber Alert.

Surrounding RCMP detachments in every direction possible were notified of what had occurred and immediately set up a perimeter to cover all possible routes out of Hudson's Hope while other supporting units headed to the town itself.

Local Fire Chief and working District of Hudson's Hope maintenance workers were notified and joined in the search. Within minutes numerous employees were located at different locations within the community and highway watching for the stolen vehicle.

Shortly after, the stolen vehicle was located by two District of Hudson's Hope Workers abandoned in the back alley behind a local gas station / convenience store. The child was still seat belted into the car seat, was reported to be in good spirits and no medical attention was necessary.

Due to the short distance from where the vehicle was stolen then abandoned, police believe the child was not targeted, rather the vehicle and once the suspect realized there was a child inside the vehicle it was abandoned.

This investigation is ongoing and police are requesting assistance from the public in order to help identify a possible suspect.

May 13, A Blue 1998 Ford Windstar was stolen from the old Ferry landing while the driver and another person were out fishing. The vehicle was uninsured and had no license plates on it. The keys were left in the vehicle with other personal effects. The van has not been recovered to date and the matter is still under investigation.

May 15, Canyon Drive near Twelve Mile Road, Hudson's Hope RCMP, BC Ambulance Service, and the Hudson's Hope Fire Department, attended a single vehicle collision on the Canyon Drive. The driver, from Fort St. John, refused to provide a valid breath sample, and as such was served a 90 day driving prohibition and a 30 day vehicle impoundment. Three firearms were seized from the vehicle, a 12 gauge shotgun, 16 gauge shotgun, and a colt 45 handgun. The handgun was located exposed on the backseat of extended cab truck with no trigger lock. Firearms charges are being recommended to Crown Counsel.

May 15-18, long weekend, extra members were brought in from Dawson Creek, Chetwynd, Fort St. John, and Fort Nelson, and overall it was fairly quiet. Members made a strong presence, including many proactive quad patrols, which reduced calls for service. Two impaired drivers, were located and charged for driving impaired on Friday night on Canyon Drive. One other driver was issued a 24 hour Driving Prohibition. One male was also found to be breaching conditions to abstain from the consumption of Alcohol.

May 23, RCMP were dispatched to a single vehicle collision 15kms east of Hudson's Hope on Hwy 29 near the Farrell Creek Road. A truck pulling a boat and trailer went off the road, crossing the oncoming lane of traffic and coming to rest in a ditch. Police attended and embarked on an impaired driving investigation. The driver (only occupant) displayed symptoms of alcohol consumption. The driver refused to provide a valid sample of breath into a roadside screening device. The driver was charged with an Immediate Roadside Prohibition Refusal. The charge carries a 90 day driving prohibition and a 30 day vehicle impound.

-Other miscellaneous files included multiple driving complaints (including stunting motorcycles), multiple threat files, a female was arrested on multiple outstanding warrants, thefts of a vehicle and trailer, multiple shots fired complaints, liquor act complaints, false alarms, and marijuana seized.

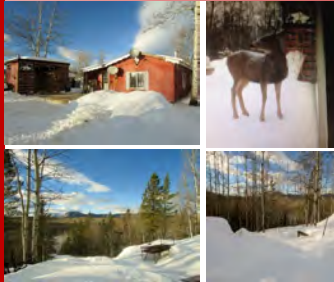

June 2015

BC Hydro is continuing to conduct environmental and engineering field studies on and around the Peace River between the Williston Reservoir and the Alberta border to inform detailed mitigation and monitoring planning. In December 2014, the Site C project received approval from the provincial government to proceed to construction.

This notice provides a list of field work planned for June 2015. Helicopters may be required for some of the work listed below. BC Hydro will obtain permits, and complete environmental management plans and archaeological assessments as required.

Current and previous field study activities are available at www.sitecproject.com/news-and-information/field-study-notice and in the Community Consultation offices in Fort St. John and in the Pearkes Centre in Hudson's Hope.

Regular and ongoing BC Hydro work may also be taking place on the Peace River and tributaries related to BC Hydro's Peace River water licence requirements or other operations work.

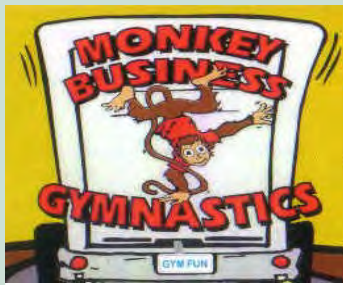
