7. Confirmation that your application has been sent will appear and you can print a copy for your files.

The commercial torch-on roof was installed approx 7 years ago, along with additional insulation - it's a 50-year roof!



## *District of Hudson's Hope*

Rain! Beautiful, beautiful rain. Yes, and snow too. Both helped enormously to get fires under control. The earth was parched, moisture is a godsend and we could stand a few more days of it.

Once again we owe an enormous thank you to our Volunteer Fire Departments, to our staff and to all those who pitched in to keep the fires away from residences and outbuildings. Although a small number of outbuildings and three turkeys were lost, no residences succumbed despite the fact that the threat to some properties this year was more immediate than in 2014, when the entire community was under evacuation order.

Evacuation Alerts and Orders are signed off and announced by the local government where the fire is located but on the advice of Wildfire BC so it's a collaborative process. Wildfire BC basically decides the general area and time when orders are appropriate based on their experience with wildfire behavior. Local governments know the geography, road system, and local conditions.

**"Days of Summer" in and around Hudson's Hope.** There's lots going on around Hudson's Hope this summer, here are some events of note:

**June 4, 5: Soccer Tournament:** Come cheer on our local Youth at the Hudson's Hope School!

**Thursday, June 9: New BC Hydro Visitors' Center:**

The new Visitors' Center is now open to the public and well-worth a visit. In addition to a number of new displays, there are lots of new items in the gift shop. A formal opening ceremony will be held June 9.

**June 17, 18 and 19: Annual BC Hydro Baseball Tournament**

**June 19: Father's Day Fishing Derby at Dinosaur Lake**

**June 24: High School Graduation Ceremony**

**July 1: Canada Day celebrations** at the Pool Park. Youth Volunteer of the Year and Volunteer of the Year will be announced.

**July 8: Opening of the Dinosaur Research Project near Carbon Creek**

As I've mentioned before in this column, a large dinosaur trackway has been discovered near Carbon Creek, west of Williston Reservoir. Rich McCrae, BC paleontologist based in Tumbler Ridge will lead a 6 to 8 week research project this summer to determine the extent of the trackway and to firmly establish its international significance.

In addition to Dr. McCrae, and his wife, Dr. Lisa Buckley, the team will consist of six visiting scientists, two from China, three from the United States, and one from the Yukon. After uncovering the trackway and securing the perimeter, they will conduct high-resolution 3D-imaging of the tracks and trackways; construct a square meter grid over the surface to create a 2-D track site map; measure all tracks and trackways; and make silicone and latex molds of the most important tracks. Those will be curated at the Peace Region Paleontology Research Centre (PRPRC). They will also record activities by video, including drone footage of the research, all of which will be used to promote fund-raising efforts aimed at eventually constructing a building over a portion of the track surface.

The purpose of the building would be to both protect the trackway and establish a new major paleontological tourism attraction in this area. A new discovery near Grande Cache; the recently opened Philip Currie Dinosaur Museum in Wembley, Alberta; the Tumbler Ridge Dinosaur Museum and eventually the Carbon Creek display could become a "Dinosaur Trail" that could be promoted as a tourist attraction.

### July 9 Annual "Paddle for the Peace"

This will be the 11<sup>th</sup> year that canoes and other watercraft have taken to the water in mid-July to celebrate the Peace River and its Valley. What started in 2006 as a paddle and picnic has grown to an annual celebration with launch taking place at the Halfway River and take-out at Bear Flat. Pancake breakfast at the Halfway in the morning and barbecue at the take-out in the afternoon.

### All Summer Long:

- **Fishing:** There are no longer fish in Lynx Creek or in the plume going downstream of the mouth, but there are certainly fish in the Peace. Fort St John residents Rick Hopkins and his son, Duncan caught this big fellow last summer just downstream of the Halfway.
- **Farmer's Market** every Tuesday at Beattie Park
- **Outdoor Swimming Pool**, open daily

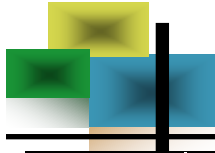

## Police Report: May 2016



Hudson's Hope RCMP Detachment responded to approximately 50 calls for service over the last four weeks.

Hudson's Hope RCMP continues to receive reports of thefts from motor vehicles. Please remove your valuables from parked vehicles and lock the doors when leaving the vehicle unattended. Reporting these thefts and suspicious persons will assist police in focusing enforcement efforts.

Safe boating will be a focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP over the next few months. Boat operators are encouraged to ensure they are compliant with licensing and have all necessary safety equipment. Marine enforcement will be conducted throughout the summer and operators could face significant fines for noncompliance or criminal charges if found to be operating while impaired. Visit the Transport Canada and boat safe Canada websites for more information on the necessary licensing and safety equipment requirements.

Over the May long weekend the Hudson's Hope RCMP were assisted by neighboring detachments and Traffic enforcement units conducting patrols and impaired check-stops. Many drivers received written warnings for minor offences while some drivers received violation tickets. One driver received a 3 day Immediate Roadside driving prohibition due to the level of alcohol in the breath sample provided.

An older, Green, Ironhorse model bicycle was turned in at the Hudson's Hope RCMP. If this bicycle belongs to you, and you can prove ownership, please contact the RCMP office.

The Hudson's Hope RCMP wishes to ask the public for assistance in identifying a person of interest regarding a grass fire on Drew Road. A slim male with short Brown hair and beard, approximately 6 feet tall, was seen quickly leaving the scene of the fire in a newer, Silver, Dodge Ram quad cab pickup truck with dual exhaust and a black tool box on the back. Anyone having information on the male's identity or location of the vehicle can contact the local detachment at 250-783-5241, or anonymously through Crime Stoppers at 1-800-222-8477.

One of the recent forest fires was determined to have been caused by careless use of fireworks at the airport runway. The public are reminded to check local fire bans prior to starting any fire and to ensure they abide by all fire regulations. Anyone found in contravention of an open fire prohibition may be fined \$1150 or, if convicted in court, be fined up to \$100,000 and sentenced to one year in jail. If the contravention causes or contributes to a wildfire, the person may be subject to a penalty of up to \$10,000 and be ordered to pay all firefighting and associated costs.

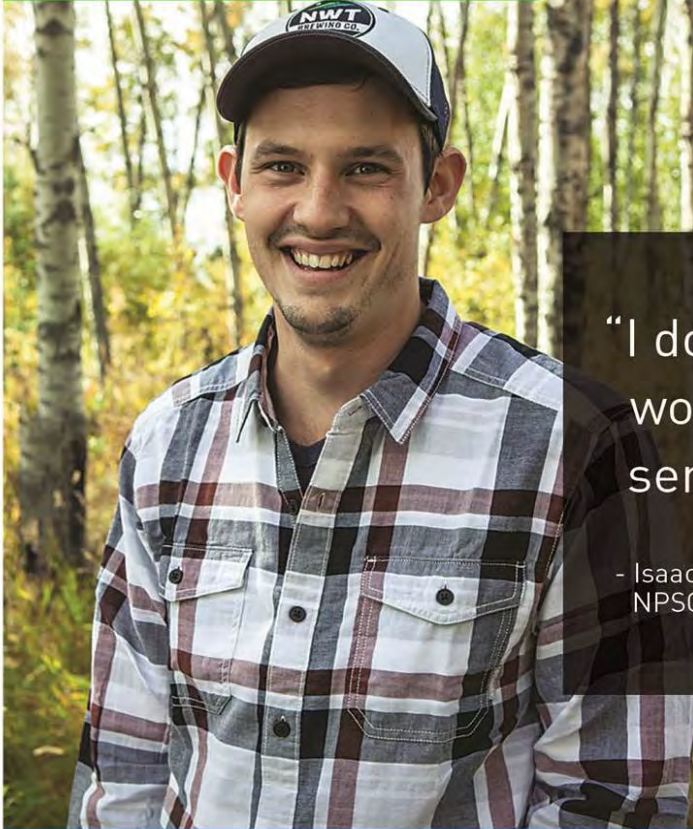

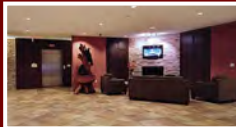
