Mayor's Corner

I would like to take the opportunity to recognize this year's Graduating Class. As we approach the end of June, we will see the class of 2024 embark on the beginning of their journey into adulthood. Some will be pursuing post secondary education; others dipping their toes into employment or perhaps trade vocations. Whichever direction our graduates choose, I wish them all good fortune and success. As a graduate of Hudson's Hope School myself I know that our community has provided these young people with the solid foundation they will require to navigate the complex and ever-changing realities of today.

As we put May behind us, we have already seen a few close calls related to fire activity in our municipality. I applaud the expert response made to our recent Trapper Lake wildfire by the BC Wildfire Service. Their quick and concise response, utilizing water bombers, helicopters, and ground-based attack crews, saw this fire contained quickly and the safety of the community protected. While the month of May did see some precipitation, we are still in a record-breaking drought condition, and I urge everyone to exercise the utmost of caution. While everything is greening at the moment, we are still at high risk due to dry forests and an overall lack of moisture.

Please check the Prince George Fire Center for burning restrictions regularly, and as always the District of Hudson's Hope will endeavor to post notices whenever restrictions are implemented, revised or rescinded.

As water is concerned, you may have noticed the draft water conservation bylaw that is currently under consideration by Council. While we live on the banks of the Peace River, and it may seem that water availability is a non-issue due to proximity, we are still working under the constraints of a temporary water treatment plant. As we work towards a permanent solution that will ease some of our current operational restraints, we must be mindful of the ability of this plant to supply potable water. We rely on potable water in our community for all uses currently, including fire fighting. As we enter spring and summer, temperatures will increase, and residential water users will turn to the water system to provide water for many seasonal outdoor uses. All these factors compound to put additional strain on our water treatment plant. Furthermore, adequate pressure in our water distribution system helps to support the integrity of the piping itself as well as ensuring that groundwater does not enter the system. The water conservation bylaw will provide council and district staff with the tools required to protect the potable water system, and by extension protect the integrity of our piping systems and ensure adequate supply of water for residential users, firefighting, and all other users of the municipal water system.

As we kick into summer mode we are also preparing to welcome visitors from across the region and across the continent to our community. Tourism is a significant part of our local economy in Hudson's Hope. As the Playground of the Peace we expect to see our campsites being heavily utilized, especially around the long weekends, and many people passing through the community to visit local attractions or simply get away from the hustle and bustle. Likewise, many of us will be setting out for summer vacations, destinations, dropping off our new graduate(s) at college or university (in my case) or simply to get away from it all for a while. Remember to plan, travel safe, and check drivebc.ca before heading out on a road trip!

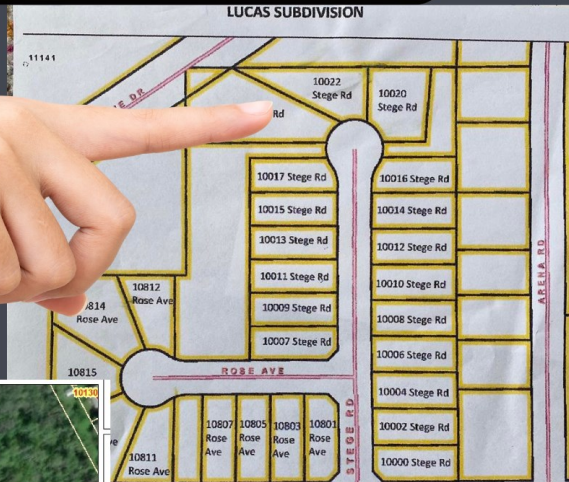



The PRRD is developing a Regional Climate Resiliency Plan (RCRP) focused on the four electoral areas (B, C, D and E).

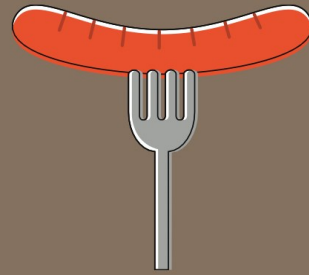
The RCRP aims to assess the potential risks associated with climate-hazard events within the region and to help plan and prepare for the effects of climate change while fostering resilience.

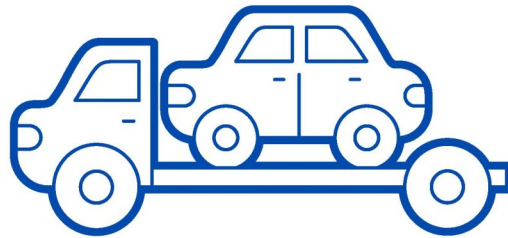

Monthly Police Report



Hudson's Hope RCMP Monthly Police Report

The Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 36 calls for service between April 21st and May 22nd. 49 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates for various motor vehicle related offences. Highway and road safety continues to be a focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP.

On April 22nd, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a motor vehicle accident along Hwy 29 which involved a pickup truck vs a silage chopper. Police attended scene and discovered that an EB truck which was pulling a silage chopper that had an improper towing pin used, came loose and drifted into the WB lane, colliding head-on with an incoming truck. All persons within the truck that was struck were transported to hospital with non-life-threatening injuries. The driver of the vehicle towing the farming equipment received several Motor Vehicle Act fines.

On April 23rd, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a residence along Twelve Mile Rd. to assist with an elk that had got stuck in a fence. Members attended and were successful in releasing the elk, but later learnt that due to the length of time that the animal had been stuck, this had caused too much stress and the elk later passed away. It was discovered that this elk was very well into its elderly years.

On May 3rd, the Hudson's Hope RCMP conducted a check-stop along Hwy 29, checking for impaired driving and Motor Vehicle Act compliance. Police stopped a motorist who presented signs of impairment and upon administering a road-side sobriety test, the driver failed both tests and received a driving prohibition for 90-days with their vehicle being impounded for 30-days.

On May 18th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a crash detection from a cell phone along Canyon Dr. Upon attending scene and locating a side x side being driven along the road, police stopped to speak with the driver and confirmed that no accident had occurred but based on observations of the driver, police suspected the driver to be impaired. The driver refused to comply with a road-side sobriety test, therefore he automatically received a 90-day driving prohibition with the side x side being impounded for 30-days.

On May 20th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP were conducting patrols through Second Beach when sirens and a loud speaker were heard. Upon speaking with a bystander, it was learnt that an individual who was operating a red ATV, was using a siren and stopping at campsites, stating

that he was a police officer and was conducting checks. Police confirmed that this individual was impersonating a police officer and upon later locating this individual, he fled from police on his ATV. The ATV was later located abandoned and police seized and impounded the ATV, after removing the wired-in police siren which is an illegal aftermarket item. The registered owner denied knowledge of the siren but was issued several violation tickets.

During the span of the May long weekend, the Hudson's Hope RCMP along with BC Conservation, were out in full force, utilizing the RCMP boat on Dinosaur Lake, RCMP ATV's were deployed on the back trails, enforcing the Off-Road Vehicle Act and conducting safety checks for camp fires. Along with general road and highway patrols and various check-stops, the RCMP were able to make their presence known and this made for a safe weekend for visitors with no major incidents. During the ATV patrols in the back country, police located and put out several abandoned campfires that had been left ignited upon campers leaving the site.

The Hudson's Hope RCMP is seeking individuals that have the commitment and flexibility to fill casual positions as an RCMP Detention Guard. This position has no fixed work schedule and candidates are called in to work on an as-needed basis. See the BC Commissionaires poster (**on page 27**) for further information. Wildfire Community Preparedness Day

On May 4th, the Hudson's Hope Fire department hosted a Wildfire Community Preparedness Event that exceeded expectations. The event drew in a large crowd of enthusiastic community members who came together to learn about wildfire preparedness and take action to protect their homes and properties.

The event was made possible through the collaborative efforts of several organizations, including BC Ambulance, Hudson's Hope Emergency Services, Mammoth Forestry and FireSmart. Each of these organizations set up informative tables, providing attendees with valuable resources and knowledge on how to prepare for and respond to wildfires.

A special thank you must be extended to Wasp Wildfire for their generous donation of two Home Protection Kits. These kits, which are designed to help homeowners prepare for wildfires, were a huge hit with attendees and will undoubtedly make a significant difference in wildfire protection.

It's the little tasks around your home that can make a world of difference if a wildfire comes a bit too close for comfort. To drastically increase the fire resiliency of your home and your community, you'll need to:

- Remove debris from your gutters.
- Mow your lawn and keep it under 10cm tall.
- Relocate combustible materials (firewood, propane tanks, etc.) at least 10 meters away from your home.
- Clean out under your deck to remove combustible debris such as leaves and branches.
- Prune tree branches on your property that are within 2 m of the ground.
- Reduce highly flammable plants on your property and choose fire-resistant plants to replace them.



Did you know Hudson's Hope has a Community Chaplain?

In February, I was appointed by Fellowship Chaplains to serve in Hudson's Hope as a community chaplain. Fellowship Chaplains are a network of over 150 individuals serving people in all walks of life. From Airports to Military Bases, in businesses, prisons, hospitals, and the communities where they live, Fellowship Chaplains provide a "ministry of presence" demonstrating love, compassion, and tangible spiritual service to people wherever they are.

As a community chaplain, my goal is simple — provide practical support, spiritual guidance and counsel, and pastoral care to people living throughout Hudson's Hope, and the surrounding peace region. This includes home visits, one-on-one or family spiritual counselling, marriage preparation and support, in person assistance and help, hospital and assisted living visitation, bereavement care and funeral preparation, and much more besides.

In addition, I am a licensed and credentialed Christian minister in the Fellowship Baptist denomination, and am available to officiate weddings, oversee funerals, administer acts of faith such as baptisms, child dedications, and celebrations, and leading special services. I am available to provide prayers, scripture readings, and blessings at civil and community events and functions, and can also provide teaching and guidance on the Christian faith, and spiritual matters, either one-on-one, in a small group or in larger environments.

As part of my role as chaplain, I lead Hudson's Hope Chapel, a small independent church community that meets weekly at 10703 Kruger Street at 11:00 for worship and teaching, with a lunch to follow at around noon.

We also run a weekly coffee house drop hosted at the Friends of Hudson's Hope, from 3:00-6:00 on Tuesdays. It's a fun, friendly and informal time to get together and chat, while enjoying great coffee and ask questions you may have.

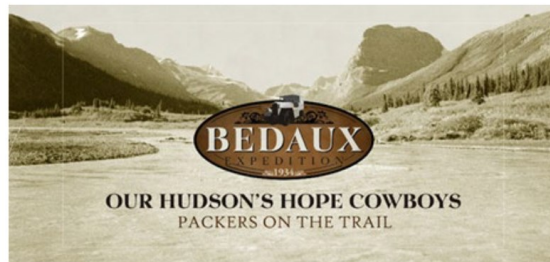

On July 4th, 1934, the advance freight outfit consisting of 51 packhorses had left Fort St. John. The six-man crew was headed by E.R.M. (Nick) Geake, an ex-Royal Navy Commander, who owned land near Pouce Coupe, B.C., and had a homestead-trapline to the north on the upper Halfway River.

Hudson's Hope, BC-based trapping partners Bob Godberson and Bob White, along with Willard Freer, had built a raft and floated down the Peace River to join the outfit. Veteran packer Ernie Peterson and his 18-year-old partner Art MacLean from the North Pine rounded out the crew.
