Returning from Prince George following the annual North Central Local Government Association (NCLGA) AGM I was struck by the contrast in the Pine Pass this year. While travelling over the summit at Powder King I was met with the most beautiful combination of late-to-melt winter snow alongside vibrant green and a myriad of waterfalls all along the highway. I also stopped briefly during intermittent heavy rainfall at Bijoux Falls to take in the majesty of the falls during early freshet, and they did not disappoint. Spring is indeed upon us, and change is in the air.

NCLGA did not disappoint this year either. Transportation and Healthcare continue to be an issue of common concern among all communities in the north, and indeed across the entire province. Several resolutions were presented dealing with Highway conditions throughout the Peace Region and interior, and all were endorsed by strong majorities. We made a special point to draw attention to the condition of Highway 29, and the regional importance of this highway for both Safety and Economic reasons. These resolutions will go forward to Union of BC Municipalities AGM (UBCM) and will form the basis for advocacy efforts from both the NCLGA and the UBCM executive on our behalf.

On the healthcare front all communities are seeing the squeeze that our healthcare providers and infrastructure have been under for longer than any of us care to admit. Lack of mental health support, a drug epidemic, struggles with long term care, an increasing population, and a population demographic that is changing over time, are putting even more load on an already overtaxed healthcare system. If there is a silver lining to the struggle we are currently facing it is that there does appear to be a willingness to attempt change. Northern Health presented on what the future of healthcare might look like, including leveraging new tools such as tele-medicine and nurse practitioners to help supplement existing healthcare professionals. Our viewpoint is that these tools should bolster, rather than replace, healthcare options that are currently available and we will continue to work with Northern Health to ensure the correct outcomes for our community.

Nearly all the healthcare related resolutions presented at NCLGA were endorsed unanimously, and we will be keeping a close eye on further promises made by Northern Health regarding expansion of Mental Health and Addiction Support in the

North, tertiary care services, and expansion of long-term care. The resolutions endorsed at NCLGA target the province directly in a bid to ensure that the province and the health authority are operating in parallel, and with our unique circumstances and needs in mind, when making policy and funding decisions that will impact our region for the decades to come.

FireSmart
Homeowners Manual

It's the little tasks around your home that can make a world of difference if a wildfire comes a bit too close for comfort. To drastically increase the fire resiliency of your home and your community, you'll need to:

- Remove debris from your gutters.
- Mow your lawn and keep it under 10cm tall.
- Relocate combustible materials (firewood, propane tanks, etc.) at least 10 meters away from your home.
- Clean out under your deck to remove combustible debris such as leaves and branches.
- Prune tree branches on your property that are within 2 m of the ground.
- Reduce highly flammable plants on your property and choose fire-resistant plants to replace them.



Monthly Police Report



Hudson's Hope RCMP Monthly Police Report

Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 36 calls for service between April 21 to May 20. Numerous traffic violation tickets and warnings were issued during this time period, along with citations for angling without a licence and fishing with an improper hook. RCMP also assisted Conservation Officers and SPCA with executing warrants held by their agencies.

During the night of April 26, various tools and other items were stolen from the laydown lot on the corner of Beryl Prairie Road and Canyon Drive.

On April 29, Police, Fire Rescue and BC Ambulance responded to a single vehicle collision involving a motor cycle. The driver suffered significant injuries and was transported to Fort St John Hospital. The driver had been wearing full safety gear, likely decreasing the amount of injuries he sustained.

On May 3rd, a male entered Marg's Mini Mart, stole some items and departed on a bicycle. The employee provided a good description of the male, who had previously been reported to police for unsafe cycling on the highway, and provided his direction of travel. Police made patrols and located the male. He initially provided a false name to police. The male was arrested and charges recommended for theft under \$5000 and Obstructing Peace Officer. He was released with a court date in Fort St John. He had recently been arrested in Fort St John for theft; he continued his travels where he was later arrested for theft in Chetwynd.

Between February 12 to May 4th, approximately \$5000 worth of copper wire was stolen from a remote worksite.

On May 7th, Cst. Bellamy was parked in his usual location on Beattie Dr. near Canyon Dr. He queried the licence plate of a passing vehicle which alerted him that the insurance was expired. He located the vehicle parked at a downtown business, unoccupied. Investigation revealed that the registered owner was prohibited from driving. The vehicle was towed for being uninsured. Police attended the registered owner's residence and issued a court date for Driving While Prohibited.

May Long Weekend

Police conducted proactive patrols throughout the Playground of the Peace over the May Long Weekend. Check stops were set up, roving ATV patrols were conducted and the Conservation Officer Service joined RCMP on the police boat on Dinosaur Lake.

Two drivers received driving prohibitions for operating a motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol. The vehicles were impounded for three days. A third driver had their marihuana seized at a police checkstop when the officer observed it in plain view, within reach of the driver, in an opened container. Officers at the check stop did a double-take when a driver, whom they had spoken with and cleared for sobriety, departed the check stop with an unusual passenger. As the vehicle departed, officers noticed a bear hide dragging behind it. Follow up with the driver determined he had thrown the hide out of the back of his truck to dispose of it, however, the bear didn't want to be left behind and "hitched" a ride back to town.

Two males chose to shoot fireworks at some males in another campsite, whom they knew. The males on the receiving end of the fireworks did not appreciate this and demanded an apology. Apologies were made and no charges were pursued.

At another campfire in the same vicinity, a person tossed a small bottle of gasoline onto the fire while a group was standing around it to keep warm. Witnesses described an explosion which caused significant injury to one male. He was transported to hospital where it was determined he suffered 2nd degree burns to his face and neck.

Police attended for a neighbour dispute that began over a discussion about their dogs, but escalated to an assault. The victim did not wish to pursue charges.

Police have received several reports about people driving recklessly throughout Hudson's Hope. Complaints include speeding, noise, excessive passengers and driving under the influence of alcohol. For those with a class 7 driver's licence, one or two violation tickets will result in a driving prohibition for 1-3 months. As nice as the summer weather is to ride a bicycle, I'm sure having a valid driver's licence would be preferable.
