7 Days a week – 9 to 5!**

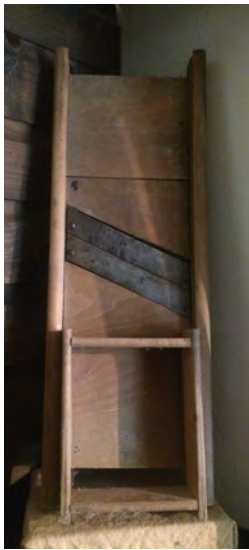

Wildfire: Huge bouquets to everyone who worked so hard to keep Hudson's Hope safe during that stupendous set of wildfires that boiled up a week ago Monday in and around the community. We've had an increase in wind in recent years, it seems, but in all the time I've been here, I've never seen the likes of those gusts that hit and swirled and hit again.

We owe a great deal of gratitude to all those who were there for us, from the members of the Fire Department, to the District workers who manned the Emergency Operations Centre, to the volunteers who got on their own equipment and started building fire guards, to the cooks who supplied meals, to those who stood ready to organize an evacuation should it have been needed, to those who labored with no-one knowing. Thank you. What a tremendous effort!

First 2014, now 2016 – it almost seems as though we're being put through a series of dress rehearsals for some main event still to come. Let us hope not.

However, the scientists have been telling us for years now that we should expect extreme weather events. We've been watching them on TV: cars floating down flooded rivers; parched and cracked landscapes in the California fields we depend on for our fruits and vegetables; extreme weather events, abnormal temperatures. And on it goes. We've been sort of immune to it in our protected little part of the world. But no more. We've had a couple of warnings now. We learned from the McAllister Fire in 2014 and we learned from this one. We will be as prepared as we can be.

Ben Jones & Coalbed Methane: Those of you who were around in the early 2000's will probably remember Ben Jones and his company, Peace River Corporation, which purchased the sub-surface rights under most of the District of Hudson's Hope that lay north of the Peace River and also some on the south side.

He called last week to let us know that Peace River Corporation is withdrawing from their operations. The gas plant has been sold; the 13 sections south of the river are gone, and they will be up during the summer to plug the holes and remove whatever assets remain. They are relinquishing all the sub-surface rights. He is keeping the disposal well which is south of the airport. He expects to have it all cleaned up by September.

He's still in the energy business, having developed a well-bore technique which he believes will be useful not just in the oil/gas business, but also in diamonds and other mining endeavors. We wish him well.

We made the Paramedicine Services List! Northern Health has just announced the communities who will receive services from a paramedic, starting this fall. And Hudson's Hope is on the list! Paramedics will be able to do regular checks of conditions such as blood pressure and diabetes; assist with medication assessment; advise on injury prevention and just be a regular on-the-ground health assistant. It will mean more services closer to home. Thank you, Northern Health!

Applications must be delivered to the municipal office by **June 1st, 2016** in a sealed envelope marked "**Scholarship Application**".

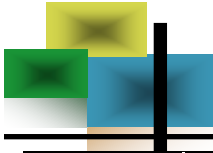

Police Report: April 2016



Hudson's Hope RCMP Detachment responded to approximately 33 calls for service over the last four weeks. Some incidents of note during that time are as follows:

Hudson's Hope RCMP has continued to receive reports of thefts from motor vehicles. Please remove your valuables from parked vehicles and lock the doors when leaving the vehicle unattended.

A back yard fire on Adams Street quickly got out of control catching the neighboring field on fire. RCMP members attended and gained control of the fire, with the help of the resident, until local fire fighters could assist and extinguish the fire completely.

Sometime between April 12th and April 14th, a theft from a residence occurred in Hudson's Hope. Stolen items included a Poulan chain saw - Model P3416 - light blue/white; a Yardworks ride on mower, 42" cut, green; and a Briggs and Stratton 7.5HP pressure washer, red. Anyone with information regarding this theft or the location of the items can call the local RCMP detachment.

Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a single vehicle collision north of Hudson's Hope. The driver and passengers were taken to hospital in Fort St John for treatment. RCMP traffic services were called in to assist in the investigation. The exact cause of the incident is still under investigation, however, driver fatigue and alcohol are suspected as contributing factors at this time.

Hudson's Hope RCMP conducted a traffic stop with a suspected impaired driver on Highway 29 north of Hudson's Hope. A breath demand was made to the driver and breath samples were obtained. Criminal charges of impaired driving and driving over the legal limit are being recommended against the driver.

Safe roads and waterways remain a top priority of the Hudson's Hope RCMP. Traffic and boating enforcement efforts will continue as the weather improves and traffic increases. Traffic checks will also include Off Road Vehicles (ORVs), boats and trailers. Please ensure your registrations, insurances, and licences are up to date as fines for non-compliance may be imposed. Check ICBC and Transport Canada websites for information related to operator licencing, registration and insurance for ORVs, and for information regarding boating safety. Don't forget your fishing licences as well.

Helmets need to worn while the vehicle is being operated and of course operators cannot be impaired. These new regulations will be strictly enforced during the summer months. Those vehicles and operators found to be in violation of the new requirements may face substantial fines and possible vehicle impoundment.

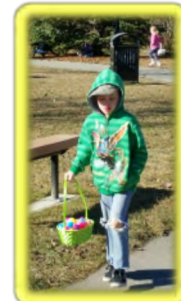
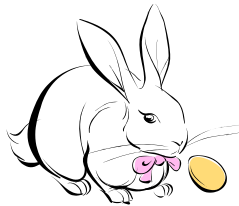

How to Report a Wildfire:

If you see a wildfire, please report it to Wildfire Management Service at **1-800-663-5555** or call ***5555** toll free on most cellular networks. Alternately, you can report a wildfire to **9-1-1**.

What You'll Be Asked:

When reporting a wildfire, a operator will ask:

- your phone number
- the location of the fire
- what the fire is burning (trees? What species?)
- the size of the fire
- how quickly the fire is spreading
- the colour of the smoke
- whether there are values or lives at risk



The details that you provide are critical in determining the type of response that the fire will receive from fire suppression authorities. Your help is greatly appreciated as it helps us to allocate our resources more efficiently and respond quickly to wildfire activity.

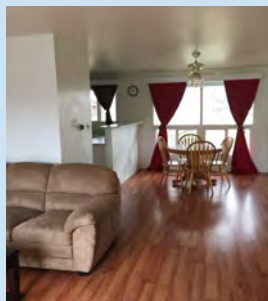

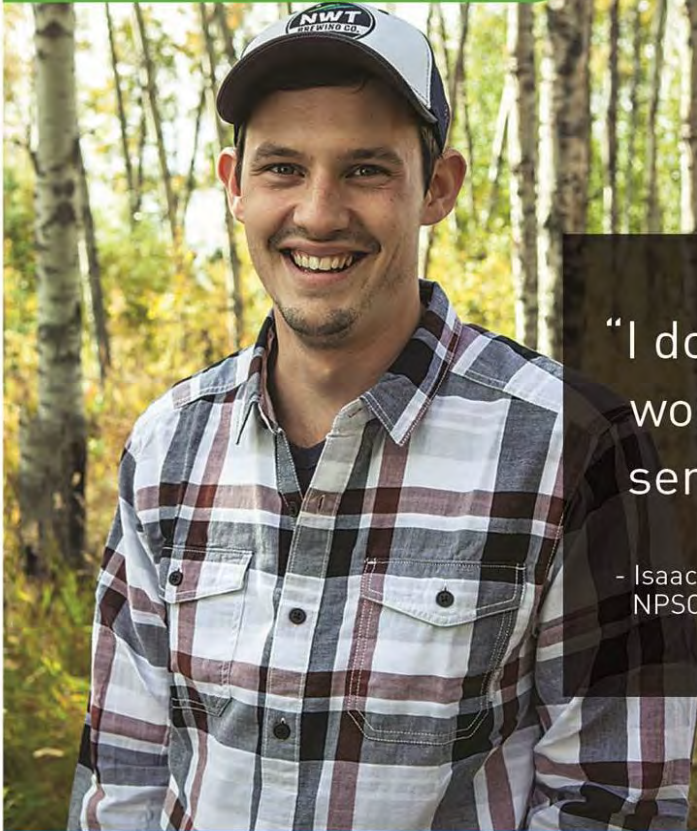
