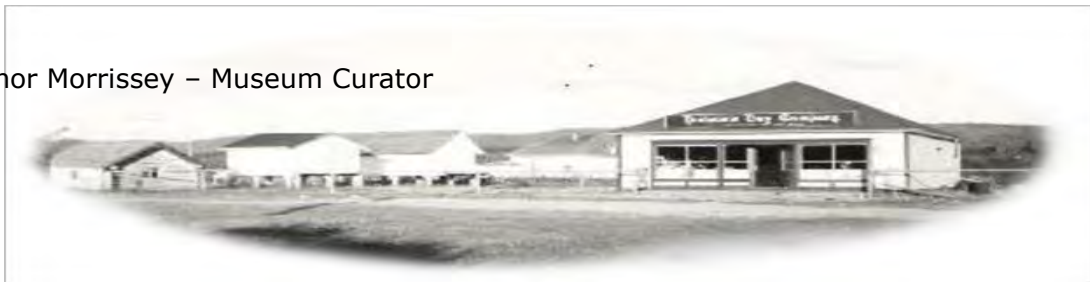

On a more personal note; my great uncle served in the infantry in World War II. He went on to earn medals and survived the war, but sadly he died from a terrible accident while still overseas helping in the effort to clear out after the war. I would like to honor him and the many other First Nations men and women who served our country well in the war effort with the following quote:

*"They were denied land, rights as citizens and lived in poverty. Their children were forced into residential schools where the objective was to "kill the Indian in the child." But when the war began, BC's aboriginal people stepped forward in remarkable numbers, even after being told they were not wanted. Approximately six thousand aboriginal soldiers served from across the country; by the end of the war 35 percent of the eligible population had enlisted."*

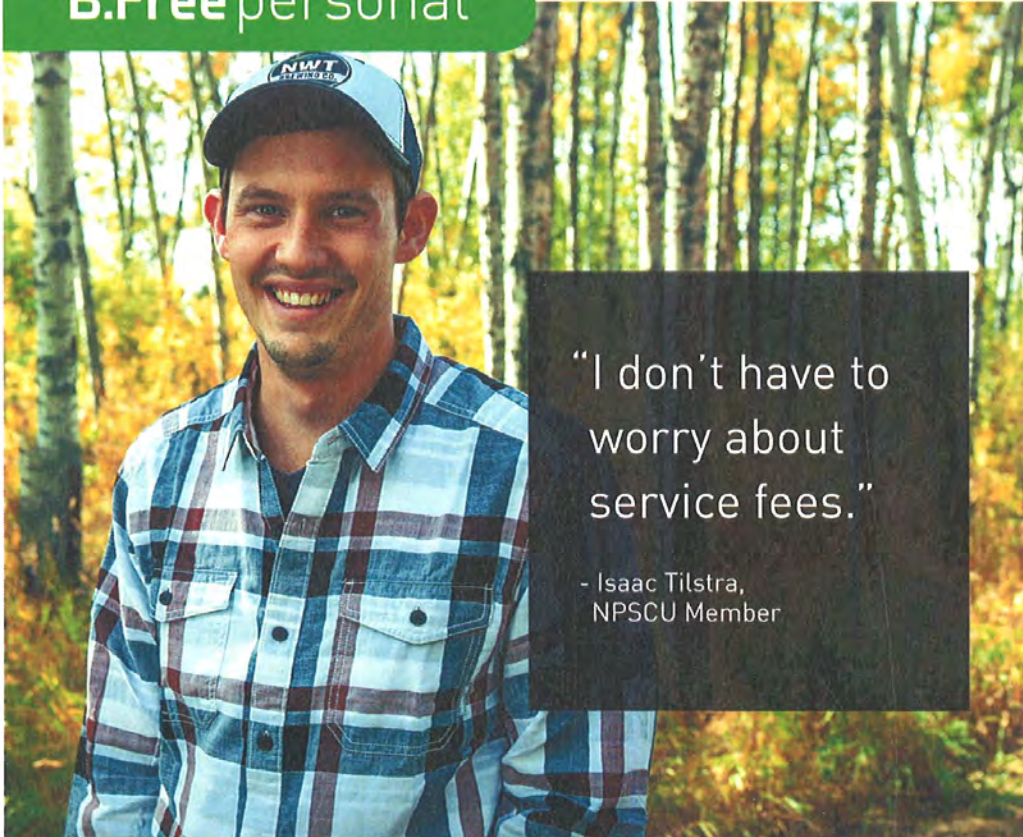

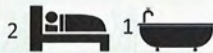

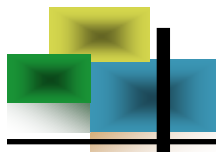

# District of Hudson's Hope Council News



Here and there a few die-hard leaves still brave the winds and cling to branches hoping to hang on for another season. Some geese and an occasional songbird are still in evidence, though most have conceded the season and are well on their way south. As we wind our way toward the end of the year, it's time to take stock of what has been accomplished in the District of Hudson's Hope. There is quite a lot, when you start adding it up. Some projects have been on the books for a long time but there was never the capacity to get them done until now; others were just initiated this year. Here's a partial list:

**New Equipment Purchased:** Street Sweeper, Pick-up Truck, Steamer, and a brand new Fire Water Truck assigned to the Beryl Prairie Fire Hall – the first new truck the Hall has had in its 50 year history.

**Electrical Security:** 2015 seems to be the year of generators. Backup generators were purchased and installed at the water treatment plant and Beryl Prairie fire hall. One for the District Office will be installed shortly. Those ensure that in case of emergency, both the primary and backup Emergency Control Centers would have electricity and water supply. In addition, two portable generators for the Kendrick Lift Station and miscellaneous duties are now in stock.

**Public Works Project:** The District purchased property from YRB for a badly needed new Public Works shop. This will hopefully be built and ready for occupancy by summer 2016. A plan has been developed for road maintenance. This year, one kilometer of road was paved, including Adams Street, the Library parking lot, and spots that were torn up for water valve replacement. Culverts on Carter Street were replaced. A multi-year store of gravel was crushed and stock-piled at the District pit. Some of that was used to gravel Miller Road. Public works crews have replaced street lighting on MacIntosh Crescent, Dudley Drive, and in municipal parking lots. Lighting inside the arena was also replaced with efficient LED bulbs. Our crew has now updated all of the outdoor lighting that belongs to the District. BC Hydro owns the rest of the outdoor lights in town and we look forward to them switching to more efficient equipment. We expect the switch to go a long way toward reducing our sizeable electricity bills.

**Recreation Facilities:** On the recreation side, four Arena furnaces were replaced, a backboard was installed at the Tennis Court, and the Ball Diamond is now complete with improved field surface, underground irrigation, and an accessible toilet facility. Software to track pool clients and arena users has been purchased. A new computerized campground reservation system was initiated this summer.

**Miscellaneous Projects to Note:** The tree planting program continued this year, with nine new trees planted at the Cemetery and eleven at the pool park. Security cameras were installed at various buildings and facilities around town and an alarm system was added to the Kendrick Lift Station. A new cardboard recycle bin has been placed at the Transfer Station. New cement stairs were installed at the District office. 2015 has been a productive year for Hudson's Hope, thanks to the team of employees which made it all happen. Thank you!

## Police Report: October 2015



Over the last four weeks, Hudson's Hope RCMP Detachment responded to approximately 40 calls for service. Hudson's Hope RCMP members continued with traffic enforcement throughout the area. Some incidents of note during the previous four weeks are as follows:

On September 19<sup>th</sup>, 2015, Hudson's Hope RCMP conducted a traffic stop with an erratic driver. The driver was found to be exhibiting signs of impairment and subsequently refused to provide a sample of breath on demand from police. The driver was also found to be prohibited from driving. Criminal charges are being forwarded to Crown counsel.

On September 24<sup>th</sup>, 2015, Hudson's Hope RCMP received a call for two missing canoers travelling on the Peace River from Hudson's Hope to Taylor. The two had not been in contact with anyone along the route as planned. Fort St John Search and rescue were activated and subsequently located the two still travelling to their destination.

On September 26<sup>th</sup>, 2015, Hudson's Hope RCMP conducted a traffic stop with an ATV driving on the highway. The driver of the ATV was found to be a suspended driver. A charge of driving while suspended under section 234(1) of the Motor Vehicle Act has been forwarded to Crown counsel.

On September 28<sup>th</sup>, 2015, The Hudson's Hope RCMP issued a warning to a driver for driving on the airport runway. The driver was learning to drive and had mistakenly thought the runway was an appropriate place to practice. The RCMP would like to remind everyone of the inherent dangers of being on the runway as it is unsupervised and used under unpredictable scheduling. Offenders could face charges.

On October 5<sup>th</sup>, 2015, the RCMP conducted a traffic stop with a vehicle and found the driver to be prohibited from driving in British Columbia. A charge for driving while prohibited has been forwarded to Crown counsel.

The Hudson's Hope RCMP conducted several check stops during the month ensuring drivers are compliant with the Motor Vehicle Act and not operating while impaired. Public safety on the highway remains a top priority with the Hudson's Hope RCMP and drivers are encouraged to be compliant.

# HALLOWEEN SAFETY



## **Walk Safely**

- Cross the street at corners, using traffic signals and crosswalks.
- Look left, right and left again when crossing and keep looking as you cross.
- Put electronic devices down and keep heads up. Walk, don't run, across the street.
- Make eye contact with drivers before crossing in front of them.
- Always walk on sidewalks or paths. If there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to the left as possible. Children should walk on direct routes with the fewest street crossings.
- Watch for cars that are turning or backing up. Teach children to never dart out into the street or cross between parked cars.

## **Trick or Treat With an Adult**

- Children under the age of 12 should not be alone at night without adult supervision. If kids are mature enough to be out without supervision, they should stick to familiar areas that are well lit and trick-or-treat in groups.

## **Keep Costumes Creative but Safe**

- Decorate costumes and bags with reflective tape or stickers and, if possible, choose light colors.
- Choose face paint and makeup whenever possible instead of masks, which can obstruct a child's vision.
- Have kids carry glow sticks or flashlights to help them see and be seen by drivers.
- When selecting a costume, make sure it is the right size to prevent trips and falls.

## **Drive Extra Safely on Halloween**

- Slow down and be especially alert in residential neighborhoods. Children are excited on Halloween and may move in unpredictable ways.
- Take extra time to look for kids at intersections, on medians and on curbs.
- Enter and exit driveways and alleys slowly and carefully.
- Eliminate any distractions inside your car so you can concentrate on the road and your surroundings.
- Drive slowly, anticipate heavy pedestrian traffic and turn your headlights on earlier in the day to spot children from greater distances.
- Popular trick-or-treating hours are 5:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. so be especially alert for kids during those hours.

## **Are your treats safe?**

- Please inspect your treats for foreign objects and hazardous material. If there is no wrapper, a strange odour or discoloration you should be cautious of the ingredients and discard the treat.

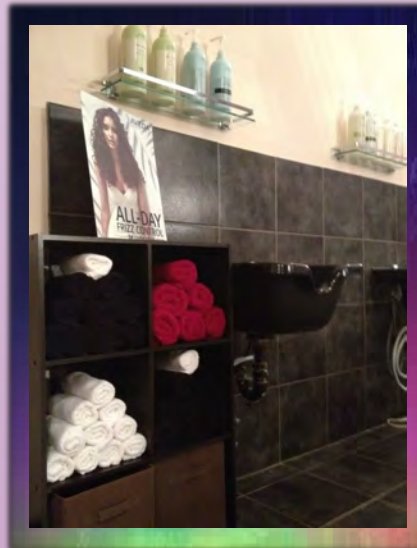

## SITE C: MONTHLY FIELD STUDIES SUMMARY

### November 2015

BC Hydro is continuing to conduct environmental and engineering field studies on and around the Peace River between the Williston Reservoir and the Alberta border to inform detailed mitigation and monitoring planning. In December 2014, the Site C project received approval from the provincial government to proceed to construction.

This notice provides a list of field work planned for November 2015. Helicopters may be required for some of the work listed below. BC Hydro will obtain permits, and complete environmental management plans and archaeological assessments as required.

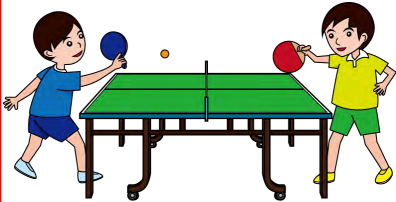

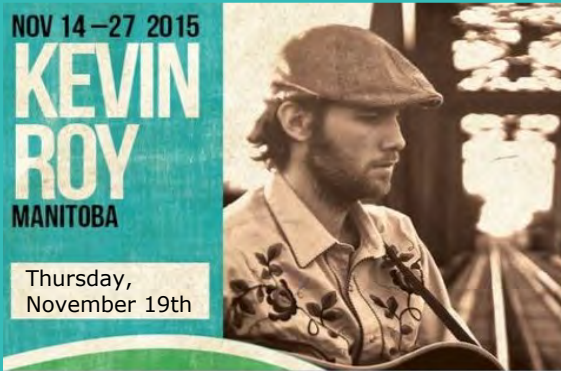

# Protective Services

## What is a Winter Tire?

British Columbia accepts “mountain snowflake” or “mud and snow” tires with at least 3.5 mm tread as winter tires.

### Check your tires for these signs:



**The mountain/snowflake symbol on the side of the tire**

These winter tires offer the best traction on snow and ice, and in cold weather.



**The mud and snow symbol on the side of the tire**

These winter tires offer better traction than summer tires, however, they are less effective than mountain/snowflake tires on snow and ice, and in cold weather.

### 3.5 mm tread

Tires must have 3.5 mm of tread remaining to be considered winter tires.

### Matching Winter Tires

You must have at least 2 **matching** winter tires on the same axle, but **it is recommend using 4**

### Studded Tires

May be used on BC highways from October 1 to April 30, but **must** have mountain/snowflake or M+S symbols to be considered winter tires.



## When are Winter Tires or Chains Right for Me?

Winter tires and chains can make your vehicle safer.

You **must** use winter tires (passenger vehicles) or carry chains (commercial trucks) between October 1 and March 31 on **most BC Highways**.

British Columbia’s climates range from freezing cold to pleasantly mild in the winter; equipping your vehicle appropriately depends on what you are driving and where you are driving. Drivers in some parts of the southern coast, where regulations are more relaxed due to warmer weather, should use discretion when equipping their vehicles.
