# Remembrance Day

November is here! And I must admit it is a great month to be in, not the least of reasons being because I have a birthday coming up!

But that isn't the only exciting news we have to share as we are embarking on the latest and hopefully final rounds of public engagement for our current Zoning Bylaw and OCP amendments, which we hope to put the wraps on by the end of this year (or early next year). So please keep your eyes peeled for the dates. Our Zoning Bylaw has some significant updates this time around that should provide a better user experience and make the process of identifying your zoning, and it's permitted uses, much easier.

As we enter the winter months, and tasks such as driving to town begin to require additional planning, I would like to take a moment to mention what has been a continual sore spot for all of us. Highway 29, specifically at Halfway Hill. We have all seen the deterioration of the highway continue, and our hopes of having some resolution before winter are once again fading.

Following the last meeting of the Peace River Regional District the board of directors has asked that this stretch of highway specifically be brought to the Minister of Transportation and Transit to be addressed. As an arterial highway, carrying Industry Traffic, Goods, Services, People and Emergency Vehicles, we cannot afford the risk of losing this critical path through the North. As the District of Hudson's Hope was unable to get a meeting with the Honorable Minister of Transportation, Mike Farnworth, during UBCM, my hope is that with the support of the PRRD we can get the attention we so sorely need.

Finally, as we continue to endure the inevitable consequences of job actions such as the Canada Post and BCGEU Strikes, I ask everyone to please be kind and be patient. Plan ahead for shopping and shipping, and as we are one of the few Driver Licensing agents in the Northeast that is open during this period, I also ask for your patience when you visit the Municipal Offices. We are doing our best to help share a regional workload now and ensure that everyone has access to the services they require.

# WATER TREATMENT PLANT UPDATE



The District of Hudson's Hope and BC Hydro continue to work collaboratively on the completion of the permanent water treatment system.

The engineering consultant, McElhanney, recently completed the detailed design for the completed system and a significant portion of the preparatory work inside of the water treatment plant building has been completed.

Later this month, work will begin to replace and strengthen portions of the water treatment plant building roof. This work is expected to take 3-4 weeks to complete and will include a number of trucks, cranes and general construction activities. The permanent clarifier is also scheduled for delivery later in November.

No service outages are expected during this period.

In early spring 2026, a new compressor shed will be installed next to the reservoir and connected to the raw water intake. A new buried water supply line will connect the new intake in the reservoir to the water treatment plant building.

Once all this work has been completed, commissioning of the system will occur in the spring/summer 2026. Temporary disruptions to water services may be needed as part of the commissioning process. Further details on any service disruptions will be provided closer to the date.

# COMMUNITY HALL PROJECT UPDATE



Building a new community hall is a big project and as you can imagine, it's a long process! We're still early on this journey, but one thing has really stood out so far: how much this project means to our community. It's clear that residents, Council, staff, and local groups all care deeply about creating a space that brings people together. There's a lot of passion, and naturally, lots of ideas about what this new hall should look like.

To help bring all those ideas together, Council hired an architect to complete a feasibility study. Having a third-party professional lead this part of the process allows them to gather input from residents and user groups, and then turn that feedback into real design options and recommendations. This ensures that the final plan truly reflects our community's needs and priorities.

We know that building new infrastructure today isn't simple — or inexpensive. The architect has been working hard to make sure the hall is right-sized for our community. Building too big would cost more than we need to spend, while building too small could mean we outgrow it too soon. Through surveys and community engagement, we've been able to identify what people value most, which spaces are important, and where the new hall should be located. While Council had its own ideas at the start, we've made every decision based on community feedback and the information gathered through this process.

## What's Been Decided So Far:



### Gathering Centre Project

- Community Hall
- Meeting/Multipurpose Spaces
- Library

- The new community hall will be built on the same site as the current hall.
- It will include a welcome area, indoor playground, commercial kitchen, a large community hall space, library and two meeting rooms.

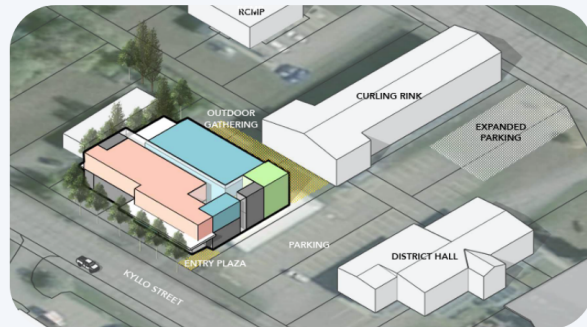
These decisions may sound simple, but they represent hundreds of hours of discussion, research, and community input. We've taken the time to get it right — to make sure every step forward is a solid one.

### **Cost and Next Steps:**

At this stage, the **estimated total project cost** is about **\$33.2 million**, which includes:

- Construction: **\$18.4 million**
- Escalation and contingency: **\$6.2 million**
- Project management, permits, and fees: **\$6.2 million**
- Furnishings and equipment: **\$2.4 million**

These numbers are very **preliminary**, and we'll continue looking for ways to reduce costs as the project moves ahead, through smart design choices, materials, and partnerships. We're also exploring ways to make the new hall adaptable for emergency use, which would make it more versatile and help us qualify for additional grant funding.



### **Funding the Project:**

Funding will likely come from a mix of District borrowing (which residents will have a chance to vote on), grant applications, and private sector contributions.

Council is committed to keeping the community informed and involved throughout this process. We appreciate everyone's input, patience, and enthusiasm as we work together to bring this important project to life.

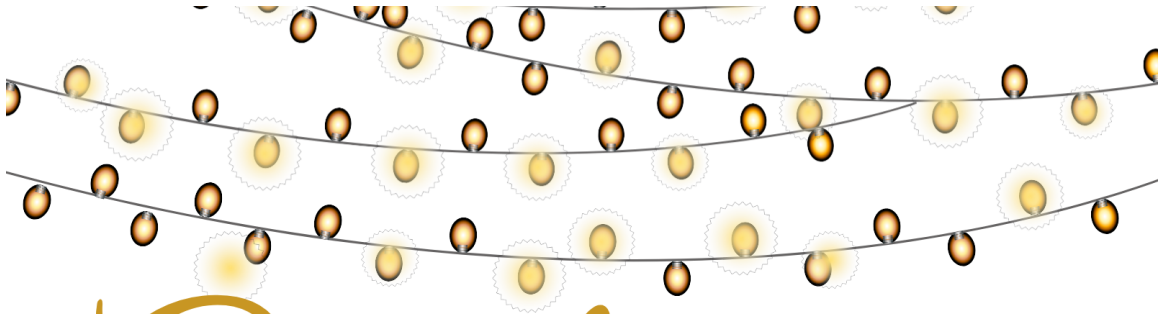

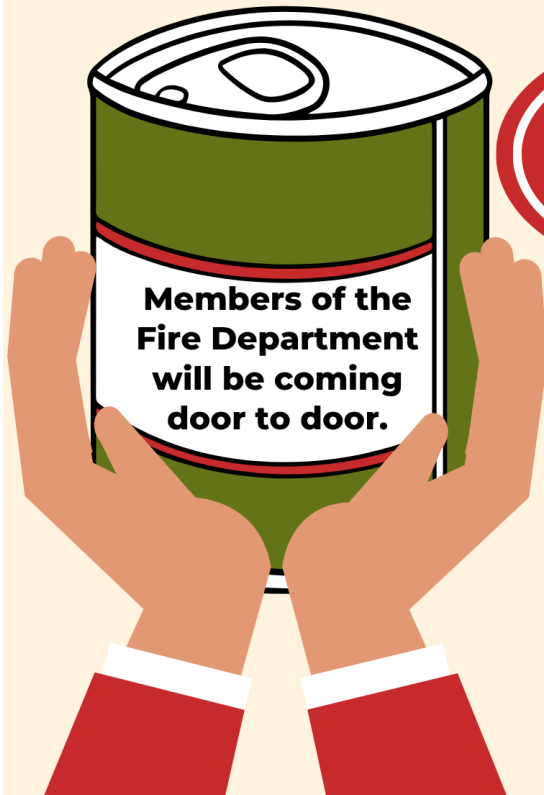

# Monthly Police Report



## Hudson's Hope RCMP Monthly Police Report

The Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 37 calls for service between September 21<sup>st</sup> and October 21<sup>st</sup>. 24 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates for various motor vehicle related offences. Highway and road safety continues to be a focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP.

On September 22<sup>nd</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of two individuals fishing down by the East side of the spillway near the Peace Canyon Dam. As this is a closed off area, police confirmed that the individuals vacated the area. As a reminder, this location is a restricted area for safety aspects as the water levels can increase in a very short period. Please avoid venturing into this area and obey the marked signage.

On September 26<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to the Kobes Creek FSR area after it was reported that a male was seen laying along the side of the road, possibly impaired. Upon police arriving and speaking with the involved hunters, it was found that the individual laying along the busy road was an elderly hunter who decided to take a nap.

On September 27<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a break & enter / theft at a construction storage site along Beryl Prairie Rd. It was reported that two persons were observed, one wearing a hoodie and a face mask, snooping around the area and that they had broken into numerous sea cans, vehicles, and cargo trailers. Items stolen included some various Milwaukee tools. File remains open for investigation.

On October 9<sup>th</sup>, Hudson's Hope RCMP conducted a traffic stop with a possible impaired driver along McDougall St. Upon the investigation, police located several packs of illicit tobacco, illegally possessed vials of steroids, and drug paraphernalia. The driver was arrested and charged for possession of controlled substances.

On October 10, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a theft from an old well site along Kobes Creek FSR. It was reported that several 12V batteries from a long-term micro seismic monitoring station had been stolen. Unknown as to when this theft occurred but believed to be sometime between July 20<sup>th</sup>, 2025 and October 9<sup>th</sup>, 2025.

On October 16<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a hunting camp that had been set up along the Pintail Rd. (Kobes Creek FSR), which was impeding the passage of heavy industrial traffic, causing a safety hazard. When the company security

spoke with the hunters, they refused to leave. Upon police attending the site, the hunters quickly left the area and no charges were sought.

On October 17<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a stolen John Deere grader that had been stolen from a work site along Canyon Dr. Police later located the grader near the Bullhead Mountain and observed several damaged windows. File remains open for investigation.
