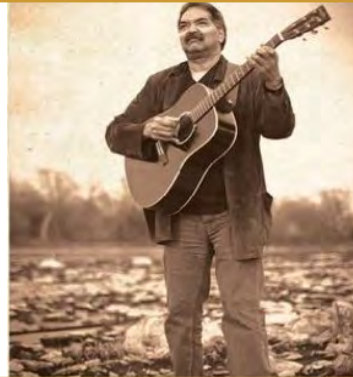

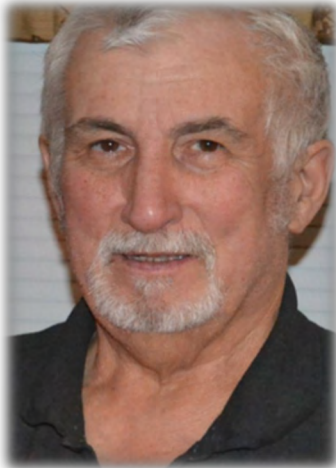

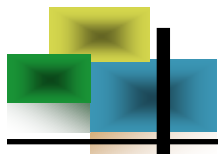

The autumn of 2015 will be remembered as one of the most beautiful to be seen in many years. Despite some pretty brisk winds, the leaves managed to hold tight day after day. The yellow, red and rust colors have been spectacular. Bright sunny days, crisp temperatures, birds in training mode as they prepare to fly south. No wonder fall is the favorite time of year for many people. Makes you grateful to be alive!

### **Union of BC Municipalities (UBCM) Conference:**

Councillors Miller, Heiberg, Middleton and myself attended the conference. Hudson's Hope's resolutions were endorsed.

Our resolution 27 asked that UBCM and the provincial government work together

to provide incentives for residential customers to install grid-interactive renewable electricity generation systems. Solar and geo-heat-exchange systems have dropped dramatically in price over the past few years largely because their accelerated use in other jurisdictions have created economies of scale. We are seeing rooftop solar panels and geo-heating in Hudson's Hope now. For years we have provided subsidies to encourage oil and gas development; directing just a fraction of those subsidies to renewables would go a long way to helping BC residents reduce their ever increasing electricity bill.

Our Resolution 57 asked that municipalities where water source contamination surfaced be able to draw on a provincial fund in order to investigate and identify the problem and create a plan to

remediate it. This was partly aimed at resolving the ongoing Brenot/Lynx Creek contamination, where sand being carried into the creek has high levels of heavy metals. There is no provincial program to address such a situation. That brought some action: a conference call has been scheduled for mid October to see what may be done.

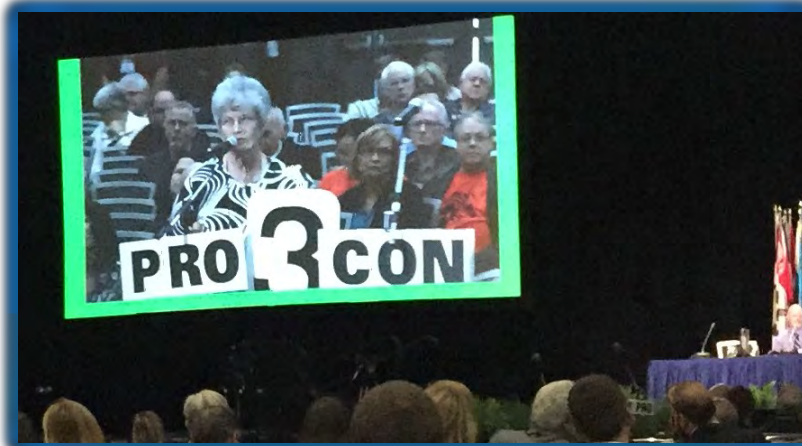

We submitted a resolution asking that the province follow the recommendations of the Site C Joint Review Panel and refer Site C to the BC Utilities Commission for review of the need for, cost of, and alternatives to the project as the commission was created for precisely the purpose of reviewing major projects to ensure they are in the public interest. Other municipalities had similar requests, including Victoria, and we acceded to their resolution, which made Site C a provincial issue. (And incidentally, a display of Peace Valley cantaloupe and watermelon out at the conference entrance drew lots of surprised comments from people who had no idea of what can be grown in the Peace.)

## Police Report: September 2015



Over the last month, Hudson's Hope RCMP Detachment responded to approximately 45 calls for service. Hudson's Hope RCMP members continued with traffic enforcement throughout the area and conducted check stops in an effort to target impaired drivers. Some incidents of note during the month are as follows:

On August 27<sup>th</sup>, 2015, Hudson's Hope RCMP received multiple calls regarding a grizzly bear in town. Police made patrols throughout the area, notifying residents of the danger and were eventually called to a residential property as the bear had chased a resident. The bear remained on the property and had to be dispatched by police due to its aggression toward humans. Other bear sightings have also been reported to police throughout the month and we have worked with BC Conservation officers to address each call. Aggressive wildlife in rural areas can be reported directly to BC Conservation Officers 24 hours a day, toll free, at 1-877-952-7277 and by calling your local detachment or 911 in emergency situations.

On September 10<sup>th</sup>, 2015, Hudson's Hope RCMP was advised of an attempted fraud at a local business. The fraudster identified himself as an employee of the Canada Revenue Agency and threatened that legal action and a warrant for arrest would be issued for overdue files. This type of fraudulent call is becoming more common and personal information should never be shared with an unknown person.

On September 16<sup>th</sup>, 2015, The Hudson's Hope RCMP hosted the Cops for Cancer Tour De North riders as they passed through the area and visited the school. The Hudson's Hope RCMP wishes to extend appreciation to the Lions Club and to Country Favours Catering for their assistance in making the event a success. # FRAUD AWARENESS

## Tip #1

If you are not a customer of the company that appears to be sending you an email, ignore it. Fraudsters rely on the few recipients who are customers of the company to fall victim to the scam.

## Tip #2

Even if you are a customer, never respond directly to an email request from a company for personal or financial information. Instead verify the authenticity of the request by using an email or telephone contact that you know is legitimate.

## Tip #3

Never go to a web site from a link in an email. Instead open up a new browser window and enter URLs that you know are legitimate directly into your browser. Better yet, use bookmarks you created.

## Tip #4

Check your credit card and bank statements immediately after receipt. Look for charges or transactions that you don't expect; even small ones can be a sign of trouble.

## Tip #5

If you unwittingly supply personal or financial information, inform the appropriate institutions immediately. Banks and credit card companies will work with you to prevent your information from being used against you.

## Tip #6

Become familiar with the tricks of the trade so you can spot fraudulent emails. Knowledge is a powerful weapon in the fight against email fraudsters.

## Tip #7

Stay up to date. Make sure your operating system and critical security software applications such as anti-spam, anti-phishing, anti-virus and anti-spyware are current.

## SITE C: MONTHLY FIELD STUDIES SUMMARY

### October 2015

BC Hydro is continuing to conduct environmental and engineering field studies on and around the Peace River between the Williston Reservoir and the Alberta border to inform detailed mitigation and monitoring planning. In December 2014, the Site C project received approval from the provincial government to proceed to construction.

This notice provides a list of field work planned for October 2015. Helicopters may be required for some of the work listed below. BC Hydro will obtain permits, and complete environmental management plans and archaeological assessments as required.

Half of home fire deaths happen between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m., when most people are asleep.



Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of the home, including the basement. Larger homes may need more alarms.

For the best protection, install interconnected smoke alarms in your home. When one sounds, they all sound.

Test alarms at least once a month by pushing the test button.

When the smoke alarm sounds, get outside and stay outside. Go to your outside meeting place.



Call the fire department from a cellphone or a neighbor's phone. Stay outside until the fire department says it's safe to go back inside.
