




MAYOR'S CORNER

I send this Mayor' Corner from the Union of BC Municipalities (UBCM) Annual Conference in Victoria, where Council and I have had an incredibly productive week. Over just four short days, we've walked more than 44 kilometers, logged over 60,000 steps, and spent countless hours in meetings with Provincial Ministers and their staff.

In conjunction with both our local Council and the Peace River Regional District (PRRD), I had the opportunity to meet with several key Provincial officials, including the Minister of State for Local Government and Rural Communities, the Minister of Finance, the Minister of Emergency Management and Climate Readiness, the Parliamentary Secretary for Rural Health, the Minister of Water, Land and Resource Stewardship, the Minister of Agriculture and Food, the Minister of Energy and Climate Solutions, the Minister of Public Safety and Solicitor General, the Minister of Mining and Critical Minerals, and the Minister of Tourism.

We arrived in Victoria ready to hit the ground running—meeting with provincial leaders to advocate for sustainable funding, healthcare, transportation, and economic growth. We emphasized our region's vital role in the provincial economy and the growing strain of provincial demands on our community.

We also built connections with other communities facing similar challenges, industry partners experiencing the same pressures, and others committed to growing not just the Northeast BC economy, but the province as a whole.

I would like to acknowledge our MLA Jordan Kealy and his Executive Assistant Natasha Scott who were able to join us for all our Ministerial Meetings. The support of our MLA, and their ability to act as our ongoing voice here in Victoria is greatly appreciated.

There is still much work ahead. UBCM is just one step in an ongoing process that repeats each year. Following this year's conference—and with our focus expanding from short-term and emergent issues to long-term sustainability and growth—I expect even more follow-up meetings, phone calls, and, hopefully, many positive outcomes to share with you in the months to come.

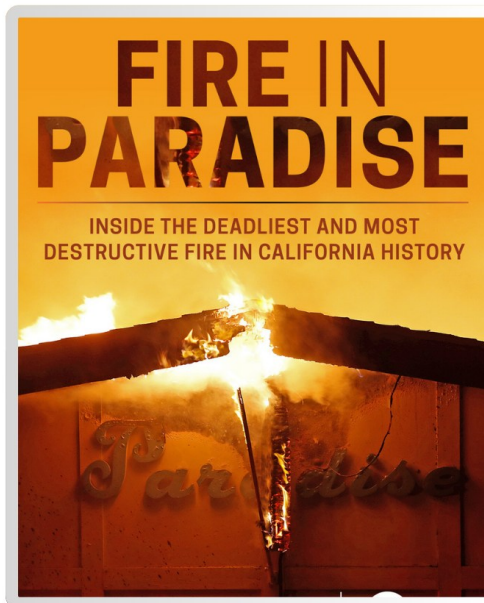

Hey, Hudson's Hope, did you know this?

Our local explorer, Mary, is the first Canadian to complete the strenuous Green Ribbon trail. Mary trekked a total of 1525 kms – this was after a walk through Wales for a slight Mary style warm up. Congratulations, Mary. You are amazing!

The Green Ribbon trail, or Grona Bandet in Swedish, is a challenging long-distance, self-planned hiking route stretching approximately 800 miles (1300 km) through the Swedish and Norwegian mountain ranges. It runs from Grovelsjon to Treriksroset (the tri-border point of Norway, Sweden, and Finland), though a fixed path doesn't exist, requiring hikers to plan their own route from valley to valley. Unlike the Kungsleden (King's Trail), which Mary also completed, the Green Ribbon is not a defined, marked trail and travelers have to have self-planned expedition, requiring significant independent navigation. The Green Ribbon focuses on traversing the mountain, often involving walking above the tree line and through valleys, sometime including marshy terrain, snow bridges, river crossings, and even rowing and towing boats across lakes. You've got to be tough!

A total of 572 people have started the Green Ribbon since its inception in 2011 up until the fall of 2024. A total of 426 people, or 74.5% have completed the entire journey. On average the participants travel 1,326 km. This year, 111 people started the green ribbon; 39 of them came from countries other than Sweden. The youngest to finish was 11 and the oldest was 72 years. Mary's smile says it all!

Monthly Police Report



Hudson's Hope RCMP Monthly Police Report

The Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 37 calls for service between August 19th to September 21st. 29 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates for various motor vehicle related offences. Highway and road safety continues to be a focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP.

On August 24th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a break & enter / theft from a residence along Beryl Prairie Rd. It was reported that someone had broken into a shed on the property and stole several batteries, troughs, and solar panels. No suspects observed. File remains open for further investigation.

On September 15th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP were advised that a male who was the subject of a BC RCMP media release for outstanding warrants for assault, was staying at the Sportsman Inn. Police conducted an investigation and confirmed the male to be the individual from the media release, but were unable to locate him on this date.

On September 16th, an RCMP member observed the suspect outside the Tempo gas station, resulting in a foot pursuit with the suspect fleeing toward the Sportsman Inn. Police cordoned the area off and upon a search and a tip from a local resident, the suspect was located, arrested, and taken into custody.

On September 18th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a mischief that had occurred at the House of Hope Church. It was reported that someone had broken several windows of the building with a piece of concrete and strewn pieces of glass onto the roadway and parking area. No entry was gained into the building. File remains open for investigation.

As we are soon to be entering the fall season, with the weather cooling, and the apples ripening, we will soon see the non-cuddly bears who are not our friends, and who will venture into town to find the easy pickings of apples, berries, and garbages so to fatten up for the winter. It will be our responsibility as a community as a whole, to work together to keep both bears and residents safe during these upcoming months. How can we do that you may ask? Well, it is very simple actually! All residents need to do, is pickup apples and fruit that have fallen, pick apples and fruit when ripe, and not put out your tasty smelling buffet style garbage cans prior to pick-up days. In following

these few simple steps, the bears will be less likely to venture into your yards and become habituated to humans, and as an added appeal to following these simple steps, property owners won't be issued Wildlife Act tickets for attracting dangerous wildlife which have a fine of \$230.00 for each incident.

If one requires assistance in picking their fruit trees due to physical inability, please contact Cpl. Schmidt at the local RCMP detachment as he has been working on creating several avenues to assist in keeping the bears and public safe this year.
