In no small part due to the hard work and perseverance of our District of Hudson's Hope staff we were able to salvage a significant part of the 2025 pool season and provide a much needed reprieve from the summer sun and hot days! Now that we have shut down the pool for the season, we will be looking to get a head start on diagnosing pool leaks and preparing a plan for the upcoming year. We won't know more until testing is done, but we will keep the community informed as we continue to develop our plan for the repair and rehabilitation of our wonderful, and extremely popular, outdoor pool.

Another big thank you to all our seasonal staff. Our Spring, Summer and Early Fall are without a doubt busy, as we prepare to open Campgrounds and Recreational Facilities and work to beautify our community. After which we then prepare for the coming winter months. Your hard work helps to make Hudson's Hope successful, and a center piece of the Peace Region. One that we can all be proud to live in.

Healthcare remains one of the primary concerns of all small rural communities, and one which your council are working on to take on a more active role. Connections are being made with Northern Health to address the issue of attachment. We are aware that our healthcare center has at times been unable to take on new members of the community. We are also acutely aware that the success of our community is contingent on keeping physicians in Hudson's Hope. Following a fruitful introduction, I am looking forward to working with the North Peace Division of Family Practice to address recruitment and retention of physicians and other professionals in Hudson's Hope.

We also hope to have some news from UBCM later this month on health and what measures are being taken to ensure the long term security healthcare in our community, as well as updates on several other issues your council will be bringing before the province.

On an equally forward looking front, the Multi Use Gathering Center (MUGC) has reached a milestone. A decision has been made which will solidify the course of this project moving forward. The overall scope of the project has been narrowed down and the location selected. With significant input from the community the decision has been made to proceed with planning for the new MUGC to be on the site of the current community hall. I would like to express my sincere thank you to everyone who provided feedback during the open houses, we received a lot of very good feedback!

This month we will be welcoming a new Director of Public Works to the District of Hudson's Hope! This is a position central to the operation of the community, and I am happy to welcome Desiree LeBlanc! Desiree joins us from the community of Chetwynd where she

acted as the Director of Engineering and Public Works. We will benefit greatly from her expertise and years of experience in the Peace Region.

### E-WASTE RECYCLING



Did you know that electronic waste is one of the fastest-growing types of waste in the world?

What Counts as E-Waste?

You can recycle more than you think:

- Phones, tablets, and laptops
- Keyboards, mice, and chargers
- · Old TVs and monitors
- Batteries and power banks
- Printers and small appliances

#### Why It Matters?

E-waste contains valuable materials like gold, silver, copper — but also hazardous chemicals like lead and mercury. When dumped in landfills, these toxins can leak into soil and water.

Recycling keeps harmful materials out of the

environment and puts precious metals back into use.

### ✓ How to Recycle It

- You can drop batteries at the District Office (bag them first)
- Take to the recycling depot in FSJ
- Many electronics retailers (Best Buy, Staples, etc.) offer free recycling bins
- Wipe your data before recycling phones and computers
- Never throw electronics in the trash!

### Pro Tip

Got working electronics you don't use? Consider donating them to a local school, shelter, or nonprofit organization.







It's the little tasks around your home that can make a world of difference if a wildfire comes a bit too close for comfort. To drastically increase the fire resiliency of your home you can:

- Remove debris from your gutters.
- Mow your lawn and keep it under 10cm tall.
- Relocate combustible materials (firewood, propane tanks, etc.) at least 10 meters away from your home.
- Clean out under your deck to remove combustible debris such as leaves and branches.
- Prune tree branches on your property that are within 2 m of the ground.
- Reduce highly flammable plants on your property and choose fireresistant plants to replace them.





### **Monthly Police Report**



### **Hudson's Hope RCMP Monthly Police Report**

The Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 22 calls for service between July 25<sup>th</sup> and August 19<sup>th</sup>. 34 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates for various motor vehicle related offences. Highway and road safety continues to be a focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP.

On July 26<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a verbal altercation between two persons at the rodeo event in which one person brandished a firearm. Based on the investigation, a male was arrested for possession of a firearm for a dangerous purpose with the firearm being seized. This matter is currently before the courts.

On July 28<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a verbal altercation between two persons with one of the persons brandishing a knife. No physical or verbal threats were made with the knife and the individual with the knife was removed from the area. No charges were sought as the complainant declined pressing charges.

On August 1<sup>st</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP conducted a check on a suspicious vehicle at the Alwin Holland Park with the driver and passengers being found to be under the influence of alcohol and marijuana. The driver was issued several fines, a 12-hour license suspension, and further received a driving prohibition.

On August 15<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of an uttering threats that stemmed from a residence along Boynton Street. It was reported that several youths were at the school basketball court and upon walking along the fence line, an unknown person from one of the nearby residences, repeatedly threatened to shoot the youths. No firearm was observed. This file remains open for investigation.

On August 17<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a noise complaint in the area of Macintosh Crescent and Turner Crescent as it was reported that there was a loud gathering at a local residence with music playing loudly past 2am. Police located and attended the residence with many of the persons scattering and hiding within the green space behind the property. Police spoke with the homeowner, who agreed to turn down the music. No fines were issued.

On August 18<sup>th</sup>, a suspicious grey Audi with Ontario license plates was pulled over along Highway 29 with a male occupant attempting to flag down passing motorists. An off-duty RCMP member stopped and upon speaking with the male, he stated that he had lost his

wallet and only had a few liters of fuel left, then immediately offered to let the off-duty member hold onto his "gold" bracelet as collateral if they gave him some money. Upon several questions being asked, the male became uninterested in this transaction and walked away. This is a scam attempt where people try to give you jewelry to hold as collateral for cash money and in the end, they do not return for said jewelry as it is not worth anything and the good Samaritan is out the money. These individuals have been noted attempting this scam in multiple areas throughout the Peace area.

On a more non-illegal fun side of things, the Hudson's Hope RCMP will be setting up a police cruiser at the upcoming Hudson's Hope Fall Fair on September 6<sup>th</sup> with the goal of stuffing the cruiser full of non-perishable foods and/or cash donations for the Friend's of Hudson's Hope food drive. 




