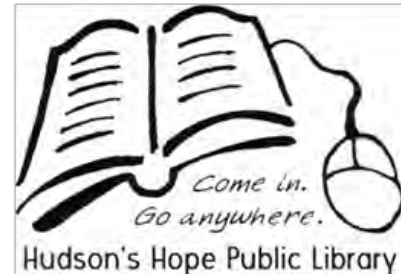

# *Protective Services*

## **Did you know it is illegal to feed wildlife, including deer within the District of Hudson's Hope?**

There are a number of conditioned deer in the Hudson's Hope area that cause concern for residents. The majority of the problems experienced within our community are the direct result of human intervention in an otherwise natural cycle – that is, feeding wildlife. Even though the action stems from good intentions, ***the consequences of feeding wildlife does not bode well for the wildlife, or for humans.***

The municipal office continues to receive reports of concern - especially from parents of young children - about the boldness and unnatural aggressive tendencies of some deer in our community. Normally deer in the wild view humans as predators and move away quickly when people approach. Many of the deer in Hudson's Hope do not display that behavior.

Feeding wildlife causes them to become conditioned to human presence to the point where the animals no longer have any fear of humans, and in some cases, threaten bodily injury to public members. It is not uncommon to see deer eating from bird feeders, entering sheds, or being hand fed. The deer view the town as a safe haven where they can fill their bellies in a fraction of the time it would take in their natural habitat. These eating habits are *unnatural* and can cause poor health and possibly premature death.

This level of familiarity many eventually lead to the demise of individual animals through harassment by dogs, disease transfer, increased chance of vehicle collisions, or being shot by individuals concerned for human safety. Winter feeding results in unnaturally high concentration of deer in a small area, especially over several years with the birth of successive generations born that do not know any other life style. This creates changes in their social behaviour and a weakening in the gene pool due to the loss of the natural selection mechanisms. This is also true in the semi-rural areas such as Jamieson, Thompson, and Lynx Creek subdivisions. In those areas predators have been attracted such as coyotes into the residential areas. Once in the area, livestock and pets also become table fare for these predators.

**The only real solution is to discontinue any feeding of deer in the vicinity of Hudson's Hope.** Deer that continue to seek food sources in back yards **need to be given "negative conditioning" or a punishment.** This can be accomplished with sling shots, blood meal, a barking dog, or noise makers. **It is important that the deer are NOT rewarded with food for their visit to your yard.** These animals are very capable of foraging for themselves in their natural habitat. Those that do succumb to starvation are being subject to nature's law of "natural selection". While this may seem cruel and harsh, it is for the benefit of the whole population to allow the fittest to survive. ## Police Report: January 2015



Over the last month, Hudson's Hope RCMP Detachment responded to approximately 35 calls for service.

Some incidents of note during the month are as follows:

- A road check on Beattie Drive resulted in one driver providing a "WARN" breath sample which carried the penalty of a three day driving prohibition.
- Just before Christmas, there was a theft of two Terex light towers that were stolen from the Farrell Creek Road. One light tower was found the following day, dumped off on a property on the Beryl Prairie Road. One tower is still missing. Any information please contact Hudson's Hope RCMP or Crime Stoppers.
- A check was made on a vehicle on Canyon Drive which resulted in a rifle seized and a large amount of liquor poured out roadside. The firearm was seized as none of the vehicles occupants had a firearms licence. The rifle is now back in the hands of the owner. No charges.
- Just after midnight on New Year's Eve, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a single vehicle rollover on the Farrell Creek Road. Hudson's Hope RCMP was assisted by Dawson Creek ICARS (Integrated Collision Analysis and Reconstruction Service), North Peace Traffic Services, Hudson's Hope Fire Rescue, and BC Ambulance Service. Upon attendance, 3 individuals had succumbed to their injuries at the scene. (Deceased were 3 men aged: driver 41, passengers 28 & 25, all from Alberta). The cause of the crash is still under investigation but alcohol and speed have not been ruled out.
- On January 18<sup>th</sup>, two stop signs and a yield sign were knocked down by a truck of some sort in the Jamieson Subdivision area. Tracks in the snow clearly showed the driver deliberately drove over the signs. Again, please contact police with any information.
- On January 19<sup>th</sup>, Hudson's Hope RCMP members were called out for a report of a fight in progress. A local female was arrested and charged with two counts of assault with a weapon and one charge of breach of conditions. This matter is before the courts.
- Miscellaneous other files included a total of four collisions, three animal related calls, driving complaints, shots fired, assisting another detachment with arresting an individual with a warrant, and three false alarms.

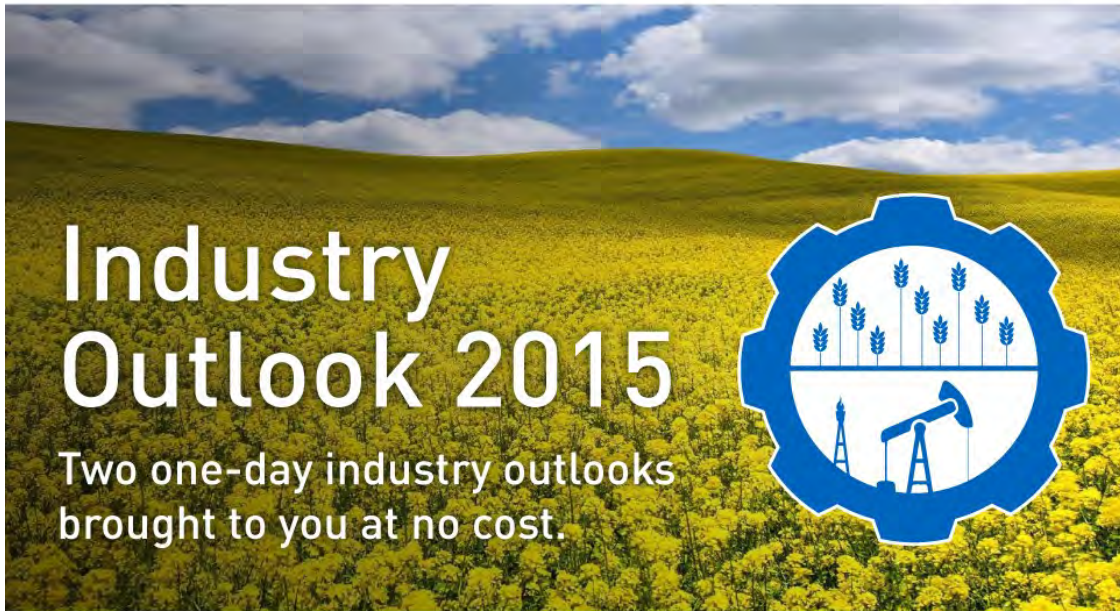

If you were looking for some inspiration to get into an exercise program, this will do it. Many thanks to BC Hydro Generation and Greta Goddard for working out a way to make the Center a reality. Now that it's here, please do use it.

**Street Lighting**

We're pleased to have completed the changeover in lighting on the poles that belong to the District. It's nice to be able to see where you're going in the dark! We look forward to the BC Hydro poles being changed out in the next year. Not only will we be able to see in the dark, but it should significantly lower the District electricity bills!

**BC Premier's Conference**

Councillors Heiberg, Gilliss and I travelled to Prince George for the BC Premier's Conference last week. A quick summary of the news:

**LNG** – still no Final Investment Decisions. Minister Coleman said he thought at least one would be made in 2015. Petronus is the one which affects Hudson's Hope the most but the Minister did not indicate



whether that was the decision he expected. As you may heard on the news, Petronus has withdrawn its application for an environmental assessment of the large expansion of the gas plant just north of the Hudson's Hope boundary. That expansion was planned by Talisman when they owned the property but Petronus has indicated that they want to do their own evaluation of a gas plant location, as they have a lot of subsurface further north and east.

**Coal** – As you probably know, we have heard nothing from CKD Coal about their proposed coal mine for sometime. That's not surprising, given that the coal mines that were operating in the Peace River area have all closed down due to the glut of coal on the market and the low price. At the conference, a representative of the mining industry said he couldn't predict when coal prices might increase. That being the case, it doesn't appear that a coal mine in the Hudson's Hope area is in the works in the near future.

**Site C** – Hydro was not at the Conference, but Minister Bennett indicated they plan to go ahead as planned this summer. From other sources, I hear that they plan to be on the land on June 21<sup>st</sup>.

## Lynx Creek Water

The Ministry of Environment Advisory to not use Lynx Creek water for human or animal consumption or for irrigation has not been lifted. I've been trying to find out what the Ministry plans to do about that. So far, they don't seem to have any plan to do anything other than let the creek cleanse itself. That's all very well, but we still have no indication of where the heavy metals came from other than the sand that came out of the bank. So we really don't know what to do to ensure that they don't continue to contaminate the creek. Samples of nearby wells do not show the high level of heavy metals found in the creek so they apparently have not moved into the groundwater. I'll continue working to try and determine what needs to be done to restore the creek to a usable state.

Back to the message for February: get out and enjoy the Winter Carnival!

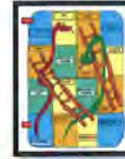

## MONTHLY FIELD STUDIES SUMMARY

### February 2015

BC Hydro is continuing to conduct environmental and engineering field studies on and around the Peace River between the Williston Reservoir and the Alberta border to inform detailed mitigation and monitoring planning. In December 2014, the Site C project received approval from the provincial government to proceed to construction. Construction of the project is planned to start in summer 2015.
