
Municipal Services Invoices and Business Licences were mailed out in the middle of January. If you have not yet received yours please call the District Office.





Sock It to Winter!

I write this having just returned from the official opening of the Hudson's Hope 2016 Winter Carnival. What a beautiful day to take in winter: beautiful blue sky, sunshine so bright it was blinding, hoarfrost clinging to tree branches, and brilliant white snow crunching underfoot. Temperatures were just low enough to nip the nose and make rosy cheeks. We couldn't have asked for a better day to kick off the annual Hudson's Hope Winter Carnival. "Sock it to Winter!" runs a full 8 days, winding up on Sunday, January 31st.

Events got off to a great start with the Ice Sculpting & Snow Fest, which attracted a good crowd of participants and onlookers. If you weren't able to watch the sculpting, do take a few minutes to stroll through Beattie Park and see the finished products. There are some great sculptures on display!

Finally, browse through the "**Sock It to Winter!**" program to check out the week's many activities. There's something there for everyone. So make sure to have some winter fun!

Williston Dinosaur Trackway

As you may know, a large-scale dinosaur track site has been discovered near Williston Reservoir. Protection and research are being undertaken by Rich McCrae and Lisa Buckley, two paleontologists based in Tumbler Ridge. They have managed to raise \$202,600 towards this project. That budget will allow for a large-scale 6-8 week research effort to be undertaken by a number of volunteers and several invited international paleontologists who specialize in finds such as this.

Site Unveiling Event - Saturday, July 9

July 9 has tentatively been set as the date for a site unveiling ceremony where academics, dignitaries and locals can mingle and learn both some ancient history of the site, as well as some potential for future development.

In addition to the researchers, the heads of the Dalglish Family Foundation, which contributed \$200,000 to the project, plan to be in attendance.

Rich McCrae, says the first step of the research will be to expose as large an area of the track surface as possible – probably about 1000 square meters. Then they will conduct high-resolution 3D-imaging of the tracks and trackways, construct a square meter grid over the surface to create a 2-D track site map, measure all tracks and trackways, and make silicone and latex molds of the most important tracks. Those will be curated at the Peace Region Paleontology Research Centre (PRPRC). They will also record activities by video, including drone footage of the research, all of which will be used to promote fund-raising efforts to construct a building over a portion of the track surface. The purpose of the building would be to both protect the trackway and establish a new major paleontological tourism attraction in this area.

Tumbler Ridge, in recognition of its dinosaur museum displays and other attractions, has been recognized as a UNESCO Global Geopark. Just across the BC/Alberta border, at Wembley, is the recently opened Philip J Currie Museum. Nearby is the largest horned

dinosaur bone-bed in the world – the home of Pachyrhinosaurus Lakustai. Rich McCrae assures us that the Williston Trackway is of very high quality and of international significance. A building to showcase the site would make it the third link in a "Northern Dinosaur Trail" that could increase tourism in the Peace region.

Interested in Getting Involved?

Rich McCrae is looking for local volunteers who could help with logistics and materials for the research program this year:

- -Information about the condition of Johnson Creek Road. Is it drivable and open to the public between now and the spring?
- -Trailers (eg. a couple of Atco trailers) for use as a camp kitchen, dining area, showers and accommodations for visiting researchers.
- -Concrete dividers in order to protect the site during and after the research this summer, he is thinking of placing the dividers around the perimeter of the site. He would need about 200 meters worth, and they would need to stay in place until the building is constructed. So it would be a temporary, but long-term loan.
- -Volunteer cooks for the camp for the week or two that the international researchers (probably about 10 from China and the US) are on-site.
- -In-kind support which could include fuel for generators and vehicles and a potable water supply.





Police Report: February 2016



From December 15th, 2015 to January 20th, 2016, Hudson's Hope RCMP Detachment responded to approximately 20 calls for service. Some incidents of note during that time are as follows:

On December 22nd, 2015, Hudson's Hope RCMP were advised by a local citizen that they had received calls from an unknown male stating he was calling from the Canada Revenue Agency and that she owed money. The male stated police would arrest her if she did not pay. This is a common scam used by fraudsters often. Should you receive a call such as this please notify the RCMP immediately and never divulge personal information or send money to anyone soliciting over the phone. Visit the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre web page for information about common scams and information on how to protect yourself from fraudsters.

Over the last few weeks, Hudson's Hope RCMP conducted random Check Stops on local roadways in an effort to combat impaired driving and enforce motor vehicle act compliance.

During this time, Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to two motor vehicle collisions. Driver error, road conditions, and speed relative to conditions continue to be factors in collisions the police are responding to. Motorists should drive at a safe speed for the conditions and remember that the posted speed limit is for ideal conditions.

On January 10th, 2016, the Hudson's Hope RCMP were made aware of a suspicious incident on two properties in the Beryl Prairie area. Unknown persons appeared to have left footprints in the snow as they walked onto the two properties. The footprints approached parked vehicles and outbuildings. The RCMP would like to remind citizens to protect their property with lighting and by locking their vehicle and residence doors. Should you observe any suspicious persons in your area or on your property, attempt to safely obtain descriptions of persons and plate numbers of vehicles, and contact the RCMP immediately.

The Hudson's Hope RCMP is currently investigating two serious domestic assaults causing injuries. The accused offenders in both files are facing several Criminal Code charges.

The Hudson's Hope RCMP requests anyone having information regarding current or past investigations, or any criminal activity, to contact the Hudson's Hope RCMP directly, or anonymously through Crime Stoppers at 1-800-222-8477.

January is Crime Stoppers Month.

The Crime Stoppers program guarantees the anonymity of the tipster. Crime Stoppers does not subscribe to call display, will not record your call and you are not required to testify in court. If your information leads to an arrest, you could qualify for a cash reward of up to \$2000.

DEVELOPMENT OF AN INTEGRATED PEST MANAGEMENT PLAN



Reference #106-271-16/21

Progress Energy Canada Ltd (Progress) is revising their current Integrated Pest Management Plan (IPMP) under British Columbia's *Integrated Pest Management Act* and associated regulations. Under these regulations this plan is required to be revised every five years.

The purpose of this revision is to ensure safe and effective vegetation and invasive weed control by utilizing the most current integrated pest management techniques along Progress Energy pipeline rights-of-way, associated facilities, lease sites and related infrastructure. This IPMP will cover various vegetation control activities near communities such as Fort St. John, Fort Nelson, Dawson Creek, Taylor, Buick, and other small communities within the Northern Rockies Regional Municipality and Peace River Regional District.

Under this newly developed integrated pest management plan, the following selective methods are proposed and may be used alone or in combination, depending on particular local circumstances:

- •Non-herbicide Integrated vegetation control measures that may include mechanical, manual, cultural, prevention and biological.
- •Herbicide control methods may include ATV mounted nozzles, selective backpack and handgun sprayers. All herbicides will be applied by licensed applicators.
- •Trade names of herbicides that are included as part of this integrated pest management plan: Vantage XRT, Vantage Plus Max, Roundup, Vision Max, Sightline, Clearview, Milestone, Navius VM, Escort, Tordon 22K, Tordon 101, Vanquish, Overdrive, Banvel VM, 2,4-D Amine, MCPA Amine 500, Truvist, Esplanade SC, Transline, Lontrel 360, Telar XP and Startup.
- •Active ingredients in these products are: Aminopyralid, metsulfuron-methyl, Diflunfezopyr, MCPA, Picloram, 2,4-D, Chlorsulfuron, Dicamba, Aminocyclopyrachlor, Indaziflam, Clopyralid, Glyphosate.

The proposed effective date for this Progress Energy IPMP is May 31st, 2016 to May 30th, 2021.

Automated External Defibrillators

What are They?

An automated external defibrillator (AED) is a small, portable device used to identify cardiac rhythms and deliver a shock to correct abnormal electrical activity in the heart. AEDs are used to treat <u>sudden cardiac arrest</u> (SCA).

Up to 40,000 cardiac arrests occur each year in Canada. That's one cardiac arrest every 12 minutes.



Eighty-five per cent of cardiac arrests in Canada happen outside of hospitals, and

having an AED close by can make all the difference. The American Heart Association warns that for every minute lost before defibrillation, the survival rate decreases by seven to 10 per cent. After 12 minutes, the survival rate plummets to less than five per cent.

AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR

When CPR and an AED are both used within five minutes of a cardiac arrest, the chance of survival rises by nearly 75 per cent, according to research published in the Journal of the American College of Cardiology.

Where are They?

Quick access to an AED can greatly improve a patient's survivability rate, and knowing where AEDs are located within your community can help facilitate this. Fortunately there are a number of AEDs located within the District of Hudson's Hope. Emergency responders including police, fire and BC Ambulance all have devices on their apparatus and vehicles. There are also AEDs located at the pool in the summer and at the arena in the winter, and staff at these locations have training in their use. Hudson's Hope School has an AED in the staff room and has staff trained in its use .Other places that might be less obvious are the library where an AED is on site, and staff and board members have received training in AED and CPR, and the Silver Willows facility where they also have an AED available.

ANNUAL COMMUNITY WATER SYSTEMS REPORT FOR HUDSON'S HOPE

The District of Hudson's Hope water system currently supplies potable drinking water to approximately 900 residents or 276 residential connections, 23 commercial connections, a commercial water stand, and a residential water stand. Prior to being distributed to town services from the open surface water source of the Peace River, all water is treated in the Water Treatment Plant. The Water Treatment Plant currently treats about 313,052 m3 of water a year. The demand on the treatment system is at its lowest during the winter months, treating approximately 700 cubic meters a day, and at its highest during the summer months, treating approximately 1400 cubic meters a day.

The water treatment process involves raw river water being pumped up to Water Treatment Plant, through a series of media filtration tanks. The media consists of different sized media in layers. This media separates turbidity in the water that pathogens can attach themselves to. There are four coarse filters and four fine filters paired with ultra violet light and sodium hypochlorite injection to support the process in successfully destroying all pathogens that may have initially entered the water supply.

The water plant facility (as certified by the provincial regulatory body of the Environmental Operations Control Program (EOCP) is operated by two qualified full time employees who also serve in other areas of Public Works Operations.

Constant computer and "hands on" monitoring of the plant is achieved through a series of sensors and monitors that assist operators in assuring town and business residents the best water quality possible.

The District of Hudson's Hope is required by the Northern Health Authority to obtain water samples from different locations and remit the collected samples to a certified laboratory for bacteriological testing twice a month.

To date all monthly bacteriological analysis samples have been returned as having a satisfactory quality rating. An annual Total Potability Test from designated locations, determined by the Northern Health Authority are sent to an accredited laboratory for comprehensive testing to assure all water users that a higher than acceptable value is maintained.

On an annual basis, the Public Works Department flushes all water distribution lines that supply town residents. This is done as a proactive measure to ensure all residents are supplied with water of a satisfactory quality.

The Beryl Prairie well is separate from the town system. The BP well is treated with sodium hypochlorite. This well is monitored by District employees. It is also part of the water sampling and analysis procedures.


