In Hudson's Hope the majority of the streets are named after the pioneers, men and women that came to the area and settled, farmed, trapped and traded. Over the next couple of months, we will be giving you a little history on the people that your streets are named after!

Next Up – Adams Street



Jack and Lucille Adams, came to the Peace region in 1913 to prospect near Finaly Forks. They built a small log home high on the banks of the Parsnip River. They only stayed the winter and headed south in the spring, but in 1920 they returned to the north with their two children Don and

Jacqueline. Jack built a large log home on the banks of the Peace upstream from Beatties – it was a magnificent home with a huge stone fireplace and balconies overlooking the river. They named their new home "All's Well". Jack was know for

his skills and strength as a woodsman and Lucille was known as an artistic and inspired woman.

The museum is always looking for volunteers if you have a keen interest in history or would just like to learn a little more about the valley we live in come out and volunteer – we have lots of scanning and accessioning of historical photos and artifacts to be done – training is provided.



Notes from the Field: Caribou Maternity Pen for Calves Proving Successful

The endangered Klinse-Za and Scott East Mountain Caribou population has doubled since 2014 thanks, in part, to a fenced, six-hectare maternity pen. The project is led by Wildlife Infometrics in collaboration with West Moberly and Saulteau First Nations. In summary:

- In 2013, the size of the combined herds was 32 individual caribou;
- The calves will stay in the pen until the youngest is about six weeks old and less vulnerable to predators;
- Calves born in the maternity pen have a higher survival rate than calves in the wild;
- Nine caribou cows were captured by net-gunning from a helicopter in March and

have been monitored, along with the calves born in the pen, by veterinarians;

- Seven calves were born in the pen this year;
- The safe enclosure is guarded 24-hours a day by shepherds from the West Moberly and Saulteau First Nations;
- There are now 61 caribou in this herd, not including the calves born in 2017; and
- Since it was set up in 2014, 35 calves have been born in the pen.

The Fish & Wildlife Compensation Program (FWCP) has been funding the maternity pen for the last two years as part of its mandate to conserve and enhance fish and wildlife impacted by existing BC Hydro dams.

Other project partners include: Wildlife Infometrics, West Moberly First Nations and Saulteau First Nations, Teck Coal, West Fraser Mills, Treaty 8 Tribal Association, Canadian Forest Products, BC Ministry of Forests, Lands, and Natural Resource Operations, Enbridge, Anglo American Coal, Conuma Coal, BC Hydro, Environment and Climate Change Canada, TransCanada, BC Oil and Gas Research and Innovation Society (BC OGRIS), and the BC Boreal Caribou Research Effectiveness Monitoring Board (REMB).



The FWCP is a partnership between BC Hydro, the Province of B.C., Fisheries and Oceans Canada, First Nations and Public Stakeholders to conserve and enhance fish and wildlife impacted by existing BC Hydro dams. 
PROPERTY TAXES DUE



Police Report: June 2017



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to approximately 30 calls for service over the last four weeks. RCMP members were involved in many community events and assisted in a Fentanyl information session presented to the public by BC Community Paramedicine. Any landlords that could not attend the information session can contact the detachment for a list of helpful websites and guides pertaining to Landlord Tenancy issues and concerns.

On May 30th, 2017, Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a report of a male pushing a shopping cart on Highway 29 near Halfway River. The male was eventually located at a nearby residence. He had been checked by police and ambulance several times over the previous few days and was taken to the local clinic for assessment. Local good Samaritans and RCMP chipped in to offer him a few meals and a night stay at a local motel. RCMP provided him a ride to Chetwynd the next day as he was on his way to William's Lake. It was great seeing our community coming together to help a man in need. He offered his thanks many times over.

On May 30th, 2017, Hudson's Hope RCMP was called to a local residence for a break and enter that occurred the previous night. The scene was processed and a suspect identified. The file is still under investigation and charges are pending.

On June 3rd, 2017, Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to several trees on the highway as a result of a sudden wind storm passing through the area. Many power wires were broken however no injuries resulted from the storm. One downed tree caused a small fire which was extinguished by our local fire fighters.

The area is closed for your safety. Please operate your vessels responsibly.

This year's Fishing Derby was a successful one. The RCMP and BC Conservation Office conducted many checks and issued several warnings and violation tickets for noted infractions. The RCMP will be conducting many boat patrols this summer on local lakes and rivers.




