

### **Hudson's Hope Pharmacy**

#### **Stacey Dixon**

As you all probably know, our tele-pharmacy is at risk of closing because the BC College of Pharmacists, the professional association which governs pharmacies, made a decision that as of December 31, 2016, tele-pharmacy employees would have to be pharmacy technicians, rather than pharmacy assistants, which is what both Hudson's Hope Pharmacy employees are/were.

Stacey Dixon, one of the assistants, registered to become a qualified technician, and after years of courses, assignments and practicums, she had only one short work-experience left before graduating as a fully qualified Pharmacy Technician. We thought we were home free! Tragically, Stacey died very suddenly on October 16. It is just so sad and so unfair! She was so determined to do her part to keep our local pharmacy open that it just doesn't seem right that after all those years of hard work, and being so close to success, that it was taken from her and from us. Our hearts and our condolences go out to her family, relatives and friends.

#### **Going Forward: Letters of Support Needed**

Despite the sad setback, we will continue efforts to ensure that our Pharmacy can continue to operate. Last spring, we submitted a resolution to the Union of BC Municipalities (UBCM) asking that the province and the College work together to find a solution for small-town pharmacies. Our resolution was endorsed at the annual Conference in September. That means that finding ways to keep small-town, rural pharmacies open is now an official policy of local governments in BC. We will ask UBCM to write a letter supporting our efforts.

Please send letters of support to the College of Pharmacists explaining why it is important to you to keep the Hudson's Hope Pharmacy open, especially how the health of you, your family, or the community will be affected, if it is closed.

### **Landlords Be Aware!**

In the near future, RCMP will be hosting an information session on how landlords can protect themselves when they rent out property. As some of our citizens discovered last week, being a trusting, small rural town doesn't exempt us from big town urban problems. It turns out that a man claiming to be a construction worker in need of a place to live was instead intending to set up an illicit lab to manufacture illegal pills. Instead of rental income, the house owners are now left with a contaminated site to deal with.

If you have rental property, keep an eye out for the upcoming RCMP information session and do attend to get tips on how to protect yourself.

### **Advice from the BC Water Comptroller:**

If you have a well, make sure that you keep all records, including when it was drilled, test results, changes in quantity or quality etc.

If you use the well for anything other than domestic use, your well will need to be registered. There is no cost if you register it within the grace period, which right now is February, 2017. The grace period may be extended, but when it is over, a fee will be charged.

#### Shop:

The new Public Works Shop is well underway. The gas line is in, the trusses up, and the main roof is on. The latter must be a welcome accomplishment for the crew,

Business Retention and Expansion, or "BRE", as it is often called, is considered by many communities to be the cornerstone of their economic development plan. And it should be! The NPEDC will be providing an outlook for the Bulletin of the overall results early in the New Year. The team would like to thank all of the businesses who are taking part in the program.





## Police Report: October 2016



Hudson's Hope RCMP Detachment responded to approximately 40 calls for service over the last four weeks. Five motor vehicle collisions occurred during this time. One impaired driving investigation was initiated.

On September 28<sup>th</sup>, 2016, Hudson's Hope RCMP was advised of suspicious person(s) attempting theft from a motor vehicle on Beryl Prairie Road. No suspects have been identified at this time. Citizens are reminded to lock their vehicles and remove any valuables from view.

On September 28<sup>th</sup>, 2016, a driver left a vehicle in drive when stopped at Fas Gas and the vehicle subsequently continued across Canyon Drive. It entered the parking lot of Stillwater Inn and collided with a parked vehicle. Luckily no injuries resulted. The driver received a warning regarding not ensuring the vehicle was in park.

On October 12<sup>th</sup>, 2016, Police were advised of a damaged gate and fencing on a rural property of Beryl Prairie. Unknown person(s) used force to enter a property, likely to hunt without permission. The file remains under investigation.

On October 18<sup>th</sup>, 2016, Police, BC Ambulance, and Hudson's Hope Fire and Rescue were called to single vehicle collision on Highway 29 near Farrell Creek. A vehicle was observed in the river at the bottom of a cliff. A male driver was recovered at scene. The cause of the collision is still under investigation.

On October 15<sup>th</sup>, 2016, Hudson's Hope RCMP was alerted by the landlord of a local residence, of the presence of a hazardous and toxic substance left inside by tenants. A search warrant was obtained and the residence was searched by police. The substance was tested and found to be a controlled drug, Fentanyl, which is extremely toxic and hazardous. This incident is still under investigation.

#### THE DANGERS OF ILLICIT DRUGS: NOT JUST A CITY PROBLEM

The effects of fentanyl are unpredictable. Users have no idea of the level of purity or the potency of what they take.

Fentanyl is a synthetic product that is part of the same family as morphine. However, it is fifty to one hundred times more potent.

Fentanyl can be absorbed through the skin or by inhalation and cause damage to health. It is prescribed to relieve chronic pain.

In the form of powder, fentanyl is sometimes sold as heroin. In the form of tablets, it is sometimes sold as OxyContin<sup>MD</sup> or any other opiate.

When mixed with antidepressants, fentanyl is potentially mortal. Abuse of prescription drugs can lead to addiction and be just as harmful as illicit drugs.

The possession of this substance without a prescription is illegal. The drugs as well as the precursors used to produce them are included in Schedules I to VIII of the *Controlled Drugs and Substances Act.* Offences range from simple possession to possession for the purpose of trafficking, trafficking, importing, exporting, possession for the purpose of exporting, and producing. All these offences are punishable by criminal sanctions.

Fentanyl is a highly potent and addictive synthetic opioid analgesic that is estimated to be up to 100 times more potent than morphine. Fentanyl has legitimate medicinal uses as an anesthetic and for severe pain management, and is regulated under the Food and Drugs Act as well as under the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act. Domestically, illicit fentanyl can be found in powder or liquid form as well as pressed into tablets mimicking the appearance of known pharmaceuticals such as OxyContin. Rental properties are being used to facilitate manufacture of illicit drugs through clandestine labs, causing significant health risks and property damage.

## PROTECTIVE SERVICES

#### What is a Winter Tire?

British Columbia accepts "mountain snowflake" or "mud and snow" tires with at least 3.5 mm tread as winter tires.

### **Check your tires for these signs:**

The mountain/snowflake symbol on the side of the tire These winter tires offer the best traction on snow and ice, and in cold weather.

The mud and snow symbol on the side of the tire These winter tires offer better traction than summer tires, however, they are less effective than mountain/snowflake tires on snow and ice, and in cold weather.

**3.5** mm tread Tires must have 3.5 mm of tread remaining to be considered winter tires.

Matching Winter Tires You must have at least 2 matching winter tires on the same axle, but it is recommended to use 4 matching tires.

#### **Studded Tires**

May be used on BC highways from October 1 to April 30, but **must** have mountain/snowflake or M+S symbols to be considered winter tires.



## When are Winter Tires or Chains Right for Me?

Winter tires and chains can make your vehicle safer.

You **MUST** use winter tires (passenger vehicles) or carry chains (commercial trucks) between October 1 and March 31 on **most BC Highways**.

British Columbia's climates range from freezing cold to pleasantly mild in the winter; equipping your vehicle appropriately depends on what you are driving and where you are driving. Drivers in some parts of the southern coast, where regulations are more relaxed due to warmer weather, should use discretion when equipping their vehicles.


