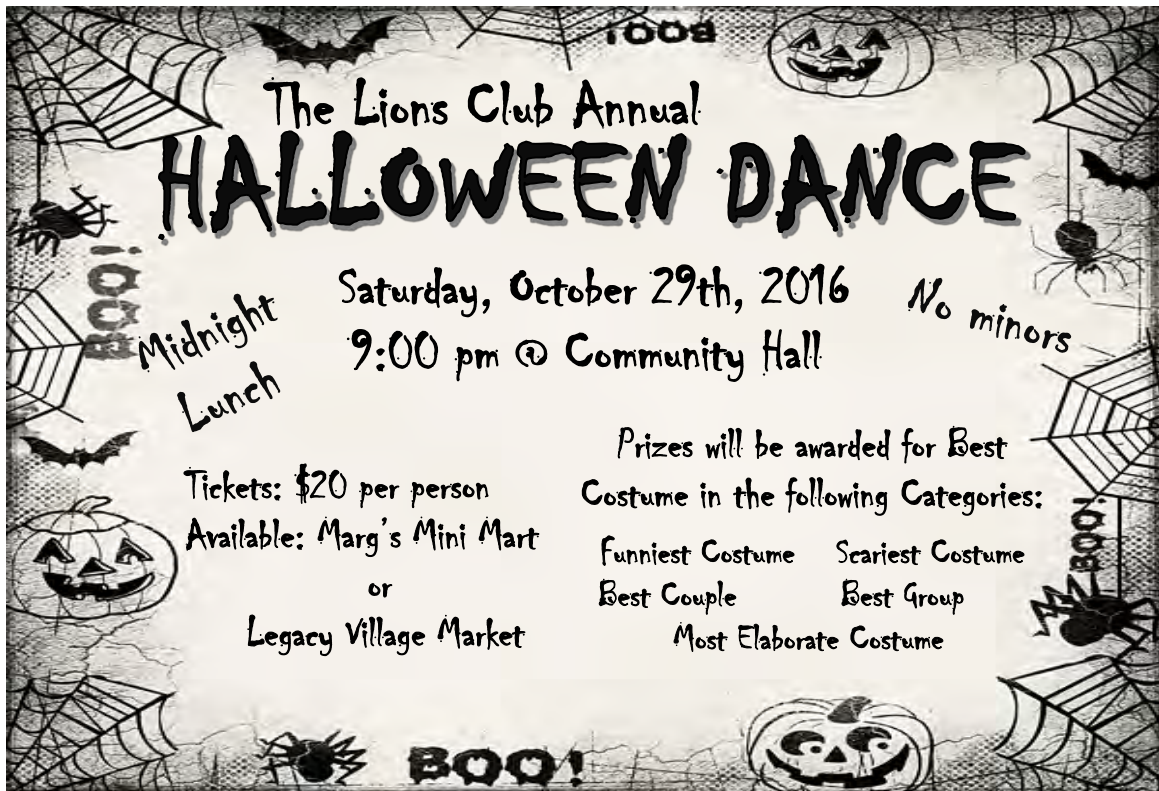

## *District of Hudson's Hope*

What a beautiful, beautiful fall we are having! It's hard not to love life when you live in such a beautiful place at such a beautiful time of year.

### **New Staff**

Lots happening at the municipal hall these days. I would like to officially welcome two new staff members at the office. Tammy McKeown joins us as Corporate Officer, filling the position left vacant by Dwylla Moraice-Budalich, who moved over to the RCMP office. Tammy has lived in Hudson's Hope for four years, working from home for Revenue Canada.

Emily Nusse fills a new one-year temporary position of Recreation Coordinator. In addition to coordinating recreation activities, and securing recreation-related grants, she will take over special events, which have been capably organized for the past many years by Greta Goddard. Emily comes to us from Rossland. A warm welcome to you both.

### **Water**

Groundwater and surface water continue to be a focus in our area. Dr. Gilles Wendling, a hydro-geologist, was contracted by the Regional District to gather all water data available in the region, convert it to standardized units for easy reference, and note any trends in water quality or quantity that could be identified using the data that we have available. The GW Solutions Report establishes a baseline that will be invaluable for future reference, and flags some potential trouble spots and parameters. With the exception of Brenot /Lynx Creek, water around Hudson's Hope seems to be within Canadian acceptable guidelines. Trends are difficult to identify because of lack of data but traces of some elements that would be expected only in very deep aquifers have shown up in shallow groundwater. That is worrisome and needs to be better understood and monitored.

The Ministry of Environment has been measuring water flow in Lynx Creek at the bridge. I have asked that they collect samples to also test quality, as that water has not been tested since 2015. There is a possibility of a monitoring well being drilled at Lynx Creek as well.

Last week Dr. Wendling presented his findings in the Peace area communities. A big thank-you to the *Custodians of the Peace Country Society* for sponsoring the presentation in Hudson's Hope. Had they not, we would have had to travel to Chetwynd or Fort St John to hear it. I'm pleased to report that the turnout in Hudson's Hope was over double that in Dawson Creek, Fort St John or Chetwynd!



### **Results from Aerial Data Program**

Last summer, a helicopter with instrumentation hanging from it, flew a grid over the North Peace. It was gathering data which can be used to locate underground aquifers. The program is under Geo-Science BC and I've asked Carlos Salas, who is in charge of it, to make a presentation in Hudson's Hope. He has agreed to come in mid-October. We'll post it when we have a date and time.

### **Union of BC Municipalities Conference**

Our two areas of focus at this year's conference are health care and roads. At our meeting with Northern Health, we will be expressing our appreciation for the locum coverage they have provided this summer, and for the appointment of a permanent doctor. Resolution of the doctor issue has been huge. Our "ask" will be that they make the lab/x-ray technician full-time so that a full spectrum of health care is available every weekday.

Although the paramedic service is not under Northern Health, they will be part of the service delivery plan and we will be inquiring how this new service will be coordinated and what the District might do to assist.

Again, it is not under Northern Health, but we will be emphasizing the need to keep our local pharmacy open.

Our emphasis on the transportation front will be to emphasize the need for highway repairs to be built to a higher standard in light of the more extreme weather events that we are now experiencing. We also have a list of local maintenance issues such as pedestrian safety at the post office, soil instability at various locations, the need for runaway lanes on Farrell Creek Road, and passing lanes.

### **Nice Clean Highway Right-of-Way**

Kudos to Roy Kelly, who has made it his personal mission to try to keep Highway #29 between Lynx Creek and Jamieson Subdivision garbage-free. He spent a back-breaking day last week, as a lot of garbage had been thrown out since he did the same thing last spring. It's a real expression of community pride, so let's all of us help out by keeping our garbage in the vehicle until we get to a garbage can.

## Police Report: September 2016



Hudson's Hope RCMP Detachment responded to approximately 37 calls for service over the last four weeks.

Hudson's Hope RCMP, BC Conservation Services and the BC Ministry of Environment conducted a joint enforcement check stop in an effort to enforce the Motor Vehicle Act, Criminal Code offences and the Wildlife Act. Approximately 130 vehicles and drivers were checked. Two marihuana seizures resulted and several written warnings were issued.

Hudson's Hope RCMP have been busy with abandoned 911 calls from faulty phone lines. Property owners are asked to consult with their phone service providers when lines are disconnected improperly, damaged or no longer in use, to have them disconnected properly.

Hudson's Hope RCMP encourages property owners to be Bear Aware. Make every effort to secure garbage and remove fallen and unwanted fruit and vegetables from yards and gardens. Sightings of nuisance bears should be reported to the Conservation Office RAPP line, 1-877-952-7277, and in cases of risk to public and personal safety, please call 911 for assistance.

On September 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2016, a traffic stop resulted in a driver being issued several violation tickets for no insurance, no driver licence and driving contrary to licence restrictions. The driver was also found to driving on a suspended licence and a charge for driving while suspended has been submitted.

On September 4<sup>th</sup>, 2016, Hudson's Hope RCMP was called for a report of an aggressive loose dog. The aggressive dog sustained minor injuries from the incident. The file has been referred to the local bylaw officer.

The Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a domestic assault at a local residence. A male was arrested for assault and released a short time later with strict conditions of no contact with the victim. An assault charge has been forwarded.

Anyone with information regarding current or past investigations, or any criminal activity, is asked to contact the RCMP directly, or anonymously through Crime Stoppers at 1-800-222-8477.

### Back to School Safety

The Hudson's Hope RCMP would like to welcome students back to school and remind everyone to be safe while travelling to and from school. The 30 km/hr school zone is implemented during school days and drivers are asked to be vigilant for pedestrians, especially in the morning when children are present and fog and mist are likely to affect a driver's view.

Test smoke alarms at least once a month by pushing the test button.



If the smoke alarm sounds, get outside and stay outside. Go to your outside meeting place.



Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of the home, including the basement. Larger homes may need more alarms. For the best protection, make sure all smoke alarms are interconnected. When one sounds, they all sound.



Call the fire department from a cellphone or a neighbor's phone. Stay outside until the fire department says it's safe to go back inside.

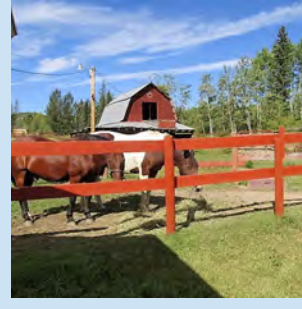

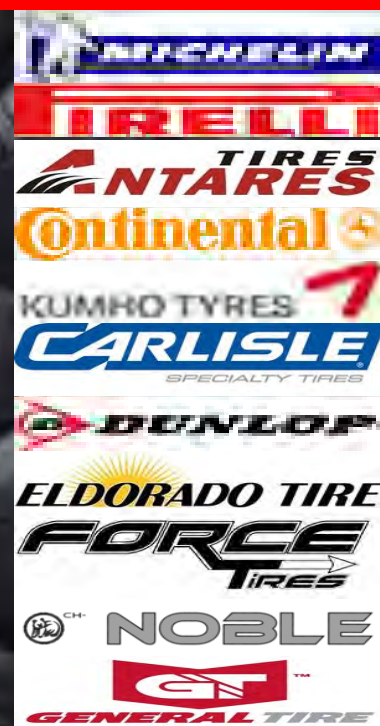
