**Hudson's Hope RCMP
Policing Report for January and March, 2015**

Total Files to Date for Hudson's Hope Detachment for 2015: **85**

Operational Issues:

In the month of February 2015, Hudson's Hope RCMP detachment responded to 31 calls for service.

The past month has been relatively uneventful for significant events.

Hudson's Hope RCMP, Fire Rescue and BC Ambulance responded to a motor vehicle collision located on the Ferrell Creek Bridge, Highway 29. A commercial vehicle pup trailer had locked up and slid into the path of an oncoming pickup truck. The pup trailer side swiped the side of the pickup truck. Both vehicles moved safely away from the location and waited for emergency services to arrive. There were only minor injuries from the collision. Based on information gathered, the driver of the commercial vehicle was served a violation ticket for driving too fast for the conditions.

RCMP received a report of a female breaching a no contact condition. Police investigated and this led to a female being arrested for a breach of her release conditions stemming from a domestic assault earlier this year. The female also had an outstanding warrant for her arrest that was related to the same domestic assault. The female is to attend court in March, 2015 for all of the combined charges.

The DARE program has started up for Grades 5/6 in the Hudson's Hope School and will run over the next couple of months.

RCMP and BC Ambulance have been participating in an intramural sports program once a week with the elementary school students. Dodge ball has been the sport of choice by the students.

Hudson's Hope members have been conducting impaired driving road checks during this month along with speed and seatbelt compliance enforcement.

In the month of March 2015 to date, Hudson's Hope Detachment has responded to 21 calls for service.

Checkstops have continued over the last month which resulted in two drivers providing breath samples over the legal limit, their vehicles were impounded for 30 days, and they were served a 90 day driving prohibition.

One driver was charged with prohibited driving and his vehicle was also impounded.

Two local residents were arrested and released on outstanding warrants under the Fisheries Act.

Miscellaneous other files included a single vehicle collision, report of poaching, multiple driving complaints, two fraud complaints, and a threats file.

RCMP have received a report of people using the airport runway for parties. This is trespassing and causing damage to the runway. Patrols will be made.

Community Involvement:

The DARE program is continuing with grade 5/6 students and weekly intramural program with the elementary students has come to an end with Spring Break hopefully bringing warmer weather.

Members continue to work on detachment initiatives that concern road safety / Enforcement and involvement in the Hudson's Hope School with the secondary students.

Other:

The May Long Week end is quickly approaching and the detachment is finalizing plans to increase members within the community for traditionally busy weekend. North Peace Traffic Services has been engaged and will also be assisting with presence on highway 29 and within Hudson's Hope.

Fiscal Year end reporting is due and keeping Cpl Romanchych busy with reporting requirements to Command.

Planning is starting for the 2015 Annual Performance Planning for the Detachment. This assists the detachment to have focused goals and priorities. Cpl ROMANCHYCH to start scheduling consultation meetings within the community. This will involve the Mayor and Council, Emergency Services consultation Group (HH Fire Rescue and BC Ambulance) and Derek Beam, Hudson's

Cpl Romanchych is arranging to have a Swift Water Rescue course put on by Rescue Canada locally in order to have local members trained. Tentatively set for the first half of May. This course will be opened up to other Peace Area Detachments to have a member trained so that they may ride as a second on the Hudson's Hope Detachment Jet Boat. This will solve an issue of taking two members from Hudson's Hope in the case the Jet Boat is required for response out of the Detachment area. Hudson's Hope Detachment is the Peace Region RCMP Jet Boat response unit. This is the only RCMP Boat in the Peace Region.

The Priorities and associated initiatives for this past fiscal year are as follows:

- 1) Property - Mischief (RCMP Divisional mandated Priority)
Goal: Reduce Property Crimes / reduction of Mischief
Initiatives: 1) Making patrols and engaging with troubled youth / adults
2) Education of the community through school visits, educational news bulletins.
- 2) Traffic - Impaired Driving / Road Safety
Goal: Contribute to Safer Roads
Initiatives: 1) Make extra patrols at and around parties, bars and local restaurants.
2) More Highway patrols and focused enforcement initiatives such as Speed, School Zone safety, Seat belts and Distracted Driving
3) Road Checkstops for Impaired Drivers, Licensing and registration compliance, and vehicle safety
- 3) Police / Community Relations - Youth
Goal: visibility and presence in the community and schools
Initiatives: 1) Organized and impromptu School visits and lectures
2) Attendance and participation at Community events
3) Participation in school / sports events (Volunteering, Coaching, Working)

The detachment has made considerable progress on meeting these priorities and related goals.

BACKGROUND:

The PRGT has submitted four TUPs for their pipeline project consisting of two stockpile sites, one laydown yard and one work campsite. Applications were received in early February. Through a misunderstanding on my part I assumed when Catie Underhill presented at Council in February that everything was put on hold due to Petronas' position that meant "everything".

PRGT had not, in fact, put on hold their intentions for Temporary Use Permits. As you are aware I have begun the process of a technical review. They would like to begin work by May 1, 2015. I have told them they cannot build before we provide them with a TUP motioned by Council. And, they would still need ALC approval before work can begin regardless of whether they have approved TUPs from the District of Hudson's Hope

DISCUSSION:

My discussions with PRGT on Friday, March 20th expounded on the need for the District of Hudson's Hope to have the PRGT's "plans" for construction and use regarding the TUPs so that Council may make informed decisions on the issuance of TUPs; not that the District of Hudson's Hope would deny the applications but that they would be fully aware, through due diligence procedures, of the project prior to any approvals of TUPs.

As you are aware, PRGT provided a host of plans on the late afternoon of Friday March 20th of which we cannot be expected to peruse and digest for tonight's meeting. The plans have been emailed to you and are being provided at tonight's meeting in hard copy for your convenience and perusal. The purpose of the TUPs tabling tonight is for Council to decide and direct Administration to perform a Technical Review of the project for Council's final consideration, following due diligent processes and procedures.

It may be prudent that in light of the expediency of these projects that PRGT would like us to undertake, that Council strike a Select Committee to peruse all aspects of the TUPs.
