





District of Hudson's

Grant for Solar Generation:

Hudson's Hope is fortunate to have received a grant of \$1.35 Million from the federal gas tax fund to install a series of solar panels on or adjacent to District buildings. We expect the project to benefit us by reducing total carbon emissions and electricity costs.

Communities are required to calculate and reduce carbon emissions with the goal of reaching carbon neutrality. We can use the solar generation to offset our carbon emissions from vehicles or heating.

Electricity is a growing expense for the District and we can reduce the our costs now and in the future by generating some of our own.

In 2000, the District electricity bill was \$68,000. In 2008, it had grown to \$90,000. Last year it was \$164,600.

The province announced annual increases from 2014 until 2018 that total a 28% increase when compounded. They also announced another 5 years of annual increases starting in 2019. The amount was not announced but it is expected to be 2.6% per year. That puts us to 2024, when Site C is expected to come on-stream. Rate-payers begin to pay the \$8.8 billion cost of Site C when it comes on-line so we can expect a further jump in electricity rates in 2024.

Given all that, reducing electricity costs is one of the most effective cost-savings measures we have. We are very pleased to have received this major grant to help us achieve it.

Last year, the province negotiated a "special management" agreement with the Saulteau First Nation regarding an area of land between the Peace River and the Moberly River, known as the Peace Moberly Tract (PMT). The Peace Moberly Tract includes land which is within the District of Hudson's Hope on the south side of the Peace River. Several local people use the area for hunting, trapping and other activities.

On January 25th, two representatives from FLNRO met with people in Hudson's Hope to discuss the implications of the agreement for our community. Those representatives didn't have the information that people here were asking for. So another meeting has been organized to talk about the impact on traplines, hunting, and general recreational use. The meeting on Thursday, March 7 is the meeting that was promised. So please come with your questions and comments.



Police Report: February 2016



Hudson's Hope RCMP Detachment responded to approximately 25 calls for service over the last few weeks. Some incidents of note during that time are as follows:

On January 21st, 2016, Hudson's Hope RCMP received complaints of footprints in the snow on several properties throughout town. One vehicle was entered and a small amount of money was taken from inside.

On January 23rd, 2016, Hudson's Hope RCMP was called out for a suicidal person that had ran off into the forest. RCMP Police Dog Service, local Fire Department, and Provincial Ambulance were called in to assist and the person was located after a lengthy search. The suicidal person was taken to hospital in Fort St. John for a mental health assessment.

On January 28th, 2016, Hudson's Hope RCMP was called out for a suicidal person heading to the river. Local Fire and Rescue, BC Ambulance and RCMP Police Dog Service were called in to assist local police. The suicidal person was located and apprehended under the Mental Health Act. The suicidal person was transported to hospital and was admitted for a mental health assessment.

On January 29th, 2016, Police were advised of illegal hunting on Twelve Mile Road. BC Conservation office was called for assistance and the file is still under investigation.

On January 29th, 2016, Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a vehicle and found the driver to be prohibited from driving in Canada. The driver was also issued a 90 day immediate road side driving prohibition for impaired driving. The vehicle was impounded for 30 days and several violation tickets were issued to the driver.

The Hudson's Hope RCMP wishes to remind citizens to protect their belongings. Take steps to secure or remove valuable items from unattended vehicles and to secure windows and doors while away from home. Theft is a crime of opportunity and takes only a few minutes or seconds if items are in plain sight and unsecured.

Bullying and the Law

Bullying can be a traumatic experience, and some forms of bullying can even be considered illegal. These include:

- •Threats of death or serious bodily harm whether done face to face, online, over the phone or through text messaging.
- •Criminal Harassment repeated tormenting online, with texts, phone calls and/or emails causing the other person to fear for their safety.
- •Distribution of intimate images without consent Sharing nude or sexual pictures of another person without their consent.
- •Assaults including pushing, tripping, slapping, hitting or spitting.

For all of these criminal offences, it is important to notify your local police detachment or report it to CYBERTIP.CA. Based on the available information, police will decide if an investigation is warranted and whether charges may be laid.

What You Can Do?

- •Walk away or leave the online conversation.
- •Keep track of the bullying (write it down and/or save a screenshot of the online message).
- •Tell a trusted adult. If you don't trust anyone or need to speak with someone urgently, contact the confidential and toll-free Kids Help Phone 1-800-668-6868.
- •Report the bullying to school administrators.
- •Report criminal offences, such as threats, assaults and sexual exploitation to the local police detachment.
- •Report unwanted text messages to your telephone service provider.
- •Report online bullying to the social media site and block the person responsible.

DID YOU KNOW?






