

Officer Bylaw No. 893, 2017

Council adopted the "Hudson's Hope Amended Fees and Charges Bylaw No. 893,2017" at the Regular Council Meeting held on December 11^{th,} 2017. The purpose of Bylaw No. 893 is to incorporate a 10% rate increase to the District of Hudson's Hope water rates and to incorporate a 4% discount for early payment of residential water and sewer fees. The new rates are as follows:

Service	Existing Rate	Proposed Rate
Residential	\$228 annually	\$250.80 annually

ELECTOR REGISTRATION

If you are not on the list of electors, you may register at the time of voting by completing the required application form available at the voting place. To register you must meet the following qualifications:

- 18 years of age or older
- Canadian citizen
- resident of BC for at least 6 months immediately preceding voting day
- resident of OR registered owner of real property in the District of Hudson's Hope for at least 30 days immediately preceding voting day, and
- not otherwise disqualified by law from voting.

Resident electors will also be required to produce **2 pieces of identification** (at least one with a signature). Picture identification is not necessary. The identification must prove both residency and identity.

Non-resident property electors must produce 2 pieces of identification (at least one with a signature) to prove identity, proof that they are entitled to register in relation to the property, and, if applicable, written consent from the other property owners.

MAIL BALLOT VOTING

Qualified electors may vote by mail if they have a physical disability, illness, or injury that affects their ability to vote at another voting opportunity.

REQUESTING A MAIL BALLOT PACKAGE:

Before 4 pm on Thursday, January 18, 2018 you must submit the following information to the municipal office (9904 Dudley Drive, Hudson's Hope, BC), by mail (Box 330, Hudson's Hope, BC, V0C 1V0), telephone (250-783-9901), fax (250-783-5741) or email (clerk@hudsonshope.ca):

- 1. Full name,
- 2. Residential address,
- 3. Address of the property in relation to which you are voting (for non-resident property electors),
- 4. Method of delivery of your mail ballot package:
 - a) pick up at the municipal office, OR
 - b) regular letter mail through Canada Post to residential address, OR
 - c) regular letter mail through Canada Post to an alternate address that you provide when requesting the ballot package,
- 5. If you are not on the list of electors, to ensure you receive the correct registration application form in your package, you must indicate whether you are going to be registering as a resident or non-resident property elector.

The municipal office will send out mail ballot packages commencing on Wednesday, January 10, 2018. To be counted, your mail ballot must be received by the Chief Election Officer no later than 8:00 PM on Saturday, January 20, 2018.

Site C:

As you all will have heard, Site C has been "re-approved" by the new NDP government. Council will be monitoring events to see what, if anything, has changed for Hudson's Hope with respect to Site C as a result of the change in government.

Municipal By-election:

As you may know, there is a vacancy on municipal council resulting from the resignation of Councillor Gilliss. A by-election to fill the position will be held on January 20. Four people are letting their name stand:

Gibbs, Mattias Knox, Reg Markin, Patricia McCarthy, John Paul

It's heartening to see so much interest in this by-election...

The next general municipal election is less than 10 months away, on Saturday, October 20, 2018. The high participation in this by-election hopefully predicts the same for October, which in turn suggests a healthy future for local government in Hudson's Hope.

A big thank you to all four candidates for your willingness to get involved in our local government!

Rural Roads:

The North Peace Economic Development Committee (NPEDC), has recommended that the Peace River Regional District (PRRD) re-establish a Rural Roads Taskforce (RRTF). In the late 1990's and early 2000's, a North Peace RRTF worked in collaboration with the provincial government's Regional Transportation Advisory Committee, to improve rural roads. It resulted in much improvement to our regional roads, including hard-surfacing of Beryl Prairie and Farrell Creek Roads in Hudson's Hope.

Wear and tear and extreme weather events in the past few years have taken their toll and our rural roads show it. As an example, for a couple weeks last spring, manned tractors were stationed at the Farrell Creek turn-off 24 hours per day to haul industrial trucks to the top of the hill. Clearly, the hill needs a lot of work.

Jackie Kjos, the consultant who facilitated the past efforts, has been engaged to document the needs and suggest a strategy forward.

The two roads within Hudson's Hope which stand to benefit from the current initiative are Farrell Creek and Beryl Prairie Roads. Neither Highway 29 nor the Alaska Highway would be covered by this program. Hudson's Hope will have representation on whatever regional committee is formed going forward.

Disposal of Produced Water Reinstated at well opposite HH Airport:

As you probably remember, a produced water disposal well is located approximately 3.3 km from Peace Canyon Dam, accessed from Canyon Drive west of the airport. Disposal well depth is 1,514 meters. On March 17, 2017, the Oil & Gas Commission issued an order stopping injection due to some uncertainty about the impact of fluid injection on the dam.

Ben Jones, CEO of Canada Energy Partners, and owner of the well, appealed the decision. That was dismissed.

Mayka Kennedy, Executive Vice-president and Chief Engineer of the Oil & Gas Commission, then reviewed the permit and on December 4, ruled that the well permit would not be cancelled but that additional conditions would be imposed. Canada Partners has the option of accepting or appealing this decision. I've contacted Ben Jones asking if he has determined his next steps but haven't heard back yet.

Do you miss gardening?







Safety and Bylaw Enforcement




Don't Get Too Close to Sanding/Salting Trucks:

If you find yourself behind a plow, keep a safe distance behind it—200 feet at the very least. Visibility near the plow will be greatly reduced because of blowing snow, and if you're following too close, you'll fall into the plow driver's blind spot, and they may not even know you're there. That could be dangerous, especially for sudden stopping. Also keep in mind that the plow may be spreading winter abrasive on the road. The abrasive is actually made up of small rocks, which can be up to 12.5mm in diameter, and travelling too fast and too close to the plow could increase the chance of damaging your

Never Pass a Winter Maintenance Vehicle on the Right:

Plows will generally be travelling relatively slowly, and it might be tempting to try and



pass them. But these vehicles can often have attachments, like wing plows, which can reach 10-12 feet to the right, so if you have to pass a winter maintenance vehicle, wait until it's safe and pass the left.

Plow drivers have limited visibility and cannot see directly behind their trucks. When plowing, a "snow cloud" is often thrown up restricting visibility on all sides of the truck.

Bylaw Information January 2018

Each month we will illustrate the requirements and limitations of the zones within the District of Hudson's Hope.

The following is an excerpt taken from the District of Hudson's Hope Zoning Bylaw No. 823, 2013.

9.0 **R1 ZONE: LOW DENSITY RESIDENTIAL**

The intent of the R1 zone is to permit single-detached dwellings and duplexes on compact parcels that are efficient to service with municipal water and sewer.

9.1 **Permitted Uses**

In the R1 zone, the following uses and no other uses are permitted:

- Accessory buildings and structures. Bed and breakfasts.
- Day care centres. Duplexes.

- Home occupations.
 Secondary suites.
 Single-detached dwellings.

Zone Specific Regulations

On a parcel located in an area zoned as R1, no building or structure will be constructed, located or altered, and no plan of subdivision approved which contravenes the regulations set out in this section. Column 1 sets out the matter to be regulated and Column 2 sets out the regulations.

BC Rural Dividend program announces fourth intake

VICTORIA – Applications for funding in the fourth intake of the BC Rural Dividend program will be accepted Nov. 15 to Dec. 15, 2017, Minister of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development Doug Donaldson announced today.

"I encourage local governments, not-for-profit organizations and First Nations to get their applications submitted," said Donaldson. "We're committed to action that will strengthen rural economies and provide jobs in rural communities." Single applicants can apply for up to \$100,000 for community-driven projects and must contribute at least 20% of the total project cost. Partnerships, involving more than one eligible applicant, can apply for up to \$500,000 and must contribute 40% of the total project cost.

A project-development funding stream will provide up to \$10,000 to help communities with limited capacity build the business cases and feasibility assessments needed to develop strong projects and support the development of future project applications.

Under the BC Rural Dividend program's special circumstances allowance, which is used to help rural communities facing economic hardship, funding will also support those communities hard hit by wildfires in 2017.

Projects will be assessed and approved based on the following criteria:

- Rural communities most in need
- Improved community resiliency and economic strength
- Partnership building and enhanced shared prosperity
- Project feasibility and sustainability
- Economic impact on rural communities
- Attracting and retaining youth
- Innovation in economic development

Police Report: January 2018



Police Report - December 2017

Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to approximately 37 calls for service over the last four weeks. Four impaired counter attack checkstops were conducted resulting in one prohibited driver having charges forwarded to Crown office. During the month of November, the Hudson's Hope RCMP issued 8 traffic tickets and 11 written warnings to drivers for various motor vehicle act infractions.

The Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to several collisions during this period. Drivers are reminded to drive according to the conditions and to ensure they have winter tires installed. Please clear snow and ice from all windows and the roof to ensure you can see clearly and not have an avalanche on your windshield when you apply the brakes.

The Hudson's Hope RCMP still needs volunteers for the Speed Watch Program. If you have a few hours per month to support road safety in your community, let us know. Contact Cst. McKenna at 250-783-5241 for complete details. The program will likely begin late Spring 2018 and run until Fall.

On November 25th, 2017, Hudson's Hope RCMP members were called out for a report of someone being followed by unknown suspects after fleeing a residence where they were being held against their will. The caller was located but could not provide any information to support the initial report.

On December 2nd, 2017, Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a local residence for a domestic assault. The offender was arrested and subsequently released on several conditions. Assault and firearms charges are being forwarded to Crown.

On December 15th, 2017, a prohibited driver was stopped after driving up to a checkstop being conducted by the Hudson's Hope RCMP. The driver was issued a violation ticket for driving without a valid driver's licence and his vehicle was impounded for 7 days. The driver will appear in court for a charge of driving while prohibited under section 95 of the Motor Vehicle Act.

Water: In plastic bottles so they won't break if frozen (change every six months)

Extra clothing and shoes

First aid kit: With seatbelt cutter

Small shovel, scraper and snowbrush

Candle in a deep can and matches

Wind-up flashlight

Whistle: In case you need to attract attention

Roadmaps

Copy of your emergency plan and personal documents

Also keep these inside your trunk

Sand, salt or cat litter (non clumping)

Antifreeze/windshield washer fluid

Tow rope

Jumper cables

Fire extinguisher

Warning light or road flares
