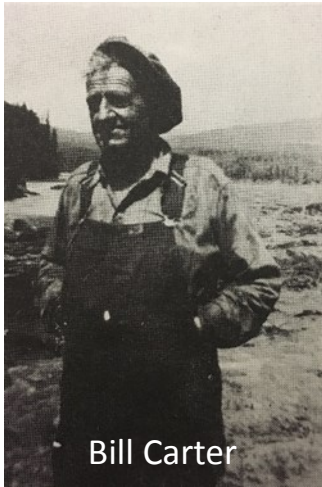


Dear Community of Hudson's Hope

Have you every wondered where the name of your street comes from? In Hudson's Hope the majority of the streets are named after the pioneers, men and women that came to the area and settled, farmed, trapped and traded. Over the next couple of months, we will be giving you a little history on the people that your streets are named after!

Up Next – Carter St – Is named after William (Bill) Carter - He was born in 1882 in England and spent his youth working with horses. He immigrated to Canada when he was 21, and started work on a farm in Manitoba. He decided to join the Royal Northwest Mounted Police in 1903. Before coming to Hudson's Hope he was involved in cutting the trail to the Yukon from Fort St John in 1905. He settled in Hudson's Hope in 1912, coming to town with Dudley Shaw and Tom Jamieson.

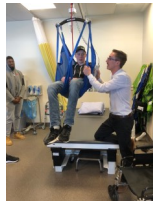
Classroom Champions - We have an exciting visitor coming to our school on April 27th.

Congratulations to Carson Gunderson, who recently competed in a



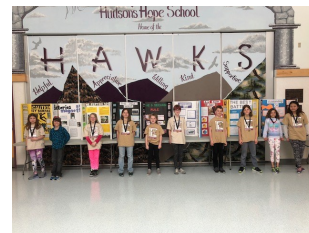

Well, the crocuses that I was looking for last month were just a little late but there are a few around now, and the birds are all in a frenzy to get things caught up. So I think we can finally say that spring has come. And though there has been some erosion from the big snow-melt, it hasn't been as bad as it could have been. In most places there didn't seem to be much frost in the ground so between water sinking in, and the wind whisking it away, the ground has dried up pretty quickly.

Disposal Well Meeting:

The Oil & Gas Commission will come to a meeting in Hudson's Hope to provide the history and future of the disposal well located across the road from the airport, and within 3.3 km of Peace Canyon Dam. The well is presently suspended but will be allowed to re-open if a number of conditions are met.

More Senior's Housing for Hudson's Hope

The **Hudson's Hope Health Care & Housing Society (HCHS)** completed a needs assessment analysis that showed that more seniors' and supportive housing is needed in Hudson's Hope. The Society is now moving ahead with a feasibility study and concept plan. This will include details of the proposed building, basic design location, and a preliminary budget.

Both Hudson's Hope Council and the Peace River Regional District have passed resolutions of support for the project. This facility would not replace Silver Willow; rather, it would add more spaces and a slightly higher level of care. It would allow seniors to continue to live in Hudson's Hope longer, a very positive addition for our community. Thanks to the Housing Society for taking the initiative on this project!

HOPE COUNCIL NEWS



Community Hall

Council has passed a bylaw to put away \$30,000 per year in a reserve fund for a new community hall. The present hall has served us well for many years but an assessment last year determined that it made more economic sense to start saving for a new hall rather than keep repairing the old one.

Solar Opening:

The **Official Commissioning** of the Hudson's Hope Solar Array will be on **Saturday, June 2**. Exact time and location will be posted nearer the day. But there will be a barbecue and some tours for those interested!

All the installed panels are now connected to the grid. The net metering began in March and the first indicators of effectiveness is starting to trickle in. Metering at the Public Works Shop started on March 7 and the meter was read March 16. In those 9 days, the shop used 880 kilowatt hours - but it generated 1,040 kilowatt hours. March was a snowy month, so the solar panels were doing pretty well despite all that snow. A good start for our solar.

The last solar installation will be a "wave-shaped array" mounted on posts at the swimming pool. It is presently being fabricated in Dawson Creek; when completed it will be dismantled, moved and re-assembled next to the pool, hopefully before pool opening day. Photos of the design are on the District website.

Police Report: April 2018



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to approximately 25 calls for service over the last four weeks. During the month of March, the Hudson's Hope RCMP issued 33 Motor Vehicle Act Warnings and Violation Tickets. Three impaired drivers were stopped and charged during this period.

The Hudson's Hope RCMP is still investigating the incident of slashed tires of one of the police vehicles that occurred at an RCMP residence. This act of mischief put residents at risk by delaying any emergency police response that would have been needed during that night and next morning. Any residents with information can call the local detachment or Crime Stoppers to report anonymously.

The Hudson's Hope RCMP is still investigating the attempted theft of ATM machine from the local Credit Union. Anyone with information regarding this incident can call the local detachment or Crime Stoppers to report anonymously.

On March 17th, 2018, Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a complaint of an erratic driver on Hwy 29 heading toward Hudson's Hope. The vehicle was located and the driver was arrested for a warrant and for being impaired by drug. Suspected drugs were located in the vehicle. Charges are pending.

On March 17th, 2018, Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a vehicle for speeding at 153 Km/hr in the 90 Km/hr zone. The vehicle plate was not associated to the vehicle and several violation tickets were issued to the driver.

On March 23rd, 2018, Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to two reports of the same tractor trailer spun out on two different hills along Hwy 29. The driver was issued a Notice and Order to repair or replace his tire chains as they were in poor condition causing the vehicle to spin out and block traffic on two occasions. The chains were replaced the following day.

On March 24th, 2018, Hudson's Hope RCMP observed a snowmobile travelling on local streets. The snowmobile took off but was eventually located at a local residence thanks to a tip from a citizen. The owner of the snowmobile was issued written warnings for no insurance and non-registered off road vehicle on public road.

On March 31st, 2018, a vehicle was stopped for speeding and the driver was issued a 3 day immediate roadside driving prohibition after providing a breath sample.

On April 8th, 2018, a driver was stopped on Beattie Drive for speeding. The driver was found to not have a driver license and failed two road side breath tests. The driver was issued a 90 day immediate road side driving prohibition, a violation ticket for no driver license, and the vehicle was impounded for 30 days.

On April 15th, 2018, Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a local property to assist BC Conservation office with a complaint of dogs attacking a small deer. The inves-

tigation revealed that a resident had fired a firearm from a vehicle while close to a residence. A charge for careless use of firearm is being investigated and charges are pending.

Off Road Vehicle and Marine Safety

As the weather improves, many people will be heading out to enjoy the local trails and rivers. The RCMP would like to remind everyone to conduct themselves in a safe manner while obeying the rules and regulations pertaining to proper and safe operation of off road and marine vehicles. Know the requirements prior to heading out. Leave a travel plan with someone who will know where you are going and when you will be expected to return.

Hudson's Hope RCMP will be conducting ORV and Marine patrols throughout the area and operators may be issued tickets for non-compliance.

May Safety Tips – National Water Safety Month

1 Staying close, being alert and watching children in and around the pool.

- Never leave a child unattended in a pool or spa and always watch your child when he or she is in or near water.
- Keep children away from pool drains, pipes and other openings to avoid entrapments.
- Have a telephone close by when you or your family is using a pool or spa.
- If a child is missing, look for him or her in the pool or spa first.
- Share safety instructions with family, friends and neighbors.

2 Learning and practicing water safety skills.

- Learn how to swim and teach your child how to swim.
- Learn to perform CPR on children and adults and update those skills regularly.
- Understand the basics of life-saving so that you can assist in a pool emergency.

3 Having appropriate equipment for your pool or spa.

- Install a four-foot or taller fence around the pool and spa and use self-closing and self-latching gates; ask your neighbors to do the same at their pools.
- Install and use a lockable safety cover on your spa.
- If your house serves as a fourth side of a fence around a pool, install door alarms and always use them.

For additional protection, install window guards on windows facing pools or spas.

- Install pool and gate alarms to alert you when children go near the water.
- Ensure any pool and spa you use has compliant drain covers and ask your pool service provider if you don't know.
- Maintain pool and spa covers in good working order.
- Consider using a surface wave or underwater alarm.

Bylaw Information May 2018 – "District of Hudson's Hope Zoning Bylaw No. 823, 2013".

15.0 M1 ZONE: LIGHT INDUSTRIAL (SERVICED)

The intent of the M1 zone is to permit a broad range of light industrial uses that require fully serviced land. It is intended that industrial uses in this zone primarily provide support products and services to local businesses, agriculture and resource development.

15.1 Permitted Uses

In the M1 zone, the following uses and no other uses are permitted:

1. Accessory buildings and structures.
2. Animal hospital.
3. Animal shelters.
4. Artist studios.
5. Auction houses.
6. Automobile sales, services, rental and repair.
7. Bottling and distribution plant.
8. Brewery and distillery operations.
9. Car wash.
10. Caretaker residence.
11. Cartage (delivery and express facilities), hauling, moving and storage (including truck terminals and packing/crating facilities).
12. Commercial storage.
13. Fuel sales and storage including card-lock fuel sales and wholesale distribution.

14. Funeral parlour.
15. Industrial trades training facility.
16. Laboratories and research establishments.
17. Laundromat and dry cleaner.
18. Machine shop.
19. Machinery and heavy equipment sales, rental, servicing and repair.
20. Nursery and greenhouse including related retail outlet.
21. Offices, storage buildings and workshops for general contractor and trade contractors.
22. Oilfield supplies and service.
23. Produce and meat processing, including canning, freezing, packing facilities for cold storage, and ice plant.
24. Recycling depot.
25. Secondary wood processing.
26. Service station.
27. Sign shop
28. Small engine sales and repair shops.
29. Small-scale manufacturing, assembly, processing, finishing and packaging.
30. Storage facility including cold storage and ice plant.
31. Taxidermy establishment.
32. Taxi office.
33. Tire shop, including sales, service and repair.
34. Truck and truck-trailer sales, rental and repair.
35. Upholstery shops.
36. Warehousing and wholesale establishments.
37. Welding shops.

Zone Specific Regulations

On a parcel located in an area zoned as M1, no building or structure will be constructed, located or altered, and no plan of subdivision approved which contravenes the regulations set out in this section. Column 1 sets out the matter to be regulated and Column 2 sets out the regulations.

If you see a wildfire, please report it to Wildfire Management Service at **1-800-663-5555** or call ***5555** toll free on most cellular networks. Alternately, you can report a wildfire to **9-1-1**.

What You'll Be Asked:

When reporting a wildfire, a operator will ask:

- your phone number
- the location of the fire
- what the fire is burning (trees? What species?)
- the size of the fire
- how quickly the fire is spreading
- the colour of the smoke
- whether there are values or lives at risk



The details that you provide are critical in determining the type of response that the fire will receive from fire suppression authorities. Your help is greatly appreciated as it helps us to allocate our resources more efficiently and respond quickly to wildfire activity.

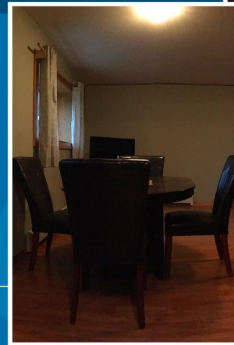

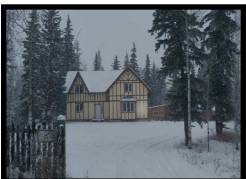
