

\$2.1 million for 30 fish and wildlife projects approved for 2018 – 2019Fish & Wildlife Compensation Program offers free wetland workshops

(PEACE REGION) Field season is underway for grant recipients working on the 30 fish and wildlife projects approved by the Fish & Wildlife Compensation Program's (FWCP) Peace Region Board. The FWCP is working to conserve and enhance fish and wildlife in watersheds impacted by existing BC Hydro dams and has just announced 118 fish and wildlife projects across the province.

In the Peace Region endangered caribou herds, Arctic Grayling, Bull Trout, amphibians, birds, and bats are among the many species that will benefit from the research and hands-on projects starting now.



"The projects approved by the FWCP in the Peace Region for 2018–2019 will benefit species, habitats and ecosystems impacted by existing dams, and we're very excited about the work planned for this year," says Chelsea Coady, Manager of the FWCP's Peace Region.

One of the projects FWCP is funding this year is a series of free, public wetland workshops in June and July, hosted by BC Wildlife Federation. The workshops, at Moberly Lake, Mackenzie, Tsay Keh Dene, and Fort St James, are aimed at building awareness about the value of wetlands and how to conserve and manage them. Find out how to register now for these workshops at fwcp.ca/wetland-workshops/.

"Projects like the wetland workshops will benefit many species, and support conservation and enhancement of important habitats. Many of the projects we fund will improve the science and understanding of species and their habitats, which is the first step in conservation planning," added Chelsea.

The FWCP is funded by BC Hydro each year. BC Hydro has water licence obligations in the Columbia and Peace regions, and has made voluntary commitments to address dam impacts in the Coastal Region. BC Hydro fulfills the applicable obligations through the work of the FWCP.

The FWCP is partnership of BC Hydro, the Province of B.C., Fisheries and Oceans Canada, First Nations, and Public Stakeholders to conserve and enhance fish and wildlife in watersheds impacted by existing BC Hydro dams. FWCP directs BC Hydro funds towards priority actions across its three regions.

DISTRICT OF HUDSON'S HOPE COUNCIL NEWS



This column is all about roads!

I met last week with representatives of the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure (MOTI) to talk about roads in and around the municipality. Here's what we talked about:

Passing lanes on Hwy #29

The criteria for putting in passing lanes is 200 vehicles per hour. Vehicle counts on Hwy #29 show 120 being the maximum, even in the busiest times. It's hard to justify passing lanes when even the maximum vehicle count is less than the criteria. We may be able to make a case that the type of traffic (heavily loaded, slow trucks) and long, steep, winding hills justify making Highway 29 an exception.

Canyon Drive Transfer Station Intersection

People have complained about poor visibility coming out of the transfer station. In response, MOTI will be shaving off the top of the berm and opening up the ditch area during the first two weeks of July. They can't go right into the ditch because there are utility lines in the right of way but they will be able to improve the line of sight.

Pedestrian Crossing at Canyon Drive & Hwy #29 (Post Office corner)

A flashing orange light was considered. Those are on municipalities' approved list but not yet on MOTI's. The Regional office made the case for using them at our corner as a pilot but the Province didn't approve. A pedestrian activated red light was also considered but rejected because they find that at low volume traffic crossings, the person presses the light, looks around, sees there is no traffic, and crosses against the light. Then when the light that the pedestrian activated changes, he's long gone, and drivers stopping at the red light get annoyed that no pedestrians are using the crossing. Eventually this pattern gets familiar and the drivers start running the red stop light.

So: they are planning to put in a large overhead sign with extra lighting and a painted crosswalk.

Farrell Creek Hill:

MOTI has done a lot of work on the hill. It's all one huge slide. The top of the hill is the top of the slide and the toe of it is in the river. They recognize that a significant re-alignment of the route is needed, but that would be a major project, costing roughly \$10 million and their total annual budget for the whole North and South Peace, is only \$20 million. This region is already budgeted extra because of the challenges here. The next largest region is the Cariboo and although it has more miles of road, it gets only \$7 million. They will do the best they can with the resources that they have and we do appreciate that. Swen Johan 55-



Police Report: June 2018



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to approximately 37 calls for service over the last four weeks. During the month of May, the Hudson's Hope RCMP issued 84 Motor Vehicle Act Warnings and Violation Tickets. Three check stops were conducted in an effort to combat impaired driving.

On May 26th, 2018, The Hudson's Hope RCMP received several calls regarding a possible impaired driver on Hwy 29. The vehicle was eventually spotted leaving a residential driveway on Farrell Creek Road and failed to stop for police when attempting to pull it over. The driver was identified by a witness and eight charges will be forwarded for charge approval including dangerous operation of a motor vehicle, drive while disqualified, drive while prohibited and failing to stop for police. 
On May 30th, 2018, The Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a complaint of a dog that had attacked a horse on a local street. The dog and its owner had left the scene prior to police arrival and have yet to be identified. A local citizen, Rock Robert, stopped to intervene and sustained significant injuries that required surgery, after being kicked by the horse. The RCMP commends Mr. Robert on his quick intervention and assistance to his fellow citizens. We wish him a speedy and full recovery.

On May 30th, 2018, The Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of theft of several barrels of jet fuel from the airport. Anyone with information regarding this incident can call the local detachment or Crimestoppers.




Multiple Intelligences

Protective Services

Hudson's Hope Fire Rescue will begin providing medical first responder services within the District of Hudson's Hope on June 23rd 2018. This new service will see District fire fighters assisting BC Ambulance staff in the provision of timely and high-quality pre-hospital care to residents and visitors of our municipality.

Fire department responders are required to complete approximately 40 hours of training, pass written and practical exams prior to



receiving their license from the BC Emergency Medical Assistant Licensing Branch, and comply with the Emergency Health Services Act and the Emergency Medical Assistant Regulations. Fire department responders are also bound by the same Code of Ethics as other Emergency Medical Assistants within the province of British Columbia.

There are currently approximately 300 departments in British Columbia providing this service.

First Responders will be endorsed to provide a number of services including:

- cardiopulmonary resuscitation;
- · basic wound and fracture management;
- maintenance of airways and ventilation;
- use of airway management techniques including oropharyngeal airways, oral suction devices and oxygen-supplemented mask devices to assist ventilation;
- use of an automatic or semi-automatic external defibrillator;
- cervical collar application and spinal immobilization on a long spine board;
- administration of oxygen;
- administration of oral glucose;
- emergency childbirth;
- and ventilation using pocket mask and bag/valve/mask devices.

Fire department responders will always respond in conjunction with BC Ambulance Service, and will be simply another step in the pre-hospital care continuum. First responders will not transport patients, and will be under the direction of BC Ambulance staff when both agencies are on scene.


