





Well, I guess we had perfect summer weather for most of August. Too bad there was so much smoke that we didn't really get to enjoy it. Still, better to have smoke than the fire itself!

Municipal Election October 20th, 2018

On Saturday, October 20th, voters will have the opportunity to select their local government for the next four years (October 2018 – October 2022). Council consists of 1 Mayor and 6 Councillors and all positions are up for election. I indicated some time ago that I would not be seeking re-election for the mayor's position and I'm sure that incumbent councillors will be announcing their plans shortly.

It's important that a community have an active and committed Council. I encourage anyone with an interest to consider running. An Information Open House will be held for any people interested in throwing their hat into the ring:

Day: Wednesday, September 5

Time: 7 pm

Place: Basement, District Office

Nomination packages are available now at the District Office. They must be filled out and returned between September 4th and 14^{th} .

An involved community is a strong community – let's make sure Hudson's Hope remains strong. Get involved! Come out to the Open House and consider running for office!

RCMP

Corporal Brendan Harkness is our new RCMP senior officer, replacing Trevor Romanchych. Welcome, Corporal Harkness, we hope you will enjoy working in our community.

Oil & Gas Committee

The province is setting up an oversight liaison committee to increase communication between landowners, industry, the regulator (OGC: Oil & Gas Commission) and the Ministry of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources (MEMPR) and local governments (Peace River Regional District, PRRD).

It's early days yet, but I understand that there will be an oversight committee, consisting of Dave Nikolejsin, Deputy Minister of MEMPR; Paul Jeakins, OGC Chief Executive Officer, and two directors from the Regional District, who haven't yet been

named. So very high level involvement from the provincial government.

Then there are to be a number of "Community Committees," the purpose of which is to bring forward oil/gas issues that need to be addressed. It appears that those will be grassroots groups, such as the landowner group that was very active here about 10 years ago. That organization still exists, and could be the foundation of one of the Community Committees referred to by the government and PRRD.

I understand that the reason the government is acting is that they have had many complaints from landowners in the Farmington area, where there is intensive natural gas development. The government anticipates that LNG Canada will soon announce a positive investment decision and activity will ramp up. As I've mentioned before, the highest priced sub-surface land sale in 2017 was up Farrell Creek Road and if LNG proceeds, this area is likely to see a lot of development. That being so, I wonder if landowners and other stakeholders see a benefit to rejuvenating the landowner group that was so active 10 years ago. If so, please get in touch with Mary Brereton (250 783 9464 or see her at the post office).

Union of BC Municipalities (UBCM)

The annual conference of all the local governments in BC is on September 10-14. It's a good forum to hear what other communities in the province are doing and to share what we are doing. Just as important is the opportunity to meet with provincial cabinet ministers and senior government officials.

We have applied for meetings on a number of issues such as the senior housing project being proposed by the Hudson's Hope Health Care and Housing Society; Rural Roads, especially Farrell Creek Hill; Highway 29 realignment; ambulance service and pre-hospital care; and protection of surface and ground water.

To those of you headed back to work or school make the best of the last week of holiday time, and may it be both smoke and fire-free!

District of Hudson's Hope Bylaw Information



District of Hudson's Hope Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 899, 2018

Council approved Third Reading and adopted the 'District of Hudson's Hope Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 899, 2018' at the Regular Council Meeting held on August 13th, 2018. This Bylaw amendment is in regard to Cannabis Related Businesses and is being created to allow Council the opportunity to review each proposal that comes forward on a case-by-case basis. A public hearing was held on August 13th, 2018, prior to Third Reading and Adoption.

District of Hudson's Hope Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 898, 2018

Council approved Third Reading and adopted the 'District of Hudson's Hope Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 898, 2018' at the Regular Council Meeting held on August 13th, 2018. This Bylaw amendment is in regard the definition of 'parking space' and to provide additional regulations surrounding landscaping plans and procedures for new building construction within the District of Hudson's Hope. It also gives direction in regard to the allowable cladding (exterior finishing) for houses and exterior buildings within the newly named Lucas subdivision, R1b Zone. A public hearing was held on August 13th, 2018, prior to Third Reading and Adoption.

Protective Services

Look, listen & be seen

Teach your child to be a safe pedestrian

Look. Make sure all vehicles have stopped before entering the road. Make eye contact before crossing.



Sidewalk/no sidewalk. Walk on the inside edge of the sidewalk away from the road, so you're further away from the traffic. Walk facing oncoming traffic if there isn't a sidewalk, so you can see approaching vehicles and make eye contact with drivers.

Set a good example. Never jaywalk or run to cross the street. Where possible, cross at intersections with a pedestrian crossing light or marked crosswalk

Map it out. Plan your child's route with them ahead of time. Review street names and landmarks to orient them.

Crossing Basics. Stop at the curb. Look left and right for oncoming vehicles that might be turning. When the intersection is clear, start crossing and keep looking for approaching vehicles.

Be Seen. Wear bright clothes and/or reflective gear especially at night and in poor weather.



Parked vehicles. Avoid shortcuts through parking lots or around parked cars where it's harder for drivers to see small children.





Listen. Put away the electronic gadgets, cell phones and ear buds so you can hear approaching traffic that may be hard to see.



Quiz time. Make a fun, interactive game out of guessing the correct traffic signs and meanings with your child.





Police Report: August 2018



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to approximately 45 calls for service over the last four weeks. During the month of July, the Hudson's Hope RCMP issued 70 Motor Vehicle Act Warnings and Violation Tickets.

Hudson's Hope RCMP are asking for the public's assistance in identifying a suspicious Ford F150, white in color, with a racing stripe down the side. This vehicle is suspected to be involved in several break and enters recently. Please contact the local detachment if you have any information related to this vehicle. File 2018-262 refers.

On July 25th, 2018, Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a complaint of a vehicle speeding in a construction zone, nearly hitting one of the flaggers. The vehicle was located and the driver was issued several violation tickets for driving without due care and attention, as well as distracted driving as he was using a cell phone when passing by police.

On August 3rd, 2018, Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a collision on Highway 29 involving a truck rear ending a boat and trailer being towed by another truck. The boat was dislodged from the trailer and sent flying across the opposite lane and into the ditch. Drivers of both trucks were treated for minor injuries. The driver of the offending vehicle was issued a violation ticket for driving without consideration for others.

On August 4th, 2018, Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a vehicle and determined the driver to have consumed enough alcohol to warrant a 3 day driving prohibition.

On August 6th, 2018, Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a collision involving two riders on a motorcycle. The driver was suspected of alcohol consumption and refused to provide a sample of breath. The driver was issued a 90 day driving prohibition and the motorcycle was impounded for 30 days. Both riders were treated for minor injuries and taken to hospital by ambulance.

On August 14th, 2018, Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a condensate tanker roll over. The truck and trailer were engulfed in flames and the driver was able extricate himself prior to emergency responders arriving. The driver was taken to hospital with serious burn injuries. The collision is still under investigation.


Please remember that the 30 Km/hr school zone will be in effect 08:00 am-05:00 pm on school days. Drivers found to be exceeding the posted limit could be issued


