We were recently awarded a \$15,000 AgriSpirit Fund grant from Farm Credit Canada (FCC). This will be used for our Public Library Enhancement project, which will update library furnishings and improve the library user experience.



FCC is giving \$1.5 million through its FCC AgriSpirit Fund to 84 community groups across Canada to support rural capital projects. This year, the FCC AgriSpirit Fund awarded between \$5,000 and \$25,000 for community improvement projects that enhance the lives of residents or contribute to sustainability in communities. Examples include equipment purchase and installation, energy efficient building improvements and repairs, and the purchase of rescue and fire equipment.

Hudson's Hope at the Union of BC Municipalities (UBCM) Conference:

Ambulance:

Every year it seems, we go talk about improving ambulance service in small communities; every year we are assured that some new innovation is going to greatly improve service for small communities; but every year, it seems, patients in need of ambulance transportation often have to wait for a unit to come from Chetwynd of Fort St John. To give credit where it is due, changes such as guaranteed four-hour callout per shit have been implemented and that is a giant step forward. We continue to have our small contingent of attendants who faithfully serve the community to the best of their ability. But we have not achieved the goal of having service consistently available within minutes of being called.

This year, a resolution from Chetwynd called for improved service for small ommunities, pointing out that sometimes they are left without an ambulance in their community. Hudson's Hope relies on Chetwynd or Fort St John to cover if we do not have service. The resolution sparked numerous comments, and not only from small communities. It seems that some of the larger centers in the Lower Mainland also have problems.

In the end, provision of province-wide ambulance service was referred to the UBCM executive for action. That will move the issue up the priority list so it will become a topic at high level province / UBCM meetings. That is a good step and hopefully will result in the service being significantly improved.

Rural Roads:

As part of the Regional District Rural Roads Task Force, I met with the Minister of Transportation. The presentation was made by Task Force consultant, Jackie Kjos, who has gathered together an impressive set of data to demonstrate the need for well-maintained rural roads if the province wishes to continue to extract resources from the rural land base.

Rural Roads cont'd.:

The Farrell Creek Hill and the Beryl Prairie Road are key to that effort and are at the top of the priority list for attention. The Ministry of Transportation (MOTI) is presently paving the Farrell Creek Road from the top of the hill. That is certainly improving that section, but if you can't get up the hill to get to it, it doesn't solve the problem. The hill is a huge problem because the slide which happened July 20 is a part of an unstable bank. MOTI representatives say the top of the slide is at the top of the plateau and the toe of it is in the river. So both the road up the Farrell Creek Hill and Hwy #29 attempt to cross this slide.

Both Farrell Creek and Beryl Prairie Roads are critical routes to get into the gas fields west of the Alaska Highway, which are expected to be a major source of gas if LNG Canada proceeds. The only other route in is off the Alaska Highway on the Upper Halfway Road and then south on the Haystack Road. However, the Haystack Bridge is not permitted for heavy industrial roads. ARC Resources has applied to the OGC for a permit to build a road to their sub-surface property on the plateau west of the Halfway, using the old Swanson Lumber Road to climb the hill.

If granted, that will help ARC but we still need a reliable all-season public road to serve the residents and industry at the top of the hill.

The Rural Roads Task Force has been a very active and effective committee. Their presentations and meetings at UBCM and earlier in Victoria has done a lot to inform the province of the importance of these roads and the need to construct and maintain them to carry the heavy industrial loads that are put on them.



Police Report: September 2018



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to approximately 57 calls for service over the last four weeks. During the month of August, the Hudson's Hope RCMP issued 34 Motor Vehicle Act Warnings and Violation Tickets. Two impaired drivers were located and issued immediate roadside driving prohibitions during this time.

The Hudson's Hope area has had an increase in break and enters and theft reports in recent weeks. Several files are under investigation and the public are asked to be vigilant, to secure their belongings, and to report any suspicious people or vehicles to local police. Remote residential and business properties, unattended vehicles, and storage facilities have been the most targeted. Property owners are encouraged to safeguard their properties and to check them regularly.

On August 25th, 2018, Hudson's Hope RCMP conducted a joint check stop with BC Conservation office at Farrell Creek road. Several warnings for minor infractions were issue to drivers. One driver was issued a three month driving suspension under the Motor Vehicle Act.

On August 27th, 2018, Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to Trespassers fishing near the Peace Canyon Dam spill way. The three were escorted out of the area and warned for Trespassing. The public are not permitted to access the river between the bridge and dam. Trespassers could be issued a \$115.00 violation ticket for Trespassing and/or be charged criminally for mischief, for interfering in normal operation of the dam. Please keep in mind that the restriction is for public safety as the spill way may be opened for emergency purposes with little notice to persons on the bank.

On September 5th, 2018, Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a stolen John Deer 50D Excavator and Hoe from a property near Reschke Road. Anyone with information can call the local detachment and quote file 2018-299

On September 7th, 2018, Hudson's Hope RCMP were called to a local residence for unwanted persons refusing to leave. The unwanted persons left prior to police arrival, however, one returned a short time later, driving a vehicle to the scene. The driver was found to be intoxicated while driving and was issued a 90 day roadside driving prohibition. The vehicle was impounded for 30 days.

On September 8th, 2018, Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a vehicle for speeding and expired trailer insurance. Two rifles were observed in the vehicle and the driver produced an expired firearms license. Charges for unauthorized possession of a firearm have been forwarded to Provincial Crown for approval.

On September 12^{th} , 2018, Hudson's Hope RCMP were advised of a theft of Crossbow from a parked vehicle on Beryl Prairie Road. The vehicle had the door lock punched out to gain access while the owner was out hunting. File 2018-314 refers.

On September 12th, 2018, Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a vehicle travelling at 158 Km/Hr on Hwy 29. The driver was subsequently found to be impaired by alcohol and was issued a 90 day roadside driving prohibition and the work truck was impounded for 30 days. The driver was also issued violation tickets for excessive speeding and driving contrary to restrictions.

Winter tires

Page Content

Winter driving can be challenging for even the most experienced drivers. Poor visibility and the presence of snow, slush and ice are additional hazards we normally don't have to deal with. Having the correct tires can make driving in winter conditions easier.

Identifying winter tires

Both the all-season Mud and Snow (M+S) tires and the mountain/snowflake tires meet the requirements for winter tire designation in B.C. To be considered a winter tire, a M+S or a mountain/snowflake tire must also have at least 3.5mm of tread depth. Tell your local tire retailer what kind of road and weather conditions you drive in, so you get tires that are best suited for your needs.

All-season M+S (Mud and Snow) tires

M+S tires are a safe option if you only encounter winter conditions on a limited basis and are prepared to drive with added care and caution if winter conditions are encountered.

Mountain/snowflake tires

If you live or travel in an area where you would normally and regularly expect snow, ice and slush, we recommend using four matched winter tires that carry the mountain/snowflake symbol. Mountain/snowflake tires offer a higher level of traction in harsh winter conditions, and receive their special designation for adhering to a performance-based standard (developed by the U.S. Rubber Manufacturers Association and the Rubber Association of Canada). They are the best winter tires available.

When you need winter tires

Most of us only encounter winter conditions such as ice, slush, or hard-packed snow on a limited basis. With this in mind, good quality all-season M+S tires may be fine for you. However, if you live in an area that regularly receives snow, go skiing often or enjoy other winter sports, your vehicle should be outfitted with four mountain/snowflake winter tires.

Routes requiring winter tires

Certain highways in B.C. require cars and light trucks to use winter tires from October 1 to March 31. Signs are posted on these designated highways to advise drivers where and when winter tires are required. Vehicles not equipped with winter tires are prohibited from travelling past the signs. These routes are on the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure website.

Winter tires and insurance

Driving without winter tires won't mean you're automatically at-fault in a crash. However, if you get in a crash where winter tires could have helped, not having them may affect whether, or how much, you are at-fault.

ELECTOR REGISTRATION

There is no need to pre-register to vote as the registration of all electors for this election will take place at the time of voting. You will be required to make a declaration that you meet the following requirements:

- · 18 years of age or older on general voting day
- · Canadian citizen
- resident of BC for at least 6 months immediately preceding the day of registration (April 19, 2018)
- resident of OR registered owner of real property in the District of Hudson's Hope for at least 30 days immediately preceding the day of registration (September 19, 2018), and
- · not disqualified under the Local Government Act or any other enactment from voting in an election or otherwise disqualified by law.

Resident electors must produce 2 pieces of identification (at least one with a signature). Picture identification is not necessary. The identification must prove both residency and identity.

Non-resident property electors must produce 2 pieces of identification (at least one with a signature) to prove identity, proof that they are entitled to register in relation to the property, and, if there is more than one owner of the property, written consent from the majority of the property owners

MAIL BALLOT VOTING

Qualified electors may vote by mail if they:

- · have a physical disability, illness or injury that affects their ability to vote at another voting opportunity. OR
- · expect to be absent from the District of Hudson's Hope on general voting day and at the times of all advance voting opportunities.

REQUESTING A MAIL BALLOT PACKAGE:

The District will be accepting mail ballot requests up to 4:00 pm on Thursday, October 18, 2018. The following information must be submitted to the District office:

- 1. Full name,
- 3. Address of the property in relation to which you are voting (for non-resident property electors),
- 4. Method of delivery of your mail ballot package:
 - · pick up at District office, OR
 - regular letter mail through Canada Post to residential address,
 - regular letter mail through Canada Post to an alternate address that you provide when requesting the ballot package

5. If you are a non-resident property owner please indicate this information as part of your request. A non-resident property owner application will be included in the package.

This information can be submitted by: mail (PO Box 330, Hudson) Hope, BC, VOC 1V0), telephone (250-783-9901), fax (250-783-5741) or email (clerk@hudsonshope.ca) to receive a mail ballot.

The District will send out mail ballot packages commencing on or about October 1, 2018. To be counted, your mail ballot must be received by the Chief Election Officer no later than 8:00 pm on Saturday, October 20, 2018.

CURBSIDE VOTING


