

District of Hudson's Hope Council Procedure Amendment Bylaw No. 900, 2018

Council adopted the 'District of Hudson's Hope Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 900, 2018' at the Regular Council Meeting held on November 26th, 2018. This Bylaw amendment changes the order of business at all regular Council meetings to the following:

- (j) Bylaws;
- (k) Correspondence;
- (I) Reports by Mayor and Council;
- (m) Old Business;
- (n) New Business; and
- (o) Public Inquiries.

District of Hudson's Hope Tax Exemption Bylaw No. 901, 2018

Council approved First, Second and Third Reading of the 'District of Hudson's Hope Property Tax Exemption Bylaw No. 901, 2018' at the Regular Council Meeting held on November 26th, 2018. Section 224 of the Community Charter stipulates that Council by Bylaw may exempt land or improvements from taxations for a period up to 10 years under the provisions of Section 224 (2). A notice will be posted in regard to the proposed tax exemptions.



Police Report: November 2018



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to approximately 20 calls for service over the last four weeks. During the month of November, the Hudson's Hope RCMP issued 23 Motor Vehicle Act Warnings and 28 Violation Tickets.

2018-11-01 Hudson's RCMP received a complaint from a local resident that two males in a black Dodge truck, unknown licence plate, had shot a deer on his property in the Farrell Creek road area. The property is vacant but is fenced and signed as private property. The two males left the dead deer there and drove away. It was believed the suspects had dark skin but it was unknown of what ethnicity they were. Complaint had also reported the incident to the Conservation Officer. Illegal hunting is a ongoing issue in the Hudson's Hope area. To date neither the pickup or suspects have been located.

2018-11-03 0824 hrs RCMP were dispatched to a two vehicle MVI on Farrell Creek Rd & Hunter Rd near Hudson's Hope. A 2018 White Ford Pickup was North bound on Farrell Creek Rd and when the driver applied brakes as he entered a corner he lost control of the truck. The truck spun into the oncoming lane of the dump truck pulling a pup travelling South bound on Farrell Ck Rd. Both vehicles sustained extensive damage and were not driveable. Fortunately neither driver sustained injury. The driver of the pickup was charged with failing to keep right. Speed, driver error and Road conditions were the contributing factors causing this motor vehicle incident.

2018-11-05 1500 hrs Hudson's Hope RCMP received a complaint of dogs running at large in the Beryl Praire Road area. Owners of the dogs were located and spoken to. To date there has been no further problems with this matter.

2018-11-09 RCMP received a 911 call reporting a logging truck at Km 2 of the Farrell Creek Rd had gone off the road. Provincial ambulance and Fire also attended. The driver was taken to hospital and believed to be suffering from a medical condition which may have led to him driving off the road. Vehicle sustained minor damage. Accident report completed, scene photographed and a medical review of drivers licence requested.

2018-11-15 A complaint was received reporting an abandoned black Dodge pickup truck on Reschke Road off of Highway 29 in Hudson's Hope. The truck was parked in the travel portion of the roadway and did not have any plates. The registered owner was requested to have the vehicle removed and did not have it towed. Police subsequently removed the truck as it had no insurance on it.

2018-11-15 Hudson's Hope received a third party report of a black 2007 Ford F350 in the ditch and was sitting on its roof. Upon Police attendance the vehicle had been removed. Registered owner did not report this matter to the Police.

2018-11-16 A local resident attended the Hudson's Hope RCMP detachment to report a suspicious occurrence. On 2018-11-15 at about 2300 hours, he saw a dark coloured Chevrolet Avalanche drive onto the back lot on Jamieson Ave. The driver had to open the back gate to gain access. The complainant is looking after the property and got into his vehicle to check why the Black Chev was there. On approach, the Avalanche took off quickly and actively evaded the property Rep. No plate was obtained. Matter reported information to Police.

2018-11-20 A Hudson's Hope off-duty member reported while walking on the Portage trail, noted a blue blanket or coat in the rocks near the river. Upon checking it determined it was an elderly woman sleeping under a blue sleeping bag. RCMP assisted the homeless woman by taking her to a known friend in the community.

2018-11-20 UBC research staff reported to the RCMP they had a 6500 Watt generator taken from their research site. Suspect and ATV were captured on video. This matter is still under investigation.


