

#### DISTRICT OF HUDSON'S

This will be my last column for the Hudson's Hope Bulletin, as I close off my Mayor's term on November 5, and the new Mayor and Council take over. It's been an interesting few years, and I wish the new Council and the Hudson's Hope people well in the future.

Thanks to all those who ran for office. You can't have a democracy if no one is willing to put their name forward and do the work. Government and the politics that go with it aren't spectator sports; people have to put in the effort. Kudos to all those who throw their hat into the ring at election time.

Congratulations to Mayor Dave Heiberg, Councillors Quibell, Gibbs, Miller, Markin, Paice and Summer. Thanks for stepping up to work at moving the community forward. I wish you well as you head into the next four years.

#### Reminiscing:

My memory isn't that great these days, but I believe my first election was in November, 1990, 28 years ago! Good Heavens! Not all on Council, though, as I didn't run in '93 or '96, if I remember right. So, 22 of the 28 years were on Council, the last six as Mayor.

1991 was a busy year. Computers were a recent addition to the office and it was in transition. A recycling program was initiated; Sam Kosolowsky designed the Hudson's Hope municipal flag; and the hillside behind the post-office was purchased to prevent it from being logged. Negotiations were underway between the School District and the municipality regarding the new school. There was a referendum on an underground museum. Water was extended to the Clark Avenue public works shop—and that was a *big* deal! (Estimated cost: \$128,020). Beryl Prairie was expanding: the Fire Hall was built, Council met with provincial Ministers to push for natural gas service, and garbage collection was begun.

Housing was an issue. BC Hydro was getting out of the housing business. So many houses were on the market that, according to a report made to Council, banks were refusing to give loans on Hudson's Hope houses. Hydro had needed to hire 10 employees but they had no place to live, given bank lending policies.

Some issues hang around in the background for years before they work their way to the forefront. The deteriorating state of the community hall was on the radar in 1991. Well, we're still dealing with that one, but this year, Council started a Community Hall reserve fund so that each year, money will be set aside for a new community hall. That way, in a few years, a sizeable nest egg will be available and if a federal/provincial infrastructure grant program comes along, the Hudson's Hope contribution will already be there. These things do get done, but sometimes it takes a long time!

#### HOPE COUNCIL NEWS



#### The Last Six Years:

Council's respond to the needs of a community according to their resources. Hudson's Hope is more fortunate than many communities our size, due to the pipeline and dam infrastructure within our boundaries. Because of that revenue, we can have the facilities like the pool, arena, curling rink etc., the summer flowers, the recreation programs, and so on. But water, sewer, roads and emergency response remain the core services provided by municipal government.

The large capital projects that we have completed over the past six years are designed to improve and maintain core facilities. I don't remember the first time that a new public works shop was talked about. But it has to be back in the 1990's. I remember going into the carpenter shop years ago, and seeing a rope strung from one corner to the other, kitty-corner, to hold up the light fixture. That and mold. It was definitely time. I am so pleased to see that shop finally replaced. We have an excellent facility that is not only more pleasant to work in, but more efficient. No more having to spend the first part of a shift brushing off snow and warming up the snow plow equipment! Not only that, but it's paid for, thanks to the money that had been put aside for so many years.

The Solar Array will reduce the amount of electricity drawn from the grid, thus reducing Hydro bills into the indefinite future. Less well-known locally, is the profile our Solar Project has given Hudson's Hope. One visitor mentioned to me not long ago that he didn't know whether our Array was well-known up here, but in renewable energy circles, our Hudson's Hope Solar Array is held up as a shining example of leadership going into the new energy era. The two provincial awards we received reinforces that assessment. And like the Shop, the Solar Project is fully paid for, thanks to renewable energy incentives.

The Lagoon Project rounds out the "Big Three" projects. Its size and specifications should be sufficient to serve the District long into the future. We paid for one-third of that; the rest came from senior government grants.

Those additions to infrastructure, along with improvements to the water system, extension of the sewer service, allocation of a residential subdivision, and light industrial area prepare Hudson's Hope for the future.

There are plenty more things for the new Council to do, but I am pleased to know that what we have accomplished in the past six years has provided a solid base to go forward.

We have indeed "lived in interesting times," these past few years. Thanks for your support and I wish Hudson's Hope well going forward!





# Police Report: October 2018



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to approximately 37 calls for service over the last four weeks. During the month of September, the Hudson's Hope RCMP issued 58 Motor Vehicle Act Warnings and Violation Tickets. Two impaired drivers were located and issued immediate roadside driving prohibitions for failing or refusing to provide breath samples. Two prohibited drivers were also stopped by police and charges were forwarded to Crown Counsel.

On September 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2018, Hudson's Hope RCMP, along with local Fire and Rescue, responded to a collision report received through an Onstar collision activation. The RCMP eventually located the vehicle on a private property driveway, flipped onto its roof, and leaking diesel fuel from a tidy tank. The driver was located at a residence on that property and had suffered only minor injuries. The fuel spill was reported to the Ministry of Environment for further follow up regarding cleaning up the spill.

On September 28<sup>th</sup>, 2018, Hudson's Hope RCMP were conducting a check stop when a southbound vehicle failed to stop for police. The vehicle was eventually stopped at a local business parking lot and determined to be stolen out of Alberta. The driver was arrested for possession of marihuana and for possession of stolen property. Charges are being forwarded to Crown Counsel for approval.

On September 29<sup>th</sup>, 2018, Hudson's Hope RCMP conducted a check stop with North District Traffic Services resulting in two prohibited drivers being located and charged. One driver was also arrested for an outstanding warrant and one driver was found to be impaired by alcohol.

On October 7<sup>th</sup>, 2018, Hudson's Hope RCMP, local Fire and Rescue, and Provincial Ambulance Service were called out to a vehicle parked in the road with hazard lights activated. A male was unresponsive in the driver seat. Police were able to wake the driver who was subsequently detained for impaired driving. The driver refused to provide a breath sample and was issued a 90 day Immediate roadside driving Prohibition and the vehicle was impounded for 30 days. The driver was also arrested for failing to comply with prior release conditions of not to consume alcohol. A breach charge has been forwarded to Crown counsel for approval.

On October 17<sup>th</sup>, 2018, Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a vehicle on Hwy 29. The vehicle had been reported stolen the previous day. The driver was arrested for taking the vehicle without the owner's consent and for an outstanding warrant for their arrest. The driver was subsequently released to appear in court.

On October 18<sup>th</sup>, 2018, Hudson's Hope RCMP conducted a check stop on Hwy 29 and located a driver that was operating a motor vehicle without a valid driver's license. The driver was issued an Unlicensed Driving prohibition, a violation ticket for not having a license, and the vehicle was impounded for 7 days.

# <u> Halloween Safety Tips</u>

#### **Costume safety:**

- While kids (and adults!) may be focused on a costume that impresses friends, try to keep safety top of mind:
- Wear a light-coloured or bright costume, reflective tape or arm bands to heighten visibility.
- Make sure the costume that is properly fitted to reduce the chance of tripping on it.
- Select a costume that is constructed from flame-retardant materials.
- Make sure your vision is not restricted. Consider completing your costume with make- up not masks. Removing masks while walking from house to house will help you see vehicles and hazards.
- Shoes should fit properly even if they do not go well with a costume.
- Create a fun necklace with string and glow sticks to keep kids visible to cars. Or accessorize with a flashlight!

#### Pedestrian Safety (Hit the sidewalk):

- If parents can't go with children, have another parent older sibling or babysitter go with them. Tell them to stay on the sidewalks
- Don't jaywalk. Use crosswalks whenever possible: Visit houses on one side of the street at a time and cross the street only at intersections or at marked cross walks

#### **Strangers:**

• Stay on the outside: Never enter a house; only accept treats at the front door

#### Plan ahead (Make a plan):

- Parents should be aware of the route that their children plan to follow
- Ensure your child is wearing a watch or has a cell phone to meet the agreed-upon curfew.

#### **Safety in Numbers:**

- Older children trick-or-treating without an adult should walk in groups and stay together **Emergencies:**
- Older children should know what to do to get in touch with you in case of an emergency.
- Make sure your child knows the places along his or her route where they can get help.

#### Fireworks:

• In many BC communities, the use of fireworks is strictly prohibited by law.

#### **Bring your treats home:**

• Save your treats. Wait until you get home before sampling your treats. Though tam pering is rare, a responsible adult should check out all treats and throw away any spoiled, unwrapped or suspicious items.



# PROTECTIVE SERVICES

#### What is a Winter Tire?

British Columbia accepts "mountain snowflake" or "mud and snow" tires with at least 3.5 mm tread as winter tires.

#### **Check your tires for these signs:**

The mountain/snowflake symbol on the side of the tire These winter tires offer the best traction on snow and ice, and in cold weather.

The mud and snow symbol on the side of the tire These winter tires offer better traction than summer tires, however, they are less effective than mountain/snowflake tires on snow and ice, and in cold weather.

**3.5 mm tread** Tires must have 3.5 mm of tread remaining to be considered winter tires.

Matching Winter Tires You must have at least 2 matching winter tires on the same axle, but it is recommended to use 4 matching tires.



#### **Studded Tires**

May be used on BC highways from October 1 to April 30, but **must** have mountain/snowflake or M+S symbols to be considered winter tires.

### When are Winter Tires or Chains Right for Me?

Winter tires and chains can make your vehicle safer.

You **MUST** use winter tires (passenger vehicles) or carry chains (commercial trucks) between October 1 and March 31 on **most BC Highways.** 

British Columbia's climates range from freezing cold to pleasantly mild in the winter; equipping your vehicle appropriately depends on what you are driving and where you
