DISTRICT OF HUDSON'S HOPE COUNCIL NEWS



Grant Writer update.

Electoral areas B, C, D, E and the District of Hudson's Hope have extended their support to continue hiring grant writer services for another year, 2019. The 2018 results are impressive. \$271,410 was approved as funding for the region, of which \$56,300 was approved for Hudson's Hope. This represents about 21% of the approved funding. In addition, the grant writers are waiting to hear about of another \$480,802 in applications which, if even a portion is approved, could improve our success rate.

Councillor Paice, through the Northern Development Initiative Trust, and Councillor Markin, through the Go Fund, are key District resources available to help your organization navigate the process.

I strongly encourage our Non Profit Societies to take advantage of this free service. There is money available, and we can help your organization leverage it.

Progress Energy is now owned by Petronas. Council was able to meet with Mark Fitz-gerald, President and CEO, and his senior staff recently to informally discuss a wide range of issues and concerns facing the region and more specifically, our community. Petronas expects to be operating in our region and the Pink Mountain area for at least the next forty years. However, they are not expecting the level of activity to return to the pace it was in 2013.

Council and Petronas share a common interest in continuing future discussions and are currently in the process of formalizing an engagement process.

A Quick update for those who are following the Caribou Recovery discussion. Representatives from the PRRD were able to meet with Provincial Ministers of Environment and Forests and Lands and their senior staff on January 23rd while at the B.C. Natural Resources Forum held in Prince George.

This was a productive meeting and key issues involving the process of stakeholder engagement were discussed. The Province has committed to work with the PRRD to evaluate and discuss these impacts within the region. The Province also committed to start public and stakeholder engagement in early February and that an agreement will not be finalized until potential impacts are completely understood.

Will keep folks posted as the process proceeds.

2019 Business License



The 2019 Business License statements have been mailed out. If you no longer require your Business license, please call the District Office to have your license cancelled. If you do not have a business license or are unsure if you require one, please stop in or call for more information.

Bylaw No. 504 clearly states "that no person shall carry on, within the Municipality, any business unless he or she is the holder of a valid and subsisting license issued to him or her under the bylaw by the License Inspector and shall pay therefore, to the License Inspector, the sum stated in the bylaw". The annual cost for a business license is \$50.00

If you are operating a business without a license, you are in direct violation of Bylaw No. 504.

A "business" is defined as any activity in which you receive monetary compensation for any services that you may provide within the community.

2018 Dog Licenses expire on December 31st.

Why Should I License My Dog?



Perhaps the best incentive for getting your dog licensed is that it increases your chances of getting your pet back if they get lost.

Licensing your dog with the District means staff are able to contact you if someone finds your dog.

It's Easy and Inexpensive

The cost is \$10.00 if your pet is spayed or neutered or \$30.00 if they are not. Stop by and pick up your license at the District Office, it only takes a few minutes.

Reduced Fines



The Fee for a dog picked up at large is \$60.00. There is an additional fee of \$60.00 if they are not licensed (this does not include any boarding fees, if applicable).

Automated External Defibrillators

What are They?

An automated external defibrillator (AED) is a small, portable device used to identify cardiac rhythms and deliver a shock to correct abnormal electrical activity in the heart. AEDs are used to treat <u>sudden cardiac arrest</u> (SCA).

Up to 40,000 cardiac arrests occur each year in Canada. That's one cardiac arrest every 13 minutes.

Eighty-five per cent of cardiac arrests in Canada happen outside of hospitals, and having an AED close by can make all the difference. The American Heart Association warns that for

every minute lost before defibrillation, the survival rate decreases by seven to 10 per cent. After 12 minutes, the survival rate plummets to less than five per cent.

When CPR and an AED are both used within five minutes of a cardiac arrest, the chance of survival rises by nearly 75 per cent, according to research published in the Journal of the American College of Cardiology.

Where are They?

Ouick access to an AED can greatly improve a patient's survivability rate, and knowing where AEDs are located within your community can help facilitate this. Fortunately there are a number of AEDs located within the District of Hudson's Hope. Emergency responders including police, fire and BC Ambulance all have devices on their apparatus and vehicles. There are also AEDs located at the Pool in the summer and at the Arena in the winter, and staff at these locations have training in their use. Hudson's Hope School has an AED in the staff room and has staff trained in its use. Other places that might be less obvious are the Library where an AED is on site, and staff and board members have received training in AED and CPR, and Silver Willow Court where they also have an AED available.

On behalf of Hudson's Hope School, I would like to extend a sincere Thank You and Best Wishes to Mr. Tim Viers and his family.







Police Report: January 2019



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to approximately 30 calls for service over the last four weeks. During this period, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 5 motor vehicle collisions and conducted 3 check stops in an effort to combat impaired driving. During the month of December, 38 violation tickets and written warnings were issued to drivers.

The Hudson Hope RCMP would like to officially welcome Cst. Erich Schmidt to the detachment. Cst. Schmidt and his family recently transferred here from the Lower mainland. The Schmidts are avid hunters and are excited to be in Hudson's Hope for the next few years.

On December 19th, 2018, Hudson's Hope RCMP conducted a check stop on Highway 29 and located a driver who was found to be driving without a valid driver's licence. The driver was also found to be flagged for vehicle impound. The vehicle was impounded and the driver was issued a violation ticket for driving without a valid licence.

On January 9th, 2019, Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a single vehicle rollover collision on Canyon Drive. The vehicle was located on its roof with no occupants. The owner of the vehicle was located at home and was not injured. Poor road conditions were a factor in the collision.

On January 12th, 2019, Hudson's Hope RCMP were called to a local residence to remove two intoxicated males who were no longer welcome there and refused to leave. One male had left prior to police arrival and went home. The second male was too intoxicated to care for himself and was subsequently arrested and lodged in cells. He was released the following morning when sober.

On January 19th, 2019, Hudson's Hope RCMP were called to a single vehicle collision on Hwy 29. A tanker truck had experienced a brake malfunction while travelling down Farrell Creek Road and went into the ditch across Hwy 29. No injuries were sustained by the driver and no cargo had leaked from the tanker. The driver was issued a Notice and Order to have the brakes repaired and inspected prior to driving the vehicle on the road again.

The Hudson's Hope RCMP is still seeking volunteers for the local Speed Watch program which will commence in the spring. Anyone interested in participating in this program can contact the local detachment, 250-783-5241, to learn more. The Speed Watch program is not an enforcement campaign, but a statistical and awareness campaign. It provides a visual aid to motorists reminding them of their speeds, as well as tracks the number of speeding vehicles in certain areas which assists the RCMP in identifying areas where speed enforcement may be needed. Volunteers do not stop vehicles nor interact with drivers.


