1. CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting called to order at 5:00 p.m. with Mayor Dave Heiberg presiding.

 Began by explaining that they had they were presenting an Independent Audit Report of the Financial Statements. 1830-01

- Financial Assets are show as of December 31, 2018.
 - The higher amount for the prior year's accounts receivable was largely accounted to the grant funding outstanding for the lagoon project.
 - The higher accounts payable from the prior year was due to a significant number of outstanding invoices for the lagoon project.
 - The Assets balance for 2018 has increased overall.
 - The Deferred revenue is in relation to the BC Hydro Partnering Relationship Agreement.
 - Liabilities have decreased overall from 2017 to 2018.
 - 2018 had some prepaid expenses compared to 2017.
 - Land held for sale is the Lucas Subdivision lands.

- The \$902,000 in additions through the year were offset with by the depreciation expense which resulted in the balance remaining consistent.
- There were a large number of projects completed during 2018;
 lagoons, roads and solar for example.
- Revenues for 2018 were in line with the budgeted amount;
 Expenses were higher than budgeted; amortization is not included in the expense amount; surplus shown for 2017 was invested in capital projects.
- Realized sales of services was lower due to not receiving the net metering rebate and a few other items.
- Government transfers- previous year balance was higher due to capital grants received for project funding.
- General government expenditures are higher due to amortization and the loss on the Lucas Subdivision not being realized in the budget amount.
- Reviewed the surplus continuity: majority is in investment of tangibles; general fund includes the balance for land development.
- Provided an explanation of the reserve funds; reserves had decreased from 2017 to 2018.

- Provided an explanation of what are the MFA reserves.
