Damage Waiver forms are available at the District Office and must be completed by Thursday, June 13<sup>th</sup>, 2018. Items need to be placed on the curb/property line. Gas tanks and tires need to be removed from vehicles prior to pick up for safety and environmental reasons.

You must provide your name, civic address or location of item(s), telephone number and which item(s) you want picked up. A waiver will need to be signed to authorize the District to remove items. A sticker, provided by the District, must be put on the article to be removed. **ALL ITEMS MUST BE LOCATED AT THE CURB!** The District staff will not go onto private property.

### 2019 PROPERTY TAXES

Property taxes were mailed out on the 17th of May. Please call the District Office if you have not yet received your notice.

Taxes must be paid by **Wednesday, July 2<sup>nd</sup>** to avoid penalty. A 10% penalty applies on the outstanding amount after this date, so even if you cannot make a payment, please claim your Home Owner Grant (HOG) prior to the deadline.

Apply for your HOG online ([see instructions below](#)) or in person at the District Office with your 2019 tax bill. If you have any questions please contact Rhonda Eastman, *Deputy Treasurer* at the District Office at 250-783-9901.

### Claim your Home Owners Grant Online Easy steps to claiming your HOG online:

3. Enter your Roll number and password from your tax form

7. Confirmation that your application has been sent will appear and you can print a copy for your files.

### YOUTH EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY- TRAIL MAINTENANCE CREW

Cameron Lake Outdoor Education Center is seeking two (2) seasonal **Youth Trail Maintenance Crew** members. The primary duties include trail maintenance, vegetation clearing and general grounds keeping of the camp area.



#### Responsibilities

- Working outdoors in a forested setting for up to 8 hours per day
- Safely working with various tools (loppers, hand saws, rakes, shovels, axes, weed whacker, etc.)
- Hiking up to 10km over rough terrain and conducting physically demanding work
- Following detailed instructions while working independently and as part of a team
- Having a positive attitude and enthusiasm for physical outdoor work

#### Requirements

- Must be at least 15 years of age
- Must be a student: high school or post-secondary and reside in the Hudson's Hope area
- Transportation to and from the Cameron Lake Outdoor Center may be available, but having your own transportation would be an asset.
- Provide your own safety boots, gloves, glasses and backpack.

This position will start early July and extend for approximately 6 weeks. Working hours are flexible and will vary. Work will primarily occur on Saturdays and/or Sundays, depending on worker availability. It is expected that work will include 8-16 hours per week.

Rain and cooler temperatures for the beginning of May delayed many of our spring activities from grass cutting to general clean-up work around the District. Poor weather the week before opening impeded our ability to balance the chlorine levels, but we finally got there just in time for the sun on Victoria Day. The pictures below show the progress from repairs to opening, including the contractor under a tarp due to falling snow as they worked.

Victoria Day weekend also saw the opening of our four campgrounds – King Gething, Alwin Holland, Dinosaur Lake and Cameron Lake. Many sites were booked keeping our attendants hopping from site to site. Following the initial clean up, we will be undertaking more work to bring the campgrounds up to pristine condition.

Bulk item spring clean-up will occur in June. Don't forget to register at the District Office. Details will be released in the very near future.

## DISTRICT OF HUDSON'S HOPE BYLAW INFORMATION



### **District of Hudson's Hope Fees and Charges Bylaw No. 904, 2019**

Council adopted the '*District of Hudson's Hope Fees and Charges Bylaw No. 904, 2019*' at the Regular Council Meeting held on May 13, 2019. This Bylaw consolidates '*District of Hudson's Hope Fees and Charges Bylaw No. 843, 2014*' with all amendments made to Bylaw No. 843 since 2014. A new Schedule D has been included which provides updated rates and a new definition of 'Family' in relation to pool fees. A new Schedule B has been included to recognize the approved Commercial Water Stand rate of 1.82 cents per imperial gallon (\$4.00/m<sup>3</sup>).

## Police Report: MAY 2019

Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 35 calls for service between April 18<sup>th</sup> and May 20<sup>th</sup>. Five checkstop road blocks were conducted in an effort to deter impaired driving and enforce the Motor Vehicle Act and Regulations. Several checkstops were jointly conducted with CVSE officers who issued several violation tickets and remove defective vehicles from the roadway. One impaired driver was located and issued a 90 day Immediate Roadside driving prohibition. 30 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers in April. Hudson's Hope RCMP in conjunction with Marg's Mini Mart, have begun their positive ticketing campaign and will be issuing youth free ice cream tickets for positive behavior.

On May 14<sup>th</sup>, 2019, Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a break and enter into two Atco trailers along Hwy 29 near Farrell Creek. The file is still under investigation at this time. File 2019-141 refers.

On May 17<sup>th</sup>, 2019, Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation and found the driver to have a warrant for arrest. The driver was arrested and later released on a Promise to Appear in Prince George court on outstanding matters.

On May 18<sup>th</sup>, 2019, Hudson's Hope RCMP, Peace Region Traffic Services and relief RCMP members from across the region, located a theft of fuel in progress on Johnson Creek FSR. Two suspects were arrested and later released on Promise to Appear in court.

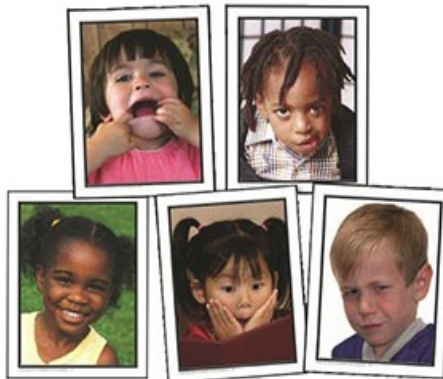

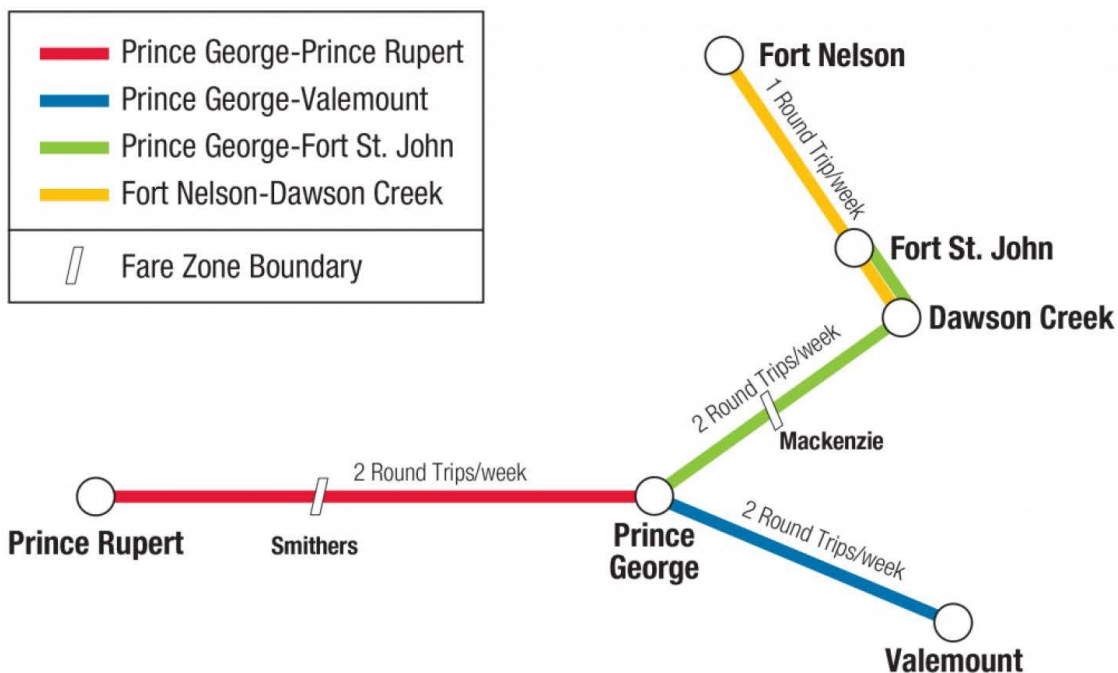

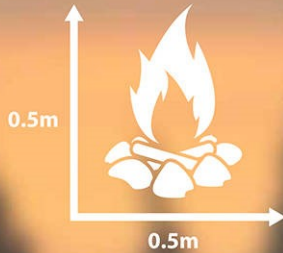

# OPEN FIRE REGULATIONS

## CAMPFIRES, CATEGORY 2 FIRES AND CATEGORY 3 FIRES: WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?



### CAMPFIRE:

- Any fire smaller than 0.5 metres high by 0.5 metres wide

#### REGULATIONS:



You must have ready access to 8 litres of water or a shovel for the entire time your campfire is lit.



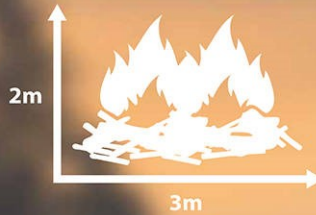
Your campfire must be completely extinguished and the ashes must be cool to the touch before leaving the area for any length of time. (Hot coals can reignite the fire.)



During campfire prohibitions, only a CSA- or ULC-approved portable campfire apparatus may be used, and the flame height must not exceed 15 centimetres.



You must build a fire guard around your campfire.



### CATEGORY 2 FIRE:

- 1 to 2 concurrently burning piles no larger than 2 metres high by 3 metres wide
- Stubble or grass burning over an area less than 0.2 hectares

#### REGULATIONS:



A fuel break must be established around any Category 2 burn area.



Fireworks are banned when a Category 2 fire prohibition is in effect.



Burning barrels are banned when a Category 2 fire prohibition is in effect.



At least one person equipped with a fire-fighting hand tool must monitor the fire at all times.



### CATEGORY 3 FIRE:

- Any fire larger than 2 metres high by 3 metres wide
- 3 or more concurrently burning piles no larger than 2 metres high by 3 metres wide
- 1 or more burning windrows
- Stubble or grass burning over an area greater than 0.2 hectares

#### REGULATIONS:



A fuel break must be established around any Category 3 burn area.



Monitor your open burn to ensure that the fire doesn't spread beyond its intended size.



You must have a burn registration number to light a Category 3 open fire. Call the burn registration line 1 888 797-1717 to obtain one.

## GENERAL REGULATIONS:



Never burn in strong wind conditions.



Your fire must be extinguished before leaving the area.



Always keep your fire a safe distance away from nearby branches, wood and other combustible materials.



Do not conduct Category 2 or Category 3 burns when venting conditions are "Poor" or "Fair". Always check here first: [www.bcairquality.ca/readings/ventilation-index.html](http://www.bcairquality.ca/readings/ventilation-index.html)

\*Further bans and restrictions can be implemented at the BC Wildfire Service's discretion.



Anyone found in contravention of an open fire prohibition may be fined up to \$1,150. If your fire escapes and results in a wildfire, you may be fined anywhere from \$100,000 to \$1 million and be sentenced to one year in prison. Please check with local government authorities for any other restrictions before lighting any open fire.

# Protective Services

## DROWNING: IT CAN HAPPEN IN SECONDS

**Drowning is a leading cause of preventable injury and death in children under 10 in Canada.**

**Sixty per cent of drownings occur in the four summer months from May to August, according to the Canadian Red Cross.**



For parents and caregivers of children, part of the problem could be perceptual. In our popular imagination, drowning involves a protracted commotion: thrashing, gasping and cries for help. But when a drowning occurs in real life, it often happens swiftly and silently.

The difference between our ideas about drowning and the reality of it can give us a false sense of security. Parents and caregivers can help to prevent drownings by taking a few basic precautions:

**ACTIVELY SUPERVISE CHILDREN** when they are in or around water. For children under five and weak swimmers, active supervision means staying close -- within arm's reach. The Canadian Lifesaving Society recommends a supervision ratio of at least one adult for every baby, and one adult for every two small children. With older children, including good swimmers, it is still important to watch closely. Do not rely on a "buddy system" to keep kids safe, or make older children responsible for younger ones.

For extra protection, especially if you are watching more than one child, have children under five and weak swimmers **WEAR LIFE JACKETS** when playing in and around water. While boating, always wear your own lifejacket and ensure children are outfitted with lifejackets that fit them properly.

**LEARN FIRST AID AND CPR** (cardiopulmonary resuscitation). It doesn't take long to get trained in these lifesaving skills. Many people have been saved from drowning by bystanders who knew how to properly administer First Aid and CPR.

Put your kids in **SWIMMING LESSONS**. Although formal swimming lessons can't "drown-proof" children, some studies show kids who receive swim training are less likely to drown. If your own swimming abilities could use some work, consider enrolling in adult learn-to-swim or swim improvement class. Some courses, like the Lifesaving Society's Swim to Survive program, focus on water survival skills.

**FENCE IT:** if you have a backyard pool (including above-ground pool or temporary pool that will not be emptied after each use), or if you have a spa or hot tub, the best practice is to fence it off completely on *all four sides*. The fence should be at least four-feet high, with no gaps larger than four-inches. Access should be restricted by a latching, self-closing gate. It may be useful to keep in mind that chain link fences may be easier for children to scale than a fence made of vertical metal bars. Regardless of the fence style, four sided "isolation" fencing is more effective than three-sided "perimeter" fencing where the house is used as the fourth side.
