2019 PROPERTY TAXES

Property taxes were mailed out on the 17th of May. Please call the District Office if you have not yet received your notice.

Taxes must be paid by **Wednesday**, **July 2**nd to avoid penalty. A 10% penalty applies on the outstanding amount after this date, so even if you cannot make a payment, please claim your Home Owner Grant (HOG) prior to the deadline.



Cameron Lake Outdoor Education Center is seeking two (2) seasonal **Youth Trail Maintenance Crew** members. The primary duties include trail maintenance, vegetation clearing and general grounds keeping of the camp area.



Outdoor Education Center

Responsibilities

- Working outdoors in a forested setting for up to 8 hours per day
- Safely working with various tools (loppers, hand saws, rakes, shovels, axes, weed whacker, etc.)
- Hiking up to 10km over rough terrain and conducting physically demanding work
- Following detailed instructions while working independently and as part of a team

Rain and cooler temperatures for the beginning of May delayed many of our spring activities from grass cutting to general clean-up work around the District. The District's tent will be erected near the pool and soccer fields in the last week of May. It will remain at that location for the summer and is not available for private rentals. The tent is available for use at its current location.



DISTRICT OF HUDSON'S HOPE BYLAW INFORMATION



District of Hudson's Hope Fees and Charges Bylaw No. 904, 2019

Council adopted the 'District of Hudson's Hope Fees and Charges Bylaw No, 904, 2019' at the Regular Council Meeting held on May 13, 2019. This Bylaw consolidates 'District of Hudson's Hope Fees and Charges Bylaw No, 843, 2014' with all amendments made to Bylaw No. 843 since 2014. A new Schedule D has been included which provides updated rates and a new definition of 'Family' in relation to pool fees. A new Schedule B has been included to recognize the approved Commercial Water Stand rate of 1.82 cents per imperial gallon (\$4.00/m³).



Police Report: MAY 2019

Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 35 calls for service between April 18th and May 20th. Five checkstop road blocks were conducted in an effort to deter impaired driving and enforce the Motor Vehicle Act and Regula-

tions. Several checkstops were jointly conducted with CVSE officers who issued several violation tickets and remove defective vehicles from the roadway. One impaired driver was located and issued a 90 day Immediate Roadside driving prohibition. 30 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers in April. Hudson's Hope RCMP in conjunction with Marg's Mini Mart, have begun their positive ticketing campaign and will be issuing youth free ice cream tickets for positive behavior.

On May 14th, 2019, Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a break and enter into two Atco trailers along Hwy 29 near Farrell Creek. The file is still under investigation at this time. File 2019-141 refers.

On May 17th, 2019, Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation and found the driver to have a warrant for arrest. The driver was arrested and later released on a Promise to Appear in Prince George court on outstanding matters.

On May 18th, 2019, Hudson's Hope RCMP, Peace Region Traffic Services and relief RCMP members from across the region, located a theft of fuel in progress on Johnson Creek FSR. Two suspects were arrested and later released on Promise to Appear in court.







OPEN FIRE REGULATIONS

CAMPFIRES, CATEGORY 2 FIRES AND CATEGORY 3 FIRES: WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?



CAMPFIRE:

Any fire smaller than 0.5 metres high by 0.5 metres wide

REGULATIONS:



You must have ready access to 8 litres of water or a shovel for the entire time your campfire is lit.



Your campfire must be completely extinguished and the ashes must be cool to the touch before leaving the area for any length of time. (Hot coals can reignite the fire.)



During campfire prohibitions, only a CSA- or ULC-approved portable campfire apparatus may be used, and the flame height must not exceed 15 centimetres.



You must build a fire guard around your campfire.

CATEGORY 2 FIRE:

- 1 to 2 concurrently burning piles no larger than 2 metres high by 3 metres
- Stubble or grass burning over an area less than 0.2 hectares

REGULATIONS:



around any Category 2 burn



Fireworks are banned when a Category 2 fire prohibition is in Burning barrels are banned when



a Category 2 fire prohibition is in effect.



At least one person equipped with a fire-fighting hand tool must monitor the fire at all times.

CATEGORY 3 FIRE:

- Any fire larger than 2 metres high by 3 metres wide
- 3 or more concurrently burning piles no larger than 2 metres high by 3
- 1 or more burning windrows
- Stubble or grass burning over an area greater than 0.2 hectares

REGULATIONS:



A fuel break must be established around any Category 3 burn



Monitor your open burn to spread beyond its intended size.



You must have a burn registration number to light a Category 3 open fire. Call the burn registration line 1888 797-1717 to obtain one.

GENERAL REGULATIONS:

DROWNING: IT CAN HAPPEN IN SECONDS

Drowning is a leading cause of preventable injury and death in children under 10 in Canada.

Sixty per cent of drownings occur in the four summer months from May to August, according to the Canadian Red Cross.

For parents and caregivers of children, part of the problem could be perceptual. In our popular imagination, drowning involves a protracted commotion: thrashing, gasping and cries for help.



But when a drowning occurs in real life, it often happens swiftly and silently.

The difference between our ideas about drowning and the reality of it can give us a false sense of security. Parents and caregivers can help to prevent drownings by taking a few basic precautions:

ACTIVELY SUPERVISE CHILDREN when they are in or around water. For children under five and weak swimmers, active supervision means staying close -- within arm's reach. The Canadian Lifesaving Society recommends a supervision ratio of at least one adult for every baby, and one adult for every two small children. With older children, including good swimmers, it is still important to watch closely. Do not rely on a "buddy system" to keep kids safe, or make older children responsible for younger ones.

For extra protection, especially if you are watching more than one child, have children under five and weak swimmers **WEAR LIFE JACKETS** when playing in and around water. While boating, always wear your own lifejacket and ensure children are outfitted with lifejackets that fit them properly.

LEARN FIRST AID AND CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation). It doesn't take long to get trained in these lifesaving skills. Many people have been saved from drowning by bystanders who knew how to properly administer First Aid and CPR.

Put your kids in **SWIMMING LESSONS**. Although formal swimming lessons can't "drown-proof" children, some studies show kids who receive swim training are less likely to drown. If your own swimming abilities could use some work, consider enrolling in adult learn-to-swim or swim improvement class. Some courses, like the Lifesaving Society's Swim to Survive program, focus on water survival skills.

FENCE IT: if you have a backyard pool (including above-ground pool or temporary pool that will not be emptied after each use), or if you have a spa or hot tub, the best practice is to fence it off completely on *all four sides*. The fence should be at least four-feet high, with no gaps larger than four-inches. Access should be restricted by a latching, self-closing gate. It may be useful to keep in mind that chain link fences may be easier for children to scale than a fence made of vertical metal bars. Regardless of the fence style, four sided "isolation" fencing is more effective than three-sided "perimeter" fencing where the house is used as the fourth side.




