RECYCLING PLASTIC CONTAINERS

Accepted Materials

- Plastic jugs with screw tops used for milk, cooking oil, laundry detergent and fabric softener, cleaning solutions, cleaning products, body care products, windshield washer fluid, etc.
- Plastic bottles with screw caps, spray pump, or pull-up tops for food, dish soap, mouthwash, shampoos, conditioners and other personal care products, pills and vitamins, laundry products, etc.
- Plastic jars with wide mouths and screw -top lids for peanut butter, jam, nuts, condiments, vitamins and supplements, personal care products, etc.
- Plastic clamshells with hinged or clickclosed tops for baked goods, fruit, produce, eggs, etc.
- Plastic back-bottom trays and clear tops for deli chicken, single-serve meals, prepared foods, baked goods, housewares, and hardware such as screws or picture hangers, etc.
- Plastic tubs and lids for food such as

- margarine and spreads, dairy products such as yogurt, cottage cheese, sour cream, ice cream, etc.
- Plastic cold drink cups with lids for takeout beverages
- Plastic garden pots and trays for bedding plants, seedlings, vegetable plants, etc.
- Plastic pails less than 25L for laundry detergent, ice cream, pet food, etc.
- Microwavable bowls and cups
- Empty single-use coffee and tea pods; remove lids and do not include lids with recycling
- Rigid plastic packaging for toys, toothbrushes, batteries, etc; remove paper backing and recycle separately.



- Ceramic plant pots
- Lawn edging, tarps, plastic furniture or toys
- Garden hoses
- Plastic string or rope
- Plastic paint cans (call the RCBC Hotline 1-800-667-4321 or check Recyclepedia)
- Pails larger than 25L
- Pails for lubricants and oils (call the RCBC Hotline 1-800-667-4321 or check <u>Recyclepedia</u>)
- Microwavable bowls with metal rims
- Plastic or foil lids from coffee and tea pods

X Not Accepted

- Beverage bottles or jugs for flavoured tea, juice, or other beverages (return to depot for deposit refund)
- Containers for motor oil, vehicle lubricant or antifreeze products (call the RCBC Hotline 1-800-667-4321 or check <u>Recyclepedia</u>)
- Packaging labelled biodegradable or compostable
- Liquid-absorbing pads, e.g., in trays of meat, poultry, fish, etc.
- Plastic wrap
- Plastic blister packs e.g. plastic/foil protective packaging for chewing gum and pills







Police Report: JULY 2019

Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 40 calls for service between June 18th and July 19th. 66 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers in June. Highway and road safety continues to be a focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP. Speeding fines range from \$138 to \$196. Excessive speeding

will result in a \$368 fine and a 7 day vehicle impound. Please obey local speed limits and drive responsibly.

On June 21st, 2019, Hudson's Hope RCMP, BC Ambulance Services, and Local Fire and Rescue personnel responded to an off road vehicle (ORV) collision on Beryl Prairie road that resulted in a hydro pole being broken off and a localized power outage. The operator of the ORV was taken to hospital with serious but non-life threatening injuries. Alcohol was not a factor, however the ORV was being operated on the main road without insurance, on the wrong side of the road and speeding. The operator was issued several violation tickets under the Off Road Vehicle Act.

On July 6th, 2019, Hudson's Hope RCMP began an investigation of fraud. A visitor to the area had their dog run away while they were camping locally. Posters and online alerts were posted and the dog's owners were contacted by an unknown male. The male advised the owners that he had found the dog and wished to collect the reward before returning the dog. The owners unfortunately sent an e-transfer to the suspect and they did not hear from him again. They did find their dog eventually, near the location where they had been camping. The file is still under investigation.

On July 8^{th} , 2019, Hudson's Hope RCMP were advised of a theft of items from a rural property on Twelve Mile road. Some of the items included a generator, European exterior doors, windows and a cook stove. The file remains under investigation and police ask that any suspicious people or vehicles in that area are reported to police as soon as possible.

On July 13th, 2019, Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a vehicle for travelling well over the posted speed limit. The driver was found to not have a valid licence and was in fact prohibited from driving. The driver was issued a speeding ticket and the vehicle was impounded for 7 days. The driver was also issued and Appearance Notice to appear in court for driving while prohibited contrary to the Motor Vehicle Act.





August at the Hudson's Hope Museum

We would like to invite you to come in and check out the Bedaux Exhibit which is back on display after a 6-year hiatus and Journey around Alberta and British Columbia.



Charles Bedaux was captivated with the country surrounding Hudson's Hope after embarking on a hunting trip in the area in 1932. His attempt, two years later, to take five Citroen half tracks across the northern wilderness of British Columbia is known throughout the world. This "Champagne Safari" did not reach its Telegraph Creek destination but it gave much needed employment to local cowboys during the Depression.

The role of the Hudson's Hope cowboys has been overshadowed by historical emphasis on Charles Bedaux's lifestyle and adventures. Through profiling the lives of these cowboys, this exhibition highlights their important role as wranglers and packers to the expedition.

Included in the exhibition are copies of the maps showing the arduous route from Fort St. John to Telegraph Creek and previously unpublished photographs.

The Next Historical Society meeting will be held on **August 15th, 2019** at **6 pm** at the museum grounds. Our monthly meetings will be rotating between 1 pm and 7pm in 2019, depending the month- please watch for reminders for the time. Everyone is welcome at historical meetings. The Importance of a 9-1-1 Address

Properly displaying your civic number on your house or at the end of your drive ensures fast emergency response for the AMBULANCE, FIRE and POLICE Services. Precious minutes can pass while the emergency vehicle attempts to locate the emergency incident.

It is strongly recommended that you ensure that a civic address is posted with the following guidelines in place:

- •the civic address the District has assigned to the premises must be displayed on the principal building on the premises and must be legible from a minimum distance of fifteen (15) metres;
- •where a building is set back from the street or roadway fronting the property such that the assigned street address is not clearly legible from the street or roadway, or where landscaping or architectural appurtenances or other obstructions obstruct the address, the assigned street address shall also be displayed at the driveway entrance from the street or road serving the building on a weather-resistant sign permanently mounted on a post and visible from all direction of traffic flow; and
- •letters or numbers displayed on a building must be of a colour which contrasts with the background colour of the building or sign.

DISTRICT OF HUDSON'S HOPE PUBLIC WORKS NEWS & VIEWS



July was another busy month for your Public Works crews. Grass cutting is proceeding with a full complement of staff and road grading has re-commenced.

We continue to maintain and monitor your water supply by performing bi-weekly tests at the water plant as well as numerous locations around the core area. Tests show that the water leaving the treatment plant, and the water we supply to most of the District is extremely clean and free of contaminants.

Staff assisted with the set up and take down for Canada Day in the Park. This was a well attended event with a busy barbeque and great local musicians. I'm told the food lasted until about 2:00 p.m. but events and music lasted until 4:00 p.m. Well done to the District staff and volunteers that made this a great day.

Did you know that we cut grass at over 50 locations throughout the District? These areas stretch from Cameron Lake Campground to Beryl Prairie Playground and through the heart of the residential and commercial core area and include all municipal sites as well as both cemeteries. This does not include the kilometres of open ditches and rough grass lands that we trim cut each year.

The pool is running well, and we receive lots of compliments on our pool and the pool staff. We recently updated the family washroom/change room with a kid/family friendly toilet seat. This is not exciting to most, but it is a benefit to parents with small children.

The electrical receptacles in Beattie Park were updated with GFCI (ground fault circuit interrupters) receptacles with weather covers to make their use safe for all. This will reduce the likelihood of electrical shock, especially in wet weather. We are now working with electrical companies to update the electrical system in the library.

Staff also put the finishing touches to the Beryl Prairie playground with the installation of new basketball posts and hoops. The site has been seeded and over time the grass will grow. The playground has a children's play area with swings and a climbing frame in addition to the basketball court.

The Beryl Prairie Fire Hall now has a new septic system to carry them forward for the next generation. A local contractor installed underground septic tanks to the south side of the hall.

Additionally, we are finalizing an agreement to install a new pump on the Beryl Prairie well. This will eliminate issues we had in the past with the existing pump which ran at its electrical capacity from time to time, causing the power feed to fail.


Contracts have been awarded for the crushing of gravel at our pit. Bid prices were very good and we were able to increase the volume of crushed gravel by 75% within the assigned budget.

We are also finalizing a contract to replace several water valves that are seized or leaking. This will give us better control of our water network in the District. Work is expected to commence in early September and be complete at the end of the month. Please be courteous around the crews and give them room when driving past work sites.

Continue to enjoy your summer, check out the pool as you only have a month left. If you haven't done so yet or its been a while, check out the museum to see what they have to show, or go to the Visitor Centre to remind yourself of local attractions.

Homeowner Information to Building Permits

The District of Hudson's Hope wants to assist homeowners and contractors to avoid unnecessary delays and expense in planning and construction of residential projects. Below explains when permits are required, requirements for the permit, possible other documents that may be required and other information to assist you in obtaining your building permit. Additional information is available at the District Office or online at www.hudsonshope.ca

A BUILDING PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO:

- construct a new home;
- •locate mobile / modular home;
- construct a commercial, industrial or public use building;
- •construct a new accessory building e.g., carport, farm building, garage or storage shed;
- renovate existing buildings;
- •undertake any structural work such as interior partitions;
- enclose a porch or roof over a sundeck;
- move or demolish a building;
- re-roof a building;
- reconstruct after damage;
- plumbing system changes;

INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED WITH A BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION

The following items must be supplied along with a completed Building Permit Application before a Building Permit can be issued. A Building Permit fee is based on the value of the building or structure and will be calculated by the Building Official.


1. BUILDING PLANS


Two sets of detailed building plans. If you cannot draw the necessary building or site plans, then you should obtain the services of a qualified person.

Example Floor Plans

- scale not less than 1:50 metric (1/4 inch to 1 foot);
- size and location of windows and doors;
- location of all plumbing fixtures;
- location of all mechanical equipment.

- all rooms, size and use of each;
- all dimensions;
- finished and unfinished areas; —





2. SITE PLAN

- full legal description of lot: lot number, plan number; district lot number (from your tax notice or Title);
- lot dimensions;
- adjoining street names;
- locations and uses of existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- distances from all property lines for existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- location of legal road access to the property;
- size, location and number of parking spaces;
- existing and proposed wells or other water sources;
- location of existing or proposed sewage disposal fields on property;
- location of any watercourses on property showing distances from existing or proposed buildings or additions;

This information is intended to assist the general public in applying for a Building Permit within the District of Hudson's Hope.

BUILDING INSPECTIONS (Typical)

The Building Bylaw requires inspections at the following stages of construction;

- Footings prior to pouring concrete.
- Backfilling after completion of damp-proofing, drain tile, and drain rock (if required), but prior to backfilling.
- Plumbing before any part of the plumbing system is covered.
- Framing after the entire rough-in plumbing, electrical and mechanical equipment is installed and the framing is completed to lockup stage, but prior to insulating.
- Insulation and Vapour Barrier after all insulation and vapour barriers are installed, but prior to covering.
- Final when the building or portion thereof is completed and ready for occupancy, but prior to occupancy thereof.

An Occupancy Certificate is required prior to occupancy of a building. In order for an Occupancy Certificate to be issued, all inspections above must be approved.

Tips to Stay Safe While Boating

With the four tips below, individuals who are boating can stay safe and ensure that each experience out on the water is rewarding and free of potential emergencies.

- 1. **The importance of lifejackets**: The most essential thing that individuals need when they're out on the water is a lifejacket or personal flotation device (PFD), as this can substantially reduce the potential for drowning or other dangerous aquatic incidents.
- 2. Avoid alcohol: According to the Canadian Red Cross, 37 per cent of boaters in Canada consume alcohol each time they are on the water, while alcohol has been linked as a factor in more than 40 percent of deaths in recreational boating incidents. Beer, liquor and wine can negatively impact a boater's judgment and make him or her less likely to maintain control of core motor functions compared to individuals who do not drink on the water, which underscores the importance of being sober while boating.
- Pay attention to weather conditions: While weather conditions may not seem as essential as wearing a lifejacket or PFD, understanding what the climate and forecast will be like during an upcoming boating experience can be crucial for staying safe while aboard a vessel.
- 4. Bringing safety gear on board: From marine first aid kits to sunscreen, drinking water, flashlights, sound signaling devices and manual propelling devices, there are a variety of safety devices that should be brought on a boat in order to reduce the likelihood of emergencies.
