Police Report: SEPTEMBER 2019

Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 36 calls for service between August 12th and September 20th. 79 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates. Highway and road safety continues to be a big focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP. Police have received reports to the increasing number of vehicles speeding along

Beattie Drive, therefore police will be monitoring this area frequently, especially with the school season now in effect. Speeding fines can range from \$138.00 to \$196.00, with excessive speeding resulting in a \$368.00 fine and a 7 day impound of the vehicle. Speeding in school zone fines range from \$196.00 to \$253.00. Please obey local speed limits within our community.

The Hudson's Hope RCMP is working with the District to put in place lighted and/or illuminated speed signs within the school zone along Beattle Drive.

On September 6th, Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report for an over due hiker in the back country of the Northern rural areas of Hudson's Hope. Being that the lost person was utilizing a Spot GPS, RCMP were able to narrow down a GPS location and with the assistance of the Search & Rescue helicopter from FSJ, the lost hiker was located in a short time period with no medical issues. As a reminder, if you plan to adventure in the remote back country of our lovely area, please inform a family member or friend as to your destination location, areas you may be hiking/camping/hunting in, and a date/time that you are to be back. Also, consider a Spot GPS device for those long excursions. This assists rescue teams immensely should you run into a situation that requires their assistance.

On September 13th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP assisted the Hudson's Hope School with their school Terry Fox run. Police later had the privilege and enjoyment of attending the school and watching the students duct tape their principal to the wall.

On September 15^{th} , the Hudson's Hope RCMP were able to lend a hand in the local Terry Fox run and monitor the traffic while the runners completed the 3, 5, and 10 km treks throughout the town.

On September 18th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP and the local Lion's Club were privileged to welcome and support the Cops for Cancer – Tour de North cyclists as they traveled from FSJ through town, and onward as they rode to raise money for the Canadian Cancer Society.

Over the past few weeks, the Hudson's Hope RCMP have been closely working with the local BC Conservation officers in regards to the recent sightings of bears within town. A bear trap was set up near Dudley Dr. for a duration of time in attempt to capture a young, rouge apple loving black bear that had an argument with one of our local residents. Though he was never captured, it appears that he has since moved on. As a reminder, please secure all outside garbage's and pick/monitor your fruit trees when possible being that these are high up the bears menus during this time of year.







DISTRICT OF HUDSON'S HOPE PUBLIC WORKS NEWS & VIEWS



Fall has arrived, along with the cooler evenings and falling leaves. In a 2018 study, Ford researchers determined that in certain circumstances, leaves can be just a slippery as snow.

Take care when driving in the early mornings. In this part of British Columbia, October 1 is the date for winter tires, if they are not already on your vehicle, you may want to think about it.



Thank you for your patience while we completed our water valve replacement work on Kyllo Street and Beattie Drive. Due to some miscommunication the water was shut off sooner than originally planned, but a change in strategy limited the impacted areas during completion of the work. We now have good control of water flows between the treatment plant and the reservoir. Also, we will be re-establishing a program of exercising our valves to limit the impact of future water works.

With the completion of the valve replacement work, the District was able to piggy-back on to the contract to have some road cuts repaired. These road cuts have been the result of earlier utility repair work and some have been waiting for a few years to be completed.



In September Public Works crews completed a round of Hydrant Flushing and Sewer Flushing. The hydrant flushing clears the water pipes in our system, while the sewer flushing does the same for the sewer lines. We also took video recordings of six locations where sanitary flow issues have been noted in the past. All these tasks help us identify condition assessments and develop future maintenance works schedules.

The arena is in the final stages of preparation for next season. The ice has been made and the arena equipped. Opening day is planned for the first weekend in October. Scheduled activities, such as hockey and figure skating programs will commence shortly after. The Friday Frightful Frolics Night is planned for October 25, 2019.

The Free Firewood giveaway was successful with several residents taking advantage of the free firewood. After the initial offer, Council extended the program to include two weekends. This allowed more residents access into the wood pile.

As much as I hate to admit it, we are getting our winter equipment ready for use. Summer, for what it was, has left us. That means crews are cleaning up and servicing our plow equipment, stockpiling our winter sand. Our winter sand for this year is more of a true sand as opposed to the large material used last year. We'll be blending it with road salts to assist with winter traction and ice melting.

Luckily, our new loader will have arrived by now. The new loader comes with a general-purpose bucket, pallet forks and a multi-position snow blade. The new machine is going into service at the beginning of October and the old machine has found a new home elsewhere. You may also have noticed a new Honda CR-V sporting the District logo. This vehicle replaced the 12-year old Toyota Prius which has served the District well. The new Honda CR-V includes all-wheel drive and provides advances in safety which were not available 12 years ago, including advanced collision warning and lane departure assist systems.

Enjoy the fall colours, enjoy the outdoors, watch out for wildlife, and watch out for your neighbours on the public works crews as we wrap up some late summer tasks.

Homeowner Information to Building Permits

The District of Hudson's Hope wants to assist homeowners and contractors to avoid unnecessary delays and expense in planning and construction of residential projects. Below explains when permits are required, requirements for the permit, possible other documents that may be required and other information to assist you in obtaining your building permit. Additional information is available at the District Office or online at www.hudsonshope.ca

A BUILDING PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO:

- construct a new home;
- •locate mobile / modular home;
- construct a commercial, industrial or public use building;
- •construct a new accessory building e.g., carport, farm building, garage or storage shed;
- renovate existing buildings;
- •undertake any structural work such as interior partitions;
- enclose a porch or roof over a sundeck;
- move or demolish a building;
- re-roof a building;
- reconstruct after damage;
- plumbing system changes;

INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED WITH A BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION

The following items must be supplied along with a completed Building Permit Application before a Building Permit can be issued. A Building Permit fee is based on the value of the building or structure and will be calculated by the Building Official.


1. BUILDING PLANS


Two sets of detailed building plans. If you cannot draw the necessary building or site plans, then you should obtain the services of a qualified person.

Example Floor Plans

- scale not less than 1:50 metric (1/4 inch to 1 foot);
- size and location of windows and doors;
- location of all plumbing fixtures;
- location of all mechanical equipment.

- all rooms, size and use of each;
- all dimensions;
- finished and unfinished areas; —





2. SITE PLAN

- full legal description of lot: lot number, plan number; district lot number (from your tax notice or Title);
- lot dimensions;
- adjoining street names;
- locations and uses of existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- distances from all property lines for existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- location of legal road access to the property;
- size, location and number of parking spaces;
- existing and proposed wells or other water sources;
- location of existing or proposed sewage disposal fields on property;
- location of any watercourses on property showing distances from existing or proposed buildings or additions;

This information is intended to assist the general public in applying for a Building Permit within the District of Hudson's Hope.

BUILDING INSPECTIONS (Typical)

The Building Bylaw requires inspections at the following stages of construction;

- Footings prior to pouring concrete.
- Backfilling after completion of damp-proofing, drain tile, and drain rock (if required), but prior to backfilling.
- Plumbing before any part of the plumbing system is covered.
- Framing after the entire rough-in plumbing, electrical and mechanical equipment is installed and the framing is completed to lockup stage, but prior to insulating.
- Insulation and Vapour Barrier after all insulation and vapour barriers are installed, but prior to covering.
- Final when the building or portion thereof is completed and ready for occupancy, but prior to occupancy thereof.

An Occupancy Certificate is required prior to occupancy of a building. In order for an Occupancy Certificate to be issued, all inspections above must be approved.


