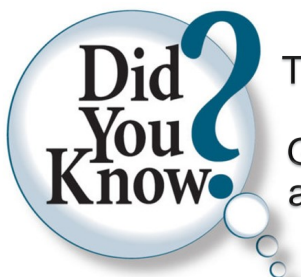

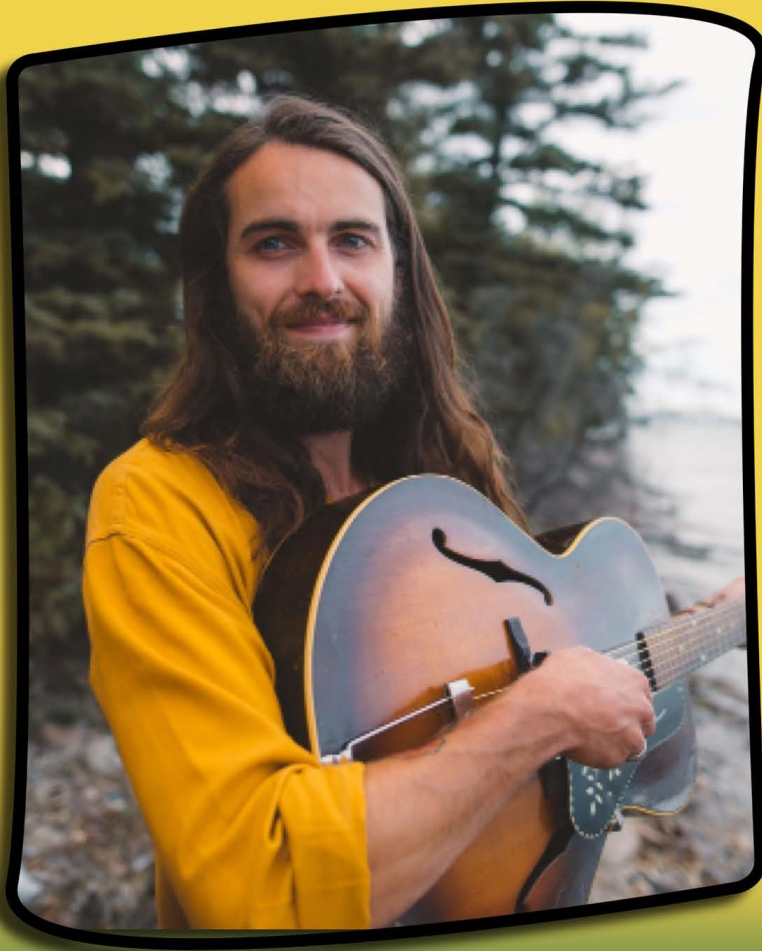

## Police Report: OCTOBER 2019

Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 40 calls for service between September 20th and October 24th. 57 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates. Highway and road safety continues to be a big focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP. Police have received reports to the increasing number of vehicles speeding along Beattie Drive, therefore police will be monitoring this area frequently, especially with the school season now in effect. Speeding fines can range from \$138.00 to \$196.00, with excessive speeding resulting in a \$368.00 fine and a 7 day impound of the vehicle. Speeding in school zone fines range from \$196.00 to \$253.00. Please obey local speed limits within our community.

On September 20<sup>th</sup>, Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a single vehicle accident along Hwy 29 near Farrell Creek Rd. A Ford truck was found off the road and had collided with a tree. Upon conducting further investigation, it was found that the driver was uninjured and had swerved for a deer, resulting in the driver losing control (the deer was confirmed to be uninjured as well).

On September 21<sup>st</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP conducted ATV patrols along the Beryl Prairie Rd., FSR and other FSRs in and around the area. RCMP were able to get into some remote areas with the use of the ATVs and checked multiple hunters and hunting camps throughout the area. Police were checking for valid hunting and fire-arm licences, tags, and confirming all off-road vehicles were licensed.

On October 3<sup>rd</sup>, Hudson's Hope RCMP assisted the local fire department for a call of a structure fire within town. Upon arriving on scene, police and fire observed smoke coming from inside the residence but were later able to confirm that there was no one inside and that there was no one injured. At this time, police are still conducting an investigation into this file.

On October 9<sup>th</sup>, Hudson's Hope RCMP were conducting an investigation at a local residence for an alleged possible break and enter. During the course of the investigation, police located several illegally stored firearms within and around the residence resulting in a complete seizure of all firearms. Charges are pending and this continues to be an open police investigation.

On October 12<sup>th</sup>, Hudson's Hope RCMP received a call regarding a person who had a large amount of nitrate fertilizer on their property and was seeking assistance with the disposal of this substance. Police had the Explosives Unit fly in from Vancouver who were able to dispose of said materials in a safe and secure manner.

On October 21<sup>st</sup>, Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a report of a vehicle fire on the Farrell Creek FSR. Upon attendance, police located a single unoccupied vehicle on the side of the road that was fully engulfed. Upon locating and speaking with the vehicle owner, it was found that the vehicle had over-heated and caught fire. The



driver was able to exit the vehicle unscathed with no injuries. Fire deemed to be non-suspicious in nature.

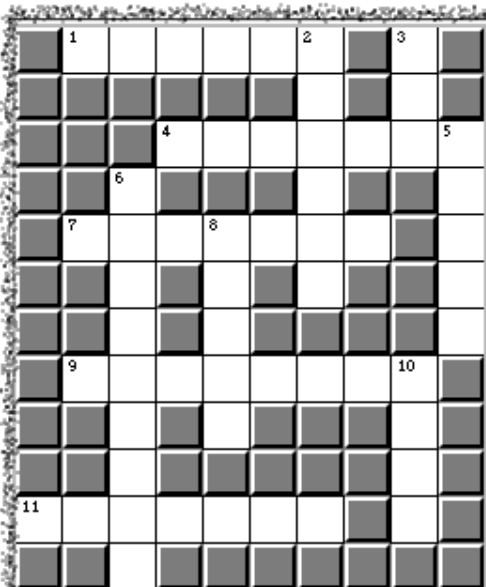

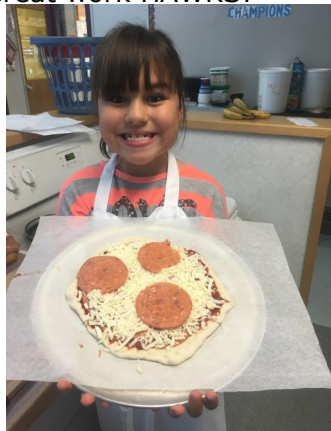

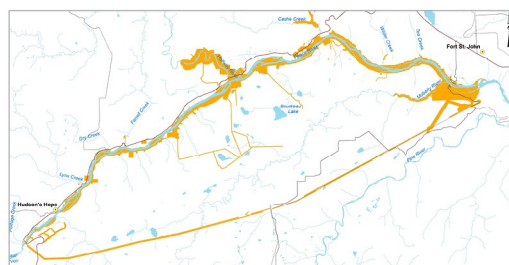


## Do not hunt or discharge firearms in Site C project areas

November is here; the ghouls and goblins, Wonder Woman and Captain Marvel have gone for another year. Snow has hit the ground, more than once, particularly in the higher elevations, BUT we did get our paving done.

For those of you that enjoy ATV and snow machine travel around the District, be advised, that our gravel pit is an active work site, there are steep drop offs in the pit area. Also, heavy equipment will be moving around and loading material from time to time. It has been posted, please respect the signs.

Fall is a time for clean-ups at home and around the District. It is also a time for us to catch up on a few smaller tasks that have not been completed, including water service connection replacements and the removal of debris from our storm sewer network.

Fall is also a time for us to plan next year's work and prepare our capital and operating budgets. Last year, Public Works implemented a 10 Year Capital plan. We will soon be entering our second year of the that plan. Subject to available funds we have projects related to roads, water, wastewater (sewer) and facilities. Our big water project is the conversion from river water to well water for our residents. This on-going project will take us into 2020 and the next decade with a new water plant and a new source of water.

The arena is open; we went through a couple of weeks of Monday to Friday operation as we trained new staff in the effective and safe management of the ice and the facility. The concession is open and should be offering a full menu of arena delights for skaters and spectators alike.

Our winter road maintenance equipment is ready for the worst that nature has to offer. Our new loader has an additional snow blade with wings to better control the windrows around driveways. The windrow is the ridge of snow that comes off the end of a plow blade as snow is cleared from the roadway. While every effort is made to minimize this windrow across driveways, we cannot eliminate it totally.

# PROTECTIVE SERVICES

## What is a Winter Tire?

British Columbia accepts "mountain snowflake" or "mud and snow" tires with at least 3.5 mm tread as winter tires.

### Check your tires for these signs:

**The mountain/snowflake symbol on the side of the tire** These winter tires offer the best traction on snow and ice, and in cold weather.

**The mud and snow symbol on the side of the tire** These winter tires offer better traction than summer tires, however, they are less effective than mountain/snowflake tires on snow and ice, and in cold weather.

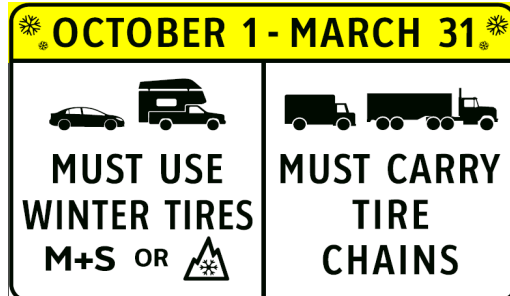
**3.5 mm tread** Tires must have 3.5 mm of tread remaining to be considered winter tires.

**Matching Winter Tires** You must have at least 2 **matching** winter tires on the same axle, but **it is recommended to use 4 matching tires.**

### Studded Tires

May be used on BC highways from October 1 to April 30, but **must** have mountain/snowflake or M+S symbols to be considered winter tires.

## When are Winter Tires or Chains Right for Me?

Winter tires and chains can make your vehicle safer.

You **MUST** use winter tires (passenger vehicles) or carry chains (commercial trucks) between October 1 and March 31 on **most BC Highways.**

British Columbia's climates range from freezing cold to pleasantly mild in the winter; equipping your vehicle appropriately depends on what you are driving and where you are driving. Drivers in some parts of the southern coast, where regulations are more relaxed due to warmer weather, should use discretion when equipping their vehicles.

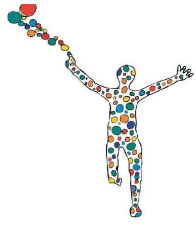

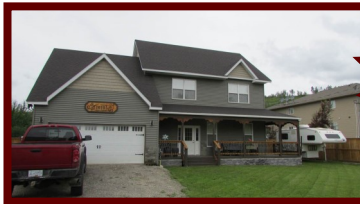

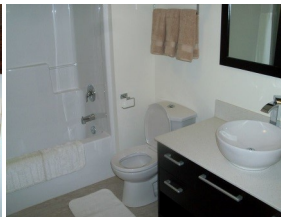
