Police Report: DECEMBER 2019



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 29 calls for service between November 12th to December 15th. 84 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates. Highway and road safety continues to be a big focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP. Police have received reports to the increasing number of vehicles speeding along Beattie Drive, therefore police will be monitoring this area frequently. Speeding fines can range

from \$138.00 to \$196.00, with excessive speeding resulting in a \$368.00 fine and a 7 day impound of the vehicle. Speeding in school zone fines range from \$196.00 to \$253.00. Please obey local speed limits within our community.

On November 13th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a stolen vehicle from a residence along Beattie Dr. Upon investigation, it was found that this vehicle had been legitimately stolen from the residence and police continue to investigate the file. Neighboring jurisdictions have had an increase in motor vehicle thefts over the last few months due to the number of un-attended vehicles left running with the keys left in the ignition.

On November 30th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP were investigating a possible firearms trafficking file and upon further information received, police were able to obtain a search warrant for a residence in town and upon execution of the search warrant, police seized several illegally stored restricted firearms. Charges are being sought and this remains an active police file.

On December 4th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of two ATVs that had been stolen from the back of a flat bed truck which was parked along the Kobes Creek Rd area. These ATV'\s were described as a camo coloured Honda TRX450FM and a red coloured Honda TRX450FM. If anyone has any information or has observed these ATVs in the area, please call the local RCMP detachment.

On December 9th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a theft from vehicle from a residence along Paquette Ave. It was reported that an unknown person had gained access to an unlocked vehicle sometime during the late hours of the evening and had rummaged through the contents of the vehicle and several items were found to be stolen. Though we live in a small town, these types of crimes still do occur so it is advised to make sure your doors are locked and to avoid leaving any items of value in plain sight.

Being that it is Christmas time, there has been and will be many Christmas gatherings and parties so please use responsibility when it comes to driving home from these events and or use a safe ride home.

Preparing an Emergency Kit for Your Car

Slippery or snow-covered roads, reduced visibility and bitter cold are all conditions that can make driving difficult and even dangerous during cold weather months. Winter also brings an increased risk of getting stuck in your car, so dress warmly before heading out.

Emergency Car Kit

If you have a car, prepare an emergency car kit and keep it in the vehicle. The basic emergency kit for cars should include the following items:

Check off the items for your 72-hour emergency kit as you accumulate them.

Top of Form

Food: That won't spoil, such as energy bars

Water: In plastic bottles so they won't break if frozen (change every six months)

Blanket

Extra clothing and shoes

First aid kit: With seatbelt cutter

Small shovel, scraper and snowbrush

Candle in a deep can and matches

Wind-up flashlight

Whistle: In case you need to attract attention

Roadmaps

Copy of your emergency plan and personal documents

Also keep these inside your trunk

Sand, salt or cat litter (non clumping)

Antifreeze/windshield washer fluid

Tow rope

Jumper cables

Fire extinguisher

Warning light or road flares

- 3. Grants will not be provided for travel expenses;
- 4. The applicant organization must be registered as a Society in either the Province of British Columbia and / or Canada, and includes organizations that belong to a parent Society in Canada; and
- 5. Upon completion of the project, the applicant must submit a final report to the District outlining how funds were expended.

Heating Safety

There is something about the winter months and curling up with a good book by the fireplace. But did you know that heating equipment is one of the leading causes of home fire deaths? With a few simple safety tips and precautions you can prevent most heating fires from happening.

BE WARM AND SAFE THIS WINTER!

- Weep anything that can burn at least three-feet away from heating equipment, like the furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable space heater.
- Have a three-foot "kid-free zone" around open fires and space heaters.
- Never use your oven to heat your home.
- Have a qualified professional install stationary space heating equipment, water heaters or central heating equipment according to the local codes and manufacturer's instructions.
- Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional.
- Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
- Always use the right kind of fuel, specified by the manufacturer, for fuel burning space heaters.
- Make sure the fireplace has a sturdy screen to stop sparks from flying into the room. Ashes should be cool before putting them in a metal container. Keep the container a safe distance away from your home.

Heating Equipment Smarts

Install wood burning stoves following manufacturer's instructions or have a professional do the installation. All fuel-burning equipment should be vented to the outside to avoid carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning.

Install and maintain CO alarms to avoid the risk of CO poisoning. If you smell gas in your gas heater, do do not light the appliance. Leave the home immediately and call your local fire department or gas company.





DISTRICT OF HUDSON'S HOPE PUBLIC WORKS NEWS & VIEWS



It's the New Year, and a time for fresh beginnings. The Public Works Department, though, is hoping to build upon the successes of 2019 and continuing doing good things for the District. I hope that you all had a good holiday season!

Some of our achievements in 2019 include:

- Replacement of water main valves and paving of old service connection areas.
- Upgrade to the Beryl Prairie well pump.
- Replacement of the sanitary system for the Beryl Prairie Fire Hall.
- Repairs to the pool liner.
- Replacement of the loader
- Commencement of an Asset Management system with initial data collection in 2019
- Crushing and stockpiling of gravel, with a 3 to 5 year supply.
- Development of new wells for our potable water supply.

In 2020 we are hopeful that we can get the Beattie Lift (sewer) Station updated and made safer for our crews who look after the site by bringing the valve control out of the wet well. It is also our hope that we can replace a few more water main valves and a couple of hydrants once the budget has been approved. Each leaking valve replaced saves us more water as we are addressing leaks in our system. We are also looking at various options for paving and road repair. The Capital Budget will go before Council in the early spring.

District staff have recently completed a draft document outlining ways we can improve our green space maintenance and grass cutting schedule. The document defines the different types of open space and the level of maintenance each should receive. Weather cooperating we are hoping to have a great outdoor season this year.

This year will also see us complete some facility assessments to determine next steps for maintenance and capital upgrades of our recreation facilities; these include the arena, swimming pool and tennis courts.

We wish you all the best for a happy, healthy and prosperous 2020.

Remember, the early winter was kind to us on the roads, but please take care and don't get complacent when travelling around the area.
