



# **Police Report: JANUARY 2020**



The Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 34 calls for service between December 15<sup>th</sup>, 2019 and January 15<sup>th</sup>, 2020. RCMP members served 34 violations tickets and written warnings in December 2019, and an additional 20 violations tickets and written warnings were issued to drivers between January 1<sup>st</sup> and January 20<sup>th</sup>, 2020. The Hudson's Hope RCMP continue to maintain a high priority of traffic enforcement and road safety. One of the 'careless driving' offences in the Motor Vehicle Act states "a person must not drive a motor vehicle on a highway at a speed that is excessive relative to the road, traffic, visibility or weather conditions" 144(1)(c) MVA. During the winter months, drivers must keep in mind the importance of reducing speed according to the weather and road conditions to ensure safety and to prevent unnecessary collisions. Speeding fines can range from \$138.00 to \$196.00. Excessive speeding (more than 40 Km/h over the speed limit) can result in fine amounts between \$368.00 and \$483.00, and includes a 7-day vehicle impound. Fine amounts for speeding in school zones range from \$196.00 to \$253.00. Please be attentive to speed limit signs and drive accordingly.

On December 17<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP were called to assist with a report of a stolen vehicle that fled from police in Fort St. John heading South on Highway 29. Hudson's Hope RCMP members set up a road block and disabled the fleeing vehicle with a spike belt. The driver, however, continued in his attempt to flee from police. A short time later, police safely apprehended two suspects from the vehicle. Several criminal code charges were laid as a result and the investigation is on-going.

Throughout the month of December, there were a number of reports of break and enter to commercial areas that resulted in significant damage as well as theft of property. The targeted items included small appliances, tools, other commercial equipment, and copper wire. These files are currently under investigation. Please contact the Hudson's Hope RCMP if you have any information about these or other similar occurrences. Residents in rural areas are reminded to be diligent to keep valuable items locked up in a secure place.

In other news, the Hudson's Hope RCMP is in the process of selecting a new detachment commander. Several applications are currently being reviewed by RCMP management for candidate selection. Keep an eye out for future announcements regarding the appointing of a new detachment commander.

Finally, now that we are in the full force of winter, members would like to remind snowmobilers and those enjoying other recreational winter activities to employ safe practices, to use appropriate outerwear, and to be prepared in case of emergencies. In British Columbia, there is an average of more than 20 fatalities every year that

result from outdoor recreational winter activities.

# HOUSE NUMBERS SAVE LIVES

#### The Importance of a 9-1-1 Address


Properly displaying your civic number on your house or at the end of your drive ensures fast emergency response for the **AMBULANCE**, **FIRE** and **POLICE** Services. Precious minutes can pass while the emergency vehicle attempts to locate the emergency incident.

It is strongly recommended that you ensure that a civic address is posted with the following guidelines in place:

- •the civic address the District has assigned to the premises must be displayed on the principal building on the premises and must be legible from a minimum distance of fifteen (15) metres;
- •where a building is set back from the street or roadway fronting the property such that the assigned street address is not clearly legible from the street or roadway, or where landscaping or architectural appurtenances or other obstructions obstruct the address, the assigned street address shall also be displayed at the driveway entrance from the street or road serving the building on a weatherresistant sign permanently mounted on a post and visible from all direction of traffic flow; and
- •letters or numbers displayed on a building must be of a colour which contrasts with the background colour of the building or sign.

#### **Automated External Defibrillators**

#### What are They?

An automated external defibrillator (AED) is a small, portable device used to identify cardiac rhythms and deliver a shock to correct abnormal electrical activity in the heart. AEDs are used to treat <u>sudden cardiac arrest</u> (SCA).

Up to 40,000 cardiac arrests occur each year in Canada. That's one cardiac arrest every 13 minutes.

Eighty-five per cent of cardiac arrests in Canada happen outside of hospitals, and having an AED close by can make all the

difference. The American Heart Association warns that for every minute lost before defibrillation, the survival rate decreases by seven to 10 per cent. After 12 minutes, the survival rate plummets to less than five per cent.

When CPR and an AED are both used within five minutes of a cardiac arrest, the chance of survival rises by nearly 75 per cent, according to research published in the Journal of the American College of Cardiology.

#### Where are They?

Quick access to an AED can greatly improve a patient's survivability rate, and knowing where AEDs are located within your community can help facilitate this. Fortunately there are a number of AEDs located within the District of Hudson's Hope. Emergency responders including police, fire and BC Ambulance all have devices on their apparatus and vehicles. There are also AEDs located at the Arena in the winter and the Pool in the summer. Staff at these locations have training in their use. Hudson's Hope School has an AED in the staff room and

- 3. Grants will not be provided for travel expenses;
- 4. The applicant organization must be registered as a Society in either the Province of British Columbia and / or Canada, and includes organizations that belong to a parent Society in Canada; and
- 5. Upon completion of the project, the applicant must submit a final report to the District outlining how funds were expended.

# **2020 Business** Licenses



The 2020 Business License statements have been mailed out. If you no longer require your Business License, please call the District Office to have your license cancelled. If you do not have a business license or are unsure if you require one, please stop in or call for more information.

Bylaw No. 504 clearly states "that no person shall carry on, within the Municipality, any business unless he or she is the holder of a valid and subsisting license issued to him or her under the bylaw by the License Inspector and shall pay therefore, to the License Inspector, the sum stated in the bylaw". The annual cost for a business license is \$50.00

A "business" is defined as any activity in which you receive monetary compensation for any services that you may provide within the community.



If you are operating a business without a license, you are in direct violation of Bylaw No. 504.

Why Should I License My Dog?



Perhaps the best incentive for getting your dog licensed is that it increases your chances of getting your pet back if they get lost.

Licensing your dog with the District means staff are able to contact you if someone finds your dog.

#### It's Easy and Inexpensive

The cost is \$10.00 if your pet is spayed or neutered or \$30.00 if they are not. Stop by and pick up your license at the District Office, it only takes a few minutes.



The Fee for a dog picked up at large is \$60.00. There is an additional fee of \$60.00 if they are not licensed (this does not include any boarding fees, if applicable).



# PUBLIC WORKS NEWS & VIEWS



Brrrrr!!! That's about all I have to say for the first 3 weeks of the new year. And the last week of January warmed up to more reasonable temperatures, just in time for the Polar Plunge.

Public Works personnel spent much of January clearing snow and performing winter maintenance activities. Plow trucks will naturally leave a windrow at the edge of the roadway as they are plowing. If the windrow is excessively high, when we have time we can come around and knock those down, but it may be some time after the road has been plowed.

There were a few issues with the heat in the Beattie Sanitary Lift station which required a new control panel for the furnace. The electronic controls for the pumps do not react well to the cold weather. Personnel responded quickly providing temporary heaters until the furnace was fixed. All repairs have now been completed and the Lift Station is operating normally.

Public Works staff assisted with the Winter Carnival events, providing firewood, clearing ice, and the like. By all accounts, it was another successful year for the Carnival.

Arena operations are continuing and we encourage you to take advantage of the public skate, or participate in some of the team activities. By the time you read this, there will be about 6 weeks of ice time before the seasonal shut down.

District staff are working on this year's operating and capital budgets and making plans to continue improvement of the District's infrastructure. More details will be provided as plans are further refined.



On a safety note, please remove all the snow from your vehicle before driving. That includes, lights, license plates, windows, your hood, trunk and roof. Snow on the flat surfaces of your vehicle can blow or slide over your windshield obscuring your view or blow into the path of a trailing vehicle blocking their view. In the 2-3 minutes it takes to warm up your car, you can clear the snow, making it safer for you and other motorists.

Remember, the early winter was kind to us on the roads, but please take care and don't get complacent when travelling around the area.


