

# **Police Report: FEBRUARY 2020**



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 27 calls for service between January 15th to February 17th.

64 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates. Highway and road safety continues to be a big focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP. Police have received reports to the increasing number of vehicles speeding along Beattie Drive, therefore police will be monitoring this area frequently. Speeding fines can range from \$138.00 to \$196.00, with excessive speeding resulting in a \$368.00 fine and a 7 day impound of the vehicle. Speeding in school zone fines range from \$196.00 to \$253.00. Please obey local speed limits within our community. Hudson's Hope RCMP is currently working with the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure to seek better school zone signage implemented along Beattie Dr.

On January 18<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a break and enter into some trailers and out buildings located on a work site along the Core Rd. Though this site is being decommissioned, suspects stole some appliances and an undetermined amount of copper wiring. Due to no video surveillance, no suspects have been identified at this time.

On January 22<sup>nd</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP were advised to a suspect who was observed in their area who had bailed on his court approved day parole and now had a Canada wide warrant issued for his arrest. With the joint efforts and assistance of local businesses and neighboring police jurisdictions, the suspect was located and arrested.

On February 8<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a single vehicle collision in the rural area of Farrell Creek Rd / Harasymyk Rd. Police attended the scene and located a single car in the ditch that contained three occupants. No injuries were observed and the male driver was confirmed to be intoxicated. The driver was charged for impaired driving and received a notice of driving prohibition with a 30 day impound of his vehicle.

On February 12<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a traffic incident in the area of Hwy 29 / Farrell Creek Rd. Upon attending the scene, it was learnt that the suspect vehicle which was observed to have a trailer attached with a Cat skidsteer and an ATV (both later confirmed stolen from the Northern Rockies area) had become stuck in the ditch and the two male occupants had exited the vehicle with one of them brandishing a firearm. The suspects then fled the area on foot into the nearby woods. Police closed this stretch of highway for several hours for public safety and with the joint efforts of neighbouring police jurisdictions, police were able to cordon the area off. After several hours of experiencing the cold elements that the North provides, one of the suspects got cold feet (literally) and surrendered to police. The second suspect was located and arrested the following morning. Police


confirmed that all the stolen property and firearms were accounted for and both males have been charged for multiple offences. The Hudson's Hope RCMP want to thank anyone that was affected by the road closure for their patience.

On February 13<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a suspicious male in the area of Hwy 29 / Farrell Creek Rd. Upon locating and identifying the male, police discovered an ample amount of methamphetamine on the individual who was then arrested and charged.

On February 16<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP assisted BC Conservation officers with checking several hunters in the area of the Twelve Mile Rd. that may have been in breach of the 400 metre rule for hunting near roadways and private property. Upon investigation, it was found that all the hunters observed at this time were following the laws and no offences were found. Police and Conservation want to stress the importance of knowing the rules and regulations to hunters for when hunting near private property and public roads.

Also, Freyja Jarnagin won the Most Outstanding Female Wrestler for the entire Northern Zone Region! The Hudson's Hope School Girls'


Team won the team tournament! Pretty exciting results for a school that has only been wrestling for three years. Great work Coaches Coleman Mercereau and Peter Douglas!



# **PUBLIC WORKS NEWS & VIEWS**



February has given us a taste of spring; but don't be fooled, we still have some cold weather and snow to come. At least February was warmer than January.

February was another month of winter maintenance on your roads, although we were able to accomplish other tasks. Crews have been removing some standing deadwood in addition to disposing of some rotten wood piles at our old shop location.

Our lower Public Works yard is to be cleaned out this year as we transition to centralized storage of goods and materials. We are also hoping to move our salt shed and winter sand pile to make access easier and closer to our equipment.

Our few problem areas with the sanitary sewers are taking time as we complete daily flushing of the lines. Subject to budget approvals, we are looking at various solutions to permanently address sanitary lines that constantly cause issues every winter.

Tenders have been issued for improvements to the Beattie Lift Station, as well as upgrades to our water treatment plant. More details will be forthcoming on those projects when they become available.

Hurry up and use the arena as it closes on March 13<sup>th</sup>. The ice will be removed by the end of March in preparation of any summer activities.

As part of the District's Winterfest, snowboard/ski features were installed behind the swimming pool. We hope you have used these with you families. This is our first year with these features so if you have any comments on how they are installed, or changes we should make, we welcome your comments through email at <a href="mailto:publicworks@hudsonshope.ca">publicworks@hudsonshope.ca</a>

Crews will commence the swimming pool preparations in mid April with a thorough cleaning and repair of items damaged through the winter months. We are looking at a successful season starting on the long weekend in May. Just pray for a warm, sunny summer.

Enjoy the Spring months, but please be aware of wildlife waking from the winter's hibernation in addition to the abundance of deer roaming around the community.







# Homeowner Information to Building Permits

The District of Hudson's Hope wants to assist homeowners and contractors to avoid unnecessary delays and expense in planning and construction of residential projects. Below explains when permits are required, requirements for the permit, possible other documents that may be required and other information to assist you in obtaining your building permit. Additional information is available at the District Office or online at www.hudsonshope.ca

#### A BUILDING PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO:

- construct a new home;
- •locate mobile / modular home;
- •construct a commercial, industrial or public use building;
- •construct a new accessory building e.g., carport, farm building, garage or storage shed;
- •renovate existing buildings;
- •undertake any structural work such as interior partitions;
- •enclose a porch or roof over a sundeck;
- move or demolish a building;
- •re-roof a building;
- •reconstruct after damage;
- plumbing system changes;

#### INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED WITH A BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION

The following items must be supplied along with a completed Building Permit Application before a Building Permit can be issued. A Building Permit fee is based on the value of the building or structure and will be calculated by the Building Official.


#### 1. BUILDING PLANS


Two sets of detailed building plans. If you cannot draw the necessary building or site plans, then you should obtain the services of a qualified person.

#### Example Floor Plans

- scale not less than 1:50 metric (1/4 inch to 1 foot);
- size and location of windows and doors;
- location of all plumbing fixtures;
- location of all mechanical equipment.

- all rooms, size and use of each;
- all dimensions;
- finished and unfinished areas; —





#### 2. SITE PLAN

- full legal description of lot: lot number, plan number; district lot number (from your tax notice or Title);
- lot dimensions;
- adjoining street names;
- locations and uses of existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- distances from all property lines for existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- location of legal road access to the property;
- size, location and number of parking spaces;
- existing and proposed wells or other water sources;
- location of existing or proposed sewage disposal fields on property;
- location of any watercourses on property showing distances from existing or proposed buildings or additions;

#### This information is intended to assist the general public in applying for a Building Permit within the District of Hudson's Hope.

#### **BUILDING INSPECTIONS (Typical)**

The Building Bylaw requires inspections at the following stages of construction;

- Footings prior to pouring concrete.
- Backfilling after completion of damp-proofing, drain tile, and drain rock (if required), but prior to backfilling.
- Plumbing before any part of the plumbing system is covered.
- Framing after the entire rough-in plumbing, electrical and mechanical equipment is installed and the framing is completed to lockup stage, but prior to insulating.
- Insulation and Vapour Barrier after all insulation and vapour barriers are installed, but prior to covering.
- Final when the building or portion thereof is completed and ready for occupancy, but prior to occupancy thereof.

An Occupancy Certificate is required prior to occupancy of a building. In order for an Occupancy Certificate to be issued, all inspections above must be approved.




