Fire Protection Services

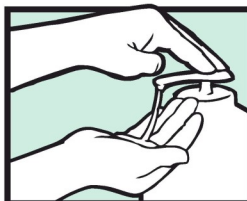

Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 25 calls for service between February 17th to March 18th. 79 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates. Highway and road safety continues to be a big focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP. Police have received several reports from site managers and flaggers who are working within the various construction sites along Hwy 29 for vehicles that are speeding through the marked construction zones. The Hudson's Hope RCMP has met with the site managers and flagging companies in regards to the markings of these zones and confirm that all the constructions zones along Hwy 29 are adequately now marked. Fines for speeding in a construction zone range from \$196 - \$253 (3 points), and fines for vehicles exceeding 41kms/hr over the posted speed limit will result in fines ranging between \$368 to \$483 (3 points) with a 7 day impound of the vehicle. Please obey the construction zone signs being they are in place for the safety of the workers in those areas.

On March 4th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a found firearm along Hwy 29 / Reschke Rd. whereas a .22 Ruger rifle was located laying on the side of the road. At this time, no owner has been located and the file remains open. If anyone has any information on this and or is missing a firearm, please contact the Hudson's Hope RCMP.

On March 10th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a single vehicle accident at Farrell Creek bridge / Hwy 29. Upon investigation, it was found that the tanker truck had swerved due to a passing vehicle that had crossed the center line, resulting in the tanker truck hitting and rolling over the barricade. The driver was transported to hospital with serious but non-life threatening injuries.

On March 11th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP conducted a routine traffic stop for a vehicle observed speeding through the school zone. Upon speaking with the driver, he was found to be a prohibited driver and was also found to be impaired. The driver was charged for both offences and his truck was impounded for 30 days.

Given the current situation regarding the Covid-19 virus, the Hudson's Hope RCMP detachment will continue to operate 24/7 for calls of service, however, officers will be taking all required precautionary measures when responding to calls. At this time, the front doors of the detachment will not be open for the public, members and staff will not be available for face-to-face general public inquires and or police checks at this time.

All calls will continue to be received and forwarded to your two lovely officers here in town. This is a precautionary measure to lessen the potential spread of this Covid-19 virus.

We appreciate that the fluidity of this situation is uncertain at this time, but please be assured that we are taking precautions to make sure the town stays safe.

We urge everyone to keep up to date on the advisories to the public by the govern-

ment entities and health authorities. This is a time to work together for a solution for us all.

Distracted Driving and the Law:

According to section 214.2 of the Motor Vehicle Act, a driver cannot operate a hand-held electronic device (including hand-held cellphones, smartphones, tablets and other electronic hand-held devices such as music players, GPS Navigation Systems, etc.). Also, a driver cannot communicate using text messages or email on any type of electronic device. Drivers in the Graduated

Licensing Program.(GLP) are restricted from using hands-free cellphones while driving. Drivers with a regular licence are permitted to use hands-free cellphones and devices that can be operated with one touch or voice command, provided that the device is securely fixed to the vehicle or worn securely on the driver's body.

Any driver caught texting, emailing, holding a cellphone or other hand-held electronic device while driving will be fined \$368 and receive four driver penalty points (total \$543 minimum).

GLP Drivers

GLP drivers who receive one ticket will have their license reviewed by the Superintendent and may face driving prohibitions. Fully licensed drivers who receive two tickets in a year will have their license reviewed by the Superintendent and face possible three to six months prohibition. In addition to the suspension, two tickets in one year will cost you \$1,256 (two fines at \$368 each, plus eight penalty points at \$520) and if you have points from other tickets (e.g. speeding), it will cost you even more.

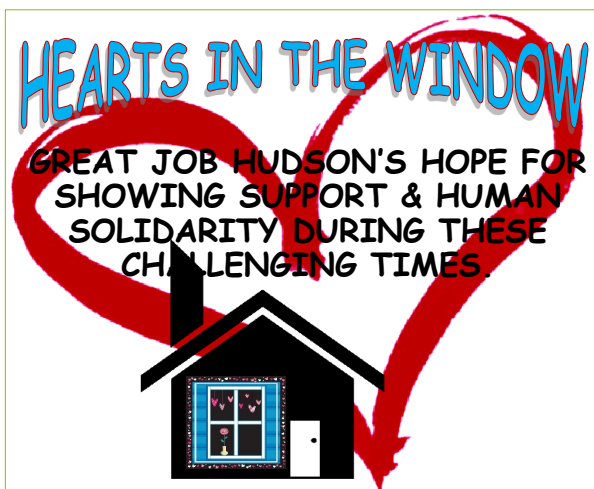

Homeowner Information to Building Permits

The District of Hudson's Hope wants to assist homeowners and contractors to avoid unnecessary delays and expense in planning and construction of residential projects. Below explains when permits are required, requirements for the permit, possible other documents that may be required and other information to assist you in obtaining your building permit. Additional information is available at the District Office or online at www.hudsonshope.ca

A BUILDING PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO:

- construct a new home;
- locate mobile / modular home;
- construct a commercial, industrial or public use building;
- construct a new accessory building e.g., carport, farm building, garage or storage shed;
- renovate existing buildings;
- undertake any structural work such as interior partitions;
- enclose a porch or roof over a sundeck;
- move or demolish a building;
- re-roof a building;
- reconstruct after damage;
- plumbing system changes;

INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED WITH A BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION

The following items must be supplied along with a completed Building Permit Application before a Building Permit can be issued. A Building Permit fee is based on the value of the building or structure and will be calculated by the Building Official.

1. BUILDING PLANS

Two sets of detailed building plans. If you cannot draw the necessary building or site plans, then you should obtain the services of a qualified person.

Example Floor Plans

- scale not less than 1:50 metric (1/4 inch to 1 foot);
- size and location of windows and doors;
- location of all plumbing fixtures;
- location of all mechanical equipment.
- all rooms, size and use of each;
- all dimensions;
- finished and unfinished areas; —



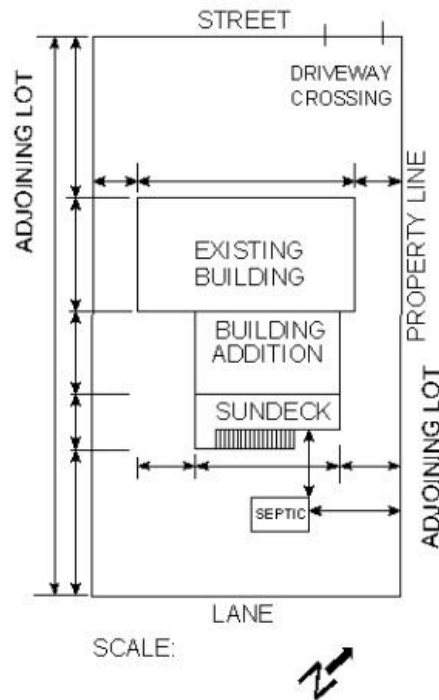

2. SITE PLAN

- full legal description of lot: lot number, plan number; district lot number (from your tax notice or Title);
- lot dimensions;
- adjoining street names;
- locations and uses of existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- distances from all property lines for existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- location of legal road access to the property;
- size, location and number of parking spaces;
- existing and proposed wells or other water sources;
- location of existing or proposed sewage disposal fields on property;
- location of any watercourses on property showing distances from existing or proposed buildings or additions;

This information is intended to assist the general public in applying for a Building Permit within the District of Hudson's Hope.



BUILDING INSPECTIONS (Typical)

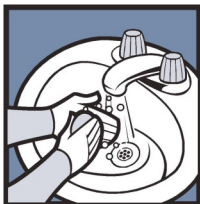
The Building Bylaw requires inspections at the following stages of construction;

- Footings - prior to pouring concrete.
- Backfilling - after completion of damp-proofing, drain tile, and drain rock (if required), but prior to backfilling.
- Plumbing - before any part of the plumbing system is covered.
- Framing - after the entire rough-in plumbing, electrical and mechanical equipment is installed and the framing is completed to lockup stage, but prior to insulating.
- Insulation and Vapour Barrier - after all insulation and vapour barriers are installed, but prior to covering.
- Final - when the building or portion thereof is completed and ready for occupancy, but prior to occupancy thereof.

An Occupancy Certificate is required prior to occupancy of a building. In order for an Occupancy Certificate to be issued, all inspections above must be approved.

PROTECTIVE SERVICES

SPRING BURNING

As the weather starts to warm up many folks are beginning to plan some spring-time cleanup activities including the removal of yard waste and debris. Please remember that under the Fire Protection & Life Safety Bylaw 775 which was adopted in 2010, no person shall light or start an open air fire within the District without first having obtained a Burning Permit from the Fire Chief or his designate. These permits are available at the District Office and can be issued for a onetime event or for an extended period of up to one year.

The only time a permit is not required is during the following situations:

- Burning refuse or garden waste only in an incinerator covered with a screen to prevent flying sparks and is approved by the Fire Chief
- The cooking of food using a portable barbeque apparatus
- Burning on privately owned lands or in developed campgrounds where fireplaces, stoves, and/or fire pits are provided and approved by the Fire Chief
- Burning by the Fire & Rescue Services for the purposes of training

If you are contemplating an open burn:

- Consider your options to compost, recycle, or haul the material to the Hudson's Hope Transfer Site.
- Be a good neighbour. Burn only when it will not affect the health and welfare of the community.
- Call the BC Ministry of Environment to check the ventilation index at **1-888-281-2992**. The index must be "good" for the day of the burn and "fair" or "good" for the second day of the burn.
- Check the wind conditions. If the wind is strong enough to carry sparks and embers to other combustible materials postpone your burn.

Remember that your burn must comply with the Environmental Management Act and the Open Burning Smoke Control Regulation as well as the British Columbia Wildfire Act.

Please remember these measures are in place to protect the health and safety of you and your neighbours. If you have any further questions regarding your burning activities please stop by the District Office to speak to Bob Norton the Director of Protective Services, or call 783-9901.

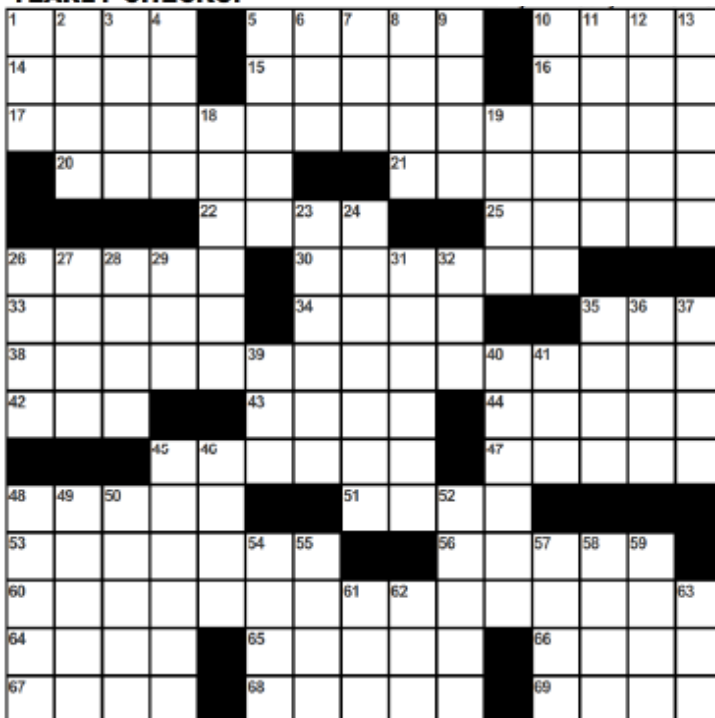

PUBLIC WORKS NEWS & VIEWS



March teased us with some spring-like weather and some, shall we say, cooler temperatures. But we are on the upswing towards summer.

The end of March saw the addition of a new Recreation/Special Events Coordinator. Congratulations to Kristina Coombs. She will be reporting to the Public Works Department, so look for lots of good news and events to come. Ms. Coombs will be based at the District Office, so please stop by to say hello and welcome.

With a lack of snowfall in the early parts of the month, Public Works personnel were able to catch up on a few outstanding tasks, including clean-up of trees and stumps.

When you are out at Dinosaur Lake Campground, you will notice the scrubby trees on the boulevard have been removed. Many of these trees were rotten through the core and were being held up by the outer rings of the trees. Later this year, we will be replacing the removed trees with a native species of coniferous (evergreen) and maybe a few deciduous trees. We also removed stumps in the Pool Park and at other spots around the core area.

Very soon you will hear the familiar hum of lawn equipment so please be careful and give our staff room as they maintain our parks and open spaces.

Our budget process is moving forward, and we are hoping to start some capital works in the next month or so. A couple of our carry-over projects from 2019 include the construction of an ATV campground park at Dinosaur Lake and the upgrade of Beattie Lift station. New projects include replacement of additional water valves and hydrants, the upgrade to the Water Treatment plant, and, hopefully the replacement or repair of sanitary sewers on McDougall Street.

In conjunction with the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure, the District shall have some guide rail installed at the intersection of Canyon Drive and Osborne Street. The design, which is being finalized, will include the installation of concrete barrier wall around the southeast corner of the intersection.

Your arena closed in March and the ice has been removed. Following a clean-up process, the facility will be available to rent for community functions throughout the summer. We are working on an Operations Manual for the Arena and hope to learn from any quirks in the 2019/2020 season.

As mentioned last month, District crews will commence the swimming pool preparations in mid-April with a thorough cleaning and repair of items damaged through the winter months. We are looking at a successful season starting on the long weekend in May.

Enjoy the Spring months, but please be aware of wildlife waking from the winter's hibernation in addition to the abundance of deer roaming around the community.

This is my last Bulletin offering as I regretfully have moved on from the District to deal with family matters. My files have been turned over to my successor so that they can continue bringing you updates from the Public Works Department.

Plastic is recycled into new packaging, broadloom, rope, brush bristles, car bumpers, household furnishings, decking, picnic tables, deck chairs and gardening supplies.

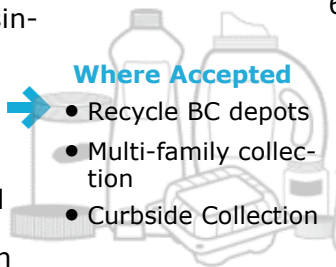

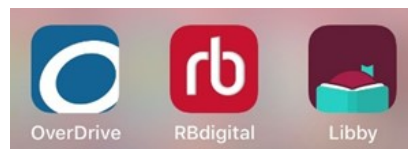

Did you know...

- We have two electronic platforms for you to borrow eBooks and Audiobooks; Library2Go and RBDigital! Each of these platforms have separate title lists, so please make sure to check them both out! You can access Library to go from the Libby or the Overdrive apps. There is also an app for RBDigital. Both of these borrowing interfaces can also be used on a desktop computer as well.
- If your electronic holds list is full but still don't have a book to read, you can still borrow electronic items! Through the Libby app, click on the search bar then change "Availability" to "Available Now". For the Overdrive app, again click the search bar, then click on "advanced" and change the "Availability" drop-down menu to "Available Now". Both of these interfaces have the same titles and also offer an "Express Collection" which features titles that are available for loan immediately without a holds list for a shorter loan period. You can search RBDigital for titles that are available immediately as well, click the search icon, choose eBook or Audiobook and change the "Availability" drop-down menu to "Available".
- Our library subscribes to a database of eMagazines through RBDigital. We received a free upgrade in 2020! We used to offer around 400 titles and the upgrade allowed our patrons access to over 2000 titles!
- You can check out our website for more information about all of our electronic loan services, including NNELS (National Network for Equitable Library Service) for the print-disabled. 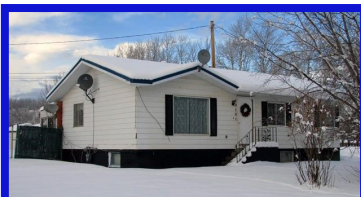

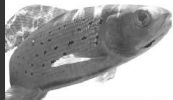
