and you don't need Cream of Tartar either!

Ingredients you will need:

4 cups flour

1 cup warm water

4 food colourings

2 Tbsp canola or vegetable oil

1½ cups salt

1. Mix flour & salt together and set aside (you use more salt instead of cream of tartar).

- 2. Add ¼ Cup of water each to 4 bowls.
- 3. Add food colouring to each of the 4 bowls.
- 4. Add 1/2 Tablespoon of oil to each bowl.
- 5. Add 1 cup of the dry ingredients to each bowl & mix well.
- 6. Sprinkle a little flour on table & knead well.
- 7. Put play dough into a zip up plastic bag or plastic wrap. Store in the fridge and enjoy!!!
 Hint: add essential oil to make scented play dough!

Easy Spray Chalk

Just because you don't have a sidewalk doesn't mean you can't still colour the grass, dirt & concrete! Making spray chalk is super easy, & washes off most surfaces. Using spray bottles is great for fine motor development.

Materials you will need:

Spray bottles

Corn Starch

Baking Soda

Food colouring

- 1. Mix the baking soda & cornstarch 50/50 and add mixture to spray bottles 1/3 full.
- Add food colouring to desired colour & then fill bottles with warm water, leaving space at the top of the bottle.
- 3. Add spray lids & shake vigorously.

Shake the bottles every time before you use them for the mixture will settle sometimes. Enjoy!!!

How to start your Seeds

- Start wildflower seeds in nursery trays with a good all-purpose potting
- Spread one layer of seeds in each section. Gently rake the surrounding soil to cover the seeds.
- Spray the soil with a fine mist of water until it is wet to the touch. Water the seeds every one to two days.
- Place the nursery trays in a bright sunny window that receives light for at least eight hours a day. Germination takes place as early as six days



Police Report: APRIL 2020



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 24 calls for service between March 18th to April 20th. 15 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates. Though police across the province have slowed down with the traffic enforcement for safety protocols during this Covid-19 pandemic, the Hudson's Hope RCMP are still making presence patrols and conducting stops for high priority traffic offences as much as possible. The construction zones along Hwy 29 are still in effect, being many of these projects are still being conducted. Fines for speeding in a construction zone range from \$196 - \$253 (3 points), and fines for vehicles exceeding 41kms/hr over the posted speed limit will result in fines ranging between \$368 to \$483 (3 points) with a 7 day impound of the vehicle. Please obey the construction zone signs as they are in place for the safety of the workers in those areas.

If there are any concerns in regard to observed traffic related issues, please contact and advise the local detachment.

On March 20th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a theft from a construction site along Hwy 29 where a light tower trailer was stolen from the site. A grey Chevrolet truck pulling a similar light trailer was observed leaving the area by a crew member but no suspects have been identified at this time.

On March 24th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a stolen quad from a work site along Farrell Creek Rd., near Harasymyk Rd. This ATV is described as a camo coloured Yamaha 700.

On March 26th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a break and enter into some utility trailers at a work site along Farrell Creek Rd. Due to these trailers being mostly empty and scheduled for removal, the only items that were reported to have been stolen were some cable materials.

On March 26th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of three stranded snowmobilers in the Dunlevy area. It was reported that these non-local individuals had driven down a drainage chute to gain access to a lake but were unable to get back out and they were not prepared to stay the night being a snow storm was incoming the same night. Communications from these individuals was able to be transmitted and received via an Inreach GPS device and police were able to acquire GPS coordinates whereas Search and Rescue was called out. A long search was conducted that continued throughout the night into the following morning where then a helicopter had to be called in to rescue the three individuals. All three were rescued and no one suffered any major injuries.

On April 16th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a suspicious fire along Hwy 29 near the Lynx Creek RV park. Construction crews on site stated that they were able to extinguish the fire but believed that it had been intentionally set as that they did not have any active burns at this time. No suspects were observed.

The Hudson's Hope Fire department has been attending several calls in the past few weeks for open and or suspicious fires that could have caused detrimental safety concerns for the town. We are asking the community to review all the updated fire bans and information being that fuel conditions are very dry and even a small fire can spread quickly in our current conditions.

At this time, with the exception of small, contained campfires, **ALL** burning activities throughout the province are prohibited.

Please call 9-1-1 immediately if you see a fire or smoke. Reporting fires quickly reduces the likelihood that property or critical infrastructures will be damaged, and reduces the risk to residents and responders.


Peace River closure begins in June

As part of the Site C project, BC Hydro will be installing two debris management structures across the Peace River in advance of river diversion this fall.

For safety reasons, starting mid–June, a 4 km section of the Peace River near Fort St. John will be permanently closed to boaters.

Portage program: To move boaters around the construction area, a Portage Program for non-motorized boats will operate between the Halfway River boat launch and the Peace Island Park boat launch from June 15 to September 15. Reservations are required seven days in advance of pickup.

Public advisory: Bird deterrents installed at construction areas near Lynx Creek

To deter waterfowl from nesting in Highway 29 construction areas, bird deterrents are being installed at two locations on the Peace River near Lynx Creek.

Placed on Gates Island and Dry Island near Hudson's Hope, the deterrents will emit sounds that are similar to birds' warning calls. These sounds are expected to deter nesting birds away from the construction sites on the island. If the natural bird sounds are ineffective, electronic sounds may be used. A large strobe light will also shine from the top of the bird deterrent.

The bird deterrents target geese, ducks and killdeer. They will operate 24 hours a day until the end of nesting season in late July. Sounds last three to 10 seconds and will be heard as far as 400 metres away.

Lynx Creek is one of several sections of Highway 29 being realigned in preparation for the Site C reservoir.

Tree Planting Rebate



District of Hudson's Hope Tree Planting Rebate Program is Running again for 2020

ONLY WHILE QUANTITIES LAST

All applicants are required to accept terms and conditions of the rebate program, which include:

- 1. Only trees purchased after January 1, 2020, and are identified as growing in Zone 1, 2 or 3 are eligible for rebate. Shrubs and flowers will not be eligible for this rebate. A limited number of rebates are available on a first-come, first-serve basis.
- 2. Each rebate is a maximum of \$50. If the price is below \$50, the rebated amount will be the actual purchase price. The subsidy will be issued in the form of a cheque payable to the purchaser.
- 3. Only one rebate per year per property will be issued.
- 4. To be eligible you must have a District of Hudson's Hope property tax account in your name, a completed rebate form, original purchase receipt (photocopies not accepted), and the tree tag indicating growing zone 1, 2 or 3.

- 5. Trees are to be planted at the address associated with the property tax account. Trees are not to be planted on public property, right of way or easement.
- 6. The District of Hudson's Hope accepts no responsibility for loss, damages or claims to property caused by or resulting from Community Tree Planting Rebate Policy.
 - 7.The District of Hudson's Hope reserves the right to reverse the rebate if information provided on the application form is either incorrect or untrue, or if the terms and conditions have been breached.
- 8. The District of Hudson's Hope reserves the right to alter, cancel or discontinue the program at any time.

Homeowner Information to Building Permits

The District of Hudson's Hope wants to assist homeowners and contractors to avoid unnecessary delays and expense in planning and construction of residential projects. Below explains when permits are required, requirements for the permit, possible other documents that may be required and other information to assist you in obtaining your building permit. Additional information is available at the District Office or online at www.hudsonshope.ca

A BUILDING PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO:

- construct a new home;
- •locate mobile / modular home;
- construct a commercial, industrial or public use building;
- •construct a new accessory building e.g., carport, farm building, garage or storage shed;
- •renovate existing buildings;
- •undertake any structural work such as interior partitions;
- enclose a porch or roof over a sundeck;
- move or demolish a building;
- re-roof a building;
- reconstruct after damage;
- plumbing system changes;

INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED WITH A BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION

The following items must be supplied along with a completed Building Permit Application before a Building Permit can be issued. A Building Permit fee is based on the value of the building or structure and will be calculated by the Building Official.


1. BUILDING PLANS


Two sets of detailed building plans. If you cannot draw the necessary building or site plans, then you should obtain the services of a qualified person.

Example Floor Plans

- scale not less than 1:50 metric (1/4 inch to 1 foot);
- size and location of windows and doors;
- location of all plumbing fixtures;
- location of all mechanical equipment.

- all rooms, size and use of each;
- all dimensions;
- finished and unfinished areas; -





2. SITE PLAN

- full legal description of lot: lot number, plan number; district lot number (from your tax notice or Title);
- lot dimensions:
- adjoining street names;
- locations and uses of existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- distances from all property lines for existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- location of legal road access to the property;
- size, location and number of parking spaces;
- existing and proposed wells or other water sources;
- location of existing or proposed sewage disposal fields on property;
- location of any watercourses on property showing distances from existing or proposed buildings or additions;

This information is intended to assist the general public in applying for a Building Permit within the District of Hudson's Hope.

BUILDING INSPECTIONS (Typical)

The Building Bylaw requires inspections at the following stages of construction;


- Footings prior to pouring concrete.
- Backfilling after completion of damp-proofing, drain tile, and drain rock (if required), but prior to backfilling.
- Plumbing before any part of the plumbing system is covered.
- Framing after the entire rough-in plumbing, electrical and mechanical equipment is installed and the framing is completed to lockup stage, but prior to insulating.
- Insulation and Vapour Barrier after all insulation and vapour barriers are installed, but prior to covering.
- Final when the building or portion thereof is completed and ready for occupancy, but prior to occupancy thereof.

An Occupancy Certificate is required prior to occupancy of a building. In order for an Occupancy Certificate to be issued, all inspections above must be approved.



Did you know...

- You do not need to sign up for Facebook to view our page? Go to https:// m.facebook.com/hudsonshopepubliclibrary/ or search for Hudson's Hope Public Library Facebook to find our feed in a browser. We will continue posting information about online access almost every day while we are closed.
- Shellie posts a weekly kids craft on our Facebook page on Tuesday mornings, take a picture of your craft attempt and share it in the comments.
- We have two electronic platforms for you to borrow eBooks and Audiobooks; Library2Go and RBDigital! Each of these platforms have separate title lists, so please make sure to check them both out! You can access Library2go from the Libby or the Overdrive apps. There is also an app for RBDigital. Both of these borrowing interfaces can also be used on a desktop computer as well.
- Tip: if you access the catalogue through our website, searching for a title will show your results in both Overdrive and RBdigital. Go to our website, search catalogue for title. If you would only like to see digital resources come back in your search, change the Format dropdown menu to Audiobooks (electronic) or Books (electronic).
- If your electronic holds list is full but you still don't have a book to read, you can still borrow electronic items! Through the Libby app, click on the search bar then change "Availability" to "Available Now". For the Overdrive app, again click the search bar,



then click on "advanced" and change the "Availability" drop-down menu to "Available Now". Both of these interfaces have the same titles and also offer an "Express Collection" which features titles that are available for loan immediately without a holds list for a shorter loan period. You can search RBdigital for titles that are available immediately as well, click the search icon, choose eBook or Audiobook and change the "Availability" drop-down menu to "Available".

- Electronic audiobook and eBook loans are up significantly. Please be courteous of other users in the province by returning the item as soon as you are done so that the next person in line can borrow the item. Most electronic loans only allow for one user at a time per record. Through Library2go, you can also delay your loan and still be the next person in line!
- Our library subscribes to a database of videos from RBDigital called IndieFlix. "IndieFlix is a streaming movie service that offers access to pop culture favorites, box office hits, award-winning feature films, documentaries, and shorts." These can either be accessed through the IndieFlix app or website. Just click through the entertainment link on the RBdigital app or website to access IndieFlix. Selection includes cult favorites Planet of the Apes (1968) and Halloween (1978), series such as Injustice and Black Widows, social impact pieces like Living the Change: Inspiring Stories for a Sustainable Future, classic TV including The Beverly Hillbillies, The Lucy Show and Bonanza and even classic animation such as Woody Woodpecker and Friends or Felix the Cat.
- You can check out our website for more information about all of our electronic loan services, including NNELS (National Network for Equitable Library Service) for the print-disabled. Please let us know if you qualify to access this feature as we need to update your library account to access these additional titles. https:// hudsonshope.bc.libraries.coop/research/download-digital-media-ebooks-audiobooksmovies-magazines-more/
- You can gain access to your library account through our website to see what items are on loan or to renew items. During the closure, renewals will already be updated for after we reopen. Anything that was overdue will not be renewed automatically. Fines accrued during the closure for on these items that could not be renewed by the system will be waived. If you logon to "My Account" you can see both physical and electronic (from Library2go) Items on Hold and Items Checked Out. By clicking on the Holds tab, you can see the Status of your hold. If you have never logged in to your patron account before, please contact us to receive your temporary password.
- The Gale database offers courses for free. Take a course in Accounting & Finance, Business, Computer Applications, Design & Composition, Healthcare & Medical, Language & Arts, Law & Legal, Personal Development, Teaching & Education, Technolo-


