

## Police Report: July 2020



Between June 17<sup>th</sup> and July 17<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP frontline officers responded to 37 calls to service. Several rural patrols and road safety patrols were also conducted during this time.

The Hudson's Hope RCMP would like to advise the public that the detachment front counter is once again open. The front counter was closed in early March, affecting services such as criminal record checks and walk in enquires. If you do attend the detachment, there is a limit of two persons in the lobby at a time. Hand sanitizer and a washroom is available to wash your hands when you enter and when you leave.

A one of a kind traffic sign was reported to have been stolen on June 22<sup>nd</sup>. The sign, described as being a large orange 2'x4' with black lettering reading 'Cattle Drive in Progress', had been put out along Highway 29N, near the Farrell Creek Bridge, to warn motorists of livestock in the area. Once the cattle drive was completed, the sign had gone missing. (2020-200)

On June 26<sup>th</sup>, while making routine patrols, a Hudson's Hope officer came across a side by side roll over collision. There were no injuries to the driver, however the side by side was not registered. The Hudson's Hope RCMP would like to remind ATV users that ATV's are to be registered and helmets must be worn. Please use the trails safety and properly to avoid injuries and possible fines. (2020-204)

The Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of an e-mail scam on June 29<sup>th</sup>. It was stated that unless the owner of the e-mail did not pay \$119 in crypto-currency (bitcoin) some personal information would be released. If you are a victim of this type of scam, or one of the many other scams that are used, please contact the detachment. You will also be asked to report these incidents to the Canadian anti-fraud centre. Unknown culprits had entered the chained compound overnight and removed the boat. The boat and trailer have since been located in the Moberly Lake Area. Unfortunately, the boat had been stripped. This investigation is ongoing and the Hudson's Hope RCMP are requesting anyone with information regarding this break and enter and theft to contact the detachment at 250-783-5241. ## **Spillway operation update**

We've started discharging water from our spillways at the WAC Bennett and Peace Canyon dams in addition to the water discharged for generation. The spill is being done to safely manage the level of the Williston Reservoir. Between Peace Canyon and the Halfway River, flows may be slightly higher than during normal maximum discharge. We request that the public continue to be very careful when active in and around the Peace River downstream of our dams and generating facilities. Water levels can rise and fluctuate without warning even under normal operations.

Spillway and generation discharge may change from time to time and our increased discharge may continue until late August.

## Tips to Stay Safe While Boating

With the four tips below, individuals who are boating can stay safe and ensure that each experience out on the water is rewarding and free of potential emergencies.

- 1. The importance of lifejackets: The most essential thing that individuals need when they're out on the water is a lifejacket or personal flotation device (PFD), as this can substantially reduce the potential for drowning or other dangerous aquatic incidents.
- **2. Avoid alcohol**: According to the Canadian Red Cross, 37 per cent of boaters in Canada consume alcohol each time they are on the water, while alcohol has been linked as a factor in more than 40 percent of deaths in recreational boating incidents. Beer, liquor and wine can negatively impact a boater's judgment and make him or her less likely to maintain control of core motor functions compared to individuals who do not drink on the water, which underscores the importance of being sober while boating.
- **3.** Pay attention to weather conditions: While weather conditions may not seem as essential as wearing a lifejacket or PFD, understanding what the climate and forecast will be like during an upcoming boating experience can be crucial for staying safe while aboard a vessel.
- **4. Bringing safety gear on board**: From marine first aid kits to sunscreen, drinking water, flashlights, sound signaling devices and manual propelling devices, there are a variety of safety devices that should be brought on a boat in order to reduce the likelihood of emergencies.

# HOUSE NUMBERS SAVE LIVES

The Importance of a 9-1-1 Address

Properly displaying your civic number on your house or at the end of your drive ensures fast emergency response for the **AMBULANCE**, **FIRE** and **POLICE** Services. Precious minutes can pass while the emergency vehicle attempts to locate the emergency incident.

It is strongly recommended that you ensure that a civic address is posted with the following guidelines in place:

- •the civic address the District has assigned to the premises must be displayed on the principal building on the premises and must be legible from a minimum distance of fifteen (15) metres;
- •where a building is set back from the street or roadway fronting the property such that the assigned street address is not clearly legible from the street or roadway, or where landscaping or architectural appurtenances or other obstructions obstruct the address, the assigned street address shall also be displayed at the driveway entrance from the street or road serving the building on a weather-resistant sign permanently mounted on a post and visible from all direction of traffic flow; and
- •letters or numbers displayed on a building must be of a colour which contrasts with the background colour of the building or sign.





To avoid congestion in our entryway, please keep your personal belongings with you at all times. Do not remove footwear; dry on mat or stomp off mud. If your footwear is bound to make a mess, please ask one of our librarians to gather your loans to deliver to you at the door, while you wait on mat just inside of the library.

**Interlibrary Loans:** As of July 23<sup>rd</sup>, when this is being written, Interlibrary Loans are still to remain closed. There has been more discussion at the provincial level in favour of reactivating this service, but there is no official date in place from the provincial authorities to reinstate this service. We sincerely apologize for the inconvenience and will notify our patrons via Facebook and PSA as soon as this service is reinstated. In the meantime, our local hold service is active and may be managed online or can be placed through phone, email or in person. Please contact our staff for a quick tutorial, to sign up for your own library card or to simply place a hold.

Current Library Services: We are now open but our hours have changed to try to accommodate more patrons that are abiding by varying levels of COVID-19 self-protection, please see our advertising to see what days and hours certain services are available. Public access is noted in the Grab & Go poster, contactless holds pickup appointment time availability are indicated in the Library Takeout poster. Mondays have been set aside for medically vulnerable patrons, including seniors, to make appointments to access the library, please see the poster at the end of the library section of the Bulletin. Please take care in noting which hours are available and for what service, as there are two ads that include a list of hours and only the Grab & Go hours are for public access. Please also note, the library is only open to individual users for short term browsing and checkouts. vidual family groups may access the library together but please note, children under the age of 10 must be directly supervised at all times by their guardian to ensure adherence to personal hygiene standards and item quarantine protocols.

Please add a note to your donation with your name so that we can thank you in the Bulletin, tie the bag and leave in our outside book drop, next to the bulletin board. If you have items that cannot fit through the book drop, we cannot accept those donations at this time.

Summer Reading Club: Due to the ongoing COVID-19 protocols and keeping in mind the new library capacity and the excessive amount of staff hours that would be needed in order to provide face-to-face programming with lower numbers of children per group, we are opting to provide SRC as an online program supplemented by weekly packages of reading materials and craft supplies to be picked up at the library.

Our Storytime littles and parents club is directed toward preschoolers but moms with babies are welcome to join the online Zoom sessions for the social aspect as well.

There will be a Summer Reading Club for 5-8 year olds as well as for 9-12. These sessions have live stories, craft sessions, games and a whole lot more fun!

Our SRC for teens ages 13-18 is a service that is not reinforced with provincial help with materials and program development, as the other SRC programs are, but we know a lot of teens out there that love to read and/or would like to join in on the Zoom session. If your teen would like to join, you just need to call the library to register as there is no option for teens to sign up on the SRC registration page. Our Monday Zoom sessions are super easy to do!


