





### Police Report: September 2020



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 38 calls for service between August 18th to September 20th. 68 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates. Highway and road safety continues to be a big focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP with the school zone along Beattie Drive being the largest focus now that that school is back in session.

The Hudson's Hope RCMP is asking that drivers be aware that the school zone is back in effect between Mon – Fri, 8am to 5pm.

Cst. SCHMIDT is still awaiting approval and confirmation with the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure in regards to having larger flashing speed signs implemented in the school zone.

On August 23<sup>rd</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a mischief to farm equipment at a property along Beryl Prairie Rd. whereas a tractor had been driven through a metal gate and several other farm vehicles had been rifled through. At this point, the file remains open for further investigation.

On August 24<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a local residence after the home owner observed the local trouble maker bear outside the residence eating garbage. Due to the fact that this bear had been displaying signs of aggression toward people, and was confirmed to be injured beyond Conservations ability to medically intervene, RCMP were able to put the bear down without incident.

On August 30<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a mischief that had occurred overnight at the Beattie Dr. lift station located along Dudley Dr. Unknown person(s) had spray painted a star and the words "Jews Win" on the side of the structure. Damages have since been repaired and police have asked that anyone with any information contact the local detachment.

On September 5<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a call for stranded boaters on the Williston Lake after their boat broke down and they were unable to paddle to shore given the windy conditions. While efforts were being arranged to launch a rescue boat, the stranded boaters contacted police to update that they were assisted by another boater and all persons aboard were now safe and sound on solid ground.

On September 6<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a shed that had been stolen from a rural property along Twelve Mile Rd. This property has had several other similar files in the past for other stolen items such as Austrian made windows and shutters. This remains an open investigation at this time.

On September 16<sup>th</sup>, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a suspicious vehicle along Hwy 29 after receiving a report that a vehicle had been observed parked on the side of the highway with all the windows smashed out. Police attended the pullout spot along Hwy 29 and located a black minivan with several windows smashed out and paint strewn within the interior. Upon speaking with the owner of the vehicle, it was learnt that the vehicle had broken down the night prior and left in place to be towed the following day. It is believed that sometime during the night, unknown person(s) vandalized the vehicle. Several fingerprints were lifted and file remains open for investigation.

#### Re: Upcoming work in Hudson's Hope

Dear Hudson's Hope resident,

We're writing to provide an update on upcoming work in Hudson's Hope, related to Site C.

#### Berm construction will begin soon

In early October, BC Hydro will begin construction of a 2.5-kilometre-long berm along the shore of Hudson's Hope.

The berm – a large barrier made of riprap, rocks and gravel – will reinforce the shoreline and protect it from potential erosion once the Site C reservoir is filled. The berm begins on the shoreline of the Peace River on the western end of the town, and will extend downstream, past the municipal sewage treatment facility. Construction of the berm will continue until the end of 2022.

#### Construction timeline (approximate)

#### Early October:

- The lower portion of Portage Trail and D. A. Thomas Road will be closed and marked with signage for public safety. The final date of the closures will be determined soon. The trail and road is anticipated to remain closed until the end of 2023.
- Crews will mobilize to site, bringing materials and equipment to a laydown area within Zone B, as shown in the attached map.
- o Archaeological data recovery will occur in several locations.

#### October - November:

- Crews will clear vegetation and chip or mulch debris.
- A temporary access road will be built on the western end of the slope within Zone B, from Clark Drive to the shoreline.
- Crews will begin hauling riprap (boulders and rocks) from Portage Mountain Quarry to the shoreline, using Canyon Drive and Clark Avenue.

### **Early 2021**

o Crews will start placing riprap in the water and building the berm

The second phase of construction, which includes the construction of D. A. Thomas Road, the recreation area and small craft launch, will not begin until approximately 2023.

#### Air quality monitoring station has been installed

BC Hydro recently installed an air quality monitoring station to provide real-time measurements on air quality, such as smoke, dust, and exhaust. Located on Dudley Drive near the shoreline and close to homes, the air quality measuring station will operate during berm construction, and through the first two years of Site C operations.

This station is one of five that BC Hydro has placed throughout the Peace Region.

Air quality data is shared with the Ministry of Environment and Climate Change, and will be found on their website once construction begins. You can find the website by searching for "BC Northeast Air Zone Data" in your Internet search engine.

#### What to expect

Safety is our top priority and BC Hydro is working with Site C contractors to ensure work is planned and managed effectively.

Construction areas will also be closed due to safety reasons.

**Hours of work:** Work will usually occur from 7 am to 7 pm, seven days a week. Work outside of these hours may be needed.

Traffic: Trucks will regularly move riprap, rocks and gravel from the quarry at Portage Mountain to the work site, via Canyon Drive. Other construction traffic will also increase.

**Equipment**: A variety of heavy equipment will be used. These include different types of on-and-off-road trucks, excavators, loaders, vegetation clearing machines, and graders. Rescue boats will be in the river for safety purposes.

Impacts: There will be increased noise, dust and traffic in the local area. Crews will mitigate these impacts when possible. These include:

- · Applying water on work sites to reduce dust
- Using white noise back up beepers
- · Installing noise barriers around generators
- · Avoiding vehicle idling



# Homeowner Information to Building Permits

The District of Hudson's Hope wants to assist homeowners and contractors to avoid unnecessary delays and expense in planning and construction of residential projects. Below explains when permits are required, requirements for the permit, possible other documents that may be required and other information to assist you in obtaining your building permit. Additional information is available at the District Office or online at www.hudsonshope.ca

### A BUILDING PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO:

- construct a new home;
- •locate mobile / modular home;
- •construct a commercial, industrial or public use building;
- •construct a new accessory building e.g., carport, farm building, garage or storage shed;
- renovate existing buildings;
- •undertake any structural work such as interior partitions;
- enclose a porch or roof over a sundeck;
- move or demolish a building;
- re-roof a building;
- reconstruct after damage;
- plumbing system changes;

#### INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED WITH A BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION

The following items must be supplied along with a completed Building Permit Application before a Building Permit can be issued. A Building Permit fee is based on the value of the building or structure and will be calculated by the Building Official.


#### 1. BUILDING PLANS


Two sets of detailed building plans. If you cannot draw the necessary building or site plans, then you should obtain the services of a qualified person.

#### **Example Floor Plans**

- scale not less than 1:50 metric (1/4 inch to 1 foot);
- size and location of windows and doors;
- location of all plumbing fixtures;
- location of all mechanical equipment.

- all rooms, size and use of each;
- all dimensions;
- finished and unfinished areas; -





#### 2. SITE PLAN

- full legal description of lot: lot number, plan number; district lot number (from your tax notice or Title);
- lot dimensions:
- adjoining street names;
- locations and uses of existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- distances from all property lines for existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- location of legal road access to the property;
- size, location and number of parking spaces;
- existing and proposed wells or other water sources;
- location of existing or proposed sewage disposal fields on property;
- location of any watercourses on property showing distances from existing or proposed buildings or additions;

# This information is intended to assist the general public in applying for a Building Permit within the District of Hudson's Hope.

# STREET DRIVEWAY CROSSING EXISTING BUILDING BUILDING BUILDING SEPTIC LANE SCALE:

#### **BUILDING INSPECTIONS (Typical)**

The Building Bylaw requires inspections at the following stages of construction;

- Footings prior to pouring concrete.
- Backfilling after completion of damp-proofing, drain tile, and drain rock (if required), but prior to backfilling.
- Plumbing before any part of the plumbing system is covered.
- Framing after the entire rough-in plumbing, electrical and mechanical equipment is installed and the framing is completed to lockup stage, but prior to insulating.
- Insulation and Vapour Barrier after all insulation and vapour barriers are installed, but prior to covering.
- Final when the building or portion thereof is completed and ready for occupancy, but prior to occupancy thereof.

An Occupancy Certificate is required prior to occupancy of a building. In order for an Occupancy Certificate to be issued, all inspections above must be approved.






