



Protective Services

Look, listen & be seen

Teach your child to be a safe pedestrian

Look. Make sure all vehicles have stopped before entering the road. Make eye contact before crossing.



Sidewalk/no sidewalk. Walk on the inside edge of the sidewalk away from the road, so you're further away from the traffic. Walk facing oncoming traffic if there isn't a sidewalk, so you can see approaching vehicles and make eye contact with drivers.

Set a good example. Never jaywalk or run to cross the street. Where possible, cross at intersections with a pedestrian crossing light or marked crosswalk

Map it out. Plan your child's route with them ahead of time. Review street names and landmarks to orient them.

Crossing Basics. Stop at the curb. Look left and right for oncoming vehicles that might be turning. When the intersection is clear, start crossing and keep looking for approaching vehicles.

Be Seen. Wear bright clothes and/or reflective gear especially at night and in poor weather.



Parked vehicles. Avoid shortcuts through parking lots or around parked cars where it's harder for drivers to see small children.





Listen. Put away the electronic gadgets, cell phones and ear buds so you can hear approaching traffic that may be hard to see.

RECYCLING PAPER PACKAGING FOR DRY GOODS

Paper packaging is recycled into new boxes, paper towels, tissues, paper-based plant pots, the paper cover for drywall liner, kraft paper, brown paper products including paper towels

Accepted Materials

- Corrugated cardboard boxes used for shipping, grocery and liquor store boxes and pizza boxes
- Cardboard and boxboard boxes used for cereal, shoes, tissues, pizza, frozen entrees, desserts, detergent, etc.
- Carrier trays for bulk bottled water, soft drinks, cans, food, etc.
- Cores for paper towels and toilet tissue
- Moulded boxboard packaging for egg cartons, take-out beverage trays, paper-based plant pots

Police Report: August 2020



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 44 calls for service between July 17th to August 18th. 46 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates. Highway and road safety continues to be a big focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP.

Given the warm sunny days that we have been having lately, there has been a large increase in the number of boaters in the area, therefore the RCMP have been conducting checks on the boats and trailers to insure that they are being towed within regulations and have valid insurance. If anyone is new to boating and or wishes to brush up on safety tips and requirements for the use of pleasure crafts, the Hudson's Hope RCMP has several shiny copies of the new Transport Canada "Safe Boating Guide" that can be picked up by attending the front counter of the detachment between business hours.

On July 23rd, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a single motorcycle accident in the area along Canyon Dr. / Summer Rd. Police attended and located an injured male and female who were later transported to hospital with non-life threatening injuries. Speed was deemed a factor to the cause of the accident.

On July 26th, while conducting radar within the construction zone along Hwy 29 near the Halfway Bridge, the Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a vehicle that was observed driving at the speed of 114km/hr through the 60km/hr construction zone. The driver received a hefty fine for excessive speeding and a 7 day impound of his vehicle.

On July 27th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP attended the Dinosaur Lake area after receiving a report of a possible impaired boater. The complainant reported that they were out kayaking on the lake when they where almost struck by a passing by boater. Police attended the area and located the operator of the boat who was found to be under the influence of alcohol, therefore found himself with a large fine and lose of licence for a set duration of time.

On August 9th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report for two missing persons who had last been observed travelling over the Bennett Dam and onward with apparent plans to look for dinosaur prints and go fishing. Police received the missing persons call later this day when the two persons did not return home and family members had not heard from them since they set out in the morning. After several hours of searching with no one located, Search and Rescue with the aid of the police helicopter were dispatched. On the following day, the Hudson's Hope RCMP

were advised from a wildlife management group who were working back along Johnson Creek forestry service road, that they had located the missing persons walking along Johnson Creek Rd after their truck had become stuck far back in on a side road. The two were found with no injuries and sore feet.

On August 14th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP conducted a routine traffic stop with a vehicle passing through town and found the driver to be a prohibited driver within the province of British Columbia. Consequently, the driver was arrested for driving while prohibited, and upon conducting a search, weapons and drugs were located and seized from within the vehicle. The file is still being investigated and further charges are pending.

Hudson's Hope Off-Road Vehicle Violations

Hudson's Hope is a well-known destination for off-roading and is frequently visited by motorists from out of town. This season, the Hudson's Hope RCMP has investigated three off-road collisions, and has had several interactions with off-road vehicle operators which resulted in written warnings and violation tickets for Off-Road Vehicle Act offences. Police would like to remind the public to be safe while operating ATV'S and to obey the BC Off-Road Vehicle Act (ORVA).

The following are some of the requirements specified in the Off-Road Vehicle Act:

All motorists and passengers must wear a DOT approved helmet (not a bicycle or ski helmet). Off-road vehicles must be properly registered and display an off-road vehicle plate when operated on Crown land or prescribed private land. Off-road vehicles must be equipped with lights if operated after dark. Motorists must refrain from operating off-road vehicles recklessly, on a railway or in a manner that is harassing to wildlife.

Fine amounts range between \$109 and \$368. Please review the Off-Road Vehicle Act at the link below to ensure safe use of off-road vehicles and compliance with BC laws.

Halfway River closed to boaters September-April

A 2-km section of the Halfway River will be closed to boaters from September 1, 2020 to April 30, 2021, as BC Hydro clears vegetation to prepare for the Site C reservoir.

During this time, six temporary crossings will be built across the river to transport logs and equipment during the winter clearing season.

The river will be re-opened and the crossings removed by May 2021, in time for the next boating season.

Boaters will continue to be able to access the Peace River from the Halfway River boat launch.

FROM THE LIONS DEN







Homeowner Information to Building Permits

The District of Hudson's Hope wants to assist homeowners and contractors to avoid unnecessary delays and expense in planning and construction of residential projects. Below explains when permits are required, requirements for the permit, possible other documents that may be required and other information to assist you in obtaining your building permit. Additional information is available at the District Office or online at www.hudsonshope.ca

A BUILDING PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO:

- construct a new home;
- •locate mobile / modular home;
- construct a commercial, industrial or public use building;
- •construct a new accessory building e.g., carport, farm building, garage or storage shed;
- renovate existing buildings;
- •undertake any structural work such as interior partitions;
- enclose a porch or roof over a sundeck;
- move or demolish a building;
- re-roof a building;
- reconstruct after damage;
- plumbing system changes;

INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED WITH A BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION

The following items must be supplied along with a completed Building Permit Application before a Building Permit can be issued. A Building Permit fee is based on the value of the building or structure and will be calculated by the Building Official.


1. BUILDING PLANS


Two sets of detailed building plans. If you cannot draw the necessary building or site plans, then you should obtain the services of a qualified person.

Example Floor Plans

- scale not less than 1:50 metric (1/4 inch to 1 foot);
- size and location of windows and doors;
- location of all plumbing fixtures;
- location of all mechanical equipment.

- all rooms, size and use of each;
- all dimensions;
- finished and unfinished areas; —





2. SITE PLAN

- full legal description of lot: lot number, plan number; district lot number (from your tax notice or Title);
- lot dimensions;
- adjoining street names;
- locations and uses of existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- distances from all property lines for existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- location of legal road access to the property;
- size, location and number of parking spaces;
- existing and proposed wells or other water sources;
- location of existing or proposed sewage disposal fields on property;
- location of any watercourses on property showing distances from existing or proposed buildings or additions;

This information is intended to assist the general public in applying for a Building Permit within the District of Hudson's Hope.

BUILDING INSPECTIONS (Typical)

The Building Bylaw requires inspections at the following stages of construction;

- Footings prior to pouring concrete.
- Backfilling after completion of damp-proofing, drain tile, and drain rock (if required), but prior to backfilling.
- Plumbing before any part of the plumbing system is covered.
- Framing after the entire rough-in plumbing, electrical and mechanical equipment is installed and the framing is completed to lockup stage, but prior to insulating.
- Insulation and Vapour Barrier after all insulation and vapour barriers are installed, but prior to covering.
- Final when the building or portion thereof is completed and ready for occupancy, but prior to occupancy thereof.


An Occupancy Certificate is required prior to occupancy of a building. In order for an Occupancy Certificate to be issued, all inspections above must be approved.

We would like to invite you to come in and check out the Bedaux Exhibit which is back on display after a 6-year hiatus and Journey around Alberta and British Columbia.

Charles Bedaux was captivated with the country surrounding Hudson's Hope after embarking on a hunting trip in the area in 1932. His attempt, two

years later, to take five Citroen half tracks across the northern wilderness of British Columbia is known throughout the world. This "Champagne Safari" did not reach its Telegraph Creek destination but it gave much needed employment to local cowboys during the Depression. The role of the Hudson's Hope cowboys has been overshadowed by historical emphasis on Charles Bedaux's lifestyle and adventures. Through profiling the lives of these cowboys, this exhibition highlights their important role as wranglers and packers to the expedition. Interlibrary Loans: As of August 18th, Interlibrary Loans are back online for the Hudson's Hope Public Library. Some libraries in the province have chosen not to activate their ILL systems at this time but our systems are updated to exclude non-participating libraries. ILLs may be requested through the catalogue database via your patron account. If you cannot find the title that you are looking for, we have access to another database that we can check for availability. Please contact our staff for a quick tutorial, to sign up for your own library card or to simply place a hold.

Current Library Services: We are now open but our hours have changed to try to accommodate more patrons that are abiding by varying levels of COVID-19 self-protection. Public access is noted in the Grab & Go poster, contactless holds pickup times for appointment availability are indicated in the Library Takeout poster. Mondays have been set aside for medically vulnerable patrons, including seniors and essential workers, to make appointments to access the library, please see the poster for Vulnerable Patron Library Access at the end of the library section of the Bulletin. Please take care in noting which hours are available and for what service, as there are two ads that include a list of hours and only the Grab & Go hours are for public access. Please also note, the library is only open to individual users for short term browsing and checkouts. Individual family groups may access the library together but please note, children under the age of 10 must be directly supervised at all times by their guardian to ensure adherence to hygiene standards. Public hours for the library has changed on Tuesdays and Saturdays.





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
