What is a Winter Tire?

British Columbia accepts "mountain snowflake" or "mud and snow" tires with at least 3.5 mm tread as winter tires.

Check your tires for these signs:

The mountain/snowflake symbol on the side of the tire These winter tires offer the best traction on snow and ice, and in cold weather.

The mud and snow symbol on the side of the tire These winter tires offer better traction than summer tires, however, they are less effective than mountain/snowflake tires on snow and ice, and in cold weather.

3.5 mm tread Tires must have 3.5 mm of tread remaining to be considered winter tires.

Matching Winter Tires You must have at least 2 matching winter tires on the same axle, but it is recommended to use 4 matching tires.

Studded Tires

May be used on BC highways from October 1 to April 30, but **must** have mountain/ snowflake or M+S symbols to be considered winter tires.

When are Winter Tires or Chains Right for Me?

Winter tires and chains can make your vehicle safer.

[®]OCTOBER 1- MARCH 31.

You **MUST** use winter tires (passenger vehicles) or carry chains (commercial trucks) between October 1 and March 31 on **most BC Highways**.

British Columbia's climates range from freezing cold to pleasantly mild in the winter; equipping your vehicle appropriately depends on what you are driving and where you are driving. Drivers in some parts of the southern coast, where regulations are more relaxed due to warmer weather, should use discretion when equipping their vehicles.

HOME OWNER GRANTS AND YOU

The home owner grant <u>reduces</u> the amount of property taxes you pay each year on your <u>principal residence</u>.

The regular grant (also called the basic grant) amount for people under the age of 65 in our area is \$770.00. The additional grant for Seniors (over 65) or persons with disabilities, the amount is \$1045.00.

Do I Qualify?

To qualify for the grant, you must:

- 1. Be the registered owner of the residence
- 2. Be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident of Canada
- 3. Live in BC
- 4. Occupy the residence as your principal residence.

For the purpose of claiming the home owner grant, you can only have **one** principal residence. If you own more than one home, you cannot designate which one is your principal residence. Your principal residence is the usual place that you **live** and conduct your daily affairs.

You must apply for the grant each year to receive it. When you receive your property tax notice, we highly recommend that you claim your homeowner grant, even if you are not able to pay your property tax amount owing at that time.

Claiming your grant will **reduce** the amount of your balance owing on your taxes. If you are unable to pay the amount owing before the due date, claiming your grant will also **reduce** the **amount of the penalty** applied to your account.

If you forget to claim your grant before the end of the year, on January 1st, the amount will roll to Arrears and start collecting interest. You may be able to claim the grant retroactively.

You can claim your home owner grant by signing the form on the back of your current property tax form. This can be dropped off at the District Office or mailed. You can also claim your grant online at www.hudsonshope.ca and follow the links on the page for the home owner grant.

Police Report October 2020



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 34 calls for service between September 20th and October 18th. 87 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates. Highway and road safety continues to be a big focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP with the school zone along Beattie Drive and the construction zones along Hwy 29 being the largest focuses for traffic enforcement at this time.

Police have been monitoring the multiple construction zones along Hwy 29 between Hudson's Hope and the Half Way Bridge and have issued a multitude of speeding tickets to drivers over the past few weeks. We are asking drivers to take heed to the white regulatory speed signs and drive accordingly so that the construction workers and flaggers can conduct their work safely.

On September 23rd, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a suspicious male at the school who was observed using a metal detector around the school grounds. This male was later observed taking a scooter belonging to a local youth and putting it in the back of a silver/grey newer model Ford truck (no canopy or distinguishing details), prior to driving off. Police have been unable to locate the male driver being no plate number was given. This vehicle has since not been observed in the area again.

On September 28th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a break and enter at a local commercial warehouse located along the Peace Canyon Rd. Unknown suspects entered the compound via cutting the chain-link fencing and stole several propane tanks. ATV tracks were noted outside the compound. Police are monitoring this area.

On September 30th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a stolen refrigerated Sea-can that had been stolen from a work site along the Core Rd. No persons observed at this time, however photographs and the serial number on the Sea-can (ACSU202392522G1)have been distributed through the area and anyone who has seen or knows the whereabouts of this



item, is asked to contact the local RCMP.

On October 10th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of an injured deer observed along Dudley Dr. Upon police locating the deer, it was found that this deer was unable to stand and was acting in an unusual manner, but had no signs of it being injured by a vehicle or another animal. Due to the deer's condition, it was humanely put down and local Conservation Officers were called and took possession of the deer to have it tested for CWD (Chronic Wasting Disease). Though there have been no confirmed cases of this in the province yet, this deer showed many signs of it so police are awaiting the test results to come back.

On October 16th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a motor vehicle accident involving a school bus and a pickup truck along Canyon Dr. The school bus, which did not have any children on board at the time, attempted to navigate a right hand curve of the road, but given the icy road conditions at the time, the bus slid across the centre lane and struck a passing by truck. Minor injuries were incurred and the persons involved were transported to hospital to be medically assessed.

Police are noting that "Winter is Coming" for all the Game of Thrones fans, and that winter graded tires are mandated between October 1st to April 30th. Failing to comply with putting on winter tires between the above dates can come with a fine of \$121.00.

On October 16th, (same icy snowy day as above), the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to another motor vehicle accident along Canyon Dr. for a single vehicle that had slid off the road and side-swiped a hydro pole. Upon speaking with the driver, it was found that no injuries were incurred and the accident was a result of the icy road conditions.

On October 17th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of several loose cows at large along Canyon Dr. near the 400 Rd. Due to the safety concerns that an accident could occur from the loose cattle, police attended the area but were unable to locate the herd. These cows were previously observed freely at large along the power lines near the 400 Rd. but no owner was found at this time. Police are noting that a fine for cattle at large could be issued to the owner for each individual cow if found at large and on public roadways.

Take flu out of the mix - get your flu shot

This year, it's more important than ever to get a flu shot to protect against the spread of influenza, especially for those at highest risk of illness. There is no COVID-19 vaccine yet, but we do have influenza vaccines. We can take influenza out of the

Influenza is a contagious respiratory disease that can lead to serious illness, hospitalization and death. If influenza spreads rapidly in communities at the same time as COVID-19 – it can overwhelm the healthcare system and put our loved ones at risk. The best protection is to get the flu shot this fall... and stay home if you are sick.

Most Northern Health flu clinics will start the first week of November, and flu vaccines will also be available from pharmacies and doctor's offices throughout the region. To find a flu clinic or provider nearest you, visit lmmunizeBC's website, or call 8-1-1 if you don't have access to the internet.

Making an appointment is strongly encouraged this year to help reduce line-ups and maintain safe physical distancing, due to COVID-19. Northerners are asked to plan ahead and schedule a time to get their flu shot. NH public health clinics will be encouraging mask use (for those aged two and up), and implementing physical distancing measures. Please follow the instructions of clinic staff, and respect COVID-19 safety protocols put in place by other flu shot providers.

In some communities, the NH Check In app is available to make physical distancing easier while waiting for your flu shot appointment (to download the app, visit: https://www.northernhealth.ca/services/digital-health/nhcheckin). Please note, the NH Check-In app is optional to use, and is not for the purpose of making flu shot appointments.

Flu shots are safe, effective and free for many people in BC including: children, seniors, pregnant people, Indigenous people, those with underlying medical or chronic health conditions, those who work with or come in close contact with higher-risk groups.

We are maintaining capacity restrictions for the library in light of increasing numbers of COVID-19 cases.

COVID-19 prevention regulations will be updated as necessary to ensure that we are adhering to WorkSafe regulations and BC Health recommendations.

Please note that all children under the age of 10 must be supervised by an adult. Computer use is by appointment only with a 45 minute maximum, except when the Reading Room computer is booked for an exam. Library use is for browsing only as we currently are not providing long term use seating or tables to set up laptops, etc.

We are presently working on rearranging and condensing some of the Children's library collections so that we can open up an old entryway for the room. In doing this, we are better able to allow more people in to the room, and will be prepared to provide limited in person programs when many other libraries in the province also start to do so. This change will mean that YA section seating will not be able to remain the same as before the closure.

To ensure physical distancing we are limiting the number of patrons in the library at a time.


book drop, we cannot accept those donations at this time, including boxes of donations. All book returns are only accepted in the exterior book drop due to quarantining protocols.

Re: Hauling truck traffic in Hudson's Hope

Dear Hudson's Hope resident,

We're writing to provide an update on the construction of the shoreline protection berm in Hudson's Hope. The berm – a large barrier made of riprap, rocks and gravel – will reinforce the shoreline and protect it from potential erosion once the Site C reservoir is filled.

Hauling begins this week

This week, we are starting to haul riprap (large rocks and boulders) from Portage Mountain Quarry to a stockpile area on Clark Avenue. Hauling will continue until the berm is completed in 2022.

Traffic impacts

- There will be 2 4 return truck trips an hour to begin with. Hauling could eventually increase to 6 - 8 return trips hourly.
- The truck route will be along Canyon Drive and Clark Avenue.
- Hauling will occur between 7 am 7 pm, seven days a week.






