Heating Safety

There is something about the winter months and curling up with a good book by the fireplace. But did you know that heating equipment is one of the leading causes of home fire deaths? With a few simple safety tips and precautions you can prevent most heating fires from happening.

BE WARM AND SAFE THIS WINTER!

- Weep anything that can burn at least three-feet away from heating equipment, like the furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable space heater.
- Have a three-foot "kid-free zone" around open fires and space heaters.
- Never use your oven to heat your home.
- Have a qualified professional install stationary space heating equipment, water heaters or central heating equipment according to the local codes and manufacturer's instructions.
- Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional.
- Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
- Always use the right kind of fuel, specified by the manufacturer, for fuel burning space heaters.
- Make sure the fireplace has a sturdy screen to stop sparks from flying into the room. Ashes should be cool before putting them in a metal container. Keep the container a safe distance away from your home.

Heating Equipment Smarts

Install wood burning stoves following manufacturer's instructions or have a professional do the installation. All fuel-burning equipment should be vented to the outside to avoid carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning.

Install and maintain CO alarms to avoid the risk of CO poisoning. If you smell gas in your gas heater, do do not light the appliance. Leave the home immediately and call your local fire department or gas company.

FACT

Half of home heating fires are reported during the months of **December**, **January**, and **February**.

2022 DOG TAGS Now Available

Reminder.... 2021 Dog Licenses expire on December 31st. Why Should I License My Dog?

Perhaps the best incentive for getting your dog licensed is that it increases your chances of getting your pet back if they get lost.

Licensing your dog with the District means staff are able to contact you if someone finds your dog.

It's Easy and Inexpensive

The cost is \$10.00 if your pet is spayed or neutered or \$30.00 if they are not. Stop by and pick up your license at the District Office, it only takes a few minutes.

Reduced Fines

The Fee for a dog picked up at large is \$60.00. There is an additional fee of \$60.00 if they are not licensed (this does not include any boarding fees, if applicable).

RECYCLING STEEL CONTAINERS

Bales of separated aluminum and steel are shipped to material remanufacturers to be melted and turned into rolls, sheets, or bars before being turned into new packaging and products. Because of the nature of metal, it can be recycled over and over, and virtually every type of metal product has some recycled content.

Accepted Materials

For food including pet food; tins for cookies, tea, chocolates, etc.; includes metal lid

- •Empty and rinse cans. Labels are OK
- Remove lids, drop into can and squeeze slightly

- Multi-family collection

Police Report: December 2021



Between October 22 and November 22 2021, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 28 calls for service.

A traffic stop conducted on October 26, 2021 resulted in an impaired driving investigation. The driver provided samples of their breath and was found to have consumed alcohol. The driver was subsequently issued a three-day driving prohibition. (2021-393)

On October 27, 2021, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a possible impaired driver. The vehicle was located on Canyon Drive and the driver was found to have consumed liquor. The driver was released on a future court date to answer to the charge of impaired operation of a conveyance. (2021-394)

While conducting speed enforcement on November 3, 2021 in the School zone on Beattie Drive, a driver was stopped for speeding. The driver was found to be travelling at 47 km/h above the posted school zone speed limit. As a result, a violation ticket was issued for excessive speed. (2021-400)

The Hudson's Hope RCMP were advised of a battery theft that had occurred in a construction site on Highway 29 on or about November 8, 2021. The batteries were removed from a Sign board that was being utilized to warn traffic of an upcoming construction project. Having this notice not available, created a large traffic safety hazard as it warned motorists of the large construction area coming up. If anyone has any dash cam or information to this theft, please contact the Hudson's Hope RCMP at 250-783-5241 and cite file 2021-401.

Between the dates of November 5 and November 8, 2021 a large piece of construction equipment that was parked at a construction site along Farrell Creek road had been broken into. Electronics and maintenance tools were removed from the piece of equipment. (2021-402)

Another day of conducting stationary RADAR enforcement in the school zone along Beattie Drive in Hudson's Hope located another vehicle travelling at an excessive speed on November 10. The school zone in this area is known for people to be traveling quickly and a vehicle was found to be travelling 43 km/h over the posted school zone speed limit. This resulted in a traffic stop and an excessive speeding ticket being issued to the driver. (2021-406)

During the evening of November 11, 2021, the District of Hudson's Hope and the Hudson's Hope RCMP teamed up for the second year to deliver meals to the local veterans. The catered meals consisted of a salad, main course, desert and a bottle of wine with glasses.

8 Remembrance day baskets with 2 meals in each were delivered in the course of the evening. It was Cpl Gardner and the District of Hudson's Hope Event Coordinator Kristina Coombs' honor to spend the time to thank every one of the veterans for their service. The District of Hudson's Hope Fire Chief Brad Milton and Hudson's Hope RCMP's own Constable Erich Schmidt are two of the youngest veterans in town that had meals delivered.





Pay special attention to provincial health orders to avoid any confusion or disappointment with our regulations upon entry to the library. As per provincial guidance, in the case of a community outbreak or exposure event, we may need to implement stronger restrictions at any time.

In accordance with provincial guidance, masks are mandatory while visiting indoor public spaces for anyone 5 and older. This is also required for people attending our programs, children ages 5 and older as well as any adults attending with them. Proof of vaccination is not currently required for regular library services or programming.






