What is a Winter Tire?

British Columbia accepts "mountain snowflake" or "mud and snow" tires with at least 3.5 mm tread as winter tires.

Check your tires for these signs:

The mountain/snowflake symbol on the side of the tire These winter tires offer the best traction on snow and ice, and in cold weather.

The mud and snow symbol on the side of the tire These winter tires offer better traction than summer tires, however, they are less effective than mountain/snowflake tires on snow and ice, and in cold weather.

3.5 mm tread Tires must have 3.5 mm of tread remaining to be considered winter tires.

Matching Winter Tires You must have at least 2 **matching** winter tires on the same axle, but **it is recommended to use 4 matching tires.**

Studded Tires

May be used on BC highways from October 1 to April 30, but **must** have mountain/snowflake or M+S symbols to be considered winter tires.

When are Winter Tires or Chains Right for Me?

Winter tires and chains can make your vehicle safer.

You **MUST** use winter tires (passenger vehicles) or carry chains (commercial trucks) between October 1 and March 31 on **most BC Highways.**

British Columbia's climates range from freezing cold to pleasantly mild in the winter; equipping your vehicle appropriately depends on what you are driving and where you are driving. Drivers in some parts of the southern coast, where regulations are more relaxed due to warmer weather, should use discretion when equipping their vehicles.

All-season tires are made with a harder rubber blend that can withstand hot weather.

Gardening Tip of the Month

Mow leaves and compost together and till this in to the garden beds. Mowing breaks the leaves down and allows them to be composted faster. This gives our soil microbes something to work on all winter and in spring worms will break them down further.



GLASS BOTTLES AND JARS



Glass bottles and jars are recycled into new glass containers, fiberglass insulation, paint for reflective signs, sand blast media and construction aggregate.

Accepted Materials

- Clear or coloured non-deposit glass bottles and jars. Check with your recycling collector for instructions.



Where Accepted

- Separately in curbside collection — confirm with your recycling collector
- Separately in multi-family collection — confirm with your recycling collector
- Recycle BC depots



Not Accepted

- Drinking glasses or dishes, cookware
- Whole or broken window glass or mirrors
- Ceramic products
- Light bulbs and light fixtures
- Deposit glass can be returned to depot for deposit refund or included in segregated glass recycling



Police Report: November 2021



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 47 calls for service between September 17th and October 21st. 64 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates for various motor vehicle related offences. Highway and road safety continues to be a focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP.

Please make note of the numerous construction sites along Hwy 29 toward Fort St. John. Due to the increase of work sites along the highway, there is a large fluctuation between the speed zones for each site. Police will be monitoring these areas as they are a posted construction zone and fines will range from \$196.00 to \$253.00 for speeding violations within a marked construction zone.

On September 20th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP conducted a vehicle check-stop along Hwy 29 where several motorists were routinely stopped and checked for sobriety and driver safety, ie: seatbelts, vehicle insurance and driver's licences with only a few drivers being ticketed for various minor Motor Vehicle offences.

On September 21st, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a theft of radios and approximately 800 litres of fuel from a bulldozer and grader that were parked along a forestry service road north of Hudson's Hope. Police are currently working on several leads and the file remains open for investigation at this time.

On September 24th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a workplace injury that had occurred on a worksite along Hwy 29. Police and BCEHS attended for a logger who had been injured while falling a tree. No major injuries were incurred due to the safety equipment that was utilized accordingly and the individual was transported to hospital where he was later released.

On September 30th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of another workplace injury that had occurred at a construction site along Hwy 29, in which a worker had been struck by a large piece of plywood decking that had come loose from the bridge deck due to the extreme wind gusts at that time. First aid was administered to the injured individual immediately by on-site first aid personnel, and he was later transported to hospital and released later in the day, expected to make a full recovery.

On October 11th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a theft of construction equipment from a work site along Hwy 29. It was reported that a clean-up bucket, rake, and ripper attachments for a 490E excavator had been stolen from the site. Police investigation remains open for this file.

On October 11th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP along with HH Fire attended the scene of a vehicle fire along Canyon Dr. It was reported that the driver had smelt smoke while driving and upon pulling over, the vehicle caught fire (unknown cause at this time). Driver was uninjured and vehicle was later towed from scene once safe.

On October 18th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of stolen firearms, jerry cans/fuel, and a

portable barbeque from a vehicle along Farrell Creek FSR. The complainant reported that he had been hunting up in the area and that the stolen items had been locked and secured within the confines of his vehicle while he slept in a nearby tent for the evening, with them being stolen sometime during the night. File remains open for investigation.

On an undisclosed date and time, local police received a report of thieves who have been stealing wheels from police vehicles around the area. Police have been unable to catch the thieves as of yet but are working “tirelessly” to catch them!

The Hudson’s Hope RCMP also would like to remind residents that the time of the year for ghosts, goblins, ghouls, and Batman to be out and about on the streets while “Trick or Treating”, is fastly approaching. Some quick reminders from your local handsome police officers to ensure everyone has a safe and fun evening:

TRICK or TREATERS

- Trick or Treat in well known areas with an adult or if you’re old enough to be on your own, stay with a group of friends,
- Stay in well lit areas and only visit well lit houses,
- Wear a costume that can be easily be seen at night (additives of glow sticks are good),
- Watch for cars pulling out of driveways and backing up,
- Carry a flashlight if possible,
- Have your treats inspected by an adult before eating them (ie: those chewy toffee rolls that pull teeth... nasty!)
- Always wait outside for your treats,
- Stay away from animals you don’t know (unless its Bigfoot handing out candy again this year!).

DRIVERS

- Motorists should drive with extra caution as there will be many children on the streets who will be very excited and may forget to cross safely, or may not look to see a car backing out of a driveway,
- Drive slowly and keep a keen eye on the road for children crossing,
- Do not wear costumes that interfere with the safe operation of a motor vehicle,
- Never drive while impaired,
- If at all possible, avoid driving where there may be a high volume of children walking about.

HOMEOWNERS

- Homeowners who plan to pass out candy should make sure their home and doorway are well lit and that sidewalks and pathways are clear.
- Please avoid using open flames in any displays.

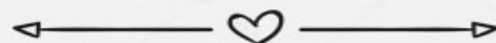

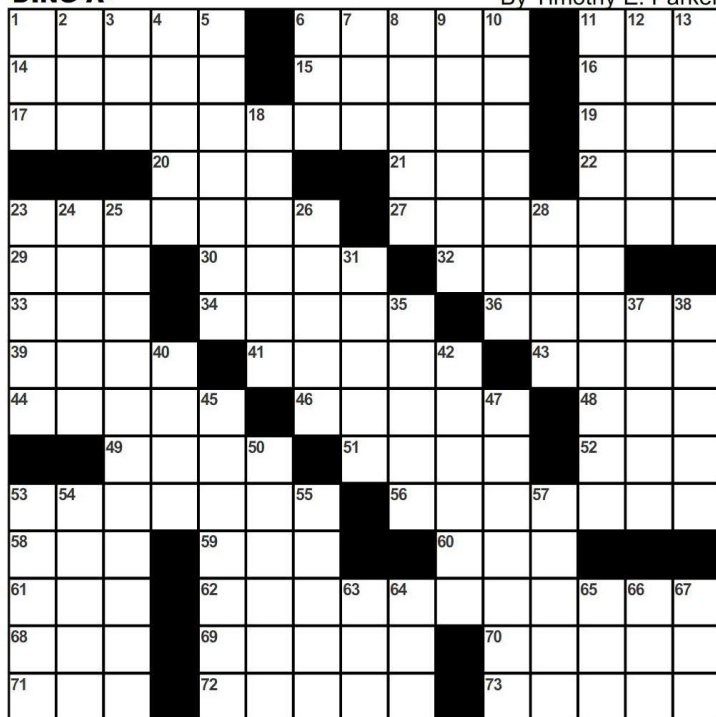

Greetings Hudson's Hope!

We would like to introduce ourselves as the brand new Hudson's Hope FireSmart Representatives. We are here to help educate homeowners about the risks of wildfire and the ways to reduce loss.

What is FireSmart?

FireSmart is a voluntary property assessment program that helps residents identify specific actions they can take on their property to reduce wildfire risks. The assessment tool is an in-depth, on-site perimeter assessment tool that identifies areas of risk and mitigation options unique to their property. By undergoing an assessment, property owners take responsibility for educating themselves on ways to reduce risk and increase the likelihood their home and property will survive a wildfire.



What are the primary threats to homes during a wildfire?

Research around home destruction vs. home survival in wildfires point to embers and small flames as the main way that the majority of homes ignite in wildfires. Embers are burning pieces of airborne wood and/or vegetation that can be carried more than a mile through the wind and can cause spot fires and ignite homes, debris and other objects.

FireSmart identifies methods for homeowners to prepare their homes to withstand ember attacks and minimize the likelihood of flames or surface fire touching the home or any attachments. Experiments, models and post-fire studies have shown homes ignite due to the condition of the home and everything around it, up to 200' from the foundation.

We are looking forward to bringing this program to Hudson's Hope to help increase our community's resilience to wildfire.

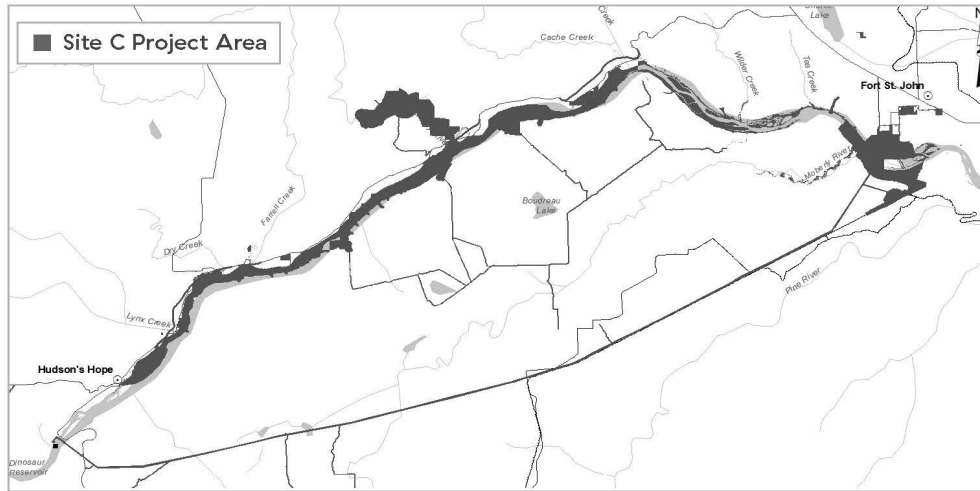
Becoming educated about wildfire resilience is everyone's job. The more we work together as a community, the greater our chance of surviving a wildfire event with minimal loss to life and structures. Reading was also very important to him, he always had an open book in his hand or on the go. He volunteered many years with our local Library, and also serving as a board member.





Bud loved the community of Hudson's Hope, and was always willing to lend a hand.



November at the Hudson's Hope Museum

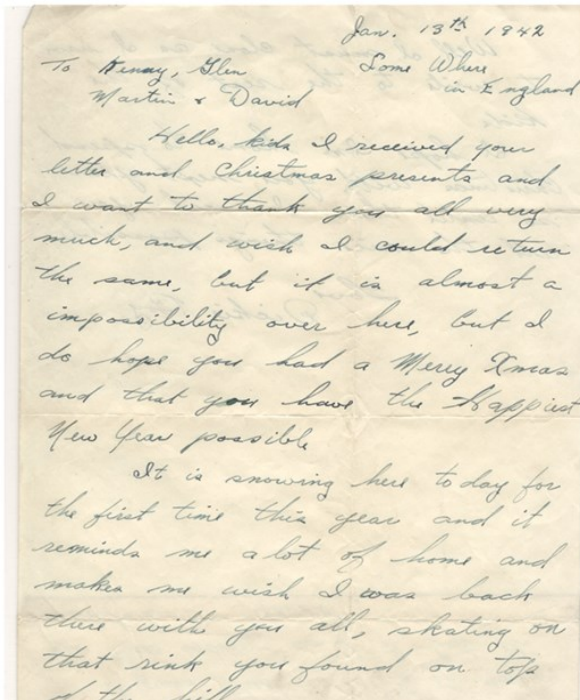


Another month in the year of 2021 has come to pass, and along with it a time of remembrance...

We continue to review applicants to replace our previous employees, Elinor and Christian. Though they may be large shoes to fill for our community's museum, we are sure to find the right fit for our lovely town.

Additionally, with the recent departure of those in the community, we look back on others who have come and gone. We came across wholesome letters to and from the brave young lads of Hudson's Hope that served in the second World War.
