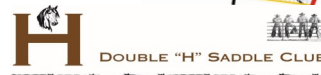

Business Licenses

The 2022 Business License statements have been mailed out. If you no longer require your Business License, please call the District Office to have your license cancelled. If you do not have a business license or are unsure if you require one, please stop in or call for more information.

Bylaw No. 504, 1994 clearly states *"that no person shall carry on, within the Municipality, any business unless he or she is the holder of a valid and subsisting license issued to him or her under the bylaw by the License Inspector and shall pay therefore, to the License Inspector, the sum stated in the bylaw"*. The annual cost for a business license is \$50.00

A "business" is defined as any activity in which you receive monetary compensation for any services that you may provide within the community.



If you are operating a business without a license, you are in direct violation of Bylaw No. 504.

Perhaps the best incentive for getting your dog licensed is that it increases your chances of getting your pet back if they get lost.

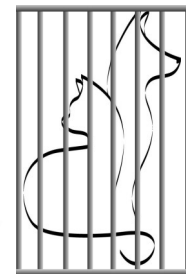
Licensing your dog with the District means staff are able to contact you if someone finds your dog.

It's Easy and Inexpensive

The cost is \$10.00 if your pet is spayed or neutered or \$30.00 if they are not. Stop by and pick up your license at the District Office, it only takes a few minutes.

Reduced Fines

The Fee for a dog picked up at large is \$60.00. There is an additional fee of \$60.00 if they are not licensed (this does not include any boarding fees, if applicable).





RECYCLING PAPER

Paper is recycled into new paper products, boxboard, the paper cover for drywall, moulded paper egg cartons and insulation.



Accepted Materials

- Newspapers, inserts and flyers
- Magazines and catalogues
- Telephone books and other directories
- Writing and home office paper, paper envelopes, and notepads
- Paper gift wrap and greeting cards
- Shredded paper (if your community separates containers and paper into different bins or bags for collection, set shredded paper out for collection in a paper bag or small box and place in your paper bin/bag; if your community collects paper and containers in the same bin, contain shredded paper in a clear plastic bag and place it in your recycling bin)



Not Accepted

- Hardcover or paperback books (donate or sell)
- Ribbons or bows
- Musical greeting cards with batteries (contact the Recycling Council of BC for battery and e-waste recycling options)
- Rubber bands
- Plastic bags used to cover newspapers/flyers (recycle at a Recycle BC depot)

- Recycle BC depots

Homeowner Information to Building Permits

The District of Hudson's Hope wants to assist homeowners and contractors to avoid unnecessary delays and expense in planning and construction of residential projects. Below explains when permits are required, requirements for the permit, possible other documents that may be required and other information to assist you in obtaining your building permit. Additional information is available at the District Office or online at www.hudsonshope.ca

A BUILDING PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO:

- construct a new home;
- locate mobile / modular home;
- construct a commercial, industrial or public use building;
- construct a new accessory building e.g., carport, farm building, garage or storage shed;
- renovate existing buildings;
- undertake any structural work such as interior partitions;
- enclose a porch or roof over a sundeck;
- move or demolish a building;
- re-roof a building;
- reconstruct after damage;
- plumbing system changes;

INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED WITH A BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATION

The following items must be supplied along with a completed Building Permit Application before a Building Permit can be issued. A Building Permit fee is based on the value of the building or structure and will be calculated by the Building Official.

1. BUILDING PLANS

Two sets of detailed building plans. If you cannot draw the necessary building or site plans, then you should obtain the services of a qualified person.

Example Floor Plans

- scale not less than 1:50 metric (1/4 inch to 1 foot);
- size and location of windows and doors;
- location of all plumbing fixtures;
- location of all mechanical equipment.
- all rooms, size and use of each;
- all dimensions;
- finished and unfinished areas; —

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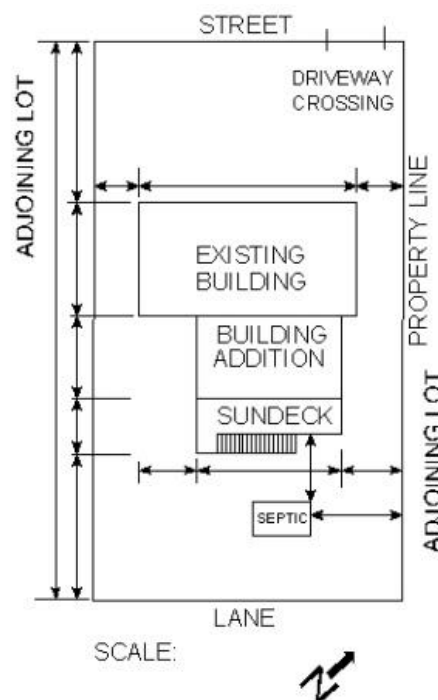

2. SITE PLAN

- full legal description of lot: lot number, plan number; district lot number (from your tax notice or Title);
- lot dimensions;
- adjoining street names;
- locations and uses of existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- distances from all property lines for existing and proposed buildings or additions;
- location of legal road access to the property;
- size, location and number of parking spaces;
- existing and proposed wells or other water sources;
- location of existing or proposed sewage disposal fields on property;
- location of any watercourses on property showing distances from existing or proposed buildings or additions;

This information is intended to assist the general public in applying for a Building Permit within the District of Hudson's Hope.



BUILDING INSPECTIONS (Typical)

The Building Bylaw requires inspections at the following stages of construction;

- Footings - prior to pouring concrete.
- Backfilling - after completion of damp-proofing, drain tile, and drain rock (if required), but prior to backfilling.
- Plumbing - before any part of the plumbing system is covered.
- Framing - after the entire rough-in plumbing, electrical and mechanical equipment is installed and the framing is completed to lockup stage, but prior to insulating.
- Insulation and Vapour Barrier - after all insulation and vapour barriers are installed, but prior to covering.
- Final - when the building or portion thereof is completed and ready for occupancy, but prior to occupancy thereof.

An Occupancy Certificate is required prior to occupancy of a building. In order for an Occupancy Certificate to be issued, all inspections above must be approved.



Police Report: January 2022



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 24 calls for service between December 16th, 2021 and January 19th, 2022. 42 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates for various motor vehicle related offences. Highway and road safety continues to be a focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP.

Please make note of the numerous construction sites along Hwy 29 toward Fort St. John. Due to the increase of work sites along the highway, there is a large fluctuation between the speed zones for each site. Police will be monitoring these areas as they are a posted construction zone and fines will range from \$196.00 to \$253.00 for speeding violations within a marked construction zone.

On December 16th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a driver for excessive speeding after they were observed travelling through the school zone at a confirmed speed of 46km/hr over the posted speed limit. The driver was issued a \$368.00 violation ticket and received the full complimentary excessive speed package that included a 7-day stay for their vehicle at the luxurious FSJ impound lot.

On December 19th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP conducted a routine stop of a vehicle on Ellis Cres., and through the use of a breathalyzer, found the driver to be impaired by alcohol. The driver received a 3-day driving prohibition.

On December 19th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a commercial truck fire on Canyon Drive after it was reported that a commercial tanker truck carrying flammable liquid condensate materials had caught on fire. Police and Fire attended scene and cordoned off an 800m safety area near Canyon Drive / Beryl Prairie Rd. until such time that Fire was able to extinguish the flames and deem the area safe. It was later found that the fire started in a wheel drum on the trailer but due to the fast response time of our amazing local Fire Department, the flames never reached the contents of the tanker.

On January 17th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a residential cabin fire along Twelve Mile Rd. Upon police arriving on scene, it was found that the fire had occurred earlier in the morning and the structure was completely destroyed. All occupants of the residence made it out unharmed and there

was no further damage to neighbouring residences. Cause of the fire is unknown at this time.

The Hudson's Hope RCMP would like to remind drivers that the time of the year is upon us again in which our roads and streets can become training grounds for bobsled and luge training overnight due to the cold, wintery weather. If you have not already done so, this is the time to make sure that your vehicles have adequate winter tires and chains for highway/road travel. Failure to operate a motor vehicle without adequate winter tires can result in a \$121.00 fine.

Lastly, during the late evening of an undisclosed date, police observed a vehicle driving erratically and swerving between lanes while it was travelling along the highway. Upon stopping the vehicle and speaking with the male driver, police questioned the man as to where he was going so late in the evening. The man replied, "I'm on my way to attend a lecture about alcohol abuse and its effects on the human body, as well as smoking and staying out late". Curious and dumbfounded, the police officer further questioned the male driver and asked, "who would give that kind of lecture at that time of night?" The man simply replied, "My wife". (Full disclosure, this is a joke...hə hə).

HOUSE NUMBERS SAVE LIVES

The Importance of a **9-1-1** Address

Properly displaying your civic number on your house or at the end of your driveway ensures fast emergency response for the **AMBULANCE, FIRE** and **POLICE** Services. Precious minutes can pass while the emergency vehicle attempts to locate the emergency incident.

It is strongly recommended that you ensure that a civic address is posted with the following guidelines in place:

- the civic address the District has assigned to the premises must be displayed on the principal building on the premises and must be legible from a minimum distance of fifteen (15) metres;
- where a building is set back from the street or roadway fronting the property such that the assigned street address is not clearly legible from the street or roadway, or where landscaping or architectural appurtenances or other obstructions obstruct the address, the assigned street address shall also be displayed at the driveway entrance from the street or road serving the building on a weather-resistant sign permanently mounted on a post and visible from all direction of traffic flow; and
- letters or numbers displayed on a building must be of a colour which contrasts with the background colour of the building or sign.

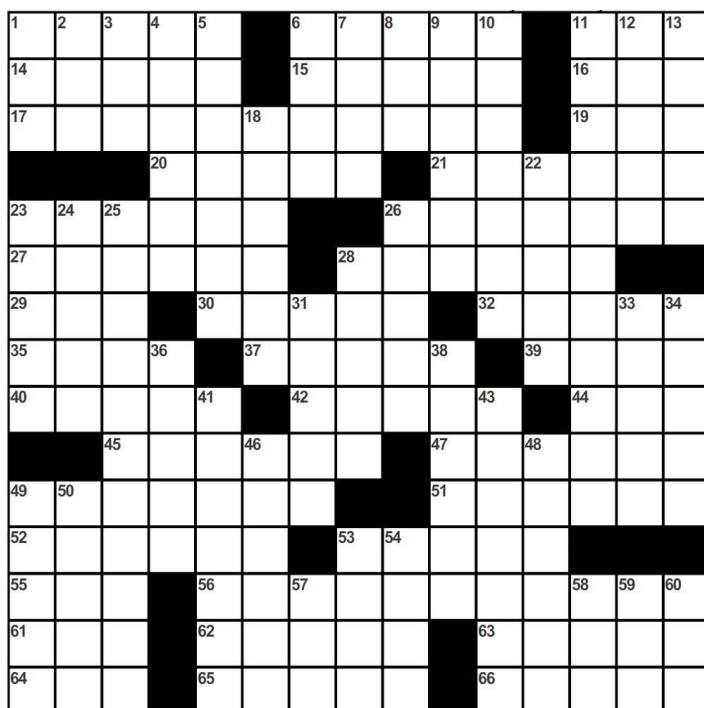

As we look around our community, we wonder what brought the settlers here. This month we are exploring Dr. Greene.

Dr. & Mrs. Greene arrived in 1913 and took up land at the "Gates". Dr. Greene was a knowledgeable man, having many trades. He was a licensed dentist, had some training as a doctor, trapped, and assisted the Wright brothers in building their very first plane. Dr. Greene while in New York, worked on the stage directing and doing makeup. Mrs. Greene was a trained nurse.

Dr. Greene and his wife started to build a sanitarium at the Gates thinking they would provide a home and care for invalids. It was not meant to be. The hospital was never completed.

The Greene's left the area for a few years. During this time Ursula was born. In the mid-twenties they returned to Weasel Creek to trap. This lasted a couple of years then they returned to Peace River, where Dr. Greene, on his trap line at Weasel Creek, set up his dentistry clinic which he operated until his death sometime around 1950.

Automated External Defibrillators

What are They?

An automated external defibrillator (AED) is a small, portable device used to identify cardiac rhythms and deliver a shock to correct abnormal electrical activity in the heart. AEDs are used to treat sudden cardiac arrest (SCA).

Up to 40,000 cardiac arrests occur each year in Canada. That's one cardiac arrest every 13 minutes.

Eighty-five per cent of cardiac arrests in Canada happen outside of hospitals, and having an AED close by can make all the difference. The American Heart Association warns that for every minute lost before defibrillation, the survival rate decreases by seven to 10 per cent. After 12 minutes, the survival rate plummets to less than five per cent.

When CPR and an AED are both used within five minutes of a cardiac arrest, the chance of survival rises by nearly 75 per cent, according to research published in the Journal of the American College of Cardiology.

Where are They?

Quick access to an AED can greatly improve a patient's survivability rate, and knowing where AEDs are located within your community can help facilitate this. Fortunately there are a number of AEDs located within the District of Hudson's Hope. Emergency responders including police, fire and BC Ambulance all have devices on their apparatus and vehicles. There are also AEDs located **at the Arena in the winter and the Pool in the summer**. Staff at these locations have training in their use. **Hudson's Hope School** has an AED in the staff room and has staff trained in its use. Other places that might be less obvious are **the Library** where an AED is on site, and staff and board members have received training in AED and CPR, and **Silver Willow Court** where they also have an AED available.

Overdrive App: One final reminder that the Overdrive app is going to be discontinued in February 2022. Those of you who are still using the Overdrive App please make the switch over to the Libby app, to avoid experiencing a service disruption when trying to access our online magazine, eBook, audiobook and video collections. The Overdrive team plans to support the app through the end of the year but you will no longer be able to download the app after this month. All of your

holds will automatically transfer over but you will have to download any books that you already have on loan on to the Libby app. The Libby app has been around for a number of years now and it is a much more simplified way to access our electronic resources collection. Also remember that you can recommend titles, but this has to be done through the Overdrive website.
