The finished painting is now hanging in the District Office fover for all to enjoy.




The **Friends of Hudson's Hope** will be hosting an AGM on May 11th at 6pm, at the Hudson's Hope Thrift Store.

Canadian Navigable Waters Act Notice

BC Hydro hereby gives notice that a submission has been added to the Common Project Search (online registry) pursuant to the Canadian Navigable Waters Act described herein and its description.

Pursuant to paragraph 4.1 and 9.1 of the said Act, BC Hydro has deposited with the Minister of Transport, on the online Common Project Search Registry (cps.canada.ca) and under registry number 4526 a description of the following work:

The existing spillway debris/public safety boom on Williston Reservoir at the W.A.C. Bennett Dam will be replaced. The replacement boom will be in the same footprint as the existing boom. This boom is located directly in front of the spillway.

Police Report: April 2022



Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to 15 calls for service between February 18th to March 18th, 2022. 47 written violations and warning tickets were issued to drivers between the above dates for various motor vehicle related offences. Highway and road safety continues to be a focus for the Hudson's Hope RCMP.

Please make note of the numerous construction sites along Hwy 29 toward Fort St. John. Due to the increase of work sites along the highway, there is a large fluctuation between the speed zones for each site. Police will be monitoring these areas as they are a posted construction zone and fines will range from \$196.00 to \$253.00 for speeding violations within a marked construction zone.

March is Distracted Driving Month in BC and with spring break just around the corner, the RCMP will be ramping up distracted driving enforcement this month. Fines for distracted driving, ie: Use of an electronic device while driving, comes with a \$368 ticket and 4 points.

"Use" in relation to an electronic device, means one or more of the following actions:

- Holding the device in a position in which it may be used;
- Operating one or more of the devices functions;
- Communicating orally by means of the device with another person or another device:
- Taking another action this is set out in the regulations by means of, with or in relation to an electronic device.

A driver must NOT:

- Hold, operate, communicate, or watch the screen of a hand-held electronic communication device;
- Send or receive text messages or email on any type of electronic device, or;
- Hold, operate, communicate or watch the screen of a hand-held electronic device, one of the purposes of which is to process or compute data.
- Nor, tape one's phone to their steering wheel and call it hands free! (true story)

These prohibitions DO NOT apply if the driver is:

- Safely parked and off the roadway, or;
- Making an emergency call to 911.

As a side note, Section 214.2 of the Motor Vehicle Act allows peace officers and person's driving or operating an ambulance, and fire services personnel to utilize an electronic device while in the operation of their duties where safe and fit to do so.

The Bulletin 8 April 2022

On March 3rd, the Hudson's Hope RCMP responded to a vehicle fire along Paquette Ave. where upon arriving on scene, police observed HH Fire extinguishing a vehicle which had flames coming from within the cab of the vehicle. No persons were inside the vehicle at the time of the fire and no persons injured. File remains open for investigation at this time.

On March 8th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP stopped a vehicle for excessive speed through the school zone along Beattie Dr. The driver of the vehicle was issued a ticket for \$368 after the vehicle was observed travelling at a speed of 48km/hr over the posted speed limit.

On March 15th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a suspicious vehicle in the area of the HH pool parking lot. It was reported that a newer dark coloured grey van, possibly a Toyota, single male occupant, had been parked in the lot near the pool and playground with suspicious attributes stemming from its presence. Upon the complainant attempting to get close enough to obtain a photograph, the vehicle hastily sped off and police were unable to locate the vehicle.

On March 18th, the Hudson's Hope RCMP received a report of a theft of fuel from a worksite along Hwy 29. It was reported that someone had syphoned a large amount of diesel from an excavator some time throughout the night. Photographs/video were on-site and provided to police. File remains open for investigation.

Please make note of the Hwy 29 road closures starting March 18th and carrying on to March 24th, with the highway being closed between the hours of 9pm and 4am. The highway near the Farrell Creek bridge project will be closed completely from both sides during the above noted dates and times and all vehicles travelling through at these times will either have to wait till the highway re-opens at 4am, or detour through Hwy 97. Police will be monitoring the road closures.





PROTECTIVE SERVICES

SPRING BURNING

As the weather starts to warm up many folks are beginning to plan some spring-time cleanup activities including the removal of yard waste and debris. Please remember that under the Fire Protection & Life Safety Bylaw 775 which was adopted in 2010, no person shall light or start an open air fire within the District without first having obtained a Burning Permit from the Fire Chief or his designate. These permits are available at the District Office and can be issued for a onetime event or for an extended period of up to one year.

The only time a permit is not required is during the following situations:

- Burning refuse or garden waste only in an incinerator covered with a screen to prevent flying sparks and is approved by the Fire Chief
- The cooking of food using a portable barbeque apparatus
- Burning on privately owned lands or in developed campgrounds where fireplaces, stoves, and/or fire pits are provided and approved by the Fire Chief
- Burning by the Fire & Rescue Services for the purposes of training

If you are contemplating an open burn:

- Consider your options to compost, recycle, or haul the material to the Hudson's Hope Transfer Site.
- Be a good neighbour. Burn only when it will not affect the health and welfare of the community.
- Call the BC Ministry of Environment to check the ventilation index at 1-888-281-2992. The index must be "good" for the day of the burn and "fair" or "good" for the second day of the burn.
- Check the wind conditions. If the wind is strong enough to carry sparks and embers to other combustible materials postpone your burn.

Remember that your burn must comply with the Environmental Management Act and the Open Burning Smoke Control Regulation as well as the British Columbia Wildfire Act.

Please remember these measures are in place to protect the health and safety of you and your neighbours. If you have any further questions regarding your burning activities please stop by the District Office to speak to Brad Milton the Director of Protective Services, or call 783-9901.






